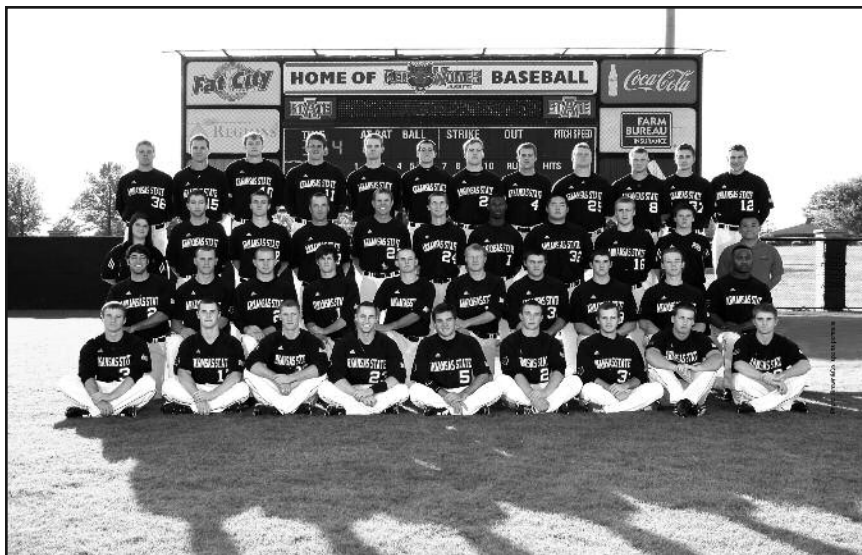


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2013 ASU Baseball Media Guide

CREDENTIALS: Credentials for home games are provided to those members of the media who are covering the game in a full working capacity. Requests with names should be submitted in writing on company letterhead. Passes will be mailed to valid applicants as long as time permits; otherwise, passes may be claimed at the main gate to Tomlinson Stadium. Spouses, dates, children and non-workers are NOT permitted in the media areas. Passes must be displayed at all times, and ASU reserves the right to revoke passes and privileges at any time due to misrepresentation or misconduct. Requests for road-game credentials should be made to the SID of the host institution.

GAME SERVICES: Notes, programs, media guides and statistic packets are provided to media personnel by the Sports Information Office. Light refreshments will be served on most game days in the press box. The press box telephone number is (870) 972-3383.

PHOTOGRAPHERS: Certified photographers of newspapers, magazines, wire services and TV stations must request passes in writing. No credentials will be issued to freelance photographers.

INTERVIEWS: The head coach will be available for interviews in the press box after each game, following a brief team meeting. A-State student-athletes will also be available by request at this time. The locker room is closed to the media following games. All interviews must be approved by the head coach.

INJURY INFORMATION POLICY: A student-athlete's protected health information is protected by federal regulations under either the Health Information Portability and Accountability Act (HIPAA) or the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (the Buckley Amendment) and may not be disclosed without either the student-athlete's authorization under HIPAA or their consent under the Buckley Amendment. Authorized/consented injury information pertaining to a student-athlete shall be released to the media through the Sports Information Department after being authorized by the athletic trainer. It is also appropriate in post-game or weekly press conferences for head coaches to announce team injury updates. Team physicians may be available

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to offer explanation on injuries if requested by the athletic trainer. Any dugout or locker room report made to the media shall be made by an athletic trainer, team physician, or a sports information staff representative.

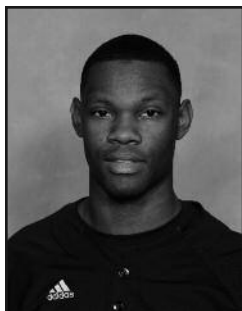

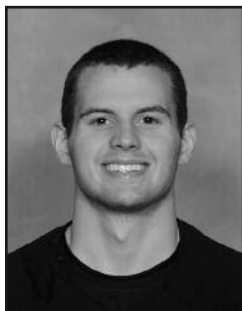

Personal: Son of Alvin Pritchard and Felecia Fitzpatrick ... Birthday is October 30, 1993 ... Enjoys playing all sports.



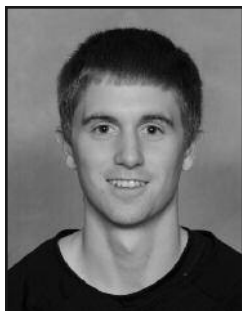

Now entering his fifth season as head baseball coach at Arkansas State, Tommy Raffo has revived the Red Wolves baseball program. In 2012 he led ASU to a 34-23 record and a 19-9 record in Sun Belt Conference play. A-State finished second overall in the SBC and the 34 victories were the most for any team in the Sun Belt Conference and the most in head coach Tommy Raffo's four seasons. ASU's 34 victories are also the most since winning 35 games in 1997 and the fourth-most in school history.

ASU advanced to the championship game of the SBC Tournament for the first time since 1996. Raffo was named the SBC Coach of the Year, while senior pitcher Jacob Lee earned SBC Pitcher of the Year honors. Closer John Koch and shortstop Dustin Jones were also All-SBC second selections.

Michael Faulkner, Jacob Lee and Brandon Farley were all chosen in the MLB Draft in the summer of 2012, giving ASU 10 players in the professional ranks, all of whom were coached by Raffo.

Under Raffo's direction, A-State ended the 2011 season with an overall winning record (30-28) for the first time since 2005

and finished above .500 in Sun Belt Conference play (16-14) for the first time since 1998. ASU not only made its first appearance in the Sun Belt Conference Tournament since 2006, but was one victory away from playing in the tournament's championship game. The Red Wolves advanced to the semifinals, enjoying their best run in the tournament since 1996.

In 2010, the Red Wolves finished with second-highest team batting average in school history (.312) and recorded the most hits (647) and third most RBIs (345) in school history.

Raffo led the Red Wolves to a 23-30 record in 2009, and although Arkansas State missed the Sun Belt Conference tournament by one-half game, the team showed a great deal of improvement over the previous season. The Red Wolves won 12 Sun Belt Conference games in Raffo's first season, up from just eight the year before, and ASU's overall record showed an improvement of three wins over the 2008 season. Arkansas State earned conference victories over Louisiana-Lafayette, Louisiana-Monroe, South Alabama and UALR.

The Red Wolves raised their team batting average an impressive 36 points over the previous season, finishing the year with a team average of .296. Five players hit .300 or better, compared to just one in the previous season, with one, sophomore Murray Watts earning All-Conference honors at the conclusion of the season. The Red Wolves were also much more aggressive on the bases in Raffo's first season, stealing 42 bases to almost double the figure from the previous year.

All-Conference selection Chase Ware helped keep the Red Wolves strong on the mound in 2009, and Ware signed with the Cincinnati Reds organization at the conclusion of the season. As a team, the Red Wolves hit .296, which ranked third all-time

in ASU history. Arkansas State belted out 557 hits during the year which was the fifth-most ever for an ASU team. The Red Wolves' 242 walks was the sixth-most in team history, and ASU's 337 runs and 291 RBIs were both the seventh-most ever at ASU. A-State's 786 total bases ranked as the ninth-most in school history.

Raffo became the fifth head coach in the history of the ASU baseball program after serving as an assistant coach at Mississippi State for the past 15 years. During his time at Mississippi State, he served as the hitting and outfield coach for a Bulldog program that made three trips to the College World Series. Under his direction, the Bulldogs posted a team batting average of .300 or better in eight of the past 11 seasons.

During his 15 seasons at Mississippi State, Raffo served as the recruiting coordinator for the Bulldog baseball program, landing 10 straight recruiting classes ranked in the top 33 nationally by Collegiate Baseball. He coached seven All-America players and four Academic All-Americans. He was named as the 2007 Southeastern Conference Fellowship of Christian Athletes Coach of the Year, and during his time at MSU, 49 Bulldogs were chosen in the Major League Baseball Draft.

Raffo's outstanding recruiting at MSU paid dividends for the program as he helped the Bulldogs reach the SEC Tournament 12 times, with two championships to their credit. Mississippi State also made 11 appearances in the NCAA Tournament during Raffo's time with the program, winning five regional titles. The Bulldogs made three appearances in the NCAA Super Regionals and advanced to the College World Series in 1997, 1998 and 2007. Raffo coached one Johnny Bench Award winner, given annually to the top college catcher in the country, and helped seven hitters finish the season in the SEC's top five batting averages.

As a player, Raffo was co-captain of the 1990 Mississippi State team that advanced to the College World Series. He was a two-time Academic All-American and a three-time Academic All-SEC selection. He was named first-team All-SEC in 1989 and 1990, and in 1990 earned second-team All-America honors from both the American Baseball Coaches Association and Baseball America.

After earning his Bachelor's of Business Administration Degree from Mississippi State in 1990, he was chosen by the Miami Miracle with the first pick of the eighth round in the 1990 MLB Draft. While playing in the Reds organization, he was the MVP of the 1991 South Atlantic League All-Star Game, and was Co-Captain of the 1992 Midwest League Champion Cedar Rapid Reds.

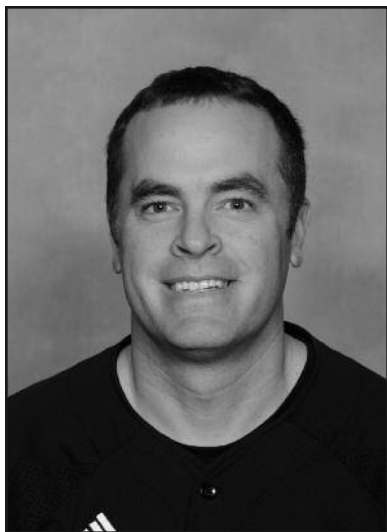
A native of Castalia, Iowa, Everman brings 10 years of collegiate coaching experience to the ASU staff, including one year at Arkansas State, where he served as a volunteer assistant during the 2009 season. Everman will work primarily with infielders and assist with hitting at ASU.

Most recently, he was an assistant at Garden City Community College during the 2012 season, while also serving as an associate scout for the Cleveland Indians during the past year. After leaving Arkansas State following the 2009 season, he was an assistant coach at Kansas State during the 2010 season, and an assistant at Northern Colorado in 2011.

While an assistant at Kansas State, he helped guide the Wildcats to a berth in the 2010 NCAA Tournament, and has coached in the post-season in five other seasons as well. He also spent time on the coaching staffs at Virginia Tech, Loras (Iowa) College

and Ferrum (Va.) College. He also brings a wealth of NCAA-sanctioned summer league experience to ASU, managing the Covington (Va.) Lumberjacks for two seasons, winning the league championship in 2005.

Everman graduated with a degree in Physical Education from Loras College in Dubuque, Iowa, where he played baseball and was an All-Iowa Intercollegiate Athletic Conference Academic selection on two occasions. He earned his Masters of Science in Physical Education from Virginia Tech in 2005.



Tighe Dickinson is in his third year as an assistant coach with the Red Wolves program and will serve as the pitching coach for A-State this season.

Dickinson brings over 10 years of coaching experience to the Red Wolves including four years at the Division I level working as a pitching coach at the University of Washington. During his career, Dickinson has worked with numerous Major League Baseball prospects including 2010 MLB All-Stars Tim Lincecum, John Lester and Evan Meek.

Dickinson coached former A-State pitcher Jacob Lee to one of the most successful seasons in school history in 2012. Lee is ASU's all-time leader in career strikeouts with 280. He broke ASU's previous record of 251 which was set by Rusty Bourg from 1957-70. Lee also finished with 24 victories, one shy of the all-time school record. He was drafted by the Cleveland Indians in the ninth round of the 2012 MLB draft.

The 2012 pitching staff recorded 391 strikeouts, the third most in school history, and allowed just 254 earned runs on the year. Opponents hit just .270 against the Red Wolves and Dickinson helped the pitching staff win 34 games, the fourth most in school history.

While at A-State, Dickinson has had

three players drafted including Jacob Lee (Cleveland Indians-2012), Brandon Farley (San Francisco Giants-2012) and Andy Ferguson (Kansas City Royals-2011). In all, Dickinson has coached 16 pitchers who have been drafted by Major League Baseball teams.

In 2010 Dickinson helped the A-State pitching staff record the sixth most strikeouts in school history with 382.

Prior to his time at ASU, Dickinson coached 13 drafted pitchers including a first and second round pick while at Washington. Dickinson served as an assistant coach at Montesano High School in 2009-10 where he led the squad to a 21-4 first-place league finish and an appearance in the state playoffs.

Prior to his appointment at Washington, Dickinson served as head coach at Edmonds Community College where he led the squad to a third-place finish in the NWAACC Tournament and a 75-16 record as head coach, including a 40-8 conference mark.

Dickinson also served as head coach at Skyline High School in Issaquah in 2003, guiding the team to a 14-7 overall mark and a 13-5 conference record. He also served as pitching coach at Edmonds CC in 2000 and 2001.

Aside from his work at Edmonds and Skyline, Dickinson has also served as pitching coach at Taylor Baseball, a top youth summer program, since 2001. Taylor took third place in the national AAU tournament in 2001 and in 2002, finished second at the USA Baseball Federation national tournament. During the 2005 summer season, Taylor finished second at the USABF World Series and completed the season with a 59-7-1 record.

A native of Aberdeen, Wash., Dickinson graduated from Montesano High in 1994. After one year at Green River CC, he played three seasons of college baseball as a pitcher at Alabama-Birmingham, lettering in 1996, 1997 and 1998. In 1999, he earned a bachelor's degree in secondary education from UAB.



Arkansas State head baseball coach Tommy Raffo announced Thursday, Dec. 6 the addition of Noah Sanders as a volunteer assistant coach to the Red Wolves coaching staff for the upcoming season.

Sanders comes to ASU after serving as an assistant coach at Crowder College this past Fall where he was the team's hitting instructor, worked with the catchers and assisted in recruiting.

Before Crowder, Sanders had a two-year stint as an assistant coach at Arkansas-Monticello and helped six players reach all-conference status during his time with the team.

As a coach at UAM, Sanders worked with catchers, outfielders and served as an assistant hitting coach. He also assisted in recruiting, player placement for summer leagues and camp coordination.

As a player, Sanders spent two years at Itawamba Community College before transferring to the University of West Alabama for two seasons. He spent the final year of his playing career at Arkansas-Monticello.

Sanders earned a bachelor's degree in general studies from Arkansas-Monticello.

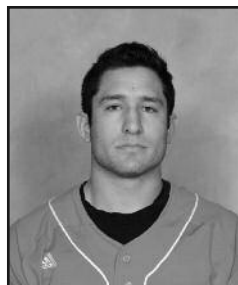

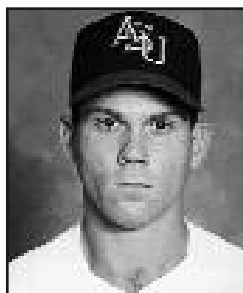

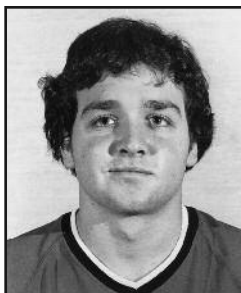

The Legacy Walk, created to recognize friends of ASU Baseball for their contributions to the program, is located underneath the seating area at Tomlinson Stadium and features plaques honoring individuals or groups who have made a significant impact on ASU baseball. Former ASU Head Baseball Coach J.A. "Ike" Tomlinson, along with former baseball players Jim Callaway and William Troy Martin were honored at last year's dedication.

Named for ASU pioneer J.A. 'Ike' Tomlinson, and Major League Baseball Hall of Famer George Kell, Tomlinson Stadium & Kell Field was opened in 1993. The complex includes Tomlinson Stadium & Kell Field as well as the baseball offices and indoor workout facilities for Arkansas State baseball.

"Coach Ike" as Tomlinson was known to his former players and ASU fans, was primarily responsible for the rebirth of ASU Athletics following the end of World War II. He coached numerous programs, including baseball, and served as the school's athletic director. He was a part of ASU Athletics for almost six decades, and the school honored him in 1994 by placing his name on the new baseball facility.

Kell, a native of Swifton (Ark.), was elected to the MLB Hall of Fame in 1983, and has been an active supporter of Arkansas State baseball for many years. Kell edged out Ted Williams for the 1949 MLB batting title, going 2-for-3 on the final day of the season, while Williams was hitless in two at-bats. Kell's final mark on the season was .3429, while Williams posted a .3427 average. He was a 10-time American League All-Star who hit over .300 in eight consecutive seasons. Kell twice led the American League in hits and in doubles, and in the late 1940's and early 1950's, he was regarded as the best third baseman in the American League.

ASU has continued making improvements to the facility, including work in the dugout and indoor

facility as well as increasing the school's colors of Scarlet and Black around the complex. Also, a batter's eye was added as well as retractable indoor and all-weather batting cages. Prior to the 2007 season, the Barton's Baseball Deck picnic area was added, and new for the 2008 season are over 200 field-level seats. Along with the new seating, which includes 26 handicap-accessible seating areas, are new party boxes which are available for groups and cor-

porate events, new backstop netting, and new, precision-leveled infield turf.

The Legacy Walk was also created prior to the 2008 season to recognize friends of ASU Baseball for their contributions to the program.

Lights were installed at the stadium, and Arkansas State hosted its first night baseball games in the 1996 season, thanks in part to the donations and support of many Indian baseball fans.

Tomlinson Stadium-Kell Field has a natural grass surface, and the outfield dimensions are 335 feet down the left and right field lines, 370 to the power alleys and 400 to straightaway centerfield. The outfield wall is eight feet high.

Arkansas State University's athletic programs compete in top-of-the line facilities.

ASU Stadium, which opened in 1974, has evolved into a beautiful stadium which seats 30,406 fans. That includes a cluster of exclusive suites in the south end zone atop the football office complex. A million dollar video/scoreboard is the focal point in the stadium.

Coaches and student-athletes moved into a new \$2.7 million track and field complex in spring 2004. It contains an eight-lane 400-meter track and can be set up for two NCAA venues.

Three local country clubs graciously allow ASU's men's and women's golf programs to utilize their facilities for practice and play.

J.A. "Ike" Tomlinson Stadium-Kell Field serves as home to Red Wolves baseball. Built in 1993, the stadium received complete lighting in 1996 and, most recently, 206 field level seats were added for the 2008 season.

ASU's newest women's program, bowling, competes in the Paragould Bowling Center, a newly-renovated, state-of-the-art facility.

ARKANSAS STATE UNIVERSITY



Those who have not visited the campus of Arkansas State University in the last five or 10 years would be shocked at the school's appearance today. So much on campus is tied to athletics. ASU Stadium is the gathering site for Saturdays and excitement surrounding each game can be felt for miles. The sights, the smells, the sounds of football.

There is so much construction and new projects on campus. The school looks . . . and is . . . a modern educational institution that has kept up with technology and student needs as much, if not more, than most schools in the nation. A student center addition anchors the campus, and a new student recreation and wellness center was completed last fall.

New campus housing has recently been completed, including a "Collegiate Park" apartment complex, coastal-type soft-colored housing throughout campus, and a new dorm. There is a new Alumni Center and construction of a new overpass connecting the campus to local businesses is about to become a reality. It's a new-look campus that is growing and improving each day.

Arkansas State University is an extremely valuable part of Northeast Arkansas and surrounding areas.



Arkansas State University was established April 1, 1909, as a "public school of agriculture" by Act 100 of the Arkansas General Assembly. It was located at Jonesboro because citizens of the city bid \$40,000 to the state and pledged 200 acres of land as a site.

After a century of growth, ASU-Jonesboro now has an annual budget of some \$122.6 million, owns more than 3,000 acres of land in five different counties, has a physical plant valued at almost \$200 million, and has an alumni roll exceeding 53,000.

ASU's rapid development over the years has been typical of other major universities in an emerging modern South. From an agricultural high school in 1909, to a junior college in 1918, to a four-year degree-granting institution in 1930, to a university in 1967, ASU has become regionally respected and nationally recognized for its qualities of teaching, research and service.

The ASU system includes campuses at Beebe (White County), Mountain Home (Baxter County), and Newport (Jackson County) where associate degree programs are offered, and at Marked Tree, Searcy and Heber Springs. An instructional site is located at Paragould.

The Jonesboro campus, which occupies 942 acres amid the gentle slopes of Crowley's Ridge in east Jonesboro, is located between the vast and fertile Mississippi River Valley and the cultural and scenic richness of the Ozark Mountains.

More than 10,000 students annually work toward degrees in 141 areas of specialization at the graduate and undergraduate levels. Fifteen undergraduate degrees are offered through the Colleges of Agriculture, Business, Communications, Education, Engineering, Fine Arts, Humanities and Social Sciences, Nursing and Health Professions, Sciences and Mathematics, and the University College. The Honors College was instituted July 1, 2004, evolving from the Honors Program.

INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS COMMITTEE

The Intercollegiate Athletics Committee was formed in the spring of 1997.

The Intercollegiate Athletics Committee reviews and makes recommendations on issues involving the welfare of student-athletes, the role of athletics in campus life, and the athletics program's compliance with the university, conference, and NCAA regulations; serves as a search advisory committee for key athletics program personnel; reviews the role of existing and potential sports programs; and reviews the athletics budget. The committee reports to the Chancellor.

Membership consists of four students appointed annually by the Student Government Association (one should be a student-athlete); four faculty appointed by the Faculty Senate (staggered two-year terms); one Faculty Athletic Representative appointed by the Chancellor (two-year term); one executive staff member appointed by the Chancellor (two-year term); the Dean of University College; two staff members appointed by the Staff Senate (staggered two-year terms); Student Government Association and Student Activities Board presidents; and representatives from the following external organizations: Alumni Association, Red Wolf Club, Letterman's Club, and the Jonesboro Regional Chamber of Commerce ASU Committee. The Director of Intercollegiate Athletics and the Senior Woman Athletic Administrator serve as ex-officio, nonvoting members. The chancellor appoints a chair at the beginning of each academic year.



Dr. Tim Hudson took office as the second chancellor of Arkansas State University in Jonesboro on May 1, 2012. He was appointed by Dr. Charles W. Welch, president of the Arkansas State University System, following a national search process.

Most recently Dr. Hudson was vice chancellor of the Texas Tech University System, after serving as special assistant to the chancellor for International Programs and Initiatives at the University of Houston System. From 2004 until 2010 he was president of the University of Houston–Victoria, following a two-decade career as a professor of economic development, program director, founding dean of the College of International and Continuing Education, and provost at the University of Southern Mississippi. Earlier in his career he was an analyst for the Bureau of Intelligence and Research in the U.S. Department of State.

At Arkansas State University he leads the campus executive team as the institution strives for progressive excellence in academics, research, fiscal management and student life.

Hudson earned a Bachelor of Arts degree in history and Latin American studies and a Master of Arts in geography from the University of Southern Mississippi. His PhD in geography is from Clark University in Worcester, Mass. He has written numerous

scholarly works for national and international publications; a recent co-authored book focuses on multinational corporation subsidiaries in China (Chandos, Cambridge).

During his tenure as president of the University of Houston–Victoria, the campus experienced tremendous growth and development including: doubling enrollment and the number of fulltime faculty; exceeding external fundraising goals for five consecutive years; founding a new school of nursing and health professions, which earned full national accreditation on its initial petition; achieving AACSB International accreditation; and ranking first in Texas on the student satisfaction portion of the 2010 National Survey of Student Engagement.

Hudson is the recipient of two Fulbright Fellowships (Germany and Mexico), and an ITT International Fellowship to study in Colombia, South America. He also has developed and led more than 30 programs for U.S. students to study abroad and was awarded an honorary doctorate by London Guildhall University for his contributions to global literacy.

Hudson is married to Dr. Deidra “Dee Dee” Ransburgh Hudson, who holds a Master of Science in speech pathology from the University of Tennessee and a PhD degree in educational leadership from the University of Southern Mississippi. The Hudsons and their children, Gianna Grace, 14, and twins Daisy and Nathaniel, 10, will live in the ASU chancellor’s residence on Nettleton Avenue in Jonesboro.



Arkansas State University Chancellor Dr. Tim Hudson announced on Wednesday, Sept. 19, 2012 that Terry Mohajir, a 20-year veteran leader in collegiate athletics with a diverse background as an administrator, coach, student-athlete and city government participant, has been named A-State's 11th Director of Athletics.

An Arkansas State University alumnus, Mohajir's (pronounced MO-HA-JUR) career path went through three other NCAA Division I institutions, including the University of Missouri-Kansas City, Florida Atlantic and Kansas, before leading him back to his alma mater.

Mohajir's wealth of experience, history of success working with a university in ASU's current conference and his noted accomplishments at a BCS automatic qualifying school made him a clear choice to take over the reins at Arkansas State.

He has gained national respect in collegiate athletics while working with some of the finest administrators and coaches in the country, such as former FAU, Louisville, Miami and Oklahoma head football coach Howard Schnellenberger.

The Overland Park, Kansas native has been involved with major fundraising campaigns at multiple universities, while also overseeing corporate sales, marketing promotions and ticket sales. He most recently served the last 13 months as Kansas' Senior Associate Director of Athletics and Chief Marketing Officer. Prior to his time with the Jayhawks, he spent a seven-year stint as Florida Atlantic's Senior Associate Director of Athletics for External Relations from 2004-11 after working at UMKC from 1997-2004 as its Assistant Director of Athletics for External Relations.

Mohajir worked at Kansas in a variety of capacities during two different stints, but his latest stop in Lawrence saw him assume responsibility for the Williams Education Fund that totaled over \$22 million in revenue for the fiscal year 2012. He supervised the athletics department's areas that

generated over \$40 million in revenue. In addition, Mohajir oversaw Kansas' multimedia rights partnership for IMG. His most recent role was heavily focused on the market strategies for the proposed football stadium renovations.

He went to Kansas from his position at Florida Atlantic, where he oversaw development, marketing, ticket sales, corporate sales and the media relations department. Foremost among his responsibilities was a fundraising campaign for a \$70 million on-campus football stadium. His astute project management helped the Owls' football program reach the 2007 New Orleans Bowl in just its fourth year as an FBS program, an NCAA record for the fastest start-up program to go to a bowl game. During his tenure, FAU's athletics department enhanced its major gift program 800 percent, Owl Club giving increased 400 percent and special-events revenue increased 150 percent.

Mohajir's original connection to KU dated back to the early 1990's, when he was a graduate assistant and later an assistant offensive line and game-day special team's football coach for the Jayhawks (1993-96). He left Kansas in 1997 but didn't go far, staying in the Kansas City area to take over his administrative position with the newly-created Division I UMKC Athletics program. There he supervised marketing and promotions, sports information, fundraising, radio and TV contracts, corporate sales, tickets, event operations, sports medicine, strength and conditioning and men's soccer.

Under his leadership, the Kangaroos saw dramatic increases in endowment, sponsorships, ticket revenue and its donor base. One of his more visible accomplishments at UMKC was the fundraising and construction efforts for a new training room and strength and conditioning center.

During his time as an assistant coach at Kansas, Mohajir was on the staff that beat UCLA in the 1995 Aloha Bowl and had a final ranking of No. 9 in the AP poll. He was also a football ticket sales and promotions account executive for Kansas Athletics and earned a master's degree in sports management at KU in 1997.

Mohajir graduated from Arkansas State University with a major in sports management and a minor in marketing in 1993. He was a starter on ASU's football team.

Mohajir is married to the former Julie Hammond and they have two daughters, Maria (11) and Molly (9), and son, Marco (4).
