ON TAP: With its non-conference schedule in its rear-view mirror, Arkansas State is set to begin a four-game stretch of Sun Belt Conference games to close out its regular season. Still right in the middle of the hunt for the Sun Belt Conference title, the Red Wolves will begin the critical four-game stretch Saturday when it plays Florida International in its third consecutive road game. Every Arkansas State game can be heard live on 107.9 FM in the Jonesboro area and the live radio broadcast can be accessed through the Arkansas State athletic Web site (astateredwolves.com).

THE PRINCIPALS: Currently in third place in the Sun Belt Conference standings with a 2-1 league record, Arkansas State can put all its focus on conference play for its four remaining games of the regular season. ASU dropped its last two games, but one was to then-ranked No. 2 Alabama and the other a narrow 28-23 road setback at Sun Belt leader Louisiana-Lafayette. While the Red Wolves have dropped their last two games, they have not lost three games in a row since 2006 and can match their best start ever (2005 and 2006) in Sun Belt Conference action with a victory over Florida International.

The Golden Panthers have also lost their last two games as well, and now stand 2-2 in league play after winning their first two Sun Belt Conference games. FIU is in fourth place in the Sun Belt race, just half a game behind the Red Wolves in the standings. The Golden Panthers most recently dropped a 49-20 decision at Louisiana-Lafayette.

HEAD COACH STEVE ROBERTS:

Arkansas State head coach **Steve Roberts** is in his seventh year at Arkansas State after leading the Red Wolves to the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Championship and their most single-season wins over NCAA FBS opponents in 2006. During his first six seasons as the Red Wolves' head coach, he guided ASU to 31 wins for its most over a six-year span at the school since 1986-1991. Roberts was named the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year. Under Roberts, the Red Wolves have had 53 All-Sun Belt Conference selections, an Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year, SBC Offensive Player of the Year, SBC Defensive Player of the Year and SBC Newcomer of the Year.

LADDER: In his first six-plus seasons as the Red Wolves head coach, **Steve Roberts** already has the fifth most victories among ASU's 26 all-time head coaches with 35 wins. Larry Lacewell (1979-89) holds the record for victories with 69 and is followed by Bennie Ellender (1963-70) with 52 wins, Bill Davidson (1971-78) with 51 and Forrest England (1946-53) with 49.

DEBUT OF THE RED WOLVES: The Arkansas State football team is competing in its first season as the Red Wolves after changing its nickname and mascot from Indians at the conclusion of the 2007-08 athletic seasons. More information on the Red Wolves mascot and logos, as well as the change in names can be found on page 171 of the 2008 ASU Football Media Guide.

THE ARKANSAS STATE - FLORIDA INTERNATIONAL SERIES: Arkansas State defeated Florida International each of the last three seasons, including a 66-24 victory in 2005 in Jonesboro that was the first game ever between the two schools. ASU came back to pick up a 31-6 victory over the Golden Panthers in Miami in 2006 and picked up a 27-24 home win last year.

ARKANSAS STATE vs. SUN BELT CONFERENCE: Arkansas State is 54-52-1 all-time against current members of the Sun Belt Conference. Since the league's inaugural football season in 2001, the Red Wolves are 25-25 against all opponents that have been a member of the league. Against current members of the conference, ASU is 20-21 since 2001. The Red Wolves hold their most all-time victories against Louisiana-Lafayette with 17, while its most victories against a Sun Belt opponent since 2001 is Louisiana-Monroe with five. The Red Wolves have defeated every team in the Sun Belt Conference since the football league was formed in 2001.

ARAUCO NAMED LOU GROZA SEMIFINALIST: Josh Arauco has been named as one of 20 semifinalists for the 2008 Lou Groza Collegiate Placekicker Award presented by the FedEx Orange Bowl. Arauco leads the nation in scoring among kickers and is second for field goals made this season. He has been named Sun Belt Conference Special Teams Player of the Week three times. He is a perfect 15-of-15 on field goal attempts this year, is the ASU career field goal

leader with 42 and is second all-time in the Sun Belt Conference.

SPREADING THE WEALTH: Junior quarterback Corey Leonard has completed at least one pass to 10 different players this season. Six of those 10 players have double figure receptions and no more than 17 percent of quarterback Corey Leonard's completions this season have gone to any one player.

REACHING THE END ZONE: Arkansas State has 14 players that have scored a touchdown this season, which ties the fourth most in the nation. Just six teams have more players with a touchdown. Miami leads the nation with 17 players. Senior tight end **David Johnson** and junior running back **Reggie Arnold** lead ASU with five touchdowns each.

USING THE CLOCK: Arkansas State is ranked 32nd in the nation in time of possession and has used more clock than six of its eight opponents this season. The Red Wolves are 4-2 in those games

and is averaging 31:23 in time of possession. While ASU finished 63rd in the nation in time of possession last season, it was ranked fourth in 2006 with an average 33:03.

TAKING CARE OF BUSINESS:

Arkansas State has taken care of business in the red zone this season, raking first in the Sun Belt Conference and third in the nation. The Red Wolves have scored 93.5 percent of the time they have entered the red zone this season, which includes 17 touchdowns and 12 field goals in 31 trips.

ON THE NATIONAL SCENE:

Two ASU players lead the nation in a statistical category. Junior kicker **Josh Arauco** is first in scoring among all kicker (10.14 ppg) and junior defensive end **Alex Carrington** is first in tackles for loss (1.88 per game). Arauco is also second in the nation in field goals made (2.14 per game) and Carrington fourth in sacks (1.19 per game).

PICK IT OFF:

Dominique Williams posted his second interception of the season and seventh of his career against Alabama last game. ASU now has 11 interceptions on the season to rank tied for 26th in the nation in the stat. The Red Wolves have posted at least one interception in seven of their eight games this season and 13 of their last 14 dating back to last year.

GETTING TO THE QUARTERBACK:

ASU recorded 23 sacks over its first eight games, including a season-high five against Louisiana-Lafayette. While ASU posted a season-high three sacks last season, it has already had four or more sacks in three games this season. ASU finished with 13 sacks for all of last season. ASU is ranked No. 1 in the Sun Belt and tied for 11th in the nation in sacks.

WINNING THE TURNOVER BATTLE:

ASU is currently sixth in the nation in turnover margin, forcing 19 opponent turnovers while giving up just nine of its own. ASU has recorded multiple turnovers in a game five times this season. The Red Wolves are also 4-0 this season when winning the turnover battle.

ASU TWICE SWEEPS WEEKLY

SBC AWARDS: Arkansas State has swept the weekly Sun Belt Conference Player of the Week awards twice this season. ASU was awarded the offensive, defensive and special teams awards fol-

lowing their victories over Texas A&M and Middle Tennessee. Junior quarterback **Corey Leonard** has been named the league's offensive player of the week twice this season and six times for his career. **Daylan Walker** and **Ben Owens** have been named the SBC Defensive Player of the Week this season, while **Josh Arauco** and **Kevin Jones** have both been named the league's special teams player of the week. Arauco has been named the special teams player of the week three times.

ASU swept all three awards for the first time in school history on Sept. 1.

A Sun Belt team has swept the awards three time this season, but just the 12 times in Sun Belt Conference history. ASU also became just the second school in league history to sweep the awards two different weeks during the same season.

MID-SEASON ALL-CONFERENCE

RECOGNITION: Arkansas State had a league-high 13 players, including six first-team selections, named to Phil Steele's Mid-Season All-Sun Belt Conference Team, announced Tuesday by the publication.

First Team: **Corey Leonard** (Jr., QB), **Derek Lawson** (RS Fr., RB), **Matt Mandich** (Sr., OL), **Bryan Hall** (So., DL), **Josh Arauco** (Jr., K).

A LARGE CROWD: The crowd of 92,138 for Red Wolves game at Alabama last week was the second largest ever to watch an Arkansas State game, just ahead of the 91,611 for its 2004 game at LSU and behind only the 102,368 for its 2007 game at Tennessee. The Red Wolves have now played in front of three of the largest five crowds to ever watch an ASU game over the last two seasons (Alabama in 2008, Tennessee and Texas in 2007).

THE TOP 25: Alabama was the eighth ASU opponent ranked among the nation's top 25 teams at the time of a game with the Red Wolves under head coach Steve Roberts. Not only that, Alabama's No. 2 ranking stands as the highest for an ASU opponent at the time of a game with a Roberts' coached team. OUT OF THE GATES: Arkansas State's 3-1 start through its four games this season was not only its best ever as an NCAA FBS member, but also its best at any level since it was 3-0-1 in 1986. The Red Wolves current 4-4 record is its best through seven games since it was 5-3 in 2006.

NICE CROWDS: ASU's first four home crowds of the 2008 season all rank among the top 10 in ASU Stadium history. Not only that, it is the first time in ASU history that the football team played four home games each in front of 20,000 or more spectators during the same season. The combined crowds for ASU's first three games this season(94,680) is the largest for any four games played at ASU Stadium in the same season. ASU's current average home attendance of 23,670 is nearly 6,000 spectators higher than its school record for average home attendance during a single season. PUTTING POINTS ON THE BOARD: ASU, ranked third in the Sun Belt Conference and 42nd in the nation in scoring offense, has scored at least 30 points in a game three times this season, including a season-high 37 points against ULM. The Red Wolves have posted at least 30 points in three games this season. ASU has now scored 30 or more points in at least three games during four of seven seasons under head coach Steve Roberts. Under Roberts, ASU is 16-3 when scoring at least 30 points in a game.

ARAUCO BREAKS SCHOOL RECORD: Junior kicker **Josh Arauco** has made 15 field goals this season to push his career total to a school-record 42. Arauco passed Jeff Caldwell for the record. Caldwell hit 40 field goals from 1993-96. Arauco's 42 field goals also ties the second most in Sun Belt Conference history and leave him eight shy of tying the league record of 50 that is held by Troy's Greg Whibbs.

THOMPSON BREAKS SCHOOL RECORD: **Brandon Thompkins** broke the school record for career kickoff return yards this season, and now has 1,759 for his career. Thompson is also ranked second for career kickoff return yards in the Sun Belt Conference behind only Troy's Leodis McKelvin (2,346 yards from 2004-07).

GLOVER POSTS TOP TACKLE NUMBERS: Sophomore linebacker **Darius Glover's** 14 tackles against Louisiana-Lafayette were not only a personal career high, they were the most by an ASU player since the Red Wolves' 2007 season opener (a span of 19 games). Glover is currently fourth on the team and tied for 33rd in the Sun Belt Conference in tackles with 41.

TAKING ADVANTAGE: ASU took advantage of a big fumble in its game against ULM as **Marcus Brown** picked up the loose ball and rumbled 71 yards for a touchdown. Brown's 71 yard return was the second longest in school history behind only a 76-yard return by Clark Watkins vs. Northern Illinois in 1995.

BUCKLE DOWN: The ASU defense has not given up more than 14 points in three games this season, while the lowest score by an ASU opponent last year was 16 points. The last time ASU held more opponents to 14 or fewer points was 2006 when it did so five times. ASU is ranked first in the Sun Belt Conference in scoring defense, giving up 23.3 points per game.

PROTECTING THE QUARTERBACK: Outside the Memphis and Alabama games, ASU has given up just eight sacks this season over its other six games. In fact, ASU did not give up a sack against Middle Tennessee this season, marking the first time in 39 games that an ASU opponent was held without a single sack. Before the MT game, the last time an ASU opponent did not record a sack was the final game of the 2004 season against North Texas. ASU gave up 38 sacks last season, ranking seventh in the league.

TOUCHDOWN GRAB: Senior tight end **David Johnson** already has five touchdown catches. Those five touchdown grabs not only top Johnson's total touchdown receptions for the last three years combined (4), they are enough to rank tied for the fifth most in school history for a single season. Just four ASU players have ever caught more touchdown passes in a single-season than Johnson already has this year.

LEONARD MILESTONES: **Corey Leonard** has already hit several milestones this season. The junior quarterback is just the third player in school history to pass for over 5,000 yards (5,097), the third player to throw at least 30 touchdowns (35) and the third player to record over 6,000 yards of total offense (6,305). Leonard is already ranked second all-time at ASU for passing touchdowns and third for completions (396), passing yards and total offense.

AUTOMATIC ARAUCO: Junior kicker **Josh Arauco** has made his first 15 field goals this season, breaking the school record for consecutive field goals made. Arauco broke the record against ULM, topping the previous record of 10 straight field goals that he shared with two other players in school history. He has also made his first 25 extra points this season, extending his streak of consecutive makes to 63. His 63 straight successful extra points is the second longest streak in ASU history, behind only Eric Neihouse's 78 straight makes from 2003-05.

DISRUPTING THE BACKFIELD: **Alex Carrington** already has a Sun Belt Conference-high 15.0 tackles for loss, which more than doubles his previous career best for a single season (5 in 2007). Carrington has a league-high 10 sacks as well, which easily tops his total of two for his freshman and sophomore seasons combined. The junior defensive end is ranked first in the nation in tackles for loss and fourth in sacks.

AMONG THE NATION'S ELITE: ASU is currently ranked among the top 25 teams in the nation in four statistical categories: turnover margin (6), sacks (T11), tackles for loss (11) and rushing offense (17). ASU is ranked among the top 50 teams in the nation in 10 statistical categories.

LEADING THE SUN BELT: Arkansas State leads the Sun Belt Conference in nine statistical categories, including turnover margin and scoring defense. ASU is ranked among the top two teams in the league in 13 statistical categories, including total defense and rushing offense.

OFFENSIVE UPRISING: ASU surpassed 400 yards of total offense in four of its first eight games, while only reaching the 400-yard mark in three games for all of last season. ASU is ranked third in the Sun Belt Conference and 35th in the nation in total offense after the season's first 10 weeks of play.

CBSSports.com Ranks ASU's Lawson Among Nation's Top Freshmen:

Arkansas State redshirt freshman running back Derek Lawson was one of 10 players recognized by CBSSports.com on its Sept. 24 "Freshman Watch" list, which will feature the best freshmen in college football throughout the remainder of the season.

94th SEASON UNDER WAY: Arkansas State kicked off its 94th season of football with its game against Texas A&M. ASU holds a 406-433-37 record since the inaugural 1911 season and have played in seven bowl games.

ROBERTS AND ASU STADIUM: Arkansas State head coach **Steve Roberts** has led the Red Wolves to a 25-8 record at ASU Stadium over the last seven years for a .781 winning percentage. Not only that, the Red Wolves are 16-3 at ASU Stadium over the last four seasons.

ROBERTS IN CLOSE GAMES: Seventh-year skipper **Steve Roberts** has seen numerous close games during his tenure with the Red Wolves, holding a 20-11 record in games decided by eight points or less (38 percent of all his games). Roberts' teams have been especially successful recently in games decided by just one score, holding an 18-8 record in its last 26 games that ended under those circumstances. 17 AND UNDER: Arkansas State holds a 16-3 record under head coach **Steve Roberts** when holding its opponents to 17 points or less. The Red Wolves have won 13 of their last 14 games when holding their opponent to 17 or fewer points and has won 26 straight games when holding their opponents to 10 or fewer points.

DOUBLE-DIGIT COMEBACKS: Arkansas State has rallied for a victory in seven games when trailing by double-digits under head coach **Steve Roberts**. Following is a year-by-year list of ASU's double-digit comeback victories under Roberts:

GAINING GROUND: With 2,759 career rushing yards, junior running back **Reggie Arnold** is ranked sixth among the career rushing leaders in ASU history. Arnold has rushed for at least 100 yards in a game 11 times, including the Texas A&M and Texas Southern games, for his career for the fifth (tied) most in school history.

HOMECOMING HISTORY: Arkansas State defeated Middle Tennessee in its 81st Homecoming game this season. ASU, which has now won its last six consecutive Homecoming games, is 54-26-1 all-time in Homecoming contests.

UNBUCKLE THE BELT: ASU improved to 7-1 all-time in Sun Belt Conference openers after defeating Middle Tennessee in its first league game of the season. ASU caught Middle Tennessee in its SBC opener for the first time ever.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD: Arkansas State broke the Sun Belt

Conference and ASU Stadium record for points in a game with 83 against Texas Southern. The 83 points are also the second most in school history, behind only the 101 scored against Arkansas Teacher's College in 1917. Additionally, ASU is the first NCAA FBS team to score 80 or more points in a game since Texas Tech scored 80 against Sam Houston State on Sept. 17, 2005.

OFFENSIVE OUTBURST: ASU piled up 670 yards of total offense against Texas Southern, which ranks as the second highest total in school history and the fourth highest in Sun Belt history. ASU has now posted its top two offensive games in school history under head coach Steve Roberts, also recording a school-record 681 yards of total offense last season against Louisiana-Lafayette.

RECORD BREAKER: Kicker **Josh Arauco** broke the Sun Belt Conference record for points by kicking (17) and extra points made (11) in the Red Wolves 83-10 victory over Texas Southern.

LAWSON BUSTS OUT: **Derek Lawson** became just the 11th player in school history to rush for over 200 yards in a game with his 209-yard performance against Texas Southern. His 209 yards ranks as the eighth most in school history.

TWICE AS NICE: Running backs **Derek Lawson** rushed for 209 yards and **Reggie Arnold** 123 yards against Texas Southern to become the first ASU duo to rush for over 100 yards in the same game since 2005 when Shermar Bracey and Antonio Warren did it against North Texas.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION: Senior linebacker **Ben Owens (Bearden, Ark.)** was named the FWAA/Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week for games of the weekend of Aug. 30 after helping lead the Red Wolves to a season-opening victory over Texas A&M.

Owens, a preseason All-Sun Belt selection, became the first player in ASU history to be named a national defensive player of the week and the first Sun Belt Conference player to receive the recognition since FAU cornerback Tavious Polo last season after the Owls defeated Minnesota on Sept. 20. Owens, already on the Butkus Award Watch List, was added to the 2008 Bronko Nagurski

Trophy Watch List. The Bronko Nagurski Trophy will be presented to the best defensive player in college football on Dec. 7 by the FWAA and the Charlotte Touchdown Club at the Westin Hotel in Charlotte, N.C. Five finalists for the Nagurski Trophy will be announced on Nov. 17.

TURNING IT AROUND ON THE ROAD: Arkansas State turned around its recent fortune in road games, snapping a seven-game skid away from ASU Stadium with its victory over Texas A&M in its season opener. The last time ASU won a season opener on the road was 1989 when it defeated Memphis 17-13. The crowd of 78,691 for the Texas A&M game was the ninth largest to ever watch an Arkansas State game.

TEXAS A&M GAME NOTABLES: ASU won its first ever game over a BCS school since it joined NCAA FBS. The Red Wolves also broke Texas A&M's 20-game winning streak in home openers, handing the Aggies just their fourth loss over their last 50 non-conference home games. ASU picked up its first victory in 15 games against current members of the Big 12 Conference.

GETTING THE START: A combined eight offensive and defensive players made their first career starts for Arkansas State against Texas A&M. **OFFENSE:** Dominic Padrta (OL), Drew Hilton (OL), Brandon Ciaramitaro (OL), Mark Clemons (OL and Jahbari McLennan (WR). **DEFENSE:** Bryan Hall (DL), Darius Glover (LB) and M.D. Jennings (S).

SENIOR RECOGNITION: Every year at ASU's Football Media Day, head coach **Steve Roberts** gives his seniors a chance to address those in attendance at the press conference. PRESEASON ALL-SBC ACCOLADES: Five Arkansas State football players have been tabbed Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference. Junior running back **Reggie Arnold (Little Rock, Ark.),** senior tight end **David Johnson (Pine Bluff, Ark.)** and senior offensive lineman **Matt Mandich (Hattiesburg, Miss.)** all represented ASU on the offensive team, while junior defensive end **Alex Carrington (Tupelo, Miss.)** and senior linebacker **Ben Owens (Bearden, Ark.)** were named to the defensive squad. . . ASU's five players on the 28-man squad tied Troy for the second most among all the schools. Florida Atlantic had a league-high eight players named to the team. Louisiana-Lafayette and Louisiana-Monroe each had three players on the team, while North Texas and Middle Tennessee both had two players.

PRESEASON PREDICTIONS: The Red Wolves are predicted to finish fourth in the conference according to the league's 2008 preseason coaches poll, announced Monday, July 21 at the Sun Belt's annual Football Media Days in New Orleans. . . ASU received 39 points, just seven fewer than third-place Monroe, in the poll. Florida Atlantic received six of the eight first-place votes and a league-high 62 points, while Troy was picked to finish second with 51 points and one first-place vote. Louisiana-Monroe picked up the final first-place vote and finished with 46 points in the voting. Middle Tennessee was picked fifth with 32 points, Louisiana-Lafayette sixth with 26 points, North Texas seventh with 19 points and Florida International eighth with 13 points.

TELEVISION TIME: Three Arkansas State games will be televised by ESPN Plus and another game televised by CSS in 2008. The Red Wolves' home games against Louisiana-Monroe on Oct. 11 (6:00 p.m.) and Florida Atlantic on Nov. 22 (2:00 p.m.) and road game at Troy on Dec. 6 (6:00 p.m.) will all be televised by ESPN Plus, while their game at Alabama on Nov. 1 will be carried by CSS. . . ASU's four regular-season televised games for 2008 ties the second most in school history, matching the 2005 season. The Red Wolves' had a school-record six tele-

vised games during the 2007 campaign.

NEW FLAGSHIP RADIO STATION ANNOUNCED: The Arkansas State University Athletic Department, along with East Arkansas Broadcasters, announced July 16 that KFIN 107.9 FM, a 100,000-watt radio station located in Jonesboro, will become the new flagship station and home of Red Wolves' football broadcasts for the 2008 season. KFIN's 100,000-watt signal reaches parts of Tennessee, Missouri and a large portion of Arkansas, giving more ASU football fans the opportunity to follow the Red Wolves during the upcoming season. The full release can be found on astateredwolves.com.

SHRABLE NAMED TO RAY GUY WATCH LIST: Senior punter **Brett Shrable** has been named to the watch list for the 2008 Ray Guy Award, given annually to the nation's top collegiate punter. Shrable, one of 46 players on the watch list, is the second player in ASU history to be named to the Ray Guy Award Watch List. Andy Shatley is the only other ASU player to receive the recognition, making the list in 2000. Shrable was a 2007 Second Team All-Sun Belt Conference selection as a junior and was named 2008 preseason All-Sun Belt Conference by Athlon's and Phil Steele's.

ARNOLD ON DOAK WALKER WATCH LIST: Junior running back Reggie Arnold has been named to the list of candidates for the 2008 Doak Walker Award, announced by the Guaranty Bank SMU Athletic Forum.

Arnold is a candidate for the award, presented annually to the nation's top running back, for the second straight year and joins former ASU running back Jonathan Adams as the only two players in school history to make the watch list during two different seasons. Adams was a candidate for the award in 2000 and 2001.

Arnold is among 43 candidates, including two from the Sun Belt Conference, to be named to the award's 2008 watch list. The Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference selection rushed for over 1,000 yards in each of his first two seasons at ASU. He was named the Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year in 2006 and is a two-time all-conference pick.

OWENS ON BUTKUS WATCH

LIST: Senior linebacker **Ben Owens** has been named to the watch list for the 2008 Butkus Award, given annually to the top linebacker in college football. Owens, a preseason All-Sun Belt Conference selection, was one of 66 players named to the watch list after posting a career-high 96 tackles last season that ranked fifth in the Sun Belt. His 96 tackles were just five fewer than team-leader Koby McKinnon, who was on the 2007 Butkus Award Watch List.

MANDICH WATCH LIST: Senior offensive lineman **Matt Mandich** is not only a preseason First Team All-Sun Belt Conference by a number of college football publications, he is also on a couple of prestigious watch lists. Mandich is on both the Outland Trophy Watch List and Rotary Lombardi Watch List. Not only that, he was named preseason Honorable Mention All-America by *Sporting News*.

FAST TRACK TO DEGREE: **Corey Leonard**, just a junior on the football field, went through ASU's Summer Commencement ceremony this year after earning his bachelor's degree in just three years in Business. Leonard is now enrolled graduate school and will begin working toward his master's degree this fall.

400TH VICTORY: With its victory over Louisiana-Lafayette on Oct. 13 of last year, ASU became the fifth Sun Belt Conference school with 400 all-time wins. ASU is in its 94th season of football and holds an all-time record of 406-433-37 since its inaugural 1911 season. The Red Wolves have played in seven bowl games, including the 2005 New Orleans Bowl.

SIX-YEAR IMPROVEMENT: During seventh-year head coach **Steve Roberts'** first six seasons at Arkansas State the football program saw its win total increase by almost 100 percent over the previous six years. ASU posted 31 wins over Roberts' first six years, 14 more than it recorded the six years prior to Roberts. In fact, ASU's 31 wins over those six years are the most for a six-year span since 1986-91.

TEAM CAPTAINS: ASU's senior class will alternate throughout the year as team captains. The team will vote on permanent captains at the end of the year.

TEAM ACADEMIC AWARD: The Arkansas State football team has won the Sun Belt Conference Team Academic Award four of the past five years, including 2007.

A VISIT FROM THE GOVERNOR: Arkansas Governor Mike Beebe looked on as the Arkansas State Red Wolves went through a two-hour practice at the ASU practice fields during 2008 fall camp. Beebe, who was the guest speaker at the ASU Touchdown Club banquet Tuesday that night, addressed the team following practice, then took time to pose for pictures with ASU players and fans. "Obviously, it was a privilege for us to have the governor of the state of Arkansas here at our practice and to speak to our team," said ASU Head Coach Steve Roberts. "We are very proud of what he has accomplished and continues to accomplish as the governor and as an ASU Alumnus."

AFCA AWARD: Prior to the start of the 2007 season, the American Football Coaches Association announced that the Arkansas State University football team was one of just 34 Division I-A football programs that graduated 70 percent or more of its student-athletes from their freshman classes of 2001-02.

A TIME TO BOND: When Head Coach Steve Roberts came to ASU, he brought a tradition with him which caught on in a hurry with the players. The night before each game, team members and coaches get together for milk and cookies. During this time, each player sits by and visits with at least three other players he has not visited with throughout the week in order to learn more about his teammates.

HEAD COACH STEVE ROBERTS

Not long after leading Arkansas State to the 2005 Sun Belt Conference championship and New Orleans Bowl, head coach Steve Roberts continues to make ASU a dominant force in the Sun Belt Conference and has ASU on track for continued success in the upcoming years.


When the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year took over the program in December 2001, he impressed everyone with his wide-eyed enthusiasm and limitless energy. And, most of all, they believed that Roberts would bring success to the ASU football program. Roberts has been the driving force behind ASU's recent success, leading the football program to its most victories over a six-year span since 1986-91.

Under Roberts' direction, ASU continues to add to the achievements that began upon his arrival. The 2006 and 2007 ASU teams backed up the 2005 Sun Belt championship with non-conference wins over teams such as Army, Memphis and SMU. The 2006 squad knocked off New Orleans Bowl champion Troy and the 2007 team fell to then-ranked No. 4 Texas by just eight points and pushed New Orleans Bowl champion Florida Atlantic to the final minutes.

The 2007 team won the Sun Belt Conference academic award for the fourth time in the last five years and finished with the second most yards of total offense in school history.

Roberts already holds the fifth most wins among ASU's 26 all-time head coaches and has led the Red Wolves to a 25-8 record at ASU Stadium, which included a 5-1 record in 2007.

Roberts was named Arkansas State's 26th head football coach on December 21, 2001. Roberts graduated from Robinson High School in Little Rock. A 1987 graduate of Ouachita Baptist University, where he was an Academic All-American, Roberts received his masters from SAU in 1989. He and his wife Sherri have one daughter – Abby (13).

- The Red Wolves finished in the top 10 turnarounds by a Division I-A school his first season at the helm, going from 2-9 in 2001 to 6-7 in 2002.

GAME 1

August 30, College Station, TX (Kyle Field - 78,691) - Arkansas State 18, Texas A&M 14

COLLEGE STATION, Texas (8/30/08) – The first game of a new era provided what was arguably the biggest victory in the long history of Arkansas State University football.

Playing its first football game as the Red Wolves, Arkansas State left 78,691 Texas A&M fans at Kyle Field stunned, defeating the Aggies 18-14 in the season opener for both teams. Texas A&M had won its last 20 home openers, and the loss was just the fourth defeat for the Aggies in their last 50 non-conference games at home.

Arkansas State got its only touchdown of the night when it needed it the most.

After penetrating the Texas A&M 30-yard line five times and coming away with three field goals and two turnovers, Arkansas State went on top to stay when junior quarterback Corey Leonard connected with senior wide receiver Kevin Jones from 15 yards out, giving the Red Wolves a 15-14 lead with 4:39 to play.

A missed two-point conversion attempt proved inconsequential when a Texas A&M turnover on its next possession led to junior Josh Arauco's fourth field goal of the night. Arauco's kick boosted the ASU lead to 18-14, and Arkansas State forced another turnover on the Aggies' final drive to seal the win.

Junior tailback Reggie Arnold rushed 21 times for 145 yards on the night, Leonard added 86 yards on the ground to go along with 160 passing yards, and Arauco was a perfect 4-for-4 in the game. His four field goals were a career high.

Arkansas State scored on the game's first possession when the Red Wolves drove 60 yards to set up Arauco's first field goal. Arkansas State used a 19-yard completion from junior quarterback Corey Leonard to junior wideout Jahbari McLennan on third-and-six from the ASU 35 to keep the drive alive.

A two-yard keeper by Leonard on fourth-and-one at the Aggie 37 again kept the possession alive, and Leonard passed complete for 15 yards to Jones on the next play to set up Arauco's field goal. Arauco's kick wrapped up the 13-play drive and put the Red Wolves on top 3-0 with 8:45 remaining in the opening quarter.

Texas A&M answered with an 8-play drive that ended when junior tailback Mike Goodson scored from nine yards out to put the Aggies on the board. Senior Richie Bean added the extra point for the 7-3 A&M lead with 6:20 to play in the first period.

The Aggies made it 14-3 with 4:23 remaining in the half when Goodson scored again, this time from seven yards out to wrap up a 12-play, 77-yard drive.

Arkansas State took advantage of an interception by junior defensive back M.D. Jennings midway through the third quarter to cut the Texas A&M advantage to 14-6.

Jennings picked off a pass from A&M quarterback Stephen McGee at the ASU 41 to give the Red Wolves possession of the ball and ASU marched 47 yards on nine plays to set up Arauco's second field goal of the night. Arauco connected from 28 yards out on the kick to cut the deficit to 14-8 with 5:28 remaining in the third.

Junior safety Marcus Brown forced a fumble by Texas A&M wide receiver Howard Morrow on the Aggies' next drive, and the ball was recovered by ASU defensive end Jeremy Gibson to set up the Red Wolf offense at the Aggie 47.

Arkansas State moved 39 yards on the possession, with 32 of those yards coming on a run from Leonard to the Texas A&M 15, and Arauco completed the possession with his third field goal of the night. Arauco's kick was good from 29 yards out, trimming the Texas A&M lead to 14-9 with 14 seconds to go in the third quarter.

Texas A&M went three-and-out on its next possession and Bean missed wide on a 27-yard field goal attempt the next time the Aggies had the ball, setting the stage for ASU's game-winning drive.

Taking over at the ASU 20 with 9:30 remaining, Leonard directed the Red Wolves 80 yards in 10 plays on a drive that consumed 4:51 seconds on the clock. Arnold rushed for 44 yards on the drive and Leonard hooked up with McLennan for 15 yards and a first down at the A&M 21 on fourth-and-13 from the Aggie 36 to keep the possession going.

Senior defensive back Dominique Williams led Arkansas State with nine tackles on the night, junior defensive back Daylan Walker added seven, senior linebacker Ben Owens also had seven to go along with a fumble recovery and the game-clinching interception, and junior defensive back Evan Van Dolah had six stops.

September 6, Jonesboro, AR (ASU Stadium - 21,741) - Arkansas State 83, Texas Southern 10

JONESBORO (9/6/08) – Arkansas State scored early and often in its home debut, pounding Texas Southern 83-10 in front of a crowd of 21,741 at ASU Stadium.

Freshman tailback Derek Lawson rushed for 209 yards and a touchdown in the game, the 8th most rushing yards in ASU history. Junior tailback Reggie Arnold added 123 yards and two touchdowns and junior quarterback Corey Leonard accounted for 229 yards of total offense and threw for four touchdowns as Arkansas State finished with 670 yards of total offense in the game, the second most in school history.

ASU got on the board with less than two minutes gone in the game with a 53-yard pass from Leonard to Johnson. Two minutes later, Leonard connected with junior tight end Trevor Gillott from 39 yards out for the 14-0 ASU lead.

A 25-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown from sophomore linebacker Javon McKinnon, a 33-yard field goal from junior Josh Arauco, and a two-yard pass from Leonard to freshman fullback Jeff Blake wrapped up a 31-0 first quarter for ASU.

Leonard and Johnson hooked up for their second touchdown pass of the night just 29 seconds into the second quarter, and Arnold scored on touchdown runs of two yards and 56 yards before Texas Southern got on the

board with a 34-yard field goal from Robert Hersh to make it 52-3 at the half.

A five-yard touchdown run from Lawson, a 30-yard field goal from Arauco and an eight-yard touchdown run from senior quarterback Travis Hewitt made it 69-3 before the Tigers scored their only touchdown of the night on a 32-yard pass from quarterback Bobby Reid to wide receiver William Osbourne.

Blake added a 15-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter, and freshman linebacker Demario Davis returned a fumble 53-yards for a touchdown to set the final at 83-10 after Arauco's 11th extra point. Arauco was 11-for-11 on extra points to tie the ASU record, and 2-for-2 on field goal tries on the night.

The Red Wolves' 83 points were the second most in school history and the most in the history of ASU Stadium. The 73-point margin of victory was the most under head coach Steve Roberts.

Arkansas State continues a three-game home stand next week when they host Southern Miss in a 6 p.m. game at ASU Stadium.

GAME 3

September 13, Jonesboro, AR (ASU Stadium - 25,938) - Southern Miss 27, Arkansas State 24

JONESBORO (9/13/08) – The Southern Miss Golden Eagles (2-1) held off a furious second-half rally by Arkansas State and came away with a 27-24 victory over the Red Wolves (2-1) at ASU Stadium.

Down 17-3 at the half, ASU came roaring back in the third quarter with 14 straight points to tie the score at 17, only to see Southern Miss answer with 10 straight to open the fourth quarter.

Southern Miss benefitted from an ASU miscue on a field goal attempt early in the fourth quarter to begin building its 10-point cushion. With the Red Wolves lined up for a 31-yard field goal attempt with just over 12 minutes to play that would have given ASU a 20-17 lead, Southern Miss turned the tables when cornerback C.J. Bailey scooped up an ASU fumble on the play and returned it to the Arkansas State 11. Bailey's return set up a 28-yard field goal from Golden Eagle placekicker Justin Estes that gave USM a 20-17 lead with 10:47 remaining.

Southern Miss then put together a 93-yard drive that ended in a 24-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Austin Davis to tailback Damion Fletcher with 5:30 to play that padded the Golden Eagle lead at 27-17.

Refusing to go quietly, Arkansas State moved 83 yards in just over three minutes to pull within 27-24. Junior quarterback Corey Leonard completed three passes for 52 yards on the drive, including a 5-yard touchdown pass to freshman fullback Jeff Blake to complete the drive with 2:14 to play.

Arkansas State's defense held Southern Miss to three-and-out on the Eagles' ensuing possession to give the Red Wolves one final opportunity with 1:44 remaining.

Starting at the ASU 20, Leonard connected with wideout Anthony Robertson for 26 yards on third-and-five to give the Red Wolves a first down at the USM 46 with just over a minute to play, but an interception by

Southern Miss cornerback Eddie Willingham with 59 seconds remaining sealed the victory for USM.

Southern Miss converted 9-of-10 third down opportunities in the first half to build its 17-3 lead at the break. The Eagles opened the game with a 19-play, 68 yard drive that chewed up 10:17 on the game clock and ended with a 23-yard field goal from kicker Justin Estes.

Arkansas State answered with a 55-yard drive that ended in a 41-yard field goal from Josh Arauco that tied the score at 3-3 less than two minutes later, but Southern Miss tacked on a pair of touchdowns to build the 14-point halftime lead.

Tailback Tory Harrison scored on a 1-yard run with 12:09 remaining in the half and tight end Jonathan Massey hauled in a 1-yard pass from Davis to put the Eagles on top 17-3 at the break.

Leonard finished the game with 325 yards of total offense, including 256 yards and a pair of touchdowns through the air. Junior tailback Reggie Arnold added 84 yards on 15 carries and freshman tailback Derek Lawson had 73 yards on seven rushing attempts. Tight end Trevor Gillott had a career-high 79 yards on five receptions.

Sophomore safety M.D. Jennings had 13 tackles to lead the ASU defense.



GAME 4

September 13, Jonesboro, AR (ASU Stadium - 25,938) - Southern Miss 27, Arkansas State 24

JONESBORO (9/20/08) – Arkansas State junior quarterback Corey Leonard rolled up a career-high 366 yards of total offense, leading the Red Wolves to a 31-14 victory over Middle Tennessee State in ASU's Sun Belt Conference opener before a crowd of 24,256 at ASU Stadium.

The Arkansas State defense did its part as well, keeping the Blue Raiders off the scoreboard for the better part of three quarters, intercepting two passes and recording six tackles behind the line of scrimmage for 30 yards of loss.

Arkansas State led 17-0 at the half, extended its lead to 24-0 on the first possession of the second half, and snuffed out any Middle Tennessee momentum gained when the Blue Raiders scored by answering MTSU's first touchdown with the Red Wolves fourth trip to the end zone.

Arkansas State used a 7-play, 57-yard drive to go up 7-0 late in the first quarter, capitalizing on two big completions from Leonard to Norman to set up the score. Leonard and Norman hooked up for 26 yards and a first down at the MTSU 27, then connected for 11 more and another set of downs at the Blue Raider 17. Two plays later, Leonard found Reggie Arnold alone on the right sideline and the junior tailback went 17 yards untouched for the score.

Placekicker Josh Arauco added the extra point to give ASU a 7-0 lead with 3:26 remaining in the opening quarter.

Arauco added three points more with 8:30 remaining in the second quarter when he booted through a 35-yard field goal to cap an 81-yard ASU drive, and the Red Wolves still weren't finished for the half.

Taking possession at their own 33 with 50 seconds remaining in second quarter, Arkansas State found the end zone again just 14 seconds later when Leonard hit senior tight end David Johnson with a 14-yard touchdown strike to stretch the ASU lead to 17-0 with 36 seconds remaining in the half. The play was set up by a 53-yard completion from Leonard to Norman on the first play of the drive.

The Red Wolves carried their momentum over past the break, scoring on the first possession of the second half to stretch the Arkansas State lead to

24-0. ASU moved 74 yards on 11 plays to open the third quarter, completing the drive when Leonard connected with Johnson for their second touchdown of the night, this time from two yards out at the 8:35 mark.

Middle Tennessee got on the board late in the third quarter when Blue Raider tailback Phillip Tanner scored from two yards out to end a nine-play 76-yard drive. Kicker Alan Gendreau added the extra point to cut the Arkansas State lead to 24-7 with 2:19 remaining in the quarter, but ASU answered the score with an 88-yard drive to extend the Red Wolves lead to 31-7.

Starting at the ASU 12, Leonard completed three passes on the drive, added 37 yards on the ground, and freshman tailback Derek Lawson ended the drive with a 14-yard touchdown run. Arauco put through his fourth extra point of the night to make it 31-7 with 12:34 to play.

The Blue Raiders scored again on their next possession, driving 80 yards in seven plays to cut the Red Wolves advantage to 31-14 with just over nine minutes to play, but the Arkansas State defense stopped Middle Tennessee on downs at the ASU 42 on the Blue Raiders next possession, and Arkansas State ran out the clock to seal the win.

In addition to the career night from Leonard and Norman, ASU got 90 yards from senior wide receiver Kevin Jones and 49 yards and a pair of touchdowns from Johnson. Lawson added 57 yards and a touchdown on 10 carries.

Junior cornerback Daylan Walker led the ASU defense with nine tackles and an interception, junior defensive end Alex Carrington added a pair of quarterback sacks and six tackles, and senior cornerback Dominique Williams had four tackles and an interceptions.

GAME 5

September 27, Memphis, TN (Liberty Bowl - 26,376) - Memphis 29, Arkansas State 17

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (9/27/08) – Memphis tailback Curtis Steele rushed for 203 yards and a touchdown to lead the Tigers (2-4) to a 29-17 victory over the Arkansas State Red Wolves (3-2) Saturday afternoon at Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium.

Arkansas State overcame a 13-0 deficit in the first quarter to take a 17-16 lead at the half, but the Tigers used two big runs from Steele in the second half to set up a pair of field goals from Vinny Zaccario, giving Memphis a 22-17 lead. Steele added a two-yard touchdown run late in the game to set the final score.

After chalking up 228 yards in the first 30 minutes, the ASU offense never got going in the final two quarters. The Red Wolves gained just 124 yards in the second half and suffered a pair of turnovers.

Memphis scored on its first two possessions in building the 13-0 lead. The Tigers went 69 yards in nine plays on the game's opening possession to put the first touchdown on the board. Tailback Charlie Jones completed the drive with a 3-yard touchdown run and Zaccario added the extra point for the 7-0 Tiger advantage.

Jones added a 7-yard touchdown run on the Tigers second possession, capping an 8-play, 69-yard drive by the Tigers. Zaccario's extra point was blocked by ASU, leaving the Tigers with a 13-0 advantage.

Arkansas State got on the board early in the second quarter when the Red Wolves put together a 5-play, 56-yard drive that ended when junior quarterback Corey Leonard scrambled in from 23 yards out for the touchdown. Kicker Josh Arauco's extra point cut the Memphis lead to 13-7.

A 94-yard drive later in the half gave Arkansas State its first lead. After rushing twice for no gain to open the possession, junior tailback Reggie Arnold took a screen pass from Leonard down the left sideline 51 yards to the Memphis 43. Freshman tailback Derek Lawson rushed three times for 35 yards for a first down at the Memphis nine and one play later, Arnold was in the end zone. Arauco's extra point put Arkansas State on top 14-13 with 7:53 remaining in the half.

Memphis countered with a 20-yard field goal from Zaccario with just under four minutes remaining before the break, but ASU went into the locker room with a 17-16 lead after the Red Wolves marched 51 yards to set up a 33-yard Arauco field goal with 18 seconds remaining in the half.

A 46-yard run from Steele helped the Tigers regain the lead in the third. Zaccario followed the run with a 35-yard field goal, and Steele added a 37-yard run in the fourth to set up a 40-yarder from Zaccario that gave Memphis a 22-17 lead with 7:58 to play.

Arkansas State went three-and-out on its next possession, and Memphis responded with a nine-play, 70-yard drive that ended in Steele's two-yard touchdown run with 2:12 to play.

Leonard was 11-of-23 on the day with an interception and Lawson led the ASU rushing attack with 79 yards on 11 carries. Sophomore safety M.D. Jennings had 11 tackles and an interception to lead the ASU defense.

GAME 6

October 11, Jonesboro, AR (ASU Stadium - 22,745) - Arkansas State 37, ULM 29

JONESBORO (10/11/08) – The Arkansas State Red Wolves built a 23-point second-half cushion, then held off a late Louisiana-Monroe rally to post a 37-29 Sun Belt Conference victory over the Warhawks at ASU Stadium.

Arkansas State freshman tailback Derek Lawson rushed for 104 yards and a touchdown, junior defensive back Marcus Brown returned a fumble 71 yards for a score and junior placekicker Josh Arauco set the Arkansas State mark for consecutive field goals, helping ASU remain undefeated in Sun Belt Conference play at 2-0 and 4-2 overall. Junior defensive end Alex Carrington, the Sun Belt sack leader coming into the game, led the ASU defense with eight tackles, including 2.5 sacks. Carrington also broke up a pass and forced a fumble in the game.

The Red Wolves got on the board with 3:45 remaining in the first quarter when junior wideout Jahbari McLennan scored from 63 yards out on a reverse. The Warhawks answered less than two minutes later when senior quarterback Kinsmon Lancaster completed the first of three touchdown passes on the night.

Lancaster connected with junior wideout Darrell McNeal from 29 yards out for the score, but Arkansas State answered with 10 straight to take a 17-7 advantage. Arauco was good on a 27-yard field goal with four seconds gone in the quarter, and the Red Wolves built the 10-point cushion when Lawson capped a 53-yard drive with a 2-yard touchdown run with 10:34 remaining in the half.

Louisiana-Monroe freshman Luther Ambrose answered Lawson's score with a 91-yard kickoff return for a touchdown to cut the ASU lead to 17-14, but the Red Wolves added 10 more before the half to take a 27-14 lead at the break.

Arkansas State junior quarterback Corey Leonard completed a 65-yard drive with a 3-yard touchdown run with 6:40 remaining in the second, and Arauco set a new ASU record for consecutive field goals when he kicked his 11th straight, hitting from 26 yards out with 4:42 to play in the half.

The Red Wolves stretched their lead to 37-14 when Brown scooped up a Lancaster fumble with just over five minutes remaining in the third and returned it 71 yards for a touchdown, and Arauco extended his streak to 12 when he booted a 44-yarder six seconds into the fourth quarter.

Lancaster hooked up with tailback Frank Goodin for a 25-yard score with 12:30 remaining, then hit tight end Zeek Zacharie on a one-yard touchdown pass with 7:31 to play to cut the Arkansas State lead to eight at 37-29.

Arkansas State picked up a first down on its next drive to drain the clock down to the 3:48 mark, and the Warhawks did not cross midfield on their final drive before turning the ball over on downs.

October 18, Lafayette, LA (Cajun Field - 23,684) - UL Lafayette 28, Arkansas State 23

LAFAYETTE, La. (10/18/08) – After scoring 10 points in a 16-second span to take a 23-14 lead with 7:39 to play in the fourth quarter, the Arkansas State Red Wolves saw their lead disappear when Louisiana-Lafayette answered with a pair of late touchdowns to defeat ASU 28-23 in a Sun Belt Conference matchup at Cajun Field.

Arkansas State junior kicker Josh Arauco connected on a 41-yard field goal with 7:55 to play to give ASU a 16-14 lead, and sophomore linebacker Darius Glover picked off a pass from ULL quarterback Brad McGuire and returned it 29 yards for a touchdown to extend the Red Wolves' lead to 23-14 with 7:39 to go in the game, but ULL followed up with the pair of touchdowns to grab the win. McGuire scored on a 4-yard run with 4:16 remaining and tailback Tyrell Fenroy put the Cajuns back on top with a 9-yard run with 42 seconds to play.

Arkansas State's final possession reached the 50-yard line, but quarterback Corey Leonard's pass into the end zone was batted down as time expired to seal the win for ULL.

The Red Wolves defense set up the game's first score when junior defensive end Alex Carrington tipped a pass from McGuire at the line of scrimmage, then picked off the pass and returned it 18 yards to set up Arkansas State at the ULL 18. The Red Wolves advanced to the Louisiana-Lafayette three yard line before settling for a 20 yard field goal from junior kicker Josh Arauco with 6:24 remaining in the opening quarter.

Arkansas State extended its lead to 10-0 when Leonard capped 55-yard drive with an 11-yard touchdown pass to junior wide receiver Brandon Thompkins with 6:57 remaining in the half. Leonard completed six of seven passes to cover 53 of the 55 yards on the drive.

Louisiana-Lafayette answered the score on its next possession when wide

receiver Richie Falgout threw an 18-yard touchdown pass off of a reverse to tight end Luke Aubrey. Placekicker Drew Edmiston added the extra point to cut the ASU lead to 10-7 with 5:43 to play before halftime.

Louisiana-Lafayette went on top with 6:05 remaining in the third quarter when McGuire scored on a one-yard sneak, wrapping up a 10-play drive that started at the ASU 44.

Arkansas State answered with a 42-yard field goal from Arauco on its next possession to pull within a point. The drive covered 46 yards in seven plays, cutting the Ragin' Cajun lead to 14-13 with 3:02 to play in the third.

Arauco's third field goal put ASU on top 16-13 and extended his school-record streak to 15. The kick also set a new ASU record, giving Arauco 42 career field goals.

Leonard completed 21-of-40 passes in the game for 235 yards to lead the ASU offense. The ASU defense, which registered a season-high five sacks, was led by Glover's 14 tackles and an interception.

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. (11/01/08) – Alabama's Mark Ingram rushed 12 times for 113 yards with two touchdowns to lead the Crimson Tide in a 35-0 win over Arkansas State at Bryant-Denny Stadium.

Glen Coffee rushed for nine yards capping off an 89-yard scoring drive, Alabama's first of the game, to give the Crimson Tide their first touchdown at the 4:23 mark of the first quarter. With a Leigh Tiffin point after try, the score was 7-0 in favor of Alabama.

ASU senior defensive back Dominique Williams stopped the Crimson Tide's second scoring drive at 38 yards when he intercepted a John Parker Wilson pass in the ASU end zone, returning the pick 23 yards at the end of the first quarter. It was the second interception for Williams on the season.

Rashad Johnson intercepted ASU junior quarterback Corey Leonard at the Red Wolves 32 yard line returning the pick for Alabama's second touchdown of the game at the 8:54 mark of the second quarter. Tiffin's kick made the score 14-0 for Alabama.

The Crimson Tide threatened with a Tiffin 37-yard field goal attempt, but the kick sailed wide-left at the 00:27 mark of the second half, setting the halftime score, ASU down 14-0.

On their first drive of the second half, like the first, Alabama took advantage of its first opportunity to get on the scoreboard. Roy Upchurch rushed over the left end for a 22 yard touchdown at the 13:37 mark of the third quarter. The Tiffin kick attempt was good giving the Crimson Tide a 21-0 lead.

Mark Ingram gave Alabama a 28-0 advantage when he had a five-yard touchdown rush over the left guard with 2:20 left in the third quarter.

Ingram added the final score for the Crimson Tide when he picked up a 17-yard touchdown run at the 4:37 mark of the fourth quarter.

Arkansas State put together its best drive of the game driving seven plays for 46 yards at the beginning of the fourth quarter. The Red Wolves were unable to convert a fourth and five situation and turned the ball over on downs with 13:17 left in the game.

Leonard was 8-17 with one interception for 67 yards. Leonard connected with junior wide receiver Jabbari McLennan for a 26-yard pass late in the third quarter which was the longest of the game for the Red Wolves. McLennan's 26 yards led all ASU receivers.

Junior running back Reggie Arnold led the Red Wolves with 15 rushes for 72 yards, with a long rush of 11 yards.

On the defensive side of the ball, ASU sophomore safety M.D. Jennings led the Red Wolves with nine tackles, including seven solo hits.
