ON TAP: The Arkansas State football team will wrap up a three-game home stand, its longest since 2002, Saturday when it hosts Middle Tennessee in its 2008 Homecoming game and Sun Belt Conference opener. Every Arkansas State game can be heard live on 107.9 FM in the Jonesboro area and the live radio broadcast can be accessed through the Arkansas State athletic Web site (astateredwolves.com).

THE PRINCIPALS: Arkansas State had a three-game home winning streak snapped with a 27-24 setback to Southern Miss last Saturday, but is still 23-8 all-time at ASU Stadium under head coach Steve Roberts and brings a 6-1 record in Sun Belt Conference openers into Saturday's game. While Middle Tennessee dropped its season and Sun Belt Conference opener to Troy, it came back to claim a big 24-14 victory over Maryland and last week narrowly missed its second straight upset in a 20-14 loss at Kentucky.

HEAD COACH STEVE ROBERTS: Arkansas State head coach Steve Roberts is in his seventh year at Arkansas State after leading the Red Wolves to the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Championship and their most single-season wins over NCAA FBS opponents in 2006. During his first six seasons as the Red Wolves' head coach, he guided ASU

the school since 1986-1991. Roberts was named the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year. Under Roberts, the Red Wolves have had 53 All-Sun Belt Conference selections, an Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year, SBC Offensive Player of the Year, SBC Defensive Player of the Year and SBC Newcomer of the Year.

ROBERTS CLIMBING VICTORIES LADDER: In his first six-plus seasons as the Red Wolves head coach, Steve Roberts already has the fifth most victories among ASU's 26 all-time head coaches with 33 wins. Larry Lacewell (1979-89) holds the record for victories with 69 and is followed by Bennie Ellender (1963-70) with 52 wins, Bill Davidson (1971-78) with 51 and Forrest England (1946-53) with 49.

DEBUT OF THE RED WOLVES: The Arkansas State football team is competing in its first season as the Red Wolves after changing its nickname and mascot from Indians at the conclusion of the 2007-08 athletic seasons. 1948, 8-1, and has outscored Arkansas State 276-95 in those nine contests. The Blue Raiders have won the last five meetings, while ASU's lone victory in the series came 13-7 in Jonesboro during the 2002 campaign. Middle Tennessee won the 1948 and 1949 games and the two teams did not meet again until 2001 as Sun Belt foes.

ARKANSAS STATE vs. SUN BELT **CONFERENCE:** Arkansas State is 52-51-1 all-time against current members of the Sun Belt Conference. Since the league's inaugural football season in 2001, the Red Wolves are 23-24 against all opponents that have been a member of the league. Against current members of the conference, ASU is 18-20 since 2001. The Red Wolves hold their most alltime victories against Louisiana-Lafavette with 17, while its most victories against a Sun Belt opponent since 2001 is Louisiana-Monroe with four. The Red Wolves have defeated every team in the Sun Belt Conference since the football league was formed in 2001.

OUT OF THE GATES: While it dropped a 27-24 decision to Southern Miss last time out, Arkansas State's 2-1 start is still its best since posting a 2-1 record through its first three games of 2003. The last time ASU held a 3-1 or better mark through its first four games was 1986 when it was 3-0-1. ASU got off to a 2-0 start in 2008 for the first time since 1986 and the first time ever as an NCAA FBS member.

HOMECOMING HISTORY: Arkansas State will host Middle Tennessee in its 81st homecoming game. ASU, which has won its last five consecutive homecoming games, is 53-26-1 all-time in homecoming games.

UNBUCKLE THE BELT: ASU is 6-1 alltime in Sun Belt Conference openers after falling 30-13 at Louisiana-Monroe in its first league game last year. ASU will play Middle Tennessee in its SBC opener for the first time ever.

NICE CROWD: The crowd of 25,938 at the Southern Miss game was the fourth largest in ASU Stadium history. For just the second time in ASU history, the Red Wolves played back-to-back home games in front of 20,000 or more spectators. The combined crowds for the Southern Miss and Texas Southern game (47,679) was the largest for any two games played at ASU Stadium in a single season.

LAST WEEK'S INDIVIDUAL HIGH-LIGHTS: Corey Leonard led the offense with 325 yards of total offense and two passing touchdowns. Safety M.D. Jennings posted a team and career-high 13 tackles and forced a fumble to pace the ASU defense against Southern Miss. Josh Arauco

1948, 8-1, and has outscored Arkansas State remained perfect on the year in both extra 276-95 in those nine contests. The Blue Raiders have won the last five meetings, while ASU's lone victory in the series came three of his extra points.

LEONARD MILESTONES: Corey Leoanrd hit several milestones last week against Southern Miss. The junior quarterback became the sixth player in school history to pass for over 4,000 yards (4,201), the third player to throw at least 30 touchdowns (31) and the fifth player to record over 5,000 yards of total offense (5,255). Already ranked third all-time at ASU for passing touchdowns, Leonard can take over third place for career completions with seven more. He currently has 332 career completions to his credit.

AUTOMATIC ARAUCO: Junior kicker **Josh Arauco** has made his first seven field goals this season, leaving him just three shy of the school record for consecutive field goals made. Arauco is one of three players in school history to make 10 straight field goals. He has also made his first 14 extra points this season, extending his streak of consecutive makes to 52. His 52 straight successful extra points is the second longest streak in ASU history, behind only Eric Neihouse's 28

DISRUPTING THE BACKFIELD: Alex Carrington already has a Sun Belt Conference-high five tackles for loss, which matches his career best for a single season (he also had five in 2007). Carrington has two sacks as well, which matches his total for his freshman and sophomore seasons combined. The junior defensive end is ranked tied for 23rd in the nation in tackles for loss.

NEW HIGHS: Three ASU players matched or surpassed their career highs for receptions last game against Southern Miss. Junior tight end **Trevor Gillott** tied his career high for receptions with five and posted a career-best 79 yards receiving. **Jarriel Norman** and **Anthony Robinson** also posted their single-game best numbers against Southern Miss. Norman tied his career high for receptions with three and his 41 yards were his best. Robinson's two catches for 45 yards were both the best of his career at ASU.

AMONG THE NATION'S ELITE: ASU is currently ranked among the top 25 teams in the nation in eight statistical categories: tackles for loss (3), turnover margin (6), rushing offense (6), punt returns (11), total offense (12), scoring offense (16), passing efficiency (18), and sacks (21). ASU is ranked among the top 50 teams in the nation in 14 statistical categories.

LEADING THE SUN BELT: While the season is just three weeks old, Arkansas State still leads the Sun Belt Conference in nine statistical categories, including total offense. ASU is ranked among the top two teams in the league in 18 statistical categories.

GETTING TO THE QUARTERBACK: ASU recorded nine sacks over its first three games, including four against Texas A&M that topped its season-high (3) for all of last season during a game. ASU finished with 13 sacks for all of last season. The Red Wolves had three sacks against Southern Miss last time out. ASU is ranked No. 1 in the Sun Belt and 21 in the nation in sacks.

PICKING IT OFF: The Red Wolves failed to intercept a pass last game, ending a streak of eight games with at least one interception. The Red Wolves led the Sun Belt Conference in interceptions in 2006 and ranked fifth in the league last year.

OFFENSIVE UPRISING: ASU surpassed 400 yards of total offense in its first three games, while only reaching the 400-yard mark in three games for all of last season. ASU is ranked second in the Sun Belt Conference and 12th in the nation in total offense after the season's first three weeks of

play. The Red Wolves have also extended their winning streak to seven games when recording 400 yards of total offense.

94th SEASON UNDER WAY: Arkansas State kicked off its 94th season of football with its game against Texas A&M. ASU holds a 404-430-37 record since the inaugural 1911 season and have played in seven bowl games.

ROBERTS AND ASU STADIUM: Arkansas State head coach Steve Roberts has led the Red Wolves to a 23-8 record at ASU Stadium over the last seven years for a .742 winning percentage. Not only that, the Red Wolves are 14-3 at ASU Stadium over the last four seasons.

ROBERTS IN CLOSE GAMES: Seventh-year skipper Steve Roberts has seen numerous close games during his tenure with the Red Wolves, holding a 19-10 record in games decided by eight points or less (38 percent of all his games). Roberts' teams have been especially successful recently in games decided by just one score, holding a 17-7 record in its last 24 games that ended under those circumstances. 17 AND UNDER: Arkansas State holds a 15-3 record under head coach **Steve Roberts** when holding its opponents to 17 points or less. However, ASU is 11-30 over the last six seasons when allowing 17 or more points. The Red Wolves have won 12 of their last 13 games when holding their opponent to 17 or fewer points and has won 26 straight games when holding their opponents to 10 or fewer points.

DOUBLE-DIGIT COMEBACKS: Arkansas State has rallied for a victory in coven games when trailing by double digits

rushing yards, junior running back **Reggie Arnold** is ranked eighth among the career rushing leaders in ASU history. Arnold has rushed for at least 100 yards in a game 11 times, including the Texas A&M and Texas Southern games, for his career for the fifth (tied) most in school history.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD: Arkansas State broke the Sun Belt Conference and ASU Stadium record for points in a game with 83 against Texas Southern. The 83 points are also the second most in school history, behind only the 101 scored against Arkansas Teacher's College in 1917. Additionally, ASU is the first NCAA FBS team to score 80 or more points in a game since Texas Tech scored 80 against Sam Houston State on Sept. 17, 2005.

OFFENSIVE OUTBURST: ASU piled up 670 yards of total offense against Texas Southern, which ranks as the second highest total in school history and the fourth highest in Sun Belt history. ASU has now posted its top two offensive games in school history under head coach Steve Roberts, also recording a school-record 681 yards of total offense last season against Louisiana-Lafayette.

RECORD BREAKER: Kicker **Josh Arauco** broke the Sun Belt Conference record for points by kicking (17) and extra points made (11) in the Red Wolves 83-10 victory over Texas Southern.

LAWSON BUSTS OUT: Derek Lawson became just the 11th player in school history to rush for over 200 yards in a game with his 209-yard performance against Texas Southern. His 209 yards ranks as the eighth most in school history.

TWICE AS NICE: Running backs **Derek Lawson** rushed for 209 yards and **Reggie Arnold** 123 yards against Texas Southern to become the first ASU duo to rush for over 100 yards in the same game since 2005 when Shermar Bracey and Antonio Warren did it against North Texas.

NATIONAL RECOGNITION: Senior linebacker **Ben Owens (Bearden, Ark.)** was named the FWAA/Bronko Nagurski National Defensive Player of the Week for games of the weekend of Aug. 30 after helping lead the Red Wolves to a season-opening victory over Texas A&M.

Owens, a preseason All-Sun Belt selection, became the first player in ASU history to be named a national defensive player of the week and the first Sun Belt Conference player to receive the recognition since FAU cornerback Tavious Polo last season after the Owls defeated Minnesota on Sept. 20. Owens, already on the Butkus Award Watch List, was added to the 2008 Bronko Nagurski Trophy Watch List. The Bronko Nagurski Trophy will be presented to the best defensive player in college football on Dec. 7 by the FWAA and the Charlotte Touchdown Club at the Westin Hotel in Charlotte, N.C. Five finalists for the Nagurski Trophy will be announced on Nov. 17.

RED WOLVES SWEEP WEEKLY SBC HONORS: Junior quarterback **Corey Leonard (Covington, La.)**, senior linebacker **Ben Owens (Bearden, Ark.)** and junior kicker **Josh Arauco (Grand Prairie, Texas)** were named the Sun Belt Conference's players of the week Sept. 1 after leading the Red Wolves football team to a season-opening victory over Texas A&M.

Leonard was named the offensive player of the Week, Owens the defensive player of the week and Arauco the special teams player of the week, marking the first time in school history ASU swept all three awards and the first time since Nov. 5, 2007 that any school swept all three honors. It is just the 10th time in Sun Belt Conference history that three players from the same school have swept the awards, and ASU becomes the fifth school to be awarded all three honors in the same week.

TURNING IT AROUND ON THE ROAD: Arkansas State turned around its recent fortune in road games, snapping a seven-game skid away from ASU Stadium with its victory over Texas A&M in its season opener. The last time ASU won a season opener on the road was 1989 when it defeated Memphis 17-13. The crowd of 78,691 for the Texas A&M game was the ninth largest to ever watch an Arkansas State game.

TEXAS A&M GAME NOTABLES: ASU won its first ever game over a BCS school since it joined NCAA FBS. The Red Wolves also broke Texas A&M's 20-game winning streak in home openers, handing the Aggies just their fourth loss over their last 50 non-conference home games. ASU picked up its first victory in 15 games against current members of the Big 12 Conference.

PRESEASON ALL-SBC ACCOLADES: Five Arkansas State football players have been tabbed Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference. Junior running back Reggie Arnold (Little Rock, Ark.), senior tight end David Johnson (Pine Bluff, Ark.) and senior offensive lineman Matt Mandich (Hattiesburg, Miss.) all represented ASU on the offensive team, while junior defensive end Alex Carrington (Tupelo, Miss.) and senior linebacker Ben Owens (Bearden, Ark.) were named to the defensive squad . . . ASU's five players on the 28-man squad tied Troy for the second most among all the schools. Florida Atlantic had a league-high eight players named to the team. Louisiana-Lafayette and Louisiana-Monroe each had three players on the team, while North Texas and Middle Tennessee both had two players.

PRESEASON PREDICTIONS: The Red Wolves are predicted to finish fourth in the conference according to the league's 2008 preseason coaches poll, announced Monday, July 21 at the Sun Belt's annual Football Media Days in New Orleans . . . ASU received 39 points, just seven fewer than third-place Monroe, in the poll. Florida Atlantic received six of the eight first-place votes and a league-high 62 points, while Troy was picked to finish second with 51 points and one first-place vote. Louisiana-Monroe picked up the final first-place vote and finished with 46 points in the voting. Middle Tennessee was picked fifth with 32 points, Louisiana-Lafayette sixth with 26 points, North Texas seventh with 19 points and Florida International eighth with 13 points.

TELEVISION TIME: Three Arkansas State games will be televised by ESPN Plus and another game televised by CSS in 2008. The Red Wolves' home games against Louisiana-Monroe on Oct. 11 (6:00 p.m.) and Florida Atlantic on Nov. 22 (2:00 p.m.) and road game at Troy on Dec. 6 (6:00 p.m.) will all be televised by ESPN Plus, while their game at Alabama on Nov. 1 will be carried by CSS... ASU's four regular-season televised games for 2008 ties the second most in school history, matching the 2005 season. The Red Wolves' had a school-record six televised games during the 2007 campaign.

NEW FLAGSHIP RADIO STATION ANNOUNCED: The Arkansas State University Athletic Department, along with East Arkansas Broadcasters, announced July 16 that KFIN 107.9 FM, a 100,000-watt radio station located in Jonesboro, will become the new flagship station and home of Red Wolves' football broadcasts for the 2008 season. KFIN's 100,000-watt signal reaches parts of Tennessee, Missouri and a large portion of Arkansas, giving more ASU football fans the opportunity to follow the Red Wolves during the upcoming season. back Reggie Arnold has been named to the list of candidates for the 2008 Doak Walker Award, announced by the Guaranty Bank SMU Athletic Forum.

Arnold is a candidate for the award, presented annually to the nation's top running back, for the second straight year and joins former ASU running back Jonathan Adams as the only two players in school history to make the watch list during two different seasons. Adams was a candidate for the award in 2000 and 2001.

Arnold is among 43 candidates, including two from the Sun Belt Conference, to be named to the award's 2008 watch list. The Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference selection rushed for over 1,000 yards in each of his first two seasons at ASU. He was named the Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year in 2006 and is a two-time all-conference pick.

OWENS ON BUTKUS WATCH LIST: Senior linebacker **Ben Owens** has been named to the watch list for the 2008 Butkus Award, given annually to the top linebacker in college football. Owens, a preseason All-Sun Belt Conference selection, was one of 66 players named to the watch list after posting a career-high 96 tackles last season that ranked fifth in the Sun Belt. His 96 tackles were just five fewer than team-leader Koby McKinnon, who was on the 2007 Butkus Award Watch List.

MANDICH WATCH LIST: Senior offensive lineman **Matt Mandich** is not only a preseason First Team All-Sun Belt Conference by a number of college football publications, he is also on a couple of prestigious watch lists. Mandich is on both the Outland Trophy Watch List and Rotary Lombardi Watch List. Not only that, he was named preseason Honorable Mention All-America by *Sporting News*.

FAST TRACK TO DEGREE: Corey Leonard, just a junior on the football field, went through ASU's Summer Commencement ceremony this year after earning his bachelor's degree in just three years in Business. Leonard is now enrolled graduate school and will begin working toward his master's degree this fall.

400TH VICTORY: With its victory over Louisiana-Lafayette on Oct. 13 of last year, ASU became the fifth Sun Belt Conference school with 400 all-time wins. ASU is in its 94th season of football and holds an all-time record of 404-430-37 since its inaugural 1911 season. The Red Wolves have played in seven bowl games, including the 2005 New Orleans Bowl.

SIX-YEAR IMPROVEMENT: During seventh-year head coach **Steve Roberts**' first six seasons at Arkansas State the football program saw its win total increase by almost 100 percent over the previous six years. ASU posted 31 wins over Roberts' first six years, 14 more than it recorded the six years prior to Roberts. In fact, ASU's 31 wins over those six years are the most for a six-year span since 1986-91.

TEAM CAPTAINS: ASU's senior class will alternate throughout the year as team captains. The team will vote on permanent captains at the end of the year.

TEAM ACADEMIC AWARD: The Arkansas State football team has won the Sun Belt Conference Team Academic Award four of the past five years, including 2007.

A VISIT FROM THE GOVERNOR: Arkansas Governor Mike Beebe looked on as the Arkansas State Red Wolves went through a two-hour practice at the ASU practice fields during 2008 fall camp. Beebe, who was the guest speaker at the ASU Touchdown Club banquet Tuesday that night, addressed the team following practice, then took time to pose for pictures with ASU players and fans. "Obviously, it was a privilege for us to have the governor of the state of Arkansas here at our practice and to speak to our team," said ASU Head Coach Steve Roberts. "We are very proud of what he has accomplished and continues to accomplish as the governor and as an ASU Alumnus."

AFCA AWARD: Prior to the start of the 2007 season, the American Football Coaches Association announced that the Arkansas State University football team was one of just 34 Division I-A football programs that graduated 70 percent or more of its student-athletes from their freshman classes of 2001-02.

A TIME TO BOND: When Head Coach Steve Roberts came to ASU, he brought a tradition with him which caught on in a hurry with the players. The night before each game, team members and coaches get together for milk and cookies. During this time, each player sits by and visits with at least three other players he has not visited with throughout the week in order to learn more about his teammates.

HEAD COACH STEVE ROBERTS

Not long after leading Arkansas State to the 2005 Sun Belt Conference championship and New Orleans Bowl, head coach Steve Roberts continues to make ASU a dominant force in the Sun Belt Conference and has ASU on track for continued success in the upcoming years.

When the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year took over the program in December 2001, he impressed everyone with his wide-eyed enthusiasm and limitless energy. And, most of all, they believed that Roberts would bring success to the ASU football program. Roberts has been the driving force behind ASU's recent success, leading the football program to its most victories over a six-year span since 1986-91.

Under Roberts' direction, ASU continues to add to the achievements that began upon his arrival. The 2006 and 2007 ASU teams backed up the 2005 Sun Belt championship with nonconference wins over teams such as Army, Memphis and SMU. The 2006 squad knocked off New Orleans Bowl champion Troy and the 2007 team fell to then-ranked No. 4 Texas by just eight points and pushed New Orleans Bowl champion Florida Atlantic to the final minutes.

The 2007 team won the Sun Belt Conference academic award for the fourth time in the last five years and finished with the second most yards of total offense in school history.

Roberts already holds the fifth most wins among ASU's 26 all-time head coaches and has led the Red Wolves to a 23-7 record at ASU Stadium, which included a 5-1 record in 2007.

Roberts was named Arkansas State's 26th head football coach on December 21, 2001. Roberts graduated from Robinson High School in Little Rock. A 1987 graduate of Ouachita Baptist University, where he was an Academic All-American, Roberts received his masters from SAU in 1989. He and his wife Sherri have one daughter – Abby (13).

GAME 1

August 30, College Station, TX (Kyle Field - 78,691) - Arkansas State 18, Texas A&M 14

COLLEGE STATION, Texas (8/30/08) – The first game of a new era provided what was arguably the biggest victory in the long history of Arkansas State University football.

Playing its first football game as the Red Wolves, Arkansas State left 78,691 Texas A&M fans at Kyle Field stunned, defeating the Aggies 18-14 in the season opener for both teams. Texas A&M had won its last 20 home openers, and the loss was just the fourth defeat for the Aggies in their last 50 non-conference games at home.

Arkansas State got its only touchdown of the night when it needed it the most.

After penetrating the Texas A&M 30-yard line five times and coming away with three field goals and two turnovers, Arkansas State went on top to stay when junior quarterback Corey Leonard connected with senior wide receiver Kevin Jones from 15 yards out, giving the Red Wolves a 15-14 lead with 4:39 to play.

A missed two-point conversion attempt proved inconsequential when a Texas A&M turnover on its next possession led to junior Josh Arauco's fourth field goal of the night. Arauco's kick boosted the ASU lead to 18-14, and Arkansas State forced another turnover on the Aggies' final drive to seal the win.

Junior tailback Reggie Arnold rushed 21 times for 145 yards on the night, Leonard added 86 yards on the ground to go along with 160 passing yards, and Arauco was a perfect 4-for-4 in the game. His four field goals were a career high.

Arkansas State scored on the game's first possession when the Red Wolves drove 60 yards to set up Arauco's first field goal. Arkansas State used a 19-yard completion from junior quarterback Corey Leonard to junior wideout Jahbari McLennan on third-and-six from the ASU 35 to keep the drive alive.

A two-yard keeper by Leonard on fourth-and-one at the Aggie 37 again kept the possession alive, and Leonard passed complete for 15 yards to Jones on the next play to set up Arauco's field goal. Arauco's kick wrapped up the 13-play drive and put the Red Wolves on top 3-0 with 8:45 remaining in the opening quarter.

Texas A&M answered with an 8-play drive that ended when junior tail-back Mike Goodson scored from nine yards out to put the Aggies on the board. Senior Richie Bean added the extra point for the 7-3 A&M lead with 6:20 to play in the first period.

The Aggies made it 14-3 with 4:23 remaining in the half when Goodson scored again, this time from seven yards out to wrap up a 12-play, 77-yard drive.

Arkansas State took advantage of an interception by junior defensive back M.D. Jennings midway through the third quarter to cut the Texas A&M advantage to 14-6.

Jennings picked off a pass from A&M quarterback Stephen McGee at the ASU 41 to give the Red Wolves possession of the ball and ASU marched 47 yards on nine plays to set up Arauco's second field goal of the night. Arauco connected from 28 yards out on the kick to cut the deficit to 14-8 with 5:28 remaining in the third.

Junior safety Marcus Brown forced a fumble by Texas A&M wide receiver Howard Morrow on the Aggies' next drive, and the ball was recovered by ASU defensive end Jeremy Gibson to set up the Red Wolf offense at the Aggie 47.

Arkansas State moved 39 yards on the possession, with 32 of those yards coming on a run from Leonard to the Texas A&M 15, and Arauco completed the possession with his third field goal of the night. Arauco's kick was good from 29 yards out, trimming the Texas A&M lead to 14-9 with 14 seconds to go in the third quarter.

Texas A&M went three-and-out on its next possession and Bean missed wide on a 27-yard field goal attempt the next time the Aggies had the ball, setting the stage for ASU's game-winning drive.

Taking over at the ASU 20 with 9:30 remaining, Leonard directed the Red Wolves 80 yards in 10 plays on a drive that consumed 4:51 seconds on the clock. Arnold rushed for 44 yards on the drive and Leonard hooked up with McLennan for 15 yards and a first down at the A&M 21 on fourth-and-13 from the Aggie 36 to keep the possession going.

Senior defensive back Dominique Williams led Arkansas State with nine tackles on the night, junior defensive back Daylan Walker added seven, senior linebacker Ben Owens also had seven to go along with a fumble recovery and the game-clinching interception, and junior defensive back Evan Van Dolah had six stops.

GAME 2

September 6, Jonesboro, AR (ASU Stadium - 21,741) - Arkansas State 83, Texas Southern 10

JONESBORO (9/6/08) – Arkansas State scored early and often in its home debut, pounding Texas Southern 83-10 in front of a crowd of 21,741 at ASU Stadium.

Freshman tailback Derek Lawson rushed for 209 yards and a touchdown in the game, the 8th most rushing yards in ASU history. Junior tailback Reggie Arnold added 123 yards and two touchdowns and junior quarterback Corey Leonard accounted for 229 yards of total offense and threw for four touchdowns as Arkansas State finished with 670 yards of total offense in the game, the second most in school history.

ASU got on the board with less than two minutes gone in the game with a 53-yard pass from Leonard to Johnson. Two minutes later, Leonard connected with junior tight end Trevor Gillott from 39 yards out for the 14-0 ASU lead.

A 25-yard fumble recovery for a touchdown from sophomore linebacker Javon McKinnon, a 33-yard field goal from junior Josh Arauco, and a two-yard pass from Leonard to freshman fullback Jeff Blake wrapped up a 31-0 first quarter for ASU.

Leonard and Johnson hooked up for their second touchdown pass of the night just 29 seconds into the second quarter, and Arnold scored on touchdown runs of two yards and 56 yards before Texas Southern got on the

board with a 34-yard field goal from Robert Hersh to make it 52-3 at the half.

A five-yard touchdown run from Lawson, a 30-yard field goal from Arauco and an eight-yard touchdown run from senior quarterback Travis Hewitt made it 69-3 before the Tigers scored their only touchdown of the night on a 32-yard pass from quarterback Bobby Reid to wide receiver William Osbourne.

Blake added a 15-yard touchdown run early in the fourth quarter, and freshman linebacker Demario Davis returned a fumble 53-yards for a touchdown to set the final at 83-10 after Arauco's 11th extra point. Arauco was 11-for-11 on extra points to tie the ASU record, and 2-for-2 on field goal tries on the night.

The Red Wolves' 83 points were the second most in school history and the most in the history of ASU Stadium. The 73-point margin of victory was the most under head coach Steve Roberts.

Arkansas State continues a three-game home stand next week when they host Southern Miss in a 6 p.m. game at ASU Stadium.

September 13, Jonesboro, AR (ASU Stadium - 25,938) - Southern Miss 27, Arkansas State 24

JONESBORO (9/13/08) – The Southern Miss Golden Eagles (2-1) held off a furious second-half rally by Arkansas State and came away with a 27-24 victory over the Red Wolves (2-1) at ASU Stadium.

Down 17-3 at the half, ASU came roaring back in the third quarter with 14 straight points to tie the score at 17, only to see Southern Miss answer with 10 straight to open the fourth quarter.

Southern Miss benefitted from an ASU miscue on a field goal attempt early in the fourth quarter to begin building its 10-point cushion. With the Red Wolves lined up for a 31-yard field goal attempt with just over 12 minutes to play that would have given ASU a 20-17 lead, Southern Miss turned the tables when cornerback C.J. Bailey scooped up an ASU fumble on the play and returned it to the Arkansas State 11. Bailey's return set up a 28-yard field goal from Golden Eagle placekicker Justin Estes that gave USM a 20-17 lead with 10:47 remaining.

Southern Miss then put together a 93-yard drive that ended in a 24-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Austin Davis to tailback Damion Fletcher with 5:30 to play that padded the Golden Eagle lead at 27-17.

Refusing to go quietly, Arkansas State moved 83 yards in just over three minutes to pull within 27-24. Junior quarterback Corey Leonard completed three passes for 52 yards on the drive, including a 5-yard touchdown pass to freshman fullback Jeff Blake to complete the drive with 2:14 to play.

Arkansas State's defense held Southern Miss to three-and-out on the Eagles' ensuing possession to give the Red Wolves one final opportunity with 1:44 remaining.

Starting at the ASU 20, Leonard connected with wideout Anthony Robertson for 26 yards on third-and-five to give the Red Wolves a first down at the USM 46 with just over a minute to play, but an interception by

Southern Miss cornerback Eddie Willingham with 59 seconds remaining sealed the victory for USM.


Southern Miss converted 9-of-10 third down opportunities in the first half to build its 17-3 lead at the break. The Eagles opened the game with a 19-play, 68 yard drive that chewed up 10:17 on the game clock and ended with a 23-yard field goal from kicker Justin Estes.

Arkansas State answered with a 55-yard drive that ended in a 41-yard field goal from Josh Arauco that tied the score at 3-3 less than two minutes later, but Southern Miss tacked on a pair of touchdowns to build the 14-point halftime lead.

Tailback Tory Harrison scored on a 1-yard run with 12:09 remaining in the half and tight end Jonathan Massey hauled in a 1-yard pass from Davis to put the Eagles on top 17-3 at the break.

Leonard finished the game with 325 yards of total offense, including 256 yards and a pair of touchdowns through the air. Junior tailback Reggie Arnold added 84 yards on 15 carries and freshman tailback Derek Lawson had 73 yards on seven rushing attempts. Tight end Trevor Gillott had a career-high 79 yards on five receptions.

Sophomore safety M.D. Jennings had 13 tackles to lead the ASU defense.
