THE PRINCIPALS: Arkansas State's last three games have all been against Sun Belt Conference opponents, but the Red Wolves will face Louisville in their second of four non-conference games this season. A-State dropped a 35-28 decision to Troy its last time out, one game after defeating ULM 34-20 to break into the win column for the first time this year. Louisville also enters the game with one victory under its belt, a 23-13 home win over Eastern Kentucky. The Cardinals are coming off an open week, but will play their second straight road game after falling 35-28 at then-ranked No. 25 Oregon State their last time out.

HEAD COACH STEVE ROBERTS: Arkansas State head coach Steve Roberts is in his ninth year at Arkansas State after leading the Red Wolves to the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Championship and to bowl eligible seasons three of the last five years. During his first eight seasons as the Red Wolves' head coach, he guided ASU to 41 wins for its most over an eight-year span at the school since 1985-1992. Roberts was named the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year. Under Roberts, the Red Wolves have had 70 All-Sun Belt Conference selections, a Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year, SBC Offensive Player of the Year, two SBC Defensive Players of the Year and an SBC Newcomer of the Year.

DOUBLE DUTY: A-State head coach Steve Roberts is one of just 12 coaches in the FBS that in addition to handling responsibilities as a head coach, also works as a position coach. Roberts has coached special teams since his arrival at ASU in 2002. Below is a list of head coaches in the FBS who also are position coaches:

ROBERTS CLIMBING VICTORIES LADDER:

Through his first eight-plus seasons as the Red Wolves head coach, Steve Roberts already has the fifth most victories among ASU's 26 all-time head coaches with 42 wins. Larry Lacewell (1979-89) holds the record for victories with 69 and is followed by Bennie Ellender (1963-70) with 52 wins, Bill Davidson (1971-78) with 51 and Forrest England (1946-53) with 49.

ROBERTS AND ASU STADIUM: Arkansas State head coach Steve Roberts has led the Red Wolves to a 30-10 record at ASU Stadium over the last eight years for .750 winning percentage. Not only that, the Red Wolves are 21-5 at ASU Stadium over the last six seasons . . . Arkansas State is 15-4 in home conference

17 AND UNDER: Arkansas State holds a 19-4 record under head coach Steve Roberts when holding its opponents to 17 points or less. The Red Wolves have won 16 of their last 18 games when holding their opponent to 17 or fewer points and have won 28 straight games when holding their opponents to 10 or fewer points.

THE ARKANSAS STATE-LOUISVILLE SERIES: Arkansas State and Louisville are playing each other for the second consecutive year, but also for just the second time ever. The Red Wolves suffered a 21-13 setback at Louisville last year at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium.

THE LAST TIME vs. THE CARDINALS LOUISVILLE, Ky. (10/31/09): The Arkansas State Red Wolves rallied to within a touchdown and a two-point conversion late in the fourth quarter but could not punch the ball into the end

zone on their final drive as the Louisville Cardinals held on for a 21-13 non-conference victory Saturday afternoon at Papa John's Cardinal Stadium.

Senior kicker Josh Arauco put the Red Wolves within eight points when he booted a 21-yard field goal with 7:47 remaining, but Arkansas State came up 14 yards short of the tying score on its final drive.

Arkansas State's final possession began at its 24 yard line with 2:42 remaining, and the Red Wolves drove as deep as the Cardinals' eight yard line in the final minute. Senior quarterback Corey Leonard's fourth-down pass from the Louisville 14 yard line was just out of the reach of tight end Trevor Gillott ending the final Red Wolves threat.

Louisville got on the board first, scoring on a 26-yard rush by Darius Ashley in the first quarter. ASU answered with a 24-yard field goal from Arauco to start the second quarter.

The Cardinals stretched their lead to 21-3 with a 25-yard interception return for a touchdown by Brandon Heath just before the half and a one-yard rushing touchdown by Ashley with 8:23 remaining in the third.

The Red Wolves cut the lead to 21-10 on a four-yard touchdown pass from Leonard to

Brandon Thompkins with just over a minute to play in the third quarter, then used Arauco's 21-yarder to pull within a score with 7:47 to play.

Arauco's two field goals on the day made him the Sun Belt Conference's all-time leader in field goals made with 51, while Thompkins became the SBC all-time leader in kickoff return yards when he returned three kickoffs on the day for 56 yards, giving him 2,357 for his career.

Leonard passed for a season-high 303 yards and a touchdown to lead the Arkansas State offense on the day, completing 23-of-42 passes to become ASU's all-time completions leader with 565.

Junior safety M.D. Jennings had a season-high 11 tackles against the Cardinals to lead the Red Wolves defense.

ARKANSAS STATE vs. THE BIG EAST: Including Louisville, Arkansas State has played just two teams all-time that are currently a member of the Big East Conference. ASU split a pair of games with Cincinnati, defeating defeating the Bearcats 14-9 in 1975 before playing them again in 1998 and dropping a 51-7 decision in that game. Both games were played at Cincinnati.

HOMECOMING HISTORY: Arkansas State is 55-26-1 all-time in Homecoming contests. The Red Wolves have won their last seven Homecoming games dating back to the 2003 season.

WELCOME TO ASU STADIUM: Louisville will become the 54th A-State opponent to ever play a game at ASU Stadium. The Cardinals will be the first Big East opponent to ever play a game at ASU Stadium as well. The last time ASU hosted a team from a BCS conference was 2001 when it played Ole Miss at ASU Stadium.

NON-CONFERENCE SUCCESS: ASU holds an 11-2 non-conference record at ASU Stadium under head coach Steve Roberts. The Red

Wolves' hold victories over teams such as Tulsa, Army, SMU and Memphis over that span, while its only two setbacks came 27-24 against Southern Miss in 2008 and 47-35 against then-ranked No. 25 Memphis in 2004.

20 SOMETHING: Arkansas State has scored at least 24 points in each of its first four games and is averaging 28 points a game, which ranks third in the Sun Belt Conference. The last time A-State scored 20 or more points in four consecutive games was the 1995 season when it did so in five straight.

AN ASU VICTORY WOULD . . . improve its non-conference home record under head coach Steve Roberts to 12-2 . . . give it eight consecutive Homecoming victories . . . give the Red Wolves its second win over a BCS conference school since joining the FBS . . . give the Red Wolves their third consecutive home victory . . . snap a four-game skid against non-conference opponents.

PLAY AFTER PLAY: Arkansas State has run at least 80 offensive plays in three of its first four games, including a season-high 84 at Auburn. Prior to this season, the last time ASU had run at least 80 plays in a game was Oct. 13, 2007 when it ran 85 against Louisiana-Monroe. If the Red Wolves maintain their average 77.5 plays per game, they would finish the regular season with 930 total plays to easily break the school record of 848 set in 2007.

WRAPPING UP: Junior safety Kelcie McCray and senior linebacker Javon McKinnon both recorded a career-high 12 tackles against Troy last week. The 12 tackles are the most by an ASU player this season, just ahead of the 11 recorded by M.D. Jennings in the season opener at Auburn. McKinnon is ranked tied for ninth in the Sun Belt Conference in tackles with 7.5 per game, while McCray is 27th with 5.5 stops per game.

FORCING TURNOVERS: The Red Wolves posted one interception and a fumble recovery against Troy, giving them back-to-back games with at least one pick and two games this year with a fumble recovery (Auburn and Troy). Sophomore defensive back Tausean Holmes recorded his first career interception against the Trojans, while sophomore cornerback Chaz Scales posted his first career fumble recovery.

PLAYING IN THE BACKFIELD: Redshirt freshman defensive lineman Amos Draper recorded his second sack of the season and a career-high three tackles for loss against Troy. His two sacks are the second most on the team and his 5.5 tackles for loss rank not only second in the Sun Belt Conference, but also 55th in the nation.

SULLIVENT HAS CAREER GAME: Junior Neely Sullivent set new career highs for punting yards (258) and average yards per punt (43.0) against Troy, while also recording three punts inside the opponent's 20 to tie the most of his career. Sullivent also had two punts that traveled at least 50 yards against Troy, including a career-long 57 yarder. Prior to the Troy game, the longest punt of his career was 49 yards.

ZALUD STEPPING UP: True freshman kicker Bobby Zalud is ranked third in the Sun Belt Conference in scoring by kick despite not at-

tempting a field goal in the Red Wolves' season opener and last week against Troy. However, Zalud is 11-of-11 on extra point attempts and 3-of-5 on field goal attempts over the last three games to give him 20 points.

IN THE ZONE: The Arkansas State offense is almost perfect in the red zone, scoring on 15 of 16 opportunities for a 93.8 percentage. That percentage is ranked first in the SBC and 12th in the nation in red zone offense.

IN THE ZONE (PART II): The Arkansas State defense is second in the Sun Belt Conference and 11th in the nation in red zone defense, holding opponents to a 63.2 scoring percentage. A-State's four opponents this season have turned just 12 of their combined 19 red zone opportunities into points (9 TD, 3 FG).

BIG PLAY: Arkansas State has run 24 plays (6.0 per game) this season that have covered at least 20 yards, including eight last week against Troy and a season-high nine against Louisiana-Lafayette. The Red Wolves have already ran four plays that covered at least 53 yards with a long play of 65 yards (Ryan Aplin pass to Taylor Stockemer) against ULL.

MUSE CONTINUING TO PUT UP BIG NUMBERS: Allen Muse caught a career-high seven passes for 119 yards and his first career touchdown last week against Troy, two weeks after

posting five receptions for a career-high 133 yards against UL Lafayette. Muse's 133 receiving yards against the Ragin' Cajuns were the 21st most in school history for a single game. The last time an A-State player had recorded more receiving yards was in 2000.

NCAA HIGH: Ryan Aplin's school-record 438 passing yards against Louisiana-Lafayette remains the most by any NCAA FBS player this season. T.J. Yates of North Carolina has the second highest total with 412 yards passing against LSU on Sept. 4. Aplin's 438 yards not only broke the ASU single-game record, but also tied UCF's Daunte Culpepper's total in 1998 for the most ever by an opponent at Cajun Field.

APLIN NOTABLES: Ryan Aplin is ranked first in the Sun Belt Conference in total offense (335.5 ypg) and second in passing yards (299.0 ypg). He is also ranked fifth in the nation in total offense and ninth in passing yards. Aplin has thrown for at least 237 yards in every game this season and has posted a completion total that that ranks among the top 10 in school history at both Auburn (28, tied for 3rd most) and ULL (25, tied for sixth most).

300-PLUS: Arkansas State posted at least 366 yards of total offense in each of its first four games, marking the first time since its last four games of the 2008 season to do so. The last time A-State posted over 300 yards of total offense in five straight games was games 3-7 of the 2008 campaign as well. The Red Wolves recorded over 300 yards of offense in six games last season. ASU is currently ranked second in the SBC and 29th in the nation in total offense with 436 yards per game.

APLIN EARNS SBC HONOR FOR SECOND STRAIGHT WEEK: Sophomore quarterback Ryan Aplin was named the Sun Belt Conference Co-Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 20, marking the second straight week he earned the league's offensive honor. Aplin recorded 318 yards of total offense with a rushing and passing touchdown against ULM, while he threw for a school-record 438 yards and two touchdowns the week prior against Louisiana-Lafayette.

RIVALS.COM RECOGNIZES APLIN: Rivals.com recognized sophomore quarterback Ryan Aplin for his play against ULM, naming him its Sun Belt Conference Player of the Week following the Red Wolves game against the Warhawks.

JENNINGS AMONG CFPA WEEKLY WINNERS: Senior safety M.D. Jennings was selected a national Honorable Mention Defensive Back of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) for his outstanding play in the Red Wolves' 34-20 victory over Louisiana-Monroe. Jennings recorded six tackles and a career-high two interceptions against ULM. Jennings' six tackles were the third most on the team and he returned his two intercep-

tions a career-best 62 yards.

JENNINGS TAKES WEEKLY SBC AWARD:

Senior safety M.D. Jennings was named the Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 6 for his performance against nationally-ranked Auburn. Jennings posted double-figure tackles (11), including a career-high 1.5 tackles for loss, in a game for the fourth time of his career. He also recorded his second career forced fumble, fourth fumble recovery of his career and his third career sack.

ANOTHER TV GAME: The Arkansas State Athletic Department announced last week that ESPN selected the Arkansas State-Louisville football game scheduled for 6:00 p.m., Oct. 2 at ASU Stadium to be televised exclusively on ESPN3.com. The addition of the Louisville game gives the Red Wolves an ASU record-tying eight televised games during the 2010 season and sets a new record for five consecutive games televised.

BIG BLOCK: Sophomore defensive end Tim Starson recorded a career-high three blocked kicks against ULM to tie the most in school history for a single game. Starson blocked two extra points and a field goal to tie Stacy Price's total against UT Arlington in 1981 and Clevon Johnson's total against UT Martin in 1980.

NICE CROWD: The crowd of 23,176 in attendance for ASU's home opener against ULM was the ninth largest ever at ASU Stadium. Out of the 17 crowds of over 20,000 all-time at ASU Stadium, 12 have been played within the last 10 years. The top three attendance averages at ASU Stadium for a single season have all been set over the last four seasons.

EARLY START TO CONFERENCE PLAY:

Prior to this season, the earliest A-State had ever played a Sun Belt Conference opponent was the third game of the season (Troy in 2009). A-State has not played three of its first four games against league foes since the 1995 season when it was a member of the Big West Conference. ASU's first three SBC games include outings against two of the top four teams in the conference's preseason coaches poll (UL Lafayette, 4th; Troy, 2nd).

NEW FACES: Twenty-three players competed in their first career game at A-State over the first four games, including four true freshmen, eight redshirt freshmen, two sophomores, seven junior-college transfers (all juniors) and two juniors Additionally, 10 players started their first career game at ASU, including Dorvus Woods (DL), Justin Robertson (DE), Walter Moody (CB), Darron Edwards (CB), Tim Starson (DE), Greg McCall (DL), Najel Byrd (LB) and Tausean Holmes (DB) on defense and Anthony Robinson (WR) and Dwayne Frampton (WR) on offense.

96th SEASON UNDER WAY: Arkansas State kicked off its 96th season of football on Sept. 4 at nationally-ranked Auburn. ASU holds a 413-

446-37 record since the inaugural 1911 season and has played in seven bowl games. A-State did not field a football team from 1942-44 due to World War II. ASU also didn't have a team in 1918 as World War I was ending.

HOME OPENERS: With a 34-20 win over ULM two weeks ago, Arkansas State improved to 8-1 in home openers at ASU Stadium under head coach Steve Roberts. A-State has now won its last six home openers. In addition to ULM, Roberts' teams have also won home openers over Mississippi Valley State (61-0 in 2009), Texas Southern (83-10 in 2008), SMU (45-28 in 2007), Tulsa (21-19 in 2002), Tennessee-Martin (63-6 in 2003 and 56-7 in 2005) and Army (14-6 in 2006).

STRESSING ACADEMICS: The Arkansas State football team won the Sun Belt Conference Team Academic Award for the 2009-10 academic year, marking the seventh time over the last eight years it has accomplished the feat.

THE TOP 25: Auburn was the 12th ASU opponent ranked among the nation's top 25 teams at the time of a game with the Red Wolves under head coach Steve Roberts. Following is a list of ranked opponents that ASU has played under Roberts:

PRESEASON ALL-SBC ACCOLADES: Three Arkansas State football players were tabbed Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference, including Defensive Player of the Year **Bryan Hall**, of-

fensive lineman **Derek Newton** and linebacker **Demario Davis**.

PRESEASON PREDICTIONS: The Red Wolves are predicted to finish third in the conference according to the league's 2009 preseason coaches poll, announced July 19 as part of the Sun Belt Conference Media Days. ASU received 53 points, while first-place Middle Tennessee won the vote with 75 points.

STRONG D: Arkansas State has ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the Sun Belt Conference and among the top 50 teams in the nation each of the last four years in total defense. Below is a breakdown of ASU's defensive statistical rankings for the last four years:

NATIONAL COVERAGE: Arkansas State will play at least two nationally televised games for the second consecutive year in 2010. The Red Wolves will catch Middle Tennessee at home on Nov. 2 in a game televised by ESPN2 and Navy on the road on Nov. 20 in a game televised by CBS College Sports. Prior to last season, the last time ASU had played a nationally televised game was in the 2005 New Orleans Bowl.

TELEVISION TIME: Arkansas State currently has eight televised games scheduled for the regular season, tying the most in school history. A-State played eight regular-season games on television last season as well. The Red Wolves have four league games (UL Lafayette, ULM, Troy, FAU) televised on the Sun Belt Network, while the Auburn game was carried by Fox Sports South. The Louisville game will be carried by ESPN3.com, while the Middle Tennessee game by ESPN2 and the Navy game by CBS College Sports.

TURF INSTALLATION COMPLETED: Installation of a new and state-of-the-art field turf surface inside ASU stadium was completed as scheduled after a final inspection of the project was conducted in late July. The field is in practice and playing condition for the beginning of the Red Wolves fall camp today. The new Geo-Surfaces field turf is slightly thicker than the previous product, which was installed when ASU originally transitioned from a grass field to an artificial playing surface prior to the 2006 season. The field also has a sand base for the first time in addition to the "no fly-out" rubber installed. The field also has a new look with two new Red Wolves logos, white Sun Belt Conference logos and black trim around the outside of the playing field.

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH STEVE ROBERTS



Not long after leading Arkansas State to the 2005 Sun Belt Conference championship and New Orleans Bowl, head coach Steve Roberts continues to make ASU a dominant force in the Sun Belt Conference and has ASU on track for continued success in the upcoming years.

When the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year took over the program in December 2001, he impressed everyone with his wide-eyed enthusiasm

and limitless energy. And, most of all, they believed that Roberts would bring success to the ASU football program. Roberts has been the driving force behind ASU's recent success, leading the football program to its most victories over an eight-year span since 1985-92.

Roberts came to Arkansas State University and brought with him a fresh enthusiasm, energy, and an "I Will" philosophy that has been adopted by everyone associated with the program.

"I Will" became the rallying cry as Roberts and his staff charged ahead through a grueling 13-game schedule in 13 weeks with no open date in his inaugural season and came within 11 points of winning the Sun Belt Conference championship and playing in the Sun Belt Conference prize—the New Orleans Bowl.

ASU ended the season with a record of 6-7 and finished third in the league rankings. That tied the most wins since rejoining Division I-A in 1992. The Red Wolves finished in the top ten turnarounds by Division I-A football schools for improving football records after finishing 2-9 in 2001.

Under Roberts' direction, ASU continues to add to the achievements that began upon his arrival. Not only did ASU represent the Sun Belt Conference in the 2005 New Orleans Bowl, it claimed its first league championship since 1986. Arkansas State went undefeated at home that season and is now 29-10 all-time at ASU Stadium under Roberts. The bowl appearance was ASU's first since playing in the 1970 Pecan Bowl.

ASU has been bowl eligible three of the last five seasons and the last four Roberts' coached teams backed up the 2005 Sun Belt championship with non-conference victories over teams such as Army, Memphis, SMU and Texas A&M. The Red Wolves' 2008 win over the Aggies was one of the biggest wins in school history as ASU picked up its first victory over a BCS conference school since joining the FBS.

The Red Wolves have finished among the top three teams in the Sun Belt Conference four times, but ASU has also been competitive during Roberts' tenure against the nation's elite teams. ASU fell to then-ranked No. 25 Memphis by just 12 points in 2004, No. 4 Texas by eight points in 2007 and No. 13 Iowa by three points in 2009.

In addition to the 2002 and 2008 teams, the 2005 and 2006 squads both posted six wins to mark the first time since the 1986 and 1987 seasons the Red Wolves recorded at least six victories in back-to-back seasons. Roberts already holds the fifth most wins among ASU's 26 all-time head and needs just 12 more victories to move into second on the list.

The 2008 Roberts' coached team holds the all-time school record for single-season offense and the ASU defense has ranked

No. 1 or No. 2 in the Sun Belt Conference each of the last four seasons.

Over the last eight years, ASU has picked up 70 all-conference selections, including at least 10 four of the last five years. ASU had 11 players named all-conference in 2008, its most ever as a member of the SBC. The Red Wolves placed 10 players on the list in 2002, 2005 and 2006, and nine in 2007.

Roberts has coached a Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year, Offensive Player of the Year, two Defensive Player of the Year winners and a Newcomer of the Year.

The Red Wolves have had four NFL draft picks under Roberts, including David Johnson in 2009, Tyrell Johnson in 2008, Oren O'Neal in 2007 and Corey Williams in 2004. Johnson was a second-round selection and the third highest drafted player in ASU history. Alex Carrington, the 2008 Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Year, is also expected by many experts to be a high draft selection in 2010. Additionally, 13 ASU players have either been drafted or signed NFL free agent contracts since Roberts' first season in 2002.

With five Sun Belt Conference Team Academic Awards, Roberts has made academics a priority as well for the Red Wolves. ASU consistently places a large number of players on the ASU Athletic Director's Honor Roll and Sun Belt Conference Academic Honor Roll. The most recent ASU AD's Honor Roll saw 45 football players make the list.

Attendance has show significant improvement during the Roberts era. ASU has drawn a crowd of over 20,000 in 15 games all-time at ASU Stadium and six of those have come over the last nine games. Of those 15 games, 11 have been played with Roberts as head coach.

A stadium-record crowd was of 30,427 was on hand to watch ASU play Memphis in 2004, and ASU set the best average attendance mark of 21,105 in 2008.

During his tenure, ASU has upgraded its facilities with a new training room, weight room, locker room, recruiting room and state-of-the-art ProGreen turf on the field.

Roberts was named Arkansas State's 26th head football coach on December 21, 2001, to bring full circle his coaching odyssey from his home state through Louisiana and back. But, the trek has been a successful one, including an 8-4 record and national ranking in Division I-AA in 2000 at Northwestern (La.) State.


Roberts spent two seasons at NSU, where he and his staff and team took on a tough schedule which included a 27-24 overtime upset at TCU. While at NSU, Roberts was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award. Prior to going to NSU, Roberts served as the head coach and defensive coordinator at Southern Arkansas University in Magnolia from 1994-99. While there, his 1997 team won the Gulf South Championship, earning him Gulf South Coach of the Year honors. The Muleriders finished with a cumulative record of 26-5 from 1997-99, including 9-1 in 1999, 8-2 in 1998 and 9-2 in 1997.

During that span, his teams enjoyed top conference rankings in scoring offense, scoring defense, total offense and total defense. At SAU, he also served as the defensive secondary coach and recruiting coordinator from 1990-94 before being named head coach. Academically, his program ranked first in academic achievements in the Gulf South Conference three seasons.

Roberts, an avid fisherman, graduated from Robinson High School in Little Rock. A 1987 graduate of Ouachita Baptist University, where he was an Academic All-American, Roberts received his masters from SAU in 1989. He and his wife Sherri have one daughter – Abby (14).

ROBERTS' ASU HIGHLIGHTS

- Roberts has led Arkansas State to its most victories over an eight-year span since 1985-92.
- Already holds the fifth most wins among ASU's 26 all-time head coaches.
- 2005 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year.
- Under Roberts, ASU has been bowl eligible three of the last five seasons.
- Holds non-conference victories over teams such as Tulsa, Army, SMU, Memphis and Texas A&M. The 2008 victory over the Aggies was one of the biggest wins in school history as ASU picked up its first victory over a BCS conference school since joining the FBS.
- Led ASU to the 2005 Sun Belt Conf. Championship, the Red Wolves' first league championship since 1986.
- The Red Wolves were undefeated at home in 2005 and are 30-10 at ASU Stadium under Roberts.
- ASU's 2005 New Orleans Bowl appearance was the first for ASU since the 1970 Pecan Bowl.
- Under Roberts the Red Wolves have picked up 70 all-conference selections, including at least 10 three of the last five years. ASU had 11 players named all-conference in 2008, its most ever as a member of the SBC. ASU placed 10 players on the list in 2002, 2005 and 2006 and nine in 2007.
- Roberts has coached a Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year, Offensive Player of the Year, two Defensive Player of the Year winners and a Newcomer of the Year. In 2006, he coached two players that were named to at least one Freshman All-America team.
- The Red Wolves finished in the top 10 turnarounds by a Division I-A school his first season at the helm, going from 2-9 in 2001 to 6-7 in 2002.
- The Red Wolves have won the Sun Belt Conference Team Academic Award seven of eight years under Roberts.

SEPTEMBER 4, AUBURN, ALA. (JORDAN HARE STADIUM - 83,441) - NO. 22 AUBURN 52, ARKANSAS STATE 26

AUBURN, Ala. (09/04/10) - Arkansas State sophomore quarterback Ryan Aplin passed for 278 yards and a touchdown, but the 22nd-ranked Auburn Tigers countered with 363 yards of total offense and five total scores from junior quarterback Cameron Newton and defeated the Red Wolves 52-26 before a crowd of 83,441 at Jordan-Hare Stadium in the season opener for both teams.

Aplin connected on 28 of his 42 passes on the night to seven receivers, with junior wide receiver Dwayne Frampton hauling in eight passes for 74 yards and a touchdown, and safety M.D. Jennings led the ASU defense with 11 tackles, including two for loss, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

Arkansas State got on the board first when Aplin passed complete across the middle to Frampton from 10 yards out for a Red Wolves touchdown at the 5:18 mark of the first quarter. The scoring strike was set up when Aplin found wide receiver Allen Muse alone down the right sideline for a 61-yard

gain on the first play of the drive, which covered 82 yards in six plays.

Auburn answered with a six-play 58-yard drive on its next possession that ended with a three-yard touchdown run from senior wideout Kodi Burns with 1:51 to go in the first quarter. Senior Wes Bynum added the extra point for the Tigers, giving Auburn a 7-6 lead after the extra point attempt following ASU's touchdown was no good.

Less than a minute later, Auburn made it 14-6 when Newton passed complete for a 36-yard touchdown to senior running back Mario Fannin with one minute to play in the opening quarter.

Auburn added a two-yard touchdown run from Newton with 9:43 remaining in the second quarter to stretch its lead to 21-6, but the Red Wolves answered with a 55-yard drive that ended with junior running back Jermaine Robertson's 13-yard touchdown run with 6:46 to go in the first half.

The Tigers used the big play to put two more touchdowns on the board before the break, getting a 48-yard scoring pass from Newton to wide receiver Quindarius Carr and a 71-yard touchdown run from Newton. A 26-yard field goal from ASU freshman Bryan Davis following Auburn's Newton-to-Carr touchdown left the Tigers with a 35-16 lead at the break.

Arkansas State's Nick Nelms recovered an Auburn fumble on the second half kickoff to set up an Arkansas State touchdown that pulled the Red Wolves trimmed the deficit 35-23. Nelms' recovery set up the Red Wolves offense at the Auburn 27, and ASU needed just five plays to find the end zone, scoring on an eight-yard touchdown run from junior running back Derek Lawson.

Auburn answered with a 38-yard touchdown pass from Newton to Fannin and a 24-yard field goal from Bynum on the final play of the third quarter to take a 45-23 lead into the final period of play.

Auburn's final score came on a two-yard touchdown run from freshman Michael Dyer midway through the fourth, and Davis added a 41-yard field goal for the Red Wolves with 4:16 remaining in the game to set the final score at 52-26.

In addition to the numbers from Aplin and Frampton, the Red Wolves also got 80 yards on four catches from Muse and six catches for 58 yards from sophomore Taylor Stockemer. Lawson tallied 45 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries to lead the ASU rushing effort. Holmes added seven tackles, including one for loss and forced a fumble for the A-State defense.

SEPTEMBER 11, LAFAYETTE, LA. (CAJUN FIELD - 15,103) - LOUISIANA-LAFAYETTE 31, ARKANSAS STATE 24

LAFAYETTE, La. (09/11/10) - A 31-7 fourth-quarter deficit proved to be too much to overcome as the Arkansas State Red Wolves suffered a 31-24 loss to the Ragin' Cajuns of Louisiana-Lafayette at Cajun Field in the Sun Belt Conference opener for both teams.

The Red Wolves trailed by 24 points early in the final period before reeling off 17 straight, but the rally fell short when ULL safety Maurice Rolle intercepted ASU sophomore quarterback Ryan Aplin with 1:59 remaining in the game to end A-State's final drive.

Aplin passed for a school-record 438 yards in the loss, completing 25 of 45 passes with two touchdowns passing and one rushing. Aplin's 438 yards also tied a Cajun Field record, matching former Central Florida quarterback Daunte Culpepper's mark set against ULL during the 1998 season. Sophomore wideout Alan Muse hauled in five passes for 133 yards from Aplin, the most yards for an ASU player since the 2000 season.

A pair of first-quarter scores from the Cajuns handed A-State an early 10-

point deficit.

Louisiana-Lafayette tailback Kevis Streeter went 69 yards on the Cajuns' first play from scrimmage to put ULL on the board early in the game, and a turnover deep in ASU territory set up the second Ragin' Cajun score. After ULL defensive back Melvin White recovered a Red Wolves fumble at the A-State 17, the Cajuns used a 27-yard field goal from Tyler Albrecht to take a 10-0 lead with 3:09 remaining in the first quarter.

Arkansas State answered on its next play from scrimmage when Aplin found wide receiver Taylor Stockemer alone across the middle for a 65-yard touchdown that cut the ULL lead to 10-7, but the Cajuns countered with three unanswered touchdowns to build a 31-7 cushion into the third quarter.

The Ragin' Cajuns took advantage of Arkansas State's second turnover to increase their lead to 17-7 midway through the second quarter. Louisiana-Lafayette took over at the ASU 32 following a fumbled punt return and got the touchdown on a six-yard pass from quarterback Chris Masson to tight end Ladarius Green with 7:11 remaining in the half.

A 47-yard touchdown pass from wide receiver Javone Lawson to wideout Andrew Joseph stretched the ULL lead to 24-7 with just over four minutes to play before the break.

Masson broke free for a 60-yard touchdown run late in the third quarter that gave the Ragin' Cajuns a 31-7 advantage before A-State freshman Bobby Zalud made it 31-10 with a 39-yard field goal with 13:24 remaining in the game.

Aplin scored on a five-yard touchdown run with 7:42 remaining that cut the ULL lead to 31-17, then passed for an 11-yard touchdown to wide receiver Anthony Robinson with 3:27 to play that trimmed the deficit to a touchdown, but Rolle's interception ended the Red Wolves' rally.

Defensively, the Red Wolves were led by linebacker Javon McKinnon's nine tackles, which was two short of his career high. Defensive lineman Bryan Hall added five stops, including one quarterback sack.

SEPTEMBER 18, JONESBORO, ARK. (ASU STADIUM - 23,176) - ARKANSAS STATE 34, LOUISIANA-MONROE 20

JONESBORO, Ark. (09/18/10) - Led by 318 total yards and two touchdowns from sophomore quarterback Ryan Aplin, the Arkansas State Red Wolves (1-2, 1-1) opened their 2010 home schedule with a 34-20 Sun Belt Conference victory over the Warhawks of Louisiana-Monroe (0-2, 0-1) Saturday night before 23,176 fans at ASU Stadium.

Aplin led a balanced ASU offense that finished with 474 yards on the night, with the Red Wolves gaining 234 yards on the ground and 240 through the air. Aplin completed 20 of 32 passes for 243 yards and a touchdown, while adding 75 more yards and a score on the ground. Safety M.D. Jennings intercepted two passes and logged six tackles to lead the Red Wolves' defensive effort.

Arkansas State churned out 180 yards in the opening quarter to put its two touchdowns on the board. The Red Wolves put together two 70-yard drives in the first period, capping the possessions with a 4-yard touchdown run from Aplin midway through the quarter and a 12-yard scoring run from tail-

back Derek Lawson with just over a minute remaining. Aplin accounted for 158 of the Red Wolves' yards in the first quarter, passing for 125 while rushing for an additional 33.

Arkansas State added another touchdown on its first possession of the second quarter, driving 80 yards in 10 plays and scoring when Aplin hooked up with wide receiver Dwayne Frampton from 34 yards out. Kicker Bobby Zalud added his third extra point of the night to give the Red Wolves a 21-0 advantage with 7:59 remaining before halftime.

The Warhawks got on the board three minutes later when ULM wrapped up a 77-yard drive with a 33-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Kolton Browning to wideout Brent Leonard. Arkansas State's Tim Starson blocked the Warhawk extra point attempt, leaving the Red Wolves with a 21-6 advantage that held until halftime, but ULM answered the second half bell with an 80-yard drive that ended in a four-yard touchdown run from quarterback Zach Rhodes. Browning passed complete to wide receiver Anthony McCall on the two-point conversion attempt to cut the A-State lead to 21-14 at the

10:49 mark of the third quarter.

Arkansas State responded with a 75-yard drive that ended in quarterback Phillip Butterfield's one-yard scoring run. Butterfield's touchdown gave the Red Wolves a two-touchdown cushion at 28-14 with just over five minutes to play in the third period.

Louisiana-Monroe drove deep into ASU territory on its next possession, but A-State stopped the drive when safety M.D. Jennings snagged his second interception of the night, picking off the Browning pass at the ASU goal line and returning it 20 yards to give the Red Wolves possession. Arkansas State capitalized on the turnover with a 37-yard field goal from Zalud with 9:31 remaining in the game.

The Warhawks added a touchdown at the 5:38 mark to trim the ASU advantage to 31-20. Browning connected with wide receiver Luther Ambrose on the scoring pass, but Starson again came up with the block on the extra point attempt, leaving ULM with the 11-point deficit.

Zalud added his second field goal of the night, this time from 24 yards out with 2:25 remaining to set the final score at 34-20.

Frampton hauled in a team-high eight passes for 83 yards and a touchdown, Lawson rushed for 52 yards on 10 carries and Butterfield added 49 yards on eight carries to go along with Aplin's offensive statistics. Linebacker Nathan Herrold and defensive back Tausean Holmes each added eight tackles for the ASU defense.

GAME 4

SEPTEMBER 25, TROY, ALA. (VETERANS MEMORIAL STADIUM - 16,320) - TROY 35, ARKANSAS STATE 28

TROY, Ala. (09/25/10) — Troy quarterback Corey Robinson's 17-yard touchdown pass to running back Shawn Southward with 22 seconds remaining wiped out a fourth quarter Arkansas State comeback and gave the Trojans a 35-28 victory over the Red Wolves in Sun Belt Conference action at Veterans Memorial Stadium.

Arkansas State trailed 27-14 when Troy's Michael Taylor booted a 43-yard field goal with 14:14 remaining, but the Red Wolves scored two touchdowns in the final 10 minutes, including a 30-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Ryan Aplin to wideout Allen Muse with 50 seconds to play that gave the Red Wolves a 28-27 advantage.

The game was delayed by almost two hours by lightning when the field was cleared with 3:04 remaining in the second quarter and with Arkansas State trailing 21-7. The delay lasted one hour and forty-five minutes, and the Red Wolves were able to cut the Trojan lead to a touchdown when play resumed, then held Troy to a pair of field goals until Southward's touchdown

in the waning seconds turned back the ASU rally.

Aplin finished the night with 89 yards rushing and 237 yards and two touchdowns through the air, with Muse hauling in seven passes for 119 yards and a score.

Troy struck early for its first touchdown, using a 70-yard touchdown pass from Robinson to slotback Jerrel Jernigan on the Trojans first possession to jump out to a 7-0 lead less than a minute into the game.

Arkansas State answered with an 11-play, 74-yard drive to tie the score with 6:31 remaining in the first quarter. Running back Derek Lawson scored from two yards out to put the Red Wolves on the board and placekicker Bobby Zalud added the extra point to tie the game at 7-7.

Troy regained the lead when the Trojans moved 92 yards in 15 plays, scoring on a three-yard pass from quarterback Jamie Hampton to wideout Tebrius Gill with 42 seconds remaining in the first quarter, then stretched its lead to 21-7 when running back Chris Anderson scored on a four-yard run midway through the second period.

Arkansas State came out of the lightning delay and marched 54 yards to pull within a touchdown. Running back Jermaine Robertson covered the distance in three plays, including a touchdown run of 14 yards that cut the Troy lead to 21-14 with 1:24 remaining in the second quarter.

Troy used a 27-yard field goal from Michael Taylor with 22 seconds remaining in the second quarter to go up 24-14, then made it 27-14 when Taylor connected from 43 yards out with 14:14 to play in the fourth quarter.

The Red Wolves countered with a 10-play, 78-yard touchdown drive that cut the Troy lead to six at 27-21. Aplin ignited the drive with a 40-yard run to the Troy 38, and seven plays later, hit tight end Kedric Murry in the back of the end zone with a four-yard touchdown pass with 9:26 remaining.

The Red Wolves defense did not allow a first down on the ensuing Troy possession, and ASU took over at its 35 with 8:53 remaining, but could only drive as far as the Troy 31 before turning it over on downs with 5:46 to play.

Arkansas State again held the Trojans without a first down on the next Troy possession and took over at the ASU 23 with 3:56 remaining. The Red Wolves moved down the field in 11 plays, taking the 28-27 lead on Muse's touchdown before Troy answered with the winning score.

Safety Kelcie McCray posted a career-best 12 tackles, and line-backer Javon McKinnon added a career-best 12 stops to lead the ASU defense.

Take exit 23B/Marked Tree/Jonesboro onto US-61 for 0.5 miles. Continue on US-63 North for 41 miles. Take ramp toward Caraway Road/Stadium Boulevard for 0.2 miles. Bear right on Stadium Boulevard and go 2.2 miles until seeing ASU Stadium on the left. Parking is available for the working media on the northwest grass lot of the stadium complex.

From Little Rock National Airport: Leaving the airport on East Roosevelt Road go 0.3 miles and continue on Annie M. Bankhead Drive for another 0.4 miles.
