THE PRINCIPALS: Arkansas State will play its fifth conference game of the season Saturday and will be televised by the Sun Belt Network for the fourth time this year. Saturday's contest has been designated a Sun Belt Conference 10-Year Anniversary game and will feature a special presentation by SBC Commissioner Wright Waters saluting Arkansas State for its membership in the league. The Red Wolves will carry a 2-2 Sun Belt Conference record into the game, while FAU is still searching for its first league win with an 0-2 mark.

HEAD COACH STEVE ROBERTS: Arkansas State head coach Steve Roberts is in his ninth year at Arkansas State after leading the Red Wolves to the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Championship and to bowl eligible seasons three of the last five years. During his first eight seasons as the Red Wolves' head coach, he guided ASU to 41 wins for its most over an eight-year span at the school since 1985-1992. Roberts was named the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year. Under Roberts, the Red Wolves have had 70 All-Sun Belt Conference selections, a Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year, SBC Offensive Player of the Year, two SBC Defensive Players of the Year and an SBC Newcomer of the Year.

DOUBLE DUTY: A-State head coach Steve Roberts is one of just 12 coaches in the FBS that in addition to handling responsibilities as a head coach, also works as a position coach. Roberts has coached special teams since his arrival at ASU in 2002. Below is a list of head coaches in the FBS who also are position coaches:

ROBERTS CLIMBING VICTORIES LADDER:

Through his first eight-plus seasons as the Red Wolves head coach, Steve Roberts already has the fifth most victories among ASU's 26 all-time head coaches with 43 wins. Larry Lacewell (1979-89) holds the record for victories with 69 and is followed by Bennie Ellender (1963-70) with 52 wins, Bill Davidson (1971-78) with 51 and Forrest England (1946-53) with 49.

ROBERTS AND ASU STADIUM: Arkansas State head coach Steve Roberts has led the Red Wolves to a 30-11 record at ASU Stadium over the last eight years for .731 winning percentage. Not only that, the Red Wolves are 21-6 at ASU Stadium over the last six seasons . . . Arkansas State is 15-4 in home conference games since 2005, its only setbacks coming against Troy in 2007 and 2009, Middle Tennessee in 2006 and Louisiana-Lafayette in 2009. The Red Wolves are 21-8 in home conference games all-time under Roberts.

ROBERTS IN CLOSE GAMES: Ninth-year skipper Steve Roberts has seen numerous close games during his tenure with the Red Wolves, holding a 24-20 record in games decided by eight

THE ARKANSAS STATE-FLORIDA ATLANTIC SERIES: Arkansas State trails Florida Atlantic 3-2 in the all-time series that dates back to the 2005 season, but is 2-0 against the Owls at ASU Stadium. The Red Wolves defeated Florida Atlantic 28-14 in Jonesboro in 2008 and won a 3-0 overtime game at ASU Stadium in 2005. FAU's three wins over ASU came 35-18 last season, 34-31 in 2007 and 29-0 in 2006.

THE LAST TIME vs. FLORIDA ATLANTIC: BOCA RATON, Fla. (11/14/09) - The Arkansas State football team dropped its third-straight contest, falling in Sun Belt Conference action at Florida Atlantic 35-18.

ASU led at the half by two points, 9-7, with senior placekicker Josh Arauco scoring a field goal from 22 yards out with 1:03 remaining in the half. Arauco also connected on 19 and 35 yard field goals in the first half and tied his career high by hitting his fourth with 8:18 remaining in the fourth quarter.

However, FAU scored 21 unanswered points to start the second half to take a 28-9 lead with 12:31

left in the game.

In the first start of his career, then-redshirt freshman quarterback Ryan Aplin connected with freshman wide receiver Taylor Stockemer for each player's first career passing or receiving touchdown and the only touchdown for the Red Wolves in the contest with 42-seconds remaining in the fourth quarter.

Aplin completed the game with 168 passing yards completing 20 of 26 passes with no interceptions. He also led the team with 82 yards on the ground. ASU had 344 total yards of offense with a balanced attack of runs and passes with 176 on the ground and 168 through the air.

Then a sophomore, running back Derek Lawson had 62-yards for ASU averaging 7.4 yards per carry with a long run of 26 yards. Nathan Herrold led the team with 11 tackles.

ARKANSAS STATE vs. THE SUN BELT CONFERENCE: Arkansas State is 61-61-1 all-time against current members of the Sun Belt Conference. Since the league's inaugural football season in 2001, the Red Wolves are 32-34 against all opponents that have been a member of the league. Against current members of the conference.

ence, ASU is 27-30 since 2001. The Red Wolves hold their most all-time victories against Louisiana-Lafayette with 17, while its most victories against a Sun Belt opponent since 2001 is Louisiana-Monroe with six. The Red Wolves have defeated every team in the Sun Belt Conference since the football league was formed in 2001.

AN A-STATE VICTORY WOULD . . .: Give ASU back-to-back Sun Belt Conference victories for the first time since the last two games of the 2009 season . . . Improve ASU's record at ASU Stadium to 2-1 this season and 31-11 all-time under head coach Steve Roberts . . . Move ASU above .500 in league play after five games for the first time since 2008 . . . Even ASU's all-time record against FAU to 3-3.

RANKING COMPARISON: Arkansas State enters Saturday's game ranked No. 2 in scoring offense and No. 2 in total offense and passing offense, while Florida Atlantic has the league's No. 1 scoring defense and passing defense and No. 3 ranked total defense. ASU's offense is averaging 402.7 yards per game, while FAU is allowing 380.6 yards per game.

SBC WEEKLY HONORS: The Red Wolves have had three players earn one of the Sun Belt Conference's weekly honors five times. Sophomore quarterback Ryan Aplin has been named the league's offensive player of the week three times, while senior safety M.D. Jennings and senior linebacker Javon McKinnon have both been recognized as the defensive player of the week once.

TALE OF TWO HALVES: Arkansas State has outscored its opponent in at least one half in every game this season except for its season opener at Auburn. Below is a breakdown of the scoring for ASU in each half of its last five games:

OFFENSIVE NOTES

APLIN EARNS WEEKLY SBC HONOR: Ryan Aplin was named the Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Week on Monday, earning the weekly honor for the third time this year after recording two passing touchdowns, a pair of rushing scores and 298 yards of total offense during the Red Wolves' game against Indiana last Saturday . . . Aplin was responsible for a career-best four touchdowns, which is also the most by any Sun Belt player this season. . . . Aplin passed for 275 yards, his third most in a game this year, and added 23 rushing yards to complete the game with 298 yards of total offense.

SCHOOL RECORDS FALL: Ryan Aplin and Dwayne Frampton rewrote the ASU single-game record book last week at Indiana. Aplin completed a school-record 33 passes, topping the previous record of 32 set by Johnny Covington against San Jose State in 1995. Frampton recorded a school-record 12 receptions, topping the old record of 11 set by Robert Kilow against Mississippi in 1999.

DUAL THREAT: Not only does Ryan Aplin have 12 passing touchdowns, he has also recorded six rushing touchdowns for the most by an ASU quarterback since 2002. Aplin's 12 passing touchdowns are just four shy of the school record, and the last time an ASU quarterback rushed for seven or more touchdowns in a season was 1991 when Roy Johnson found the end zone 12 times.

THORNTON FINDS THE END ZONE: True freshman running back Sirgregory Thornton recorded his first two career touchdowns at ASU last week, picking up a six-yard rushing score and a 22-yard receiving touchdown. Thornton finished the game with four receptions for 54 yards, both career highs. He set his career-high rushing mark two games earlier against Louisville, running for 78 yards against the Cardinals.

record at least one reception against Indiana, matching its season-high total previously set against both Auburn and Louisiana-Lafayette. Through just seven games, A-State has already had 16 players haul in at least one pass this year. A-State's 16 players with a reception is its most since the 2006 campaign when 18 players caught at least one pass. ASU has completed at least one pass to six players in every game this year.

CATCH AFTER CATCH: Junior wide receiver Dwayne Frampton has either tied or led A-State in receptions in four of its seven games played, including its last outing at Indiana. Frampton has a team-high 40 receptions that is just seven shy of the most by any ASU player for all of last season. He has caught multiple passes in every game.

20 SOMETHING: Arkansas State has scored at least 24 points in each of its first seven games and is averaging 27.7 points a game, which ranks second in the Sun Belt Conference. The last time A-State scored 20 or more points in seven consecutive games was the 1987 season when it actually did so in eight straight outings.

IN THE ZONE: The Arkansas State offense is almost perfect in the red zone, scoring on 24 of 26 opportunities for a 92.3 percentage. That percentage is ranked first in the SBC and sixth in the

nation in red zone offense. ASU's 24 scores in the red zone consist of 19 touchdowns and five field goals.

BIG PLAY: Arkansas State has run 37 plays (5.2 per game) this season that have covered at least 20 yards, including a season-high nine against Louisiana-Lafayette. The Red Wolves have run four plays that covered at least 53 yards with a long play of 65 yards (Ryan Aplin pass to Taylor Stockemer) against ULL.

300-PLUS: Arkansas State posted at least 327 yards of total offense in each of its first seven games, marking the first time since the 2008 season it has compiled over 300 yards of offense in seven consecutive outings. The last time ASU recorded 300-plus yards of total offense in eight straight games was 1996 when it did so in nine consecutive outings. The Red Wolves recorded over 300 yards of offense in six games for all of last season.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

KNOCK IT DOWN: Junior cornerback Darron Edwards recorded a career-high four pass break-ups last game against Indiana, which also ties the most

in the nation for a single game. Edward's leads the Sun Belt Conference and is ranked 32nd in the nation in passes defended with eight to his credit (1.14 per game). Edwards has posted at least one pass break-up in five games this season.

McKINNON HAS STRONG OUTING: Senior line-backer Javon McKinnon recorded eight tackles, including one tackle for loss, forced a fumble and recovered a fumble in ASU's game against Indiana. McKinnon's eight tackles tied the second most on the team and increased his team-leading season total to 58, which is also the second most in the Sun Belt Conference. He recorded at least eight tackles in a game for the fourth time this season. His tackle for loss gives him 3.5 for the year sewell. The game marked the second time this season and fourth time of his career he recovered a fumble, while he now has three forced fumbles for his career.

CONFERENCE DEFENSE: While Arkansas State is ranked ninth in the Sun Belt Conference in total defense for all games combined, it is ranked fifth in league games only. The Red Wolves statistically

had their best defensive performance against North Texas two games ago, holding the Mean Green to a season-low 292 yards of total offense that was also the fewest yards allowed by ASU this year.

FORCING TURNOVERS: The Red Wolves posted two fumble recoveries against Indiana, giving them four straight games and five games total with a fumble recovery (Auburn, Troy, Louisville, North Texas, Indiana). ASU also has four interceptions in three games this year. While the Red Wolves didn't intercept a pass the last two games, they had at least one pick in the three previous games.

PLAYING IN THE BACKFIELD: Junior defensive lineman Dorvus Woods recorded 1.0 tackle for loss against Indiana and has 4.5 over the last three games to climb to 10th in the Sun Belt Conference in the stat with 5.5 total. Also ranked among the top players in the league in tackles for loss is redshirt freshman Amos Draper (ranked 7th with a team-high six).

IN THE ZONE (PART II): The Arkansas State defense is second in the Sun Belt Conference and tied for 12th in the nation in red zone defense, holding opponents to a 69.7 scoring percentage. A-State's seven opponents this season have turned just 23 of their combined 33 red zone opportunities into points (13 TD, 10 FG).

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

NEAR SCHOOL RECORD: Arkansas State recorded 223 kickoff return yards last week against Indiana, the second most in school history behind only the 227 yards posted against Louisiana-Lafayette in 2007. The 223 yards are also the second most this season by a Sun Belt Conference team. ASU had three returns of over 50 yards, in-

cluding two by Rod Hall and one by R.J. Fleming.

BIG RETURNS: Junior wide receiver and return specialist Rod Hall returned four kickoffs for a career-high 158 yards, the sixth most in school history and the most by an ASU player since 2007, in the Red Wolves' game against Indiana. Hall averaged 39.5 yards per return, the second highest by a Sun Belt Conference player this season. He returned his first kickoff a career-best 71 yards to Indiana's 26-yard line, setting up ASU's second touchdown after Indiana had pulled within 7-6 of ASU's lead. Not only was Hall's 71 yard return the longest by an ASU player since 2001, he later added a 50-yard kickoff return to give him two returns in the same game that rank among the top three this year by an ASU player. His 158 return yards gives him 571 for the season, the second most in the Sun Belt Conference and the sixth most in school history. He is also now averaging 24.8 yards per return, the highest average in the league.

SULLIVENT HONORED: Junior Neely Sullivent has been selected a national Honorable Mention Punter of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) after averaging a careerbest 47.2 yards per punt during the Red Wolves' game against Indiana last Saturday . . . Indiana was unable to return any of Sullivent's four punts that traveled a combined 189 vards and was pinned inside its own 20-yard line three times by ASU's punt-coverage team. Sullivent's three punts inside the Hoosiers' 20-yard line matched his career high and his 47.2 average was almost two yards higher than the best cumulative average held by a Sun Belt Conference player this season . . Sullivent had two punts of at least 50 yards, including a career long of 61 yards, that gave him six total for the year. He now has 10 punts inside the opponent's 20-yard line, tying the second most this year by a Sun Belt Conference player.

ARCHIVED NOTES

McKINNON NAMED SBC DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK: Senior linebacker Javon McKinnon was named the Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Week on Oct. 4 after recording a career-high 16 tackles, including a career-best two tackles for loss, against Louisville. McKinnon's 16 tackles were the most by a Sun Belt Conference player since the 2008 season, the most by an ASU player since former SBC Defensive Player of the Year Tyrell Johnson posted 25 against North Texas in 2005 and tied the 14th most in the nation this year. His 16 stops were also just four shy of the seventh most in school history.

APLIN EARNS SBC HONOR FOR SECOND STRAIGHT WEEK: Sophomore quarterback Ryan Aplin was named the Sun Belt Conference Co-Offensive Player of the Week on Sept. 20, marking the second straight week he earned the league's offensive honor. Aplin recorded 318 yards of total offense with a rushing and passing touchdown against ULM, while he threw for a school-record 438 yards and two touchdowns the week prior against Louisiana-Lafayette.

RIVALS.COM RECOGNIZES APLIN: Rivals.com recognized sophomore quarterback Ryan Aplin for

his play against ULM, naming him its Sun Belt Conference Player of the Week following the Red Wolves game against the Warhawks.

JENNINGS AMONG CFPA WEEKLY WINNERS: Senior safety M.D. Jennings was selected a national Honorable Mention Defensive Back of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) for his outstanding play in the Red Wolves' 34-20 victory over Louisiana-Monroe. Jennings recorded six tackles and a career-high two interceptions against ULM. Jennings' six tackles were the third most on the team and he returned his two interceptions a career-best 62

JENNINGS TAKES WEEKLY SBC AWARD: Senior safety M.D. Jennings was named the Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Week on Sept. 6 for his performance against nationally-ranked Auburn. Jennings posted double-figure tackles (11), including a career-high 1.5 tackles for loss, in a game for the fourth time of his career. He also recorded his second career forced fumble, fourth fumble recovery of his career and his third career sack

BIG BLOCK: Sophomore defensive end Tim Starson recorded a career-high three blocked kicks against ULM to tie the most in school history for a single game. Starson blocked two extra points and a field goal to tie Stacy Price's total against UT Arlington in 1981 and Clevon Johnson's total against UT Martin in 1980.

NICE CROWD: The crowd of 25,219 for the Louisville game was the fifth largest in ASU Stadium history. The Red Wolves also drew a crowd of 23,176 for their home opener against ULM, which is the 10th largest ever at ASU Stadium. Out of the 18 crowds of over 20,000 all-time at ASU Stadium, 13 have been played within the last 10 years. The top three attendance averages at ASU Stadium for a single season have all been set over the last four seasons.

MOST YARDS IN A DECADE: Sophomore wide receiver Allen Muse posted five receptions for a career-high 133 yards against UL Lafayette in the Red Wolves' second game of the season. Muse's 133 receiving yards against the Ragin' Cajuns were the 21st most in school history for a single game. The last time an A-State player had more receiving yards was in 2000.

STILL RANKED AMONG THE TOP IN THE NCAA: Ryan Aplin's school-record 438 passing yards against Louisiana-Lafayette are still the fifth most by any NCAA FBS player this season. Aplin's 438 yards not only broke the ASU singlegame record, but also tied UCF's Daunte Culpepper's total in 1998 for the most ever by an opponent at Caiun Field.

NEW FACES: Twenty-four players competed in their first career game at A-State over the first four games, including four true freshmen, nine redshirt freshmen, two sophomores, seven junior-college transfers (all juniors) and two juniors Additionally, 13 players started their first career game at ASU, including Dorvus Woods (DL), Justin Robertson (DE), Darryl Feemster (DB), Amos Draper (DL), Walter Moody (CB), Darron Edwards (CB), Tim Starson(DE), Greg McCall (DL), Najel

Byrd (LB), Brandon Joiner (LB) and Tausean Holmes (DB) on defense and Anthony Robinson (WR) and Dwayne Frampton (WR) on offense.

96th SEASON UNDER WAY: Arkansas State kicked off its 96th season of football on Sept. 4 at nationally-ranked Auburn. ASU holds a 414-448-37 record since the inaugural 1911 season and has played in seven bowl games. A-State did not field a football team from 1942-44 due to World War II. ASU also didn't have a team in 1918 as World War I was ending.

HOME OPENERS: With a 34-20 win over ULM, Arkansas State improved to 8-1 in home openers at ASU Stadium under head coach Steve Roberts. A-State has now won its last six home openers. In addition to ULM, Roberts' teams have also won home openers over Mississippi Valley State (61-0 in 2009), Texas Southern (83-10 in 2008), SMU (45-28 in 2007), Tulsa (21-19 in 2002), Tennessee-Martin (63-6 in 2003 and 56-7 in 2005) and Army (14-6 in 2006).

STRESSING ACADEMICS: The Arkansas State football team won the Sun Belt Conference Team Academic Award for the 2009-10 academic year, marking the seventh time over the last eight years it has accomplished the feat.

PRESEASON ALL-SBC ACCOLADES: Three Arkansas State football players were tabbed Pre-

season All-Sun Belt Conference, including Defensive Player of the Year Bryan Hall, offensive lineman Derek Newton and linebacker Demario Davis.

PRESEASON PREDICTIONS: The Red Wolves are predicted to finish third in the conference according to the league's 2009 preseason coaches poll, announced July 19 as part of the Sun Belt Conference Media Days. ASU received 53 points, while first-place Middle Tennessee won the vote with 75 points.

STRONG D: Arkansas State has ranked No. 1 or No. 2 in the Sun Belt Conference and among the top 50 teams in the nation each of the last four years in total defense. Below is a break down of ASU's defensive statistical rankings for the last four years:

NATIONAL COVERAGE: Arkansas State will play at least two nationally televised games for the second consecutive year in 2010. The Red Wolves will catch Middle Tennessee at home on Nov. 2 in a game televised by ESPN2 and Navy on the road on Nov. 20 in a game televised by CBS College Sports. Prior to last season, the last time ASU had played a nationally televised game was in the 2005 New Orleans Bowl.

TURF INSTALLATION COMPLETED: Installation of a new and state-of-the-art field turf surface inside ASU stadium was completed as scheduled after a final inspection of the project was conducted in late July. The field is in practice and playing condition for the beginning of the Red Wolves fall camp today. The new GeoSurfaces field turf is slightly thicker than the previous product, which was installed when ASU originally transitioned from a grass field to an artificial playing surface prior to the 2006 season. The field also has a sand base for the first time in addition to the "no fly-out" rubber installed. The field also has a new look with two new Red Wolves logos, white Sun Belt Conference logos and black trim around the outside of the playing field.

HEAD FOOTBALL COACH STEVE ROBERTS



Not long after leading Arkansas State to the 2005 Sun Belt Conference championship and New Orleans Bowl, head coach Steve Roberts continues to make ASU a dominant force in the Sun Belt Conference and has ASU on track for continued success in the upcoming years.

When the 2005 Sun Belt Conference Coach of the Year took over the program in December 2001, he impressed everyone with his wide-eyed enthusiasm

and limitless energy. And, most of all, they believed that Roberts would bring success to the ASU football program. Roberts has been the driving force behind ASU's recent success, leading the football program to its most victories over an eight-year span since 1985-92.

Roberts came to Arkansas State University and brought with him a fresh enthusiasm, energy, and an "I Will" philosophy that has been adopted by everyone associated with the program.

"I Will" became the rallying cry as Roberts and his staff charged ahead through a grueling 13-game schedule in 13 weeks with no open date in his inaugural season and came within 11 points of winning the Sun Belt Conference championship and playing in the Sun Belt Conference prize—the New Orleans Bowl.

ASU ended the season with a record of 6-7 and finished third in the league rankings. That tied the most wins since rejoining Division I-A in 1992. The Red Wolves finished in the top ten turnarounds by Division I-A football schools for improving football records after finishing 2-9 in 2001.

Under Roberts' direction, ASU continues to add to the achievements that began upon his arrival. Not only did ASU represent the Sun Belt Conference in the 2005 New Orleans Bowl, it claimed its first league championship since 1986. Arkansas State went undefeated at home that season and is now 29-10 all-time at ASU Stadium under Roberts. The bowl appearance was ASU's first since playing in the 1970 Pecan Bowl.

ASU has been bowl eligible three of the last five seasons and the last four Roberts' coached teams backed up the 2005 Sun Belt championship with non-conference victories over teams such as Army, Memphis, SMU and Texas A&M. The Red Wolves' 2008 win over the Aggies was one of the biggest wins in school history as ASU picked up its first victory over a BCS conference school since joining the FBS.

The Red Wolves have finished among the top three teams in the Sun Belt Conference four times, but ASU has also been competitive during Roberts' tenure against the nation's elite teams. ASU fell to then-ranked No. 25 Memphis by just 12 points in 2004, No. 4 Texas by eight points in 2007 and No. 13 Iowa by three points in 2009.

In addition to the 2002 and 2008 teams, the 2005 and 2006 squads both posted six wins to mark the first time since the 1986 and 1987 seasons the Red Wolves recorded at least six victories in back-to-back seasons. Roberts already holds the fifth most wins among ASU's 26 all-time head and needs just 12 more victories to move into second on the list.

The 2008 Roberts' coached team holds the all-time school record for single-season offense and the ASU defense has ranked

No. 1 or No. 2 in the Sun Belt Conference each of the last four seasons.

Over the last eight years, ASU has picked up 70 all-conference selections, including at least 10 four of the last five years. ASU had 11 players named all-conference in 2008, its most ever as a member of the SBC. The Red Wolves placed 10 players on the list in 2002, 2005 and 2006, and nine in 2007.

Roberts has coached a Sun Belt Conference Freshman of the Year, Offensive Player of the Year, two Defensive Player of the Year winners and a Newcomer of the Year.

The Red Wolves have had four NFL draft picks under Roberts, including David Johnson in 2009, Tyrell Johnson in 2008, Oren O'Neal in 2007 and Corey Williams in 2004. Johnson was a second-round selection and the third highest drafted player in ASU history. Alex Carrington, the 2008 Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Year, is also expected by many experts to be a high draft selection in 2010. Additonally, 13 ASU players have either been drafted or signed NFL free agent contracts since Roberts' first season in 2002.

With five Sun Belt Conference Team Academic Awards, Roberts has made academics a priority as well for the Red Wolves. ASU consistently places a large number of players on the ASU Athletic Director's Honor Roll and Sun Belt Conference Academic Honor Roll. The most recent ASU AD's Honor Roll saw 45 football players make the list.

Attendance has show significant improvement during the Roberts era. ASU has drawn a crowd of over 20,000 in 15 games all-time at ASU Stadium and six of those have come over the last nine games. Of those 15 games, 11 have been played with Roberts as head coach.

A stadium-record crowd was of 30,427 was on hand to watch ASU play Memphis in 2004, and ASU set the best average attendance mark of 21,105 in 2008.

During his tenure, ASU has upgraded its facilities with a new training room, weight room, locker room, recruiting room and state-of-the-art ProGreen turf on the field.

Roberts was named Arkansas State's 26th head football coach on December 21, 2001, to bring full circle his coaching odyssey from his home state through Louisiana and back. But, the trek has been a successful one, including an 8-4 record and national ranking in Division I-AA in 2000 at Northwestern (La.) State.


Roberts spent two seasons at NSU, where he and his staff and team took on a tough schedule which included a 27-24 overtime upset at TCU. While at NSU, Roberts was a finalist for the Eddie Robinson National Coach of the Year Award. Prior to going to NSU, Roberts served as the head coach and defensive coordinator at Southern Arkansas University in Magnolia from 1994-99. While there, his 1997 team won the Gulf South Championship, earning him Gulf South Coach of the Year honors. The Muleriders finished with a cumulative record of 26-5 from 1997-99, including 9-1 in 1999, 8-2 in 1998 and 9-2 in 1997.

During that span, his teams enjoyed top conference rankings in scoring offense, scoring defense, total offense and total defense. At SAU, he also served as the defensive secondary coach and recruiting coordinator from 1990-94 before being named head coach. Academically, his program ranked first in academic achievements in the Gulf South Conference three seasons.

Roberts, an avid fisherman, graduated from Robinson High School in Little Rock. A 1987 graduate of Ouachita Baptist University, where he was an Academic All-American, Roberts received his masters from SAU in 1989. He and his wife Sherri have one daughter – Abby (14).

AUBURN, Ala. (09/04/10) - Arkansas State sophomore quarterback Ryan Aplin passed for 278 yards and a touchdown, but the 22nd-ranked Auburn Tigers countered with 363 yards of total offense and five total scores from junior quarterback Cameron Newton and defeated the Red Wolves 52-26 before a crowd of 83,441 at Jordan-Hare Stadium in the season opener for both teams.

Aplin connected on 28 of his 42 passes on the night to seven receivers, with junior wide receiver Dwayne Frampton hauling in eight passes for 74 yards and a touchdown, and safety M.D. Jennings led the ASU defense with 11 tackles, including two for loss, one forced fumble and one fumble recovery.

Arkansas State got on the board first when Aplin passed complete across the middle to Frampton from 10 yards out for a Red Wolves touchdown at the 5:18 mark of the first quarter. The scoring strike was set up when Aplin found wide receiver Allen Muse alone down the right sideline for a 61-yard

gain on the first play of the drive, which covered 82 yards in six plays.

Auburn answered with a six-play 58-yard drive on its next possession that ended with a three-yard touchdown run from senior wideout Kodi Burns with 1:51 to go in the first quarter. Senior Wes Bynum added the extra point for the Tigers, giving Auburn a 7-6 lead after the extra point attempt following ASU's touchdown was no good.

Less than a minute later, Auburn made it 14-6 when Newton passed complete for a 36-yard touchdown to senior running back Mario Fannin with one minute to play in the opening quarter.

Auburn added a two-yard touchdown run from Newton with 9:43 remaining in the second quarter to stretch its lead to 21-6, but the Red Wolves answered with a 55-yard drive that ended with junior running back Jermaine Robertson's 13-yard touchdown run with 6:46 to go in the first half.

The Tigers used the big play to put two more touchdowns on the board before the break, getting a 48-yard scoring pass from Newton to wide receiver

Quindarius Carr and a 71-yard touchdown run from Newton. A 26-yard field goal from ASU freshman Bryan Davis following Auburn's Newton-to-Carr touchdown left the Tigers with a 35-16 lead at the break.

Arkansas State's Nick Nelms recovered an Auburn fumble on the second half kickoff to set up an Arkansas State touchdown that pulled the Red Wolves trimmed the deficit 35-23. Nelms' recovery set up the Red Wolves offense at the Auburn 27, and ASU needed just five plays to find the end zone, scoring on an eight-yard touchdown run from junior running back Derek Lawson.

Auburn answered with a 38-yard touchdown pass from Newton to Fannin and a 24-yard field goal from Bynum on the final play of the third quarter to take a 45-23 lead into the final period of play.

Auburn's final score came on a two-yard touchdown run from freshman Michael Dyer midway through the fourth, and Davis added a 41-yard field goal for the Red Wolves with 4:16 remaining in the game to set the final score at 52-26.

In addition to the numbers from Aplin and Frampton, the Red Wolves also got 80 yards on four catches from Muse and six catches for 58 yards from sophomore Taylor Stockemer. Lawson tallied 45 yards and a touchdown on 16 carries to lead the ASU rushing effort. Holmes added seven tackles, including one for loss and forced a fumble for the A-State defense.

SEPTEMBER 11, LAFAYETTE, LA. (CAJUN FIELD - 15,103) - LOUISIANA-LAFAYETTE 31, ARKANSAS STATE 24

LAFAYETTE, La. (09/11/10) - A 31-7 fourth-quarter deficit proved to be too much to overcome as the Arkansas State Red Wolves suffered a 31-24 loss to the Ragin' Cajuns of Louisiana-Lafayette at Cajun Field in the Sun Belt Conference opener for both teams.

The Red Wolves trailed by 24 points early in the final period before reeling off 17 straight, but the rally fell short when ULL safety Maurice Rolle intercepted ASU sophomore quarterback Ryan Aplin with 1:59 remaining in the game to end A-State's final drive.

Aplin passed for a school-record 438 yards in the loss, completing 25 of 45 passes with two touchdowns passing and one rushing. Aplin's 438 yards also tied a Cajun Field record, matching former Central Florida quarterback Daunte Culpepper's mark set against ULL during the 1998 season. Sophomore wideout Alan Muse hauled in five passes for 133 yards from Aplin, the most yards for an ASU player since the 2000 season.

A pair of first-quarter scores from the Cajuns handed A-State an early 10-

point deficit.

Louisiana-Lafayette tailback Kevis Streeter went 69 yards on the Cajuns' first play from scrimmage to put ULL on the board early in the game, and a turnover deep in ASU territory set up the second Ragin' Cajun score. After ULL defensive back Melvin White recovered a Red Wolves fumble at the A-State 17, the Cajuns used a 27-yard field goal from Tyler Albrecht to take a 10-0 lead with 3:09 remaining in the first quarter.

Arkansas State answered on its next play from scrimmage when Aplin found wide receiver Taylor Stockemer alone across the middle for a 65-yard touchdown that cut the ULL lead to 10-7, but the Cajuns countered with three unanswered touchdowns to build a 31-7 cushion into the third guarter.

The Ragin' Cajuns took advantage of Arkansas State's second turnover to increase their lead to 17-7 midway through the second quarter. Louisiana-Lafayette took over at the ASU 32 following a fumbled punt return and got the touchdown on a six-yard pass from quarterback Chris Masson to tight

end Ladarius Green with 7:11 remaining in the half.

A 47-yard touchdown pass from wide receiver Javone Lawson to wideout Andrew Joseph stretched the ULL lead to 24-7 with just over four minutes to play before the break.

Masson broke free for a 60-yard touchdown run late in the third quarter that gave the Ragin' Cajuns a 31-7 advantage before A-State freshman Bobby Zalud made it 31-10 with a 39-yard field goal with 13:24 remaining in the game.

Aplin scored on a five-yard touchdown run with 7:42 remaining that cut the ULL lead to 31-17, then passed for an 11-yard touchdown to wide receiver Anthony Robinson with 3:27 to play that trimmed the deficit to a touchdown, but Rolle's interception ended the Red Wolves' rally.

Defensively, the Red Wolves were led by linebacker Javon McKinnon's nine tackles, which was two short of his career high. Defensive lineman Bryan Hall added five stops, including one quarterback sack

SEPTEMBER 18, JONESBORO, ARK. (ASU STADIUM - 23,176) - ARKANSAS STATE 34, LOUISIANA-MONROE 20

JONESBORO, Ark. (09/18/10) - Led by 318 total yards and two touchdowns from sophomore quarterback Ryan Aplin, the Arkansas State Red Wolves (1-2, 1-1) opened their 2010 home schedule with a 34-20 Sun Belt Conference victory over the Warhawks of Louisiana-Monroe (0-2, 0-1) Saturday night before 23,176 fans at ASU Stadium.

Aplin led a balanced ASU offense that finished with 474 yards on the night, with the Red Wolves gaining 234 yards on the ground and 240 through the air. Aplin completed 20 of 32 passes for 243 yards and a touchdown, while adding 75 more yards and a score on the ground. Safety M.D. Jennings intercepted two passes and logged six tackles to lead the Red Wolves' defensive effort.

Arkansas State churned out 180 yards in the opening quarter to put its two touchdowns on the board. The Red Wolves put together two 70-yard drives in the first period, capping the possessions with a 4-yard touchdown run from Aplin midway through the quarter and a 12-yard scoring run from tail-

back Derek Lawson with just over a minute remaining. Aplin accounted for 158 of the Red Wolves' yards in the first quarter, passing for 125 while rushing for an additional 33.

Arkansas State added another touchdown on its first possession of the second quarter, driving 80 yards in 10 plays and scoring when Aplin hooked up with wide receiver Dwayne Frampton from 34 yards out. Kicker Bobby Zalud added his third extra point of the night to give the Red Wolves a 21-0 advantage with 7:59 remaining before halftime.

The Warhawks got on the board three minutes later when ULM wrapped up a 77-yard drive with a 33-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Kolton Browning to wideout Brent Leonard. Arkansas State's Tim Starson blocked the Warhawk extra point attempt, leaving the Red Wolves with a 21-6 advantage that held until halftime, but ULM answered the second half bell with an 80-yard drive that ended in a four-yard touchdown run from quarterback Zach Rhodes. Browning passed complete to wide receiver Anthony McCall on the two-point conversion attempt to cut the A-State lead to 21-14 at the

10:49 mark of the third quarter.

Arkansas State responded with a 75-yard drive that ended in quarterback Phillip Butterfield's one-yard scoring run. Butterfield's touchdown gave the Red Wolves a two-touchdown cushion at 28-14 with just over five minutes to play in the third period.

Louisiana-Monroe drove deep into ASU territory on its next possession, but A-State stopped the drive when safety M.D. Jennings snagged his second interception of the night, picking off the Browning pass at the ASU goal line and returning it 20 yards to give the Red Wolves possession. Arkansas State capitalized on the turnover with a 37-yard field goal from Zalud with 9:31 remaining in the game.

The Warhawks added a touchdown at the 5:38 mark to trim the ASU advantage to 31-20. Browning connected with wide receiver Luther Ambrose on the scoring pass, but Starson again came up with the block on the extra point attempt, leaving ULM with the 11point deficit.

Zalud added his second field goal of the night, this time from 24 yards out with 2:25 remaining to set the final score at 34-20.

Frampton hauled in a team-high eight passes for 83 yards and a touchdown, Lawson rushed for 52 yards on 10 carries and Butterfield added 49 yards on eight carries to go along with Aplin's offensive statistics. Linebacker Nathan Herrold and defensive back Tausean Holmes each added eight tackles for the ASU defense.

SEPTEMBER 25, TROY, ALA. (VETERANS MEMORIAL STADIUM - 16,320) - TROY 35, ARKANSAS STATE 28

TROY, Ala. (09/25/10) — Troy quarterback Corey Robinson's 17-yard touchdown pass to running back Shawn Southward with 22 seconds remaining wiped out a fourth quarter Arkansas State comeback and gave the Trojans a 35-28 victory over the Red Wolves in Sun Belt Conference action at Veterans Memorial Stadium.

Arkansas State trailed 27-14 when Troy's Michael Taylor booted a 43-yard field goal with 14:14 remaining, but the Red Wolves scored two touchdowns in the final 10 minutes, including a 30-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Ryan Aplin to wideout Allen Muse with 50 seconds to play that gave the Red Wolves a 28-27 advantage.

The game was delayed by almost two hours by lightning when the field was cleared with 3:04 remaining in the second quarter and with Arkansas State trailing 21-7. The delay lasted one hour and forty-five minutes, and the Red Wolves were able to cut the Trojan lead to a touchdown when play resumed, then held Troy to a pair of field goals until Southward's touchdown

in the waning seconds turned back the ASU rally.

Aplin finished the night with 89 yards rushing and 237 yards and two touchdowns through the air, with Muse hauling in seven passes for 119 yards and a score

Troy struck early for its first touchdown, using a 70-yard touchdown pass from Robinson to slotback Jerrel Jernigan on the Trojans first possession to jump out to a 7-0 lead less than a minute into the game.

Arkansas State answered with an 11-play, 74-yard drive to tie the score with 6:31 remaining in the first quarter. Running back Derek Lawson scored from two yards out to put the Red Wolves on the board and placekicker Bobby Zalud added the extra point to tie the game at 7-7.

Troy regained the lead when the Trojans moved 92 yards in 15 plays, scoring on a three-yard pass from quarterback Jamie Hampton to wideout Tebiarus Gill with 42 seconds remaining in the first quarter, then stretched its lead to 21-7 when running back Chris Anderson scored on a four-yard run

midway through the second period.
Arkansas State came out of the lightning delay and marched 54 yards to pull within a touchdown. Running back Jermaine Robertson covered the distance in three plays, including a touchdown run of 14 yards that cut the Troy lead to 21-14 with 1:24 remaining in the second quarter.

Troy used a 27-yard field goal from Michael Taylor with 22 seconds remaining in the second quarter to go up 24-14, then made it 27-14 when Taylor connected from 43 yards out with 14:14 to play in the fourth quarter.

The Red Wolves countered with a 10-play, 78-yard touchdown drive that cut the Troy lead to six at 27-21. Aplin ignited the drive with a 40-yard run to the Troy 38, and seven plays later, hit tight end Kedric Murry in the back of the end zone with a four-yard touchdown pass with 9:26 remaining.

The Red Wolves defense did not allow a first down on the ensuing Troy possession, and ASU took over at its 35 with 8:53 remaining, but could only drive as far as the Troy 31 before turning it over on downs with 5:46 to play.

Arkansas State again held the Trojans without a first down on the next Troy possession and took over at the ASU 23 with 3:56 remaining. The Red Wolves moved down the field in 11 plays, taking the 28-27 lead on Muse's touchdown before Troy answered with the winning score.

Safety Kelcie McCray posted a career-best 12 tackles, and line-backer Javon McKinnon added a career-best 12 stops to lead the ASU defense.

OCTOBER 2, JONESBORO, ARK. (ASU STADIUM - 25,219) - LOUISVILLE 34, ARKANSAS STATE 24

JONESBORO, Ark. (10/2/10) — Down 31-7 at the break, Arkansas State scored 17 consecutive points in the second half, but the Louisville Cardinals turned back the Red Wolves in the final minutes of the game to secure a 34-24 victory over ASU before a homecoming crowd of 25,219 at ASU Stadium.

The Red Wolves pulled within a touchdown with just over eight minutes to go in the game when freshman kicker Bobby Zalud knocked through a 35-yard field goal that trimmed the Louisville lead to 31-24, but the Cardinals answered with a 46-yard field goal from kicker Chris Philpott with 3:54 remaining and ASU was unable to score again.

Arkansas State quarterback Ryan Aplin passed for 209 yards and three touchdowns in the loss, with sophomore Alan Muse grabbing three passes for 50 yards and two touchdowns. Senior linebacker Javon McKinnon recorded a career-high 16 tackles, including two behind the line of scrimmage to lead the ASU defensive effort.

Louisville jumped out to a 10-0 first quarter lead, using a 28-yard field goal

from Philpott to put the Cardinals on the board, and an 11-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Adam Froman to wide receiver Josh Bellamy with 2:43 remaining in the period.

Arkansas State countered with a seven-play 75-yard drive midway through the second quarter to cut the Louisville lead to 10-7. The Red Wolves' touchdown came on a 33-yard pass from Aplin to Muse with 9:19 remaining in the first half, but the Cardinals were able to use a fake punt on their next possession to start a string of three consecutive touchdowns that gave Louisville a 31-7 advantage at the break.

Facing a fourth-and-three from the ASU 47, Louisville converted on the fake punt when running back Bilal Powell took the short snap down the left sideline for the Cardinal touchdown. Louisville made it 24-7 when Powell hauled in a 57-yard touchdown pass from Froman with 3:18 remaining in the half, and Froman hooked up with Bellamy again 13 seconds before the break, this time from 21 yards away for the 31-7 Cardinal advantage.

Arkansas State made it 31-14 when the Red Wolves moved 79 yards on their first possession of the second half, getting a 15-yard, Aplin-to-Muse touchdown pass with 10:19 remaining in the third quarter.

The Arkansas State defense helped set up the next Red Wolves touchdown when it held the Cardinals on a fourth-and-seven from the ASU 38, and the A-State offense responded with a sevenplay, 68-yard drive that ended in Aplin's third touchdown pass of the night. Aplin kept the drive alive when he converted a third-and-10 from the Cardinal 38 with an 11yard pass to wide receiver Dwayne Frampton, and two plays later hit wideout Taylor Stockemer with a 24-yard touchdown pass with 14 seconds to play in the third. Zalud added his third extra point of the night to cut the Louisville lead to 31-21.

The A-State defense came up big again midway through the fourth when ASU defensive tackle Bryan Hall sacked Froman and recovered Froman's fumble at the Cardinals' 26, setting up a 35-yard field goal from Zalud with 8:08 remaining. Louisville answered with an 11-play, 55-yard drive that drained 4:10 from the clock and stretched the Cardinals lead to 34-24 with 3:54 to play. The Red Wolves moved to the ASU 39 on their next possession, before Louisville's Shenard Holton intercepted Aplin at the Cardinals' 39 to stop any further threat of an A-State comeback.

DENTON, Texas(10/9/10) — Arkansas State jumped out to a 21-3 first half lead, and the Red Wolves held off the Mean Green of North Texas in the second half to post a 24-19 Sun Belt Conference victory at Fouts Field.

Quarterback Ryan Aplin passed for 169 yards and a touchdown and added 61 yards and two scores on the ground to lead the Red Wolves offense. North Texas countered with 105 yards rushing and a touchdown from running back Lance Dunbar and four field goals from freshman Zach Olen, but the Red Wolves defense held the Mean Green offense to 74 yards in the second half to help preserve the win.

Linebacker Nathan Herrold led the ASU defensive effort with a seasonhigh nine tackles, and forced an early Mean Green fumble that led to the Red Wolves first touchdown.

"We are very excited to get this win," said ASU head coach Steve Roberts. "It was a tale of two halves. We knew North Texas would be very physical and run the football, but we were able to make enough plays to get out of

here with a win.'

Arkansas State took advantage of a Mean Green turnover on the game's first play from scrimmage to put an early touchdown on the board. After Herrold stripped the ball away from North Texas' Jamaal Jackson and linebacker Javon McKinnon recovered at the Mean Green 20, the Red Wolves needed just six plays to go on top 7-0, getting a 13-yard run from Aplin to put the Red Wolves on the scoreboard less than four minutes into the game.

North Texas answered with a 37-yard field goal from Olen, but the Red Wolves reeled off a pair of touchdowns to go up 21-3 with 21:31 remaining in the second quarter. Aplin connected with wide receiver Dwayne Frampton on an 11-yard scoring pass for ASU's second touchdown of the night, and Aplin scored from nine yards out to put the third touchdown on the scoreboard. Placekicker Bobby Zalud tacked on his third extra point of the night for the 21-3 ASU advantage.

North Texas matched the Aplin touchdown with a 71-yard drive that ended

in a one-yard touchdown run on fourth down from Dunbar midway through the second quarter, then got two more 37-yard field goals from Olen to cut the Red Wolves advantage to 21-16 at the half. Olen knocked through his second field goal of the night with 1:30 to play in the half, and following an ASU turnover, connected with six seconds remaining before the break

Following a scoreless third quarter, Olen added a 27-yard field goal with 14:48 remaining in the fourth to trim the ASU lead to 21-19, but Zalud answered with a 39-yarder with 9:40 remaining that tied his career high and pushed the Red Wolves lead back to five at 24-10

North Texas managed to drive as far as the ASU 33 on its final drive, but ASU defensive end Justin Robertson sacked UNT quarterback Chase Baine on thirdand-14 to end the threat.

Sophomore linebacker Nathan Herrold recorded a team-high and personal season-best nine tackles against North Texas, helping ASU hold the Mean Green to a season-low 292 yards of total offense.

OCTOBER 16, BLOOMINGTON, IND. (MEMORIAL STADIUM - 40,480) - INDIANA 36, ARKANSAS STATE 34

BLOOMINGTON, Ind. (10/16/10) - The Arkansas State Red Wolves led Indiana for the better part of three quarters, but the Hoosiers rallied to go on top 19-14 late in the third period, then held off ASU in the final quarter to secure a 36-34 victory before a crowd of 40,480 at Memorial Stadium.

Arkansas State led 14-12 before Indiana wide receiver Terrence Turner scored on a 27-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Ben Chappell with 4:08 remaining in the third, and the Red Wolves outscored the Hoosiers 20-17 in a wild fourth quarter, but Indiana recovered an ASU onsides kick in the final minute and was able to hold on for the win.

Arkansas State quarterback Ryan Aplin completed a school-record 33 of 44 passes for 275 yards, two touchdowns and two interceptions in the loss, with wide receiver Dwayne Frampton hauling in a school-record 12 passes from Aplin for 93 yards and a score. The Red Wolves returned seven kickoffs for 223 yards, which goes down as second all-time in ASU history.

Chappell completed 26 of 42 passes for 382 yards and four touchdowns to lead the Hoosiers.

With the Red Wolves trailing 36-27, linebacker ASU Javon McKinnon forced and recovered an Indiana fumble at the Hoosier 26 with 1:36 to play. The Red Wolves took advantage of the turnover with a 22-yard touchdown pass from Aplin to running back Sirgregory Thornton that cut the Hoosier lead to 36-34 with 47 seconds remaining, but the ensuing onsides kick attempt bounced out of bounds and Indiana was able to run out the clock to seal the win.

The Red Wolves jumped out to an early 7-0 lead when ASU marched 85 yards in 12 plays on its first possession. Aplin crossed the goal line from a yard out, and placekicker Bobby Zalud added the extra point for the 7-0 ASU advantage with 7:05 remaining in the first quarter.

An interception by Indiana safety Mitchell Evans set up the first Hoosier score of the afternoon. Evans picked off an Aplin pass at the Red Wolves 29 and returned it to the ASU five, but the Arkansas State defense denied the touchdown and the Hoosiers settled for a 20-yard field goal from placekicker Mitch Ewald to cut the A-State lead to 7-3.

A second interception from Evans midway through the second quarter led

to a 34-yard field goal from Ewald with 6:15 remaining in the first half. A 72-yard kickoff return from ASU's Roderick Hall set up the Red Wolves at the Hoosier 26. Arkansas State drove to the Indiana five before Lawson converted a fourth-andone with a one-yard run to the IU four, and Aplin scored from the four two plays later for the 14-6 ASU lead

The Hoosiers answered with a touchdown 40 seconds before the half that cut the ASU lead to 14-12.

The Hoosiers took their first lead of the game at the 4:08 mark in the third quarter, getting a 27-yard touchdown pass from Chappell to wide receiver Terrence Turner to wrap up an eight-play 58-yard drive. Ewald added the extra point for the 19-14 Indiana advantage, then booted a 46-yard field goal with 13:19 remaining in the fourth to put the Hoosiers up by eight, 22-14.

A 62-yard kickoff return from A-State's R.J. Fleming put ASU in business at the Hoosier 28, and the Red Wolves cashed in on the field position with a six-yard touchdown jaunt from Thornton with 11:39 remaining.

Less than two minutes later, the Hoosiers answered again, getting a 16-yard touchdown pass from Chappell to tight end Max Dedmond to give Indiana a nine-point cushion at 29-20. Arkansas State drove 51 yards on its next possession to cut the Indiana lead to 29-27 on a five-yard touchdown pass from Aplin to Frampton, but Hoosier wideout Demarlo Belcher got behind the ASU secondary on the ensuing Hoosier possession for a 65-yard touchdown that again put IU up by nine at 36-27 with 7:46 remaining.
