ON TAP: Arkansas State opens Sun Belt Conference play Saturday with a 3:00 p.m. (CT) matchup against Western Kentucky in Bowling Green. The game will be televised by the Sun Belt Network, and every A-State game can be heard live on 107.9 FM in the Jonesboro area. The live radio broadcast can also be accessed through the Arkansas State athletic Web site (AStateRedWolves.com).

THE PRINCIPALS: A-State completed its non-conference schedule with its best record since 2008 and is now set to begin its league slate with back-to-back road games at Western Kentucky and ULM. The Hilltoppers, also playing their league opener, are coming off an open week and will face the Red Wolves in their third consecutive game at Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium.

HEAD COACH HUGH FREEZE: After enjoying successful stints as both a head and assistant coach at the NCAA FBS, NAIA and high school levels over the last 18 years, Hugh Freeze was named Arkansas State's 27th head football coach on Dec. 2, 2010. Freeze most recently completed his first season as Arkansas State's offensive coordinator, guiding the Red Wolves' offense to a record-breaking year in 2010.

THE ARKANSAS STATE-WKU SERIES: Arkansas State is 2-2-1 all-time versus Western Kentucky and 1-0-1 when facing the Hilltoppers in Bowling Green. The Red Wolves pulled out a 24-20 comeback victory over the Hilltoppers in Bowling Green in 2010, the first meeting between the two teams in 57 years, but dropped a 36-35 overtime decision to the Hilltoppers last year at ASU Stadium. ASU and WKU first met during the 1947 season when they played to a 14-14 tie. The very next year, ASU picked up a 13-12 victory. WKU evened the series with a 34-19 victory in the 1952 Refrigerator Bowl played in Evansville, Ind. During the Refrigerator Bowl, the Hilltoppers overcame an opening 73-yard drive on ASU's first possession to improve their record to 9-1. They scored 34 unanswered points before a pair of fourth quarter ASU touchdowns made it more respectable. ASU had to play without All-America running back Richie Woit, sidelined with a broken ankle, during the game.

A-STATE vs. SUN BELT CONFERENCE: Arkansas State is 63-63-1 all-time record against current members of the Sun Belt Conference. Since the league's inaugural football season in 2001, the Red Wolves hold a 34-36 on-field record against all opponents that have been a member of the league. Against current members of the conference, ASU is 29-32 since 2001. The Red Wolves hold their most all-time victories against Louisiana-Lafayette with 17, while its most victories against a Sun Belt opponent since 2001 is Louisiana-Monroe with six. The Red Wolves have defeated every team in the SBC since the football league was formed in 2001.

ON THIS DATE: Arkansas State has played nine times on Oct. 1 and holds a 3-9 record in those games, including a 2-3 road mark. A-State has dropped its last four games when playing on the date, including a 31-27 decision at ULM most recently. The Red Wolves last victory on Oct. 1 came 18-17 over Texas A&M-Commerce in 1977. ASU picked up its other two victories over North Alabama, 19-0 in 1960, and Ole Miss, 10-0 in 1915.

AN A-STATE VICTORY WOULD ...: Give the Red Wolves their best record through five games since 2008 when they were 3-2 . . . snap a five-game road losing streak and a two-game Sun Belt Conference skid . . . give the Red Wolves back-to-back victories for the first time since knocking off Florida Atlantic and Middle Tennessee on Oct. 23 and Nov. 2 of last cason . . . give the Red Wolves a win in their first Sun Belt Conference game of the season since 2008 and improve their all-time record in SBC openers to 7-4 . . . improve its record against WKU to 3-2-1.

UNBUCKLE THE BELT: ASU is 6-4 all-time in Sun Belt Conference openers. The Red Wolves have dropped their last two Sun Belt Conference openers, falling 30-27 to Troy in 2009 and 31-24 against Louisiana-Lafayette last season. ASU's last win in its first conference game came 31-14 over Middle Tennessee in 2008. ASU will play Western Kentucky in its SBC opener for the first time ever.

DAVIS HONORED: After breaking the ASU and Sun Belt Conference records for both field goals made in a game (6) and points scored by kick (23) during the Red Wolves' game against Central Arkansas, sophomore kicker *Brian Davis* received numerous honors. Davis, who was only one field goal

and one point shy tying NCAA records, was named a Lou Groza Star of the Week, the Sun Belt Conference Special Teams Player of the Week and the College Football Performance Awards' National Placekicker of the Week. Davis was a perfect 6-of-6 on his field goal attempts and 5-of-5 on his extra point attempts. He has now made 8-of-10 field goals on the season and is 12-of-12 on extra points.

WHAT GIVES?: The Arkansas State defense has not surrendered 100 yards rushing to an individual player this season, while WKU's Bobby Rainey will enter the game with eight consecutive 100-yard rushing games dating back to last season. Among the running backs ASU has faced this season is Virginia Tech's David Wilson (ranked No. 7 in the nation in rushing with three 100-yard rushing games) and Illinois' Troy Pollard (two 100-yard rushing games this year).

TWICE AS NICE: The Red Wolves are one of just five teams in the nation to record at least 600 yards of total offense in two or more games this season, joining Georgia Tech, Houston, Oregon and Wisconsin. A-State piled up 646 yards of total offense, the fourth most in school history, last game against UCA. ASU also posted 611 yards of total offense, the eighth most in school history, against Memphis.

RUSHING POWER: ASU piled up 375 rushing yards against UCA, its most since recording 441 against Texas Southern in 2008. ASU also posted 236 yards rushing against Memphis, but was limited to 60 yards against Illinois and 64 against Virginia Tech.

TOP 50: Arkansas State is ranked among the top 50 teams in the nation in nine statistical categories, including total offense (20) and total defense (50). ASU also ranks in the top 50 in tackles for loss (9), sacks (18), net punting (28), pass offense (29), rushing offense (40), scoring defense (43) and pass efficiency (49).

BIG GAINS: Arkansas State has now completed at least one pass of over 40 yards in each of its first four games. Junior quarterback *Ryan Aplin* completed passes of 71 yards vs. Memphis, 65 vs. Illinois, 51 vs. Virginia Tech and 43 (twice) vs. UCA. The combined five completions have been to three different receivers, including *Josh Jarboe, Dwayne Frampton* (2) and *Taylor Stockemer* (2). The Red Wolves are averaging 5.3 plays per game where it gains at least 20 yards. They recorded a season-high eight plays that went for 20-plus yards against UCA.

1,000 YARD CLUB: Junior wide receiver *Taylor Stockemer* and senior receiver *Dwayne Frampton* both went over 1,000

receiving yards for their careers this season. Stockemer accomplished the feat during the Virginia Tech game and Frampton against UCA. Stockemer has a team-high 1,143 yards and Frampton 1,071 as both near top-10 marks at ASU. Steve Lockhart (1969-71) is currently ranked 10th for career receiving yards at ASU with 1,216.

FRAMPTON EXTENDS STREAK: Senior wide receiver *Dwayne Frampton* caught eight passes for 100 yards against UCA, extending his streak of consecutive games with at least one reception to 16. He has caught a pass in every game he has played at A-State. Frampton is ranked tied for 33rd in the nation in receptions (6.3 rpg) and 47th in receiving yards (83.3 ypg).

PICK IT OFF: While the Red Wolves didn't record an interception in either of their first two games, they've now posted a combined three over the last two. Cornerbacks *Darron Edwards* and *Darryl Feemster* both had a pick against Virginia Tech and safety *Sterling Young* returned his first career interception 31 yards for a touchdown against UCA.

PLAYING IN THE BACKFIELD: The Red Wolves defense recorded at least eight tackles for loss in three of its first four games this season. A-State posted eight or more tackles behind the line of scrimmage in three games for all of last season. ASU is ranked ninth in the nation in tackles for loss (8.3 pg).

GETTING TO THE QUARTERBACK: Dating back to last season, senior defensive end *Brandon Joiner* has recorded at least 0.5 sacks in eight of ASU's last nine games. In fact, 8.5 of his 9.0 career sacks at A-State have come over the Red Wolves last nine games. He has at least a partial sack in each of ASU's first four games this season. Joiner recorded a career-high 2.5 sacks against Middle Tennessee in the 10th game of last year.

HOME SWEET HOME: Arkansas State posted an actual onfield winning record at ASU Stadium from 2005-2010. ASU is now 26-7 at ASU Stadium since the 2005 season. The Red Wolves actual on-field record all-time at ASU Stadium is 118-70-1 since opening in 1974.

300-PLUS: Dating back to last season, Arkansas State has posted at least 300 yards of total offense 15 of its last 16 games. ASU's school-record 14 consecutive games with over 300 yards of total offense came to an end against Virginia Tech earlier this season when the Hokies limited the Red Wolves to 269 yards. ASU posted over 300 yards of total offense in just six games the season prior to Hugh Freeze taking over as offensive coordinator in 2010.

ECLIPSING 200/300: Junior quarterback *Ryan Aplin* passed for at least 200 yards for the 14th time of his career last game with 220 yards to his credit, and all 14 games have come over

THE LAST TIME vs. WESTERN KENTUCKY (NOV. 13, 2010)

JONESBORO (11/13/10) - ASU overcame a 14-point fourth quarter deficit to take a 28-21 lead late into its game at ASU Stadium against Western Kentucky, but the Hilltoppers scored a touchdown as time expired in regulation and later secured a 36-35 victory on a two-point conversion at the end of the first overtime session.

ASU scored 21 unanswered points in the fourth quarter to take a 28-21 lead with 1:49 left in regulation play. Sophomore quarterback Ryan Aplin led the Red Wolves rally, throwing two of his three touchdown passes and recording one of his two rushing touchdowns in the fourth quarter.

A-State got a fourth-down stop on WKU's next possession to give it the ball at the WKU 46-yard line with 1:10 remaining. However, WKU forced a three-and-out for ASU and a snap that never made it to the punter on fourth down gave the Hilltoppers the ball at the A-State 22-yard line with 22 seconds left in the game.

It took WKU eight plays to find the end zone and force the overtime period.

Aplin recorded a 25-yard touchdown run up the middle of WKU's defense on the first play of overtime to give the Red Wolves a 35-28 lead.

However, WKU capped a five-play scoring drive on its first overtime possession with a three-yard touchdown run by Bobby Rainey, and then Derrius Brooks ran a reverse and found the end zone on the following two-point conversion.

WKU finished with 60 fewer yards of total offense, but forced five ASU turnovers that led to two touchdowns. The Hilltoppers were led offensively by Rainey, who finished with 154 rushing yards and two touchdowns on 37 attempts.

his last 18 played. Aplin has recorded over 300 yards of total offense seven times during his career, including the Illinois game with 301 yards and the UCA game with 304.

CROWD SUPPORT: Arkansas State's first two home games this season were played in front of the largest back-to-back crowds in ASU Stadium history. The 29,872 in attendance for the Memphis game was the second largest in ASU Stadium history and the 27,918 announced for the UCA game was the fourth largest. ASU Stadium reached 94 percent of its maximum capacity for the Red Wolves' first two home games combined. Based on attendance sorted by percent of stadium capacity, ASU ranks No. 1 in the Sun Belt Conference and No. 43 in the nation.

MANNING AWARD STAR OF THE WEEK: Following his performance in Arkansas State's 47-3 victory over Memphis, quarterback *Ryan Aplin* was selected as one of eight quarterbacks from across the nation to be named to the Manning Award Stars of the Week list. Aplin completed 19-of-21 passes for 274 yards and three touchdowns in the victory over the Tigers. His completion rate of 90.5% was the second highest in school and Sun Belt Conference history.

JARBOE HONORED: Following the Memphis game, junior wide receiver *Josh Jarboe* was selected as one of nine wide receivers from across the nation to be named to the honorable mention list for the College Football Performance Awards' Wide Receiver of the Week award. Jarboe hauled in seven passes for 162 yards and two touchdowns in the Red Wolves' 47-3 victory over Memphis. Jarboe's 162 receiving yards ranked as the 10th-best single game performance alltime at ASU and is the 13th-highest total in the nation this season. His 162-yard performance was also the best by an ASU player since 1999. Jarboe is ranked 39th in the nation in receiving yards this season, averaging 86 per game.

DIALING IT UP FROM LONG DISTANCE: Sophomore kicker *Bobby Zalud* kicked a career-best 56 yard field goal against Memphis that tied the third longest in school history and ties the longest in the NCAA this season. His 56-yard field goal is also the second longest in Sun Belt Conference history behind only a 57-yard make by North Texas' Jason Ball in 2001. Zalud also had a 49 yard field goal against Illinois in the season opener and is now 2-of-3 on his field goal attempts this year.

97th SEASON UNDER WAY: Arkansas State kicked off off its 97th season of football on Sept. 3 at Illinois. ASU now holds a 408-453-37 record since the inaugural 1911 season and has played in seven bowl games. A-State did not field a football team from 1942-44 due to World War II. ASU also didn't have a team in 1918 as World War I was ending.

NATIONAL COVERAGE: Arkansas State will play at least one nationally-televised game for the third consecutive year in 2011. The Red Wolves will host a nationally-televised game for the second straight season as well, catching Florida International at ASU Stadium Oct. 18 on ESPN2.

RIMINGTON AWARD WATCH LIST: Senior center *Tom Castilaw* is on the 2011 Rimington Award Watch List issued annually to the nation's top center, making him the second ASU player to ever earn the preseason recognition. Tanner Jenkins was also on the list in 2006. Castilaw was a 2010 Second Team All-Sun Belt Conference selection after starting the final 11 games of the season.

LOMBARDI AWARD WATCH LIST: Senior linebacker *Demario Davis* is the fifth player in school to be named to the Lombardi Award Watch List, issued to the top college lineman at the end of the season. Davis, a 2010 First Team All-Sun Belt choice, joins Alex Carrington (2009), Matt Mandich (2008), Tanner Jenkins (2006) and Garry Johnson (2001 and 2002) as A-State players that have been named to the award's watch list.

BILETNIKOFF AWARD WATCH LIST: Senior wide receiver *Dwayne Frampton* and junior wide receiver *Josh Jarboe* are the first player in school history to ever be named to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List for the nation's top receiver.

PRESEASON ALL-SUN BELT RECOGNITION: Sixteen different ASU players have been named to at least one of the major preseason publication's preseason All-Sun Belt Conference teams. The Red Wolves have at least one player on a preseason all-conference squad at 12 different positions, including quarterback (Ryan Aplin), running back (Derek Lawson), wide receiver (Dwayne Frampton, Allen Muse, Taylor Stockemer), center (Tom Castilaw), offensive tackle (James Williams), defensive tackle (Dorvus Woods, Amos Draper), linebacker (Demario Davis, Nathan Herrold), defensive end (Brandon Joiner), linebacker (Demario Davis), cornerback (Darron Edwards), safety (Kelcie McCray) and punt returner (Rod Hall).

After enjoying successful stints as both a head and assistant coach at the NCAA FBS, NAIA and high school levels over the last 18 years, Hugh Freeze was named Arkansas State's 27th head football coach on Dec. 2, 2010.

Freeze most recently completed his first season as Arkansas State's offensive coordinator, guiding the Red Wolves' offense to a record-breaking year in 2010.

"I am thrilled to be the next head coach at Arkansas State and continue building on the foundation Coach Roberts has set," said Freeze. "It is a dream come true and I am very indebted to President Welch, Chancellor Howard, Dr. Lee and Dr. Potts for their confidence in my ability to take this program to another level. My family and I look forward to being a very vital part of the Jonesboro community and the A-State family."

Freeze made an immediate impact on ASU's program, leading the offense to a No. 43 national ranking in total offense one year after the Red Wolves finished toward the bottom of the NCAA FBS rankings at No. 95. In just their first year under Freeze's up-tempo spread offense, the Red Wolves broke nine offensive school records that included 4,841 yards of total offense ranked No. 2 in the Sun Belt Conference.

Freeze, a noted speaker, motivator and recruiter throughout his career, led the ASU offense to other school records such as total plays (856), first downs (262), pass attempts (438), pass completions (266), completion percentage (.607), passing yards (3,057), passing yards per game (254.8) and passing touchdowns (23).

The Red Wolves' potent offensive attack averaged 403.4 yards per game, eclipsing over 300 yards all 12 times it took the field for the first time in the history of the program. A-State posted at least 400 yards of total offense in seven games during the 2010 campaign, the most ever as an NCAA FBS member.

ASU, ranked 42nd in the nation in scoring offense, finished the season averaging 30 points a game and recorded at least 20 points in 11 consecutive games for the first time in school history. Freeze's offense scored 46 touchdowns, including 23 on the ground and 23 through the air, for the fourth most in school history and the most since the 1975 season. While the Red Wolves' 23 passing touchdowns broke the school record, their 23 scores on the ground were the most by an ASU team since 2002. Their 360 total points were the most since 1987 and tied the fourth most in ASU history.

Under Freeze, the A-State offense was among the most dangerous in the Sun Belt Conference in 2010. The Red Wolves were ranked among the top two teams in the league in scoring offense, passing offense, total offense, pass efficiency, red zone offense and first downs. In addition to its

No. 40 national ranking in total offense and No. 42 spot in scoring offense, ASU ranked among the top 50 teams in the nation in red zone offense at No. 28.

In addition to working as ASU's offensive coordinator, Freeze was also the quarterbacks coach for the Red Wolves. Under Freeze's direction, sophomore Ryan Aplin exploded onto the scene in 2010 to emerge as a Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year candidate. Aplin not only broke the ASU records for total offense, passing yards, passing touchdowns and completions, he posted numbers that rank among the top 10 in Sun Belt Conference history in the same categories. Aplin was named the Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Week three times during the 2010 season.

"We are extremely excited to named Hugh Freeze head football coach at Arkansas State University," said Dr. Lee at the announcement press conference. "He is a tremendous leader that makes those around him better and his high energy level is contagious. Coach Freeze has a great passion and vision for our football program. He is highly organized and has a plan that has made him successful throughout his career."

Prior to his arrival at Arkansas State, Freeze compiled a 20-5 record over the 2008 and 2009 seasons at the helm of the Lambuth University football program.

Freeze was named the American Football Coaches Association's Southeast Region Coach of the Year in 2009 after leading the Eagles to their best regular season in school history with an 11-0 record. Under Freeze's direction, Lambuth won the Mid-South Conference West Division, advanced to the second round of the NAIA playoffs for the first time since 1999, finished the year with a 12-1 mark and ascended to the No. 6 ranking in NAIA.

The Mid-South Conference Coach of the Year oversaw the offense and called the plays for a Lambuth team that averaged over 40 points per game and ranked ninth nationally in total yards per game (465 ypg). The Eagles also ranked first in the nation in fourth down conversions, fourth in first downs per game and third down conversions, fifth in passing offense and eighth in scoring offense per game.

Prior to taking over as head coach at Lambuth, Freeze served as interim head coach at the University of Mississippi in November of 2007 and was an assistant coach with the Rebels from 2005-07. He was named the Rebels' recruiting coordinator and tight ends coach before the 2006 season after originally serving as Assistant Athletic Director for Football External Affairs upon his arrival in Oxford.

In his first year as recruiting coordinator, he helped bring in the nation's 13th ranked recruiting class, the highest in the history of the program. Freeze was responsible for the recruitment of nine signees, including two that went on to be named Freshman All-America, in the class alone.

While maintaining his duties as recruiting coordinator, he moved to wide receivers coach in 2007 and tutored two players that were ranked among the top-15 players in receiving in the SEC. Ole Miss' 2007 signing class was ranked 25th nationally and he was responsible for nine commitments in the 2008 signing class.


Before going to Ole Miss, Freeze served 13 years at Briarcrest Christian School in Memphis, Tenn., as a classroom teacher, coach and administrator. He was the Saints' head football coach from 1995 to 2004, running the no huddle "spread system" for six years that led to six straight state championship games.

Freeze compiled a 99-23 record, which included an undefeated season in 1996, while at Briarcrest and led the school to state championship titles in 2002 and 2004. Briarcrest won regional championships in 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2001 and 2002, and Freeze was named the Region 8-AA Coach of the Year five times and Associated Press Coach of the Year four times.

Before assuming the role of head coach at Briarcrest, Freeze served as the Saints offensive coordinator and defensive backs coach from 1992-1994 as the Saints reached the TSSAA state semifinals twice.

A 1988 graduate of Senatobia (Miss.) High School, Freeze earned his bachelors degree in mathematics with a minor in coaching and sports administration from the University of Southern Mississippi in 1992.

Hugh and his wife, Jill, are the parents of three daughters, Ragan (13), Jordan (12), and Madison (9).

Take ramp onto I-240 West toward I-240 Little Rock/Downtown for 2.6 miles. Continue on I-55 North for 6.1 miles. Take the St. Louis/Little Rock exit on I-55 North and go 24.4 miles. Take exit 23B/Marked Tree/Jonesboro onto US-61for 0.5 miles. Continue on US-63 North for 41 miles. Take ramp toward Caraway Road/Stadium Boulevard for 0.2 miles. Bear right on Stadium Boulevard and go 2.2 miles until seeing ASU Stadium on the left. Parking is available for the working media on the northwest grass lot of the stadium complex.

From Little Rock National Airport: Leaving the airport on East Roosevelt Road go 0.3 miles and continue on Annie M. Bankhead Drive for another 0.4 miles. Turn left to take the ramp onto I-440 East toward TO I-40 for 11.3 miles. Take the Jacksonville exit onto US-67 North and go 96.5 miles. Turn right on AR-226E and go 11.7 miles. Turn right on Co. Road 203. Turn left on US-49 and 6.5 miles. Take ramp onto US 49 North and go 2.7 miles until taking the Stadium Boulevard exit for 0.2 miles. Turn left on Stadium Boulevard and go 2.4 miles until seeing ASU Stadium on the left. Parking is available for working media on the northwest grass lot of the stadium complex.
