**THE PRINCIPALS:** A-State became bowl eligible last week when it moved its overall record to 6-2 and Sun Belt Conference mark to 4-0 with a 37-14 victory over North Texas. The Red Wolves have matched their most victories ever as an FBS member and are undefeated through four Sun Belt Conference games for the first time in school history. Florida Atlantic, coming off an open week, is looking for its first victory of the season as it carries an 0-7 overall and 0-4 Sun Belt record into Saturday's game. ASU has won its last two straight road games, while FAU is playing its third consecutive home game.

**HEAD COACH HUGH FREEZE:** After enjoying successful stints as both a head and assistant coach at the NCAA FBS, NAIA and high school levels over the last 18 years, Hugh Freeze was named Arkansas State's 27th head football coach on Dec. 2, 2010. Freeze most recently completed his first season as Arkansas State's offensive coordinator, guiding the Red Wolves' offense to a record-breaking year in 2010.

**FAST START:** Hugh Freeze has tied the most victories ever by a head coach in his first season at Arkansas State. Out of 27 all-time head coaches at A-State, Freeze is one of just four to win six games in his first season, joining Steve Roberts (2002), Gene Harlow (1955) and Jack Dale (1931). He has tied Dale as the fastest coach to six wins in school history.

**THE ARKANSAS STATE-FLORIDA ATLANTIC SERIES:** Arkansas State picked up a 37-16 victory over Florida Atlantic last season in Jonesboro to even the all-time series at 3-3. Three games in the series have been played in both Jonesboro and Boca Raton, and all six outings have been won by the home team. Five of the seven meetings, including the last three in a row, have been decided by at least two touchdowns.

**A-STATE vs. SUN BELT CONFERENCE:** Arkansas State is 67-63-1 all-time against current members of the Sun Belt Conference. Since the league's inaugural football season in 2001, the Red Wolves hold a 38-36 on-field record against all opponents that have been a member of the league. Against current members of the conference, ASU is 33-32 since 2001. The Red Wolves hold their most all-time victories against Louisiana-Monroe with 19. The Red Wolves have defeated every team in the SBC since the football league was formed in 2001.

**AN A-STATE VICTORY WOULD . . . :** Give the Red Wolves their best record through nine games since 1986 when it was 7-1-1 as a member of the I-AA Southland Conference . . . Give the Red Wolves their first 5-0 conference record as a member of any league since 1986 when it finished the season 5-0 against SLC competition . . . Give the Red Wolves their first six game winning streak since 1986 when they actually won eight

in a row . . . Give the Red Wolves their most victories ever as an FBS member and its most at any level since 1987 . . . Give the Red Wolves three road victories in the same season for the first time since 2006 . . . Give the Red Wolves three consecutive road victories for the first time since 1986 . . . Give the Red Wolves their first road victory ever over Florida Atlantic . . . Guarantee ASU a winning record for the first time since 1995 when it finished 6-5.

**BOWL ELIGIBLE:** Arkansas State is bowl eligible for the first time since 2008, but for the fourth time over the last seven seasons. This is the earliest ASU has ever been bowl eligible as an FBS member (since 1992). Arkansas State's last appearance in a bowl game was 2005 when it played Southern Miss in the New Orleans Bowl.

**MATCHING THE BEST AS AN FBS MEMBER:** Arkansas State has matched its most victories ever as an FBS member with six. The Red Wolves also had six wins 1995, 2002, 2005, 2006 and 2008. The last time the Red Wolves won seven games in a season was 1987 when it was an NCAA I-AA member.

**THROUGH EIGHT:** Arkansas State not only holds its best record ever as an FBS member through eight games, but its best since 1986 when it was 6-1-1 as a member of the I-AA Southland Conference. The last time ASU was 7-2 or better through nine games was 1986 as well when it held a 7-1-1 record.

**ON A ROLL:** ASU has won five consecutive games for the first time since 1986 when it actually claimed eight straight victories. The Red Wolves' five game winning streak ties them with Cincinnati for the 11th longest in the nation. The teams with a longer winning streak than A-State

include Stanford (16), Alabama (9), LSU (9), Boise State (9), Oklahoma State (9), Houston (8), Penn State (7), Oregon (7), Southern Miss (6) and Georgia (6).

**UNDEFEATED IN CONFERENCE:** Arkansas State holds a 4-0 Sun Belt Conference record for the first time in school history. Prior to this season, the Red Wolves' best start in SBC play was 3-0 in 2008 and 2006. The last time ASU was 5-0 or better in any league was 1986 when it actually posted a 5-0 Southland Conference record for the year.

**ROAD WARRIORS:** The Red Wolves have won two consecutive games on the road for the first time since 2006. ASU's last two road victories marked the first time since 1985 it won two road games during consecutive weeks. The victories also marked the first time in school history that ASU won back-to-back road games against Sun Belt opponents. The last time ASU won three consecutive road games was 1986.

**1 OF 8:** Arkansas State is one of just eight teams in the nation ranked among the top 30 in both total offense and defense. The Red Wolves are No. 26 in total defense (330.1 ypg) and No. 27 in total offense (448.8 ypg). The other teams ranked in the top 30 in both total offense and total defense include Stanford, Wisconsin, West Virginia, Boise State, Southern Miss, Alabama and Ohio.

**DOUBLE DIGITS:** Arkansas State has won four games by a double-figure margin this season, which is its most since 1996. ASU has won its last two games by at least 18 points and holds an average scoring margin of +10.8 points per game (30.4 to 19.6). The last time A-State won five games by a double-digit margin was 1987.

**IN THE POLLS:** Arkansas State climbed from No. 44 to No. 37 in the CBSSports.com 120 poll after improving to 6-2 with its 37-14 victory over North Texas. The Red Wolves are also No. 47 in

**THE LAST TIME vs. FLORIDA ATLANTIC (OCT. 23, 2010)**

JONESBORO (10/23/10) - Trailing by a touchdown early in the fourth quarter, Arkansas State reeled off 28 consecutive points and went on to defeat Florida Atlantic 37-16 in Sun Belt Conference action at ASU Stadium.

Florida Atlantic led 16-9 following a field goal from kicker Ross Gonall on the opening play of the fourth quarter, but the Red Wolves used a 28-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Ryan Aplin to wide receiver Anthony Robinson to tie the game on the next ASU possession. ASU then cashed in when the ASU defense forced turnovers on the next three FAU drives, resulting in three A-State touchdowns in just over two minutes to set the final score.

Robinson, now a graduate assistant coach for ASU, hauled in a career-high eight passes for 88 yards and added a receiving touchdown from Aplin, who finished the day 28-of-46 for 230 yards and a touchdown. Aplin also rushed for 64 yards and a score to go along with 55 yards and a touchdown from running back Jermaine Robertson.

Linebacker Nathan Herrold led the Red Wolves defense with 8 tackles, and defensive tackle Bryan Hall added six stops and a pair of sacks.

now a graduate assistant coach at A-State, posted career-high numbers as a senior wide receiver against FAU last year with eight receptions for 88 yards and a TD. He also added a four-yard TD run against the Owls.

**TOP 50:** Arkansas State is ranked among the top 50 teams in the nation in 13 statistical categories, including total offense (27) and total defense (26). ASU also ranks in the top 50 in tackles for loss (22), sacks (T18), net punting (24), pass offense (25), pass efficiency defense (29), scoring defense (23), punt returns (39), interceptions (26), scoring offense (46), pass efficiency (45) and rushing defense (30).

**SUN BELT PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:** Arkansas State has had four players named a Sun Belt Conference Player of the Week. Senior safety **Kelcie McCray** (Defensive) and junior defensive back Don Jones (Special Teams) earned the recognition on Oct. 10 following the ULM game. Junior quarterback **Ryan Aplin** was named the Offensive Player of the Week on Oct. 3 following the WKU game and sophomore kicker **Brian Davis** the Special Teams Player of the Week on Sept. 26 following the UCA game.

**CFPA RECOGNITION:** Senior WR **Dwayne Frampton**, senior safety **Kelcie McCray**, junior punter **Ryan Wilbourn**, senior WR **Josh Jarboe** and senior LB **Demario Davis** have all been national honorable mention selections at their respective position by the CFPA this season. Sophomore kicker **Brian Davis** has been named the CFPA's national placekicker of the week as well.

**HOME SWEET HOME:** With a 4-0 home record this season, Arkansas State has secured its seventh consecutive winning record at ASU Stadium, dating back to 2005. ASU is now 28-7 at ASU Stadium since the 2005 season. The Red Wolves actual on-field record all-time at ASU Stadium is 120-70-1 since it opened in 1974.

**CROWD SUPPORT:** Arkansas State's first two home games this season were played in front of the largest back-to-back crowds in ASU Stadium history. The 29,872 in attendance for the Memphis game made it the second largest crowd in ASU Stadium history and the 27,918 announced for the UCA game was the fourth largest. The Red Wolves current average home attendance is 23,281, which is 2,000 more than the school record of 21,105 set in 2008. ASU's average attendance of 23,281 is the second highest in the Sun Belt Conference.

**MIDSEASON ALL-CONFERENCE:** A-State placed 11 players on Phil Steele's Midseason All-Sun Belt Conference Team. Three ASU players were first team selections, including senior center **Tom Castilaw** who was also an honorable mention All-America choice by the publication. ASU's other first team selections were senior WR

**97th SEASON UNDER WAY:** Arkansas State kicked off its 97th season of football on Sept. 3 at Illinois. ASU now holds a 411-453-37 record since the inaugural 1911 season and has played in seven bowl games. A-State did not field a football team from 1942-44 due to World War II. ASU also didn't have a team in 1918 as World War I was ending.

**TV TIME:** It was announced this week that ESPN has selected Arkansas State's Nov. 12 football game against Louisiana-Lafayette, scheduled for a 2 p.m. kickoff at ASU Stadium, to be televised on ESPN3.com.

Arkansas State has already played six televised games this season, and now has at least two more slated for television. In addition to the Louisiana-Lafayette game, the Red Wolves' game at Middle Tennessee on Nov. 19 is also scheduled as an ESPN3.com broadcast. A-State's regular-season finale at ASU Stadium against Troy on Dec. 3 could also be selected for television.

The Red Wolves set a school record with 10 televised games last year, and 2011 marks the third consecutive season with at least eight televised contests for A-State. ASU also hosted a nationally-televised game at ASU Stadium for the second consecutive year in 2011, defeating Florida International 34-16 on ESPN2.

**PRESEASON ALL-SUN BELT RECOGNITION:** Sixteen different ASU players were named to at least one of the major preseason publication's preseason All-Sun Belt Conference teams. The Red Wolves had at least one player on a preseason all-conference squad at 12 different positions, including quarterback (**Ryan Aplin**), running back (**Derek Lawson**), wide receiver (**Dwayne Frampton**, **Allen Muse**, **Taylor Stockemer**), center (**Tom Castilaw**), offensive tackle (**James Williams**), defensive tackle (**Dorvus Woods**, **Amos Draper**), linebacker (**Demario Davis**, **Nathan Herrold**), defensive end (**Brandon Joiner**), cornerback (**Demario Davis**), cornerback (**Darron Edwards**), safety (**Kelcie McCray**) and punt returner (**Rod Hall**).

**LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD:** A-State has recorded at least 30 points in four games this season, including the last two in a row, and is on pace to finish the regular season with the fourth most points in school history (364). The Red Wolves have tied the second most games in a season with at least 30 points since 1988. ASU scored 30-plus points in five games last year, which tied the 2007 team for the most since 1987 when it eclipsed 30 in six games. ASU is ranked second in the Sun Belt Conference and No. 46 in the nation in scoring offense (30.4 ppg).

**GROUND ATTACK:** Arkansas State posted its fourth 200-yard rushing game, including its second in a row, this season last week against North Texas. The Red Wolves improved to 4-0 in those games, and their four 200-yard games are their most in a single season since 2008 when it had five.

**300-PLUS:** Dating back to last season, Arkansas State has posted at least 300 yards of total offense 19 of its last 20 games. ASU's school-record 14 consecutive games with over 300 yards of total offense came to an end against Virginia Tech earlier this season when the Hokies limited the Red Wolves to 269 yards. ASU posted over 300 yards of total offense in just six games the season prior to Hugh Freeze taking over as offensive coordinator in 2010.

**BIG HITTERS:** Arkansas State has recorded at least one play covering 40 yards or more in seven of its eight games. The Red Wolves have 11 plays, including nine passing, of 40 yards or more for all eight games combined. Four different players have caught a pass for at least 40 yards, including **Dwayne Frampton**, **Josh Jarboe**, **Taylor Stockemer** and **Frankie Jackson**. ASU's longest pass was a 71-yard completion from **Ryan Aplin** to Jarboe, and its longest rush was 48 yards by Jackson.

**APPROACHING MILESTONES:** Entering Saturday's game against FAU, junior QB **Ryan Aplin** needs 57 yards to become the third player in school history to pass for over 6,000 in a career, senior RB **Derek Lawson** needs 28 yards to become the 16th player in school history to eclipse 1,700 rushing yards and senior WR **Dwayne Frampton** needs 72 yards to become the sixth player in A-State history to record 1,500 receiving yards.

**AMONG THE BEST IN SCHOOL HISTORY:** Junior quarterback **Ryan Aplin**, who holds the school record for passing yards in a game (438 at UL Lafayette in 2010) is one of just three players in ASU history to record over 5,000 passing yards (5,943) and also one of just three to post over 7,000 yards of total offense (7,083). He is also ranked third all-time in completions (509) and third in TD passes (34).

**ECLIPSING 200/300:** Junior quarterback **Ryan**

**Aplin** has passed for at least 200 yards 17 times during his career, and all 17 games have come over his last 22 played. Aplin has recorded over 300 yards of total offense 10 times during his career, including the Illinois, UCA, WKU, FIU and North Texas games this season.

**THREE OVER 100:** Senior WR **Dwayne Frampton** has posted three 100-yard receiving games, including a career-high 147 against Louisiana-Monroe. All three games were played consecutively against UCA (100), WKU (126) and ULM. Frampton also had 99 receiving yards in the season opener at Illinois. For the entire year, he is ranked 20th in the nation in receptions (6.8 pg) and 33rd in receiving yards (86.3 ypg). Frampton is on the Biletnikoff Award Watch List.

**1,000 YARD CLUB:** Junior wide receiver **Taylor Stockemer** and senior receiver **Dwayne Frampton** both went over 1,000 receiving yards for their careers this season. Stockemer accomplished the feat during the Virginia Tech game and Frampton against UCA. Frampton has a team-high 1,351 yards to rank seventh in school history, while Stockemer has posted 1,279 yards as he nears joining the top 10 at ASU as well.

**FRAMPTON EXTENDS STREAK:** Senior wide receiver **Dwayne Frampton** caught one pass last week against FIU, extending his streak of consecutive games with at least one reception to 19. He has caught a pass in every game he has played at A-State. Frampton is ranked tied for 17th in the nation in receptions (6.9 rpg).

**FRAMPTON EXTENDS STREAK:** Senior wide receiver **Dwayne Frampton** caught one pass last week against FIU, extending his streak of consecutive games with at least one reception to 20. He has caught a pass in every game he has played at A-State.

**CAREER DAY:** Senior wide receiver **Dwayne Frampton** recorded a school-record 13 receptions for a career-high 147 yards and one touchdown three games ago against ULM. Frampton's 13 receptions topped his previous school record of 12, set last season at Indiana. His 147 receiving yards tied the 15th most in school history.

**1,000 YARD CLUB:** Junior wide receiver **Taylor Stockemer** and senior receiver **Dwayne Frampton** both went over 1,000 receiving yards for their careers this season. Stockemer accomplished the feat during the Virginia Tech game and Frampton against UCA. Frampton has a team-high 1,428 yards to rank sixth in school history, while Stockemer has posted 1,317 yards to rank 10th in school history.

**MANNING AWARD STAR OF THE WEEK:** Following his performance in Arkansas State's 47-3 victory over Memphis, quarterback **Ryan Aplin** was selected as one of eight quarterbacks from across the nation to be named to the Manning

Award Stars of the Week list. Aplin completed 19-of-21 passes for 274 yards and three touchdowns in the victory over the Tigers. His completion rate of 90.5% was the second highest in school and Sun Belt Conference history.

**JARBOE HONORED:** Following the Memphis game, junior wide receiver **Josh Jarboe** was selected as one of nine wide receivers from across the nation to be named to the honorable mention list for the College Football Performance Awards' Wide Receiver of the Week award. Jarboe hauled in seven passes for 162 yards and two touchdowns in the Red Wolves' 47-3 victory over Memphis. Jarboe's 162 receiving yards ranked as the 10th-best single game performance all-time at ASU. His 162-yard performance was also the best by an ASU player since 1999. Jarboe is ranked 75th in the nation in receiving yards this season, averaging 65.7 per game.

**RIMINGTON AWARD WATCH LIST:** Senior center **Tom Castilaw** is on the 2011 Rimington Award Watch List issued annually to the nation's top center, making him the second ASU player to ever earn the preseason recognition. Tanner Jenkins was also on the list in 2006. Castilaw was a 2010 Second Team All-Sun Belt Conference selection after starting the final 11 games of the season.

**BILETNIKOFF AWARD WATCH LIST:** Senior wide receiver **Dwayne Frampton** and junior wide receiver **Josh Jarboe** are the first player in school history to ever be named to the Biletnikoff Award Watch List for the nation's top receiver.

**SCORING DEFENSE:** The Arkansas State defense has held four opponents under 20 points, including the last three in a row, this season. It is the first time since 1987 ASU has held three consecutive opponents under 20 points. The last time ASU held four straight opponents under 20 was 1986. The last time A-State held four opponents to less than 20 points over the course of an entire season was 2008, and the last time it held five under 20 was 2002. ASU is No. 23 in the nation and No. 1 in the Sun Belt Conference in scoring defense (19.6 ppg).

**STINGY DEFENSE:** The ASU defense has held three opponents under 300 yards total defense, including the last two in a row, and five under 350 yards. The last time ASU held five teams under 350 yards of total offense was 2009 and the last time it did so six times or more was 2008.

**UNDER 100:** The Arkansas State defense has not surrendered 100 yards rushing to an individual player this season, including the Sun Belt's top three rushers. During its nine-game stretch that dates back to last season, ASU has stopped an eight-game 100-yard rushing streak by WKU's Bobby Rainey, limited Doak Walker Award candidate and North Texas running back Lance Dunbar under 100 yards and also held the nation's 3rd leading rusher in Virginia Tech's David Wilson under 100 yards. ASU is ranked No. 30 in the nation in rushing defense.

**PICK IT OFF:** While the Red Wolves didn't record an interception in either of their first two games, they've now posted a combined 10 over the last six to climb to rank 26th in the nation. **Darryl Feemster** and **Kelcie McCray** each have a team-high 3 interceptions over that span, while **Qushaun Lee** both have 2 and **Darron Edwards** and **Sterling Young** both have 1. ASU has recorded at least one interception in each of the last six games.

**CFPA RECOGNIZES DAVIS:** This week, senior linebacker **Demario Davis** was selected as one of 11 linebackers from across the nation to be named to the honorable mention list for the College Football Performance Awards' Linebacker of the Week Award. Davis notched a season-high 12 tackles and a quarterback sack in the Red Wolves' 37-14 victory over North Texas. His 12 tackles were just two shy of his career high.

**GETTING TO THE QUARTERBACK:** Dating back to last season, senior defensive end **Brandon Joiner** has recorded at least a partial sack in 10 of ASU's last 13 games. In fact, 10.0 of his 10.5 career sacks at A-State have come over the Red Wolves last 13 games. He has at least a partial sack in six of ASU's first eight games this season. Joiner recorded a career-high 2.5 sacks against Middle Tennessee in the 10th game of last year.

**LOMBARDI AWARD WATCH LIST:** Senior linebacker **Demario Davis** is the fifth player in school

to be named to the Lombardi Award Watch List, issued to the top college lineman at the end of the season. Davis, a 2010 First Team All-Sun Belt choice, joins Alex Carrington (2009), Matt Mandich (2008), Tanner Jenkins (2006) and Garry Johnson (2001 and 2002) as A-State players that have been named to the award's watch list.

**DAVIS HONORED:** After breaking the ASU and Sun Belt Conference records for both field goals made in a game (6) and points scored by kick (23) during the Red Wolves' game against Central Arkansas, sophomore kicker **Brian Davis** received numerous honors. Davis, who was only one field goal and one point shy tying NCAA records, was named a Lou Groza Star of the Week, the Sun Belt Conference Special Teams Player of the Week and the College Football Performance Awards' National Placekicker of the Week. Davis was a perfect 6-of-6 on his field goal attempts and 5-of-5 on his extra point attempts. He has now made 10-of-13 field goals on the season.

**FIRST TIME IN OVER A DECADE:** Arkansas State returned a blocked punt for a TD during the ULM game for the first time since 2000 (Sean Mitchell block and Danny Smith return against Richmond). Junior DB **Don Jones** blocked his first career punt and also returned it for a touchdown. It was ASU's first special teams score since Kevin Jones returned a punt for a TD against Memphis in 2007.

**DIALING IT UP FROM LONG DISTANCE:** Sophomore kicker **Bobby Zalud** kicked a career-best 56 yard field goal against Memphis that tied the third longest in school history and ties the longest in the NCAA this season. His 56-yard field goal is also the second longest in Sun Belt Conference history behind only a 57-yard make by North Texas' Jason Ball in 2001. Zalud also had a 49 yard field goal against both Illinois and FIU and is now 5-of-8 on his field goal attempts this year with all five makes coming from over 40 yards.

**THE RETURN GAME:** Senior WR **Rod Hall** finished the WKU with 46 kickoff return yards, making him the ninth player in school history to record over 1,000 career KO return yards in a career. Senior WR **Dwayne Frampton** had a career-long 43 yard punt return, which was also the longest by an ASU player since 2008. His 50 yards total against WKU was also the most of his career.



After enjoying successful stints as both a head and assistant coach at the NCAA FBS, NAIA and high school levels over the last 18 years, Hugh Freeze was named Arkansas State's 27th head football coach on Dec. 2, 2010.

Freeze most recently completed his first season as Arkansas State's offensive coordinator, guiding the Red Wolves' offense to a record-breaking year in 2010.

"I am thrilled to be the next head coach at Arkansas State and continue building on the foundation Coach Roberts has set," said Freeze. "It is a dream come true and I am very indebted to President Welch, Chancellor Howard, Dr. Lee and Dr. Potts for their confidence in my ability to take this program to another level. My family and I look forward to being a very vital part of the Jonesboro community and the A-State family."

Freeze made an immediate impact on ASU's program, leading the offense to a No. 43 national ranking in total offense one year after the Red Wolves finished toward the bottom of the NCAA FBS rankings at No. 95. In just their first year under Freeze's up-tempo spread offense, the Red Wolves broke nine offensive school records that included 4,841 yards of total offense ranked No. 2 in the Sun Belt Conference.

Freeze, a noted speaker, motivator and recruiter throughout his career, led the ASU offense to other school records such as total plays (856), first downs (262), pass attempts (438), pass completions (266), completion percentage (.607), passing yards (3,057), passing yards per game (254.8) and passing touchdowns (23).

The Red Wolves' potent offensive attack averaged 403.4 yards per game, eclipsing over 300 yards all 12 times it took the field for the first time in the history of the program. A-State posted at least 400 yards of total offense in seven games during the 2010 campaign, the most ever as an NCAA FBS member.

ASU, ranked 42nd in the nation in scoring offense, finished the season averaging 30 points a game and recorded at least 20 points in 11 consecutive games for the first time in school history. Freeze's offense scored 46 touchdowns, including 23 on the ground and 23 through the air, for the fourth most in school history and the most since the 1975 season. While the Red Wolves' 23 passing touchdowns broke the school record, their 23 scores on the ground were the most by an ASU team since 2002. Their 360 total points were the most since 1987 and tied the fourth most in ASU history.

Under Freeze, the A-State offense was among the most dangerous in the Sun Belt Conference in 2010. The Red Wolves were ranked among the top two teams in the league in scoring offense, passing offense, total offense, pass efficiency, red zone offense and first downs. In addition to its

No. 40 national ranking in total offense and No. 42 spot in scoring offense, ASU ranked among the top 50 teams in the nation in red zone offense at No. 28.

In addition to working as ASU's offensive coordinator, Freeze was also the quarterbacks coach for the Red Wolves. Under Freeze's direction, sophomore Ryan Aplin exploded onto the scene in 2010 to emerge as a Sun Belt Conference Player of the Year candidate. Aplin not only broke the ASU records for total offense, passing yards, passing touchdowns and completions, he posted numbers that rank among the top 10 in Sun Belt Conference history in the same categories. Aplin was named the Sun Belt Conference Offensive Player of the Week three times during the 2010 season.

"We are extremely excited to named Hugh Freeze head football coach at Arkansas State University," said Dr. Lee at the announcement press conference. "He is a tremendous leader that makes those around him better and his high energy level is contagious. Coach Freeze has a great passion and vision for our football program. He is highly organized and has a plan that has made him successful throughout his career."

Prior to his arrival at Arkansas State, Freeze compiled a 20-5 record over the 2008 and 2009 seasons at the helm of the Lambuth University football program.

Freeze was named the American Football Coaches Association's Southeast Region Coach of the Year in 2009 after leading the Eagles to their best regular season in school history with an 11-0 record. Under Freeze's direction, Lambuth won the Mid-South Conference West Division, advanced to the second round of the NAIA playoffs for the first time since 1999, finished the year with a 12-1 mark and ascended to the No. 6 ranking in NAIA.

The Mid-South Conference Coach of the Year oversaw the offense and called the plays for a Lambuth team that averaged over 40 points per game and ranked ninth nationally in total yards per game (465 ypg). The Eagles also ranked first in the nation in fourth down conversions, fourth in first downs per game and third down conversions, fifth in passing offense and eighth in scoring offense per game.

Prior to taking over as head coach at Lambuth, Freeze served as interim head coach at the University of Mississippi in November of 2007 and was an assistant coach with the Rebels from 2005-07. He was named the Rebels' recruiting coordinator and tight ends coach before the 2006 season after originally serving as Assistant Athletic Director for Football External Affairs upon his arrival in Oxford.

In his first year as recruiting coordinator, he helped bring in the nation's 13th ranked recruiting class, the highest in the history of the program. Freeze was responsible for the recruitment of nine signees, including two that went on to be named Freshman All-America, in the class alone.

While maintaining his duties as recruiting coordinator, he moved to wide receivers coach in 2007 and tutored two players that were ranked among the top-15 players in receiving in the SEC. Ole Miss' 2007 signing class was ranked 25th nationally and he was responsible for nine commitments in the 2008 signing class.

Before going to Ole Miss, Freeze served 13 years at Briarcrest Christian School in Memphis, Tenn., as a classroom teacher, coach and administrator. He was the Saints' head football coach from 1995 to 2004, running the no huddle "spread system" for six years that led to six straight state championship games.

Freeze compiled a 99-23 record, which included an undefeated season in 1996, while at Briarcrest and led the school to state championship titles in 2002 and 2004. Briarcrest won regional championships in 1995, 1996, 1997, 1998, 2001 and 2002, and Freeze was named the Region 8-AA Coach of the Year five times and Associated Press Coach of the Year four times.

Before assuming the role of head coach at Briarcrest, Freeze served as the Saints offensive coordinator and defensive backs coach from 1992-1994 as the Saints reached the TSSAA state semifinals twice.

A 1988 graduate of Senatobia (Miss.) High School, Freeze earned his bachelors degree in mathematics with a minor in coaching and sports administration from the University of Southern Mississippi in 1992.

Hugh and his wife, Jill, are the parents of three daughters, Ragan (13), Jordan (12), and Madison (9).

## GAME 1

CHAMPAIGN, Ill. - Arkansas State put up 350 yards of total offense but dropped its season opener 33-15 at Illinois.

Frankie Jackson scored the only touchdown of the game for the Red Wolves with 3:20 remaining in the fourth quarter. Jackson led ASU's rushing attack with 39 yards on the ground. Dwayne Frampton recorded 99 yards receiving and quarterback Ryan Aplin went 20-of-32 for 290 yards to lead the Red Wolves passing game.

Amos Draper dropped Illinois running back Jason Ford a yard deep in the Illini end zone to give the Red Wolves a safety and cut the Illinois lead to five, 7-2, at the 14:02 mark of the second quarter. ASU took the lead with a pair of career-long field goals from Bobby Zalud and Brian Davis to go up 8-7 in the second quarter.

However, IU quarter back Nathan Scheelhasse completed a pass to Darius Millines for a 45-yard score with 1:24 left in the first half that started a run of 26 unanswered points by the Illini.

Defensively, Nathan Herrold, Kelcie McCray and Justin Robertson led the Red Wolves with eight tackles each. Brandon Joiner, Elroy Brown and Don Jones each had a quarterback sack for A-State.

## GAME 2

JONESBORO - Arkansas State Red Wolves piled up 611 yards of total offense and limited Memphis to just 169 as the Red Wolves rolled to a 47-3 victory over the Tigers before 29,872 fans at ASU Stadium. The crowd was the second largest in ASU Stadium history and marked the home debut of first-year head coach Hugh Freeze. The Red Wolves' 611 yards of total offense was the seventh most in school history, and the 169 yards allowed was the fewest surrendered by the ASU defense against an FBS opponent since giving up 164 against Army in 2006.

Junior quarterback Ryan Aplin completed 19-of-21 passes for 274 yards and three touchdowns, junior wide receiver Josh Jarboe hauled in seven passes for 162 yards and two scores and freshman running back Frankie Jackson rushed for 101 yards and a touchdown on 10 carries to lead the Red Wolves' offense. Sophomore placekicker Bobby Zalud matched the third-longest field goal in school history when he booted a 56-yarder in the third quarter and senior safety A.J. Hills led the ASU defense with a career-high nine tackles, including one behind the line of scrimmage.

ASU took a 30-3 halftime advantage before adding 17 points in the third quarter to set the final score.

## GAME 3

BLACKSBURG, Va. - Arkansas State jumped out to a quick 7-0 lead against Virginia Tech, but the 13th-ranked Hokies responded with 23 first-half points and went on to defeat ASU 26-7 Saturday afternoon at Lane Stadium.

The Red Wolves found the end zone on their first possession when Ryan Aplin scrambled in from five yards out just over three minutes into the game.

Virginia Tech was shut out of the end zone on its next possession to give ASU the ball at its own one, but on the second play of the drive, Aplin was flagged for intentional grounding in the end zone, with the penalty awarding Virginia Tech a safety.

## GAME 4

JONESBORO - Arkansas State sophomore kicker Brian Davis set a new ASU and Sun Belt Conference record with six field goals as the Red Wolves pulled away from a 19-10 halftime lead and went on to defeat the Central Arkansas 53-24 at ASU Stadium.

Davis also set an ASU and SBC scoring record by a kicker with 23 points on the night. Quarterback Ryan Aplin accounted for 304 yards on the evening, rushing for 84 and completing 19-of-28 passes for 220 yards and a touchdown. Wide receiver Dwayne Frampton caught a team-high eight passes in the game for 100 yards.

The Red Wolves opened the third quarter with a one-yard touchdown plunge from running back Jermaine Robertson, Davis added a 21-yard field goal, and quarterback Andre Smith scored on a two-yard run to stretch the Arkansas State lead to 36-10. UCA was not able to get closer than 19 points the rest of the way.

Defensively, the Red Wolves were led by linebacker Demario Davis and safety A.J. Hills with six tackles each. Defensive ends Brandon Joiner and Justin Robertson added three tackles and a quarterback sack each. Joiner continued his streak of recording a sack in each of ASU's first four games this season.

## GAME 5

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. - Arkansas State running back Derek Lawson's one-yard touchdown plunge with 43 seconds remaining capped a wild fourth quarter and lifted the Red Wolves to a 26-22 victory over the Western Kentucky Hilltoppers at Houchens Industries-L.T. Smith Stadium in the Sun Belt Conference opener for both teams.

Lawson's touchdown put the finishing touch on a nine-play, 66-yard drive that seemed improbable after WKU appeared to have picked up a first down at the ASU 31 with just under three minutes remaining in the game.

From there, quarterback Ryan Aplin directed a nine-play drive, completing five passes on the possession. Aplin found wide receiver Dwayne Frampton for a first down at the WKU one, and on the next play, Lawson crossed the goal line for what proved to be the winning score.

Aplin finished the night 37-of-49 for 396 yards and a touchdown. His 37 completions set a new ASU record. He completed passes to eight different receivers on the night, led by Frampton with 126 yards and Jarboe with 112. Senior safety A.J. Hills recorded a career-high 11 tackles to lead the ASU defense.

## GAME 6

MONROE, La. - Arkansas State senior wide receiver Dwayne Frampton set a school record with 13 receptions and the Red Wolves overcame a 13-10 halftime deficit to defeat the ULM Warhawks 24-19 at Malone Stadium.

Frampton's 13 receptions were good for a career-high 147 yards and a touchdown, all coming from quarterback Ryan Aplin who completed 27-of-43 passes on the night for 261 yards and a touchdown.

The Red Wolves scored 14 unanswered points in the second half to take a 24-13 lead with 13:51 remaining, then held on as ULM scored with just under three minutes to play and threatened again in the final minute. ## GAME 7

JONESBORO - Arkansas State junior quarterback Ryan Aplin rushed for a career-high 164 yards and two touchdowns to lead the Red Wolves to a 34-16 victory over Florida International in a nationally-televised ESPN2 Sun Belt Conference game at ASU Stadium.

The Red Wolves broke away from a 6-6 halftime tie to outscore the Panthers 28-10 in the second half.

Aplin's rushing total was the most for an ASU player since the 2008 season and helped the Red Wolves extend their win streak to four games and remain unbeaten in SBC action. Aplin added 147 passing yards and a touchdown as the A-State defense held FIU, the pre-season league favorite, to just 289 yards on the night.

Defensively, the Red Wolves were led by linebacker Nick Nelms and safety Jaquan Kilcrease with eight tackles each. Nelms' tackle total was a career-high and he also forced a fumble for the second consecutive game. Freshman Sterling Young added a career-best seven tackles and a sack in his first start. Arkansas State's defense held FIU to 117 fewer yards than it's season average of 406 and limited the Golden Panthers to just 66 rushing yards on the night after FIU entered the game averaging 157 on the ground.

Take ramp onto I-240 West toward I-240 Little Rock/Downtown for 2.6 miles. Continue on I-55 North for 6.1 miles. Take the St. Louis/Little Rock exit on I-55 North and go 24.4 miles. Take exit 23B/Marked Tree/Jonesboro onto US-61 for 0.5 miles. Continue on US-63 North for 41 miles. Take ramp toward Caraway Road/Stadium Boulevard for 0.2 miles. Bear right on Stadium Boulevard and go 2.2 miles until seeing ASU Stadium on the left. Parking is available for the working media on the northwest grass lot of the stadium complex.

**From Little Rock National Airport:** Leaving the airport on East Roosevelt Road go 0.3 miles and continue on Annie M. Bankhead Drive for another 0.4 miles. Turn left to take the ramp onto I-440 East toward TO I-40 for 11.3 miles. Take the Jacksonville exit onto US-67 North and go 96.5 miles. Turn right on AR-226E and go 11.7 miles. Turn right on Co. Road 203. Turn left on US-49 and 6.5 miles. Take ramp onto US 49 North and go 2.7 miles until taking the Stadium Boulevard exit for 0.2 miles.
