THE PRINCIPALS: Arkansas State is off to a 1-2 start for the fourth consecutive year, picking up its lone victory against Memphis and dropping road games against two nationally-ranked programs in Oregon and Nebraska. The Red Wolves are coming off a 42-13 setback to the Huskers, but have not dropped back-to-back games during the regular season since the 2010 campaign. Alcorn State holds an identical 1-2 record, suffering its second straight loss last week in a 24-6 decision to UAPB.

HEAD COACH GUS MALZAHN: Gus Malzahn was named the Red Wolves' 28th head football coach at Dec. 14 press conference, bringing him back to his home state after most recently enjoying highly successful stints as a top assistant coach at three NCAA FBS universities that garnered him national acclaim. A name highly recognized throughout Arkansas and the nation, Malzahn comes to Arkansas State after serving as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Auburn for the past three seasons. A native of Fort Smith, Malzahn was named the winner of the 2010 Frank Broyles Award, given annually to the nation's top collegiate assistant coach.

COACHING RECOGNITION: First-year Arkansas State Head Football Coach Gus Malzahn was recognized as one of the top hires in the nation this offseason, named as the No. 4 best hire and No. 2 most intriguing hire in the nation by CBSSports.com. He was also one of two head coaches in the nation to receive a grade of A+ among new hires for the 2012 season by the Sporting News. Bleacher Report's "Over/Under Victories" for every new head coach places A-State at nine victories, one of the tops listed in the report

HALL OF HONOR: A-State head coach Gus Malzahn will be one of seven inductees into Henderson State University's Reddie Hall of Honor on Oct. 6. The event will take place at the Garrison Center Day Gym on the Henderson campus with festivities beginning at 11 a.m. Saturday. A two-year letterman, Malzahn averaged 35.3 yards per punt his first year at Henderson and 37.7 yards his senior year, including a long of 64 yards. He also caught 24 passes for 288 yards for an average of 12.0 yards

ASU ANNOUNCES FOOTBALL FACILITY PROJECT: Arkansas State University announced a \$22 million football facility project, including a two-level football operations building and 76,000 square-foot indoor practice facility in ASU Stadium's north end zone, at an 11 a.m. press conference held Sept. 6 at the current ASU Football Facility . . . The new football operations building's first floor will house A-State's locker room, stateof-the-art strength and conditioning and sports medicine centers, a players lounge and equipment room. The second floor will feature coaching and administrative offices, team meeting rooms, a history and heritage showroom and a team film room with theatre seating. The indoor practice facility will run east and west and be connected to the north side of the operations building . . . The facility will have a brick exterior and feature an outdoor plaza facing the field on the building's second level. The interior will have a strong Red Wolves' theme with black and red dominating the esthetic

IT'S ALL IN THE NAME: In recognition of a \$5 million contribution by Liberty Bank, the ASU Board of Trustees announced last Saturday that Liberty Bank Stadium is the new name of the football stadium at Arkansas State University. The naming rights to the stadium are for the next 15 years, as announced at the newly-named facility just prior to kickoff of the Red Wolves' home football game against the Memphis Tigers.

A-STATE NAMES NEW AD: Arkansas State University Chancellor Dr. Tim Hudson announced Wednesday that Terry Mohajir, a 20-year veteran leader in collegiate athletics with a diverse background as an administrator, coach, student-athlete and city government participant, has been named A-State's 11th Director of Athletics. An Arkansas State University alumnus, Mohajir's (pronounced MO-HA-JUR) career path went through three other NCAA Division I institutions, including the University of Missouri-Kansas City, Florida Atlantic and Kansas, before leading him back to his alma mater. The Overland Park, Kansas native has been involved with major fundraising campaigns at multiple universities, while also overseeing corporate sales, marketing promotions and ticket sales. He most recently served the last 13 months as Kansas' Senior Associate Director of Athletics and Chief Marketing Officer. Prior to his time with the Jayhawks, he spent a seven-year stint as Florida Atlantic's Senior Associate Director of Athletics for External Relations from 2004-11 after working at UMKC from 1997-2004 as its Assistant Director of Athletics for External

THE ASU-ALCORN STATE SERIES: Saturday's game will be the first ever meeting between Arkansas State and Alcorn State.

A-STATE vs. THE SWAC: While A-State and Alcorn State will meet for the first time Saturday, the Red Wolves have played four other opponents among the current SWAC membership all-time. The Red Wolves hold a 5-0 record in those games with victories over Grambling (1985), Jackson State (1987), Mississippi Valley State (1995, 2009) and Texas Southern (2008). A-State has outscored its opponents a combined 244-10 in those games, including a 61-0 victory over Mississippi Valley State (2009) and an 83-10 win against Texas Southern in the two most recent meetings against a SWAC team.

A-STATE vs. THE FCS: Arkansas State is playing an FCS member for the second consecutive season and the fourth time over the last five years. Dating back to the 2002 campaign, the Red Wolves have won their last seven games against FCS foes by a combined 370-60 score. A-State's last setback against an FCS opponent was the 2001 regular-season finale when it dropped a 28-22 decision to Nicholls State. ASU is 18-4 against FCS opponents since moving to the FBS in 1992.

AN A-STATE VICTORY WOULD . . . : Give the Red Wolves a 2-2 record through four games played for the second consecutive season . . . Extend its home winning streak to eight games . . . Extend its winning streak against FCS opponents to eight games . . . Improve its record against SWAC opponents to 6-0 . . . Give ASU back-to-back seasons with at least two non-conference victories for the first time since 2007 and 2008 . . . Move ASU's record at Liberty Bank Stadium to 33-7 since the 2005 season.

HOME OPENERS: Arkansas State defeated Memphis on Sept. 8 to extend its winning streak in home openers played in Jonesboro to eight

games dating back to the 2005 campaign. The Red Wolves now stand 28-11 all-time in home openers at Liberty Bank Stadium and are also 15-6 in such games since moving to Division I-A (FBS) in 1992.

DEFEND THIS HOUSE: Arkansas State has won its last seven home games, which gives the Red Wolves their longest winning streak at Liberty Bank Stadium since 2004-2006 when they won 11 in a row.

HOME SWEET HOME: With a 6-0 home record last season, Arkansas State secured its seventh consecutive winning record at Liberty Bank Stadium dating back to 2005. ASU is now 32-7 at ASU Stadium since the 2005 season. The Red Wolves actual on-field record all-time at Liberty Bank Stadium is 124-70-1 since it opened in 1974. ASU's six home wins last season were its most since 1985.

98th SEASON UNDER WAY: Arkansas State kicked off its 98th season of football Sept. 1 at Oregon. ASU now holds a 417-456-37 record since the inaugural 1911 season and has played in eight bowl games. A-State did not field a football team from 1942-44 due to World War II. ASU also didn't have a team in 1918 as World War I was ending.

300-PLUS: Dating back to the 2010 season, Arkansas State has posted at least 300 yards of total offense 26 of its last 28 games. ASU's 12-game streak with over 300 yards total offense came to an end just two games shy of the school record last time out against Nebraska.

HERALDED PEFORMANCE: Senior linebacker *Nathan Herrold* matched his season high with 11 tackles last game, marking the second time this year and fifth time of his career he reached double-figure stops. He now has a team-high 31 tackles, placing him second in the Sun Belt Conference and tied for 28th in the nation in tackles.

MAGIC 8-BALL: Redshirt freshman receiver *J.D. McKissic* recorded a career-high eight receptions for the second straight game last time out, giving him 20 receptions on the season to tie teammate *Josh Jarboe* for the most on the squad. McKissic and Jarboe are tied for the third most receptions in the Sun Belt Conference (6.7 per game) and 24th most in the nation. Jarboe tied the school record for receptions in a game with 13 against Oregon.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD: The Red Wolves regular-season streak of eight games with at least 30 points came to an end last week against Memphis. However, ASU has still scored 30 or more points in 10 of its last 14 regular-season games. A-State scored 30 or more points in eight games during the 2011 season, the most since 1951 when it hit the total 10 times.

FUMBLE, FUMBLE-I-YA . . . : The Red Wolves defense and special teams combined to record four fumble recoveries last game against Nebraska, which was only one shy of tying the second most in school history. The last time ASU tallied more than four fumble recoveries in a game was 1997 when it had five against Southern Utah.

SULLIVENT HONORED: Senior punter *Neely* | his season average to 41.3 yards per punt to rank Sullivent was announced Sunday as a College Football Performance Awards national honorable mention punter of the week. Sullivent averaged 48 yards per punt against Nebraska, almost a full 10 yards more than his season average of 38.4 entering the game. He recorded his second punt of the season to travel over 50 yards and also posted his first punt inside the 20. Sullivent raised

him fourth in the Sun Belt Conference.

MONSTER GAME: Sophomore linebacker Qushaun Lee recorded a career-high 15 tackles and recovered a fumble for a touchdown against No. 24 Nebraska. Lee's 15 tackles not only topped his previous best of seven, but were also the most by an A-State player since Javon McKinnon recorded 16 stops against Louisville in 2010 and tied the most by a Sun Belt Conference player this year. Additionally, Lee's 15 tackles matched the fourth highest total recorded by any player in the nation this season. Lee's fumble recovery in the end zone gave him his first career touchdown, and marked the first time the Red Wolves scored on a touchdown on a fumble recovery since their 2011 regular-season finale. The touchdown pulled ASU within 28-10 of Nebraska early in the third guarter.

MORE OFTEN THAN NOT: Senior quarterback Ryan Aplin's 12-game streak with at least one touchdown pass came to an end last week against Nebraska, but he has still tossed at least one touchdown in 28 of his last 31 games dating back to his freshman season. Aplin has also thrown for at least 200 yards 24 times in his career and all 24 have come over ASU's last 30 games. Additionally, he has 15 career games with over 300 yards total offense, including five of the last six.

KICK IT INTO GEAR: Junior kicker Brian Davis took over sole possession for the sixth most field goals made in a career last time out, ending the Nebraska game with two field goals to run his three-year total to 30. He made two field goals for the fourth straight game and is tied for 8th in the nation this season in field goals made with six. He has now made multiple field goals in eight career games.

ACTIVE APLIN: Senior quarterback Ryan Aplin is ranked among the top active players in the NCAA in several career statistics, including:

GETTING DEFENSIVE: A-State held Memphis to 293 yards total offense, the fewest by an ASU opponent since FAU recorded 281 last season. The Red Wolves recorded six tackles for loss against the Tigers as well, matching their total from the Oregon game.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: A-State's 619 yards of total offense against Memphis were the eighth most in school history and its most against an FBS opponent since recording a school-record 681 against Louisiana-Lafayette in 2007. The Red Wolves' also ran 98 plays, which tied the second most in school history and were the most in a game since 1975. Additionally, the Red Wolves set the school record for first downs in a game with 34, topping the previous total of 28 set against Southern Illinois in 1982.

CAREER HIGHS: Senior defensive lineman Ronnell Wright, sophomore safety Kyle Coleman and junior linebacker Eddie Porter all at least tied their career-high tackles total last game against Nebraska. Wright and Coleman both set new highs with six tackles each, while Porter tied his high with five. Porter also posted his first forced fumble and fumble recovery in the game.

TWO MORE SCHOOL RECORDS: Senior quarterback *Ryan Aplin* set two new school records this year both career total offense and career passing yards, giving him 17 combined game, season and career records at ASU... His *single-game* records include most plays, total offense, most average yards per game, passes attempted and completions... His single-season records include most plays, total offense, passes attempted, completions, touchdown passes, highest completion percentage and most passing yards per game... His *career* records include total offense, most average yards per game, completions, highest completion percentage and most passing yards per game.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE: Senior quarterback *Ryan Aplin* was named Sun Belt Conference Preseason Offensive Player of the Year and one of four A-State players named to the all-conference team at the league's Media Day in New Orleans. Aplin, senior wideout *Josh Jarboe*, senior offensive lineman *Zack McKnight* and senior defensive back *Don Jones* were all named to the Preseason All-SBC Team.

RED WOLVES TABBED SECOND IN PRESEASON SBC POLL: The Red Wolves were picked second in the preseason coaches poll announced as part of the league's annual Media Day. Arkansas State received 85 points and two first place votes, just behind Florida International, which received five first place votes and 92 points to earn the nod as the preseason favorite in the league race. The Red Wolves won the Sun Belt Conference Championship a year ago after posting a perfect 8-0 record in league play during the 2011 season. Louisiana-Lafayette, Western Kentucky and Troy rounded out the top five in the poll, and FIU defensive lineman Tourek Williams was named the Preseason Defensive Player of the Year.

HIGHLY TOUTED RECRUITING CLASS: With a

Parade All-Amercian, Under Armour All-American, NJCAA All-American, 23 players that earned either junior college all-conference or high school all-state recognition and 18 players rated at least three stars by one or more of the major recruiting sources, the 2012 ASU signing class could be considered one of the best in the history of the ASU football program. Arkansas State had the top-rated class in the Sun Belt Conference by Rivals.com, Scout.com, ESPN.com and 247Sports.com.

RETURNING ALL-CONFERENCE PLAYERS: A-State returns five 2011 All-Sun Belt Conference players this season, including the league's Player of the Year in senior quarterback *Ryan Aplin*. Aplin was a first-team selection and was joined by second-team choices *Josh Jarboe* (Sr., WR) and *Nathan Herrold* (Sr., LB). Returning as honorable mention choices are senior wideout *Taylor Stockemer* and senior punter *Neely Sullivent*.

GODADDY.COM BOWL: Arkansas State accepted an official invitation to the GoDaddy.com Bowl last season following its victory over Middle Tennessee on Nov. 19, placing the Red Wolves in a bowl game for the first time since 2005 when they played Southern Miss in the New Orleans Bowl in Lafayette, La. ASU was bowl eligible for the first time since 2008, but for the fourth time over the last seven seasons. ASU reached bowl eligibility after just eight games, making last year the earliest ASU had ever been bowl eligible as an FBS member (since 1992).

SUN BELT CHAMPIONS: Arkansas State claimed its first ever outright Sun Belt Conference championship last season. Including 2011, Arkansas State has won eight conference championships all-time. ASU won the Southland Conference seven times (1986, 1985, 1978, 1975, 1970, 1969, 1968). ASU also won the 2005 Sun Belt Conference championship, but it was later vacated due to NCAA sanctions.

IN THE POLLS: Arkansas State received as many as 18 votes in the AP Top 25 Poll and 13 votes in the USA Today Top 25 Coaches Poll, while also ranking as high as No. 35 in the BCS and reaching No. 30 in the CBSSports.com 120 rankings during the season.

SENIOR BOWL WATCHLIST: ASU has two players on the inaugural Senior Bowl Watch list. Senior quarterback *Ryan Aplin* and senior wide out *Josh Jarboe* were added to the watch list on August 24.

APLIN ON NUMEROUS WATCH LISTS: An All-America and Heisman candidate, senior quarterback *Ryan Aplin* has garnered a significant amount of national attention this preseason as he is listed on the Walter Camp Player of the Year Watch List, Davey O'Brien Award Watch List, Johnny Unitas Award Watch List and the Manning Award Watch List. Video, action photos and biographical information for Aplin are all available on a Facebook Page, maintained by the ASU Sports Information Department, called "Ryan Aplin All-America and Heisman Campaign." Fans and media will be able to follow Aplin's 2012 season on the page, where updates will be posted throughout fall camp and the upcoming season.

ATHLON'S PRESEASON HONORS: The Red Wolves had six players named to Athlon's preseason All-Sun Belt Conference Team, including senior quarterback Ryan Aplin (first team), senior wide receiver Josh Jarboe (first team), senior offensive lineman Zack McKnight (first team), senior linebacker Nathan Herrold (first team), junior defensive lineman Ryan Carrethers (second team) and senior safety Don Jones (second team).

PHIL STEELE'S PRESEASON HONORS: Phil Steele's preseason All-Sun Belt team featured 12 A-State players, including first team selections Ryan Aplin (Sr., QB) and Josh Jarboe (Sr., WR). ASU's 12 selections tied the fourth most in the league with Troy. Earning a spot on the second team were Taylor Stockemer (Sr., WR), Zack McKnight (Sr., OL), Nathan Herrold (Sr., LB), Chaz Scales (Sr., DB) and Andrew Tryon (So., DB), who made the team as a kick returner. The Wolves' third-team choices were Frankie Jackson (So., RB), Ryan Carrethers (Jr., DL) and Brian Davis (Jr., K), while Ishamail Hayes (Jr., DE) and Qushaun Lee (So., LB) were fourth-team selections.

COLLEGE SPORTS MADNESS PRESEASON HONORS: CollegeSportsMadness.com has announced its preseason All-Sun Belt Conference Team, which includes Offensive Player of the Year Ryan Aplin (Sr., QB). Along with Aplin, Zack McKnight (Sr., OL) was named a first team choice. Second team selections inlcuded Josh Jarboe (Sr., WR), Brian Davis (Jr., K) and Nathan Herrold (Sr., LB). A-State's third team picks included Taylor Stockemer (Sr., WR), Andrew Tryon (So., DB) as a kick returner and Chaz Scales (Sr., DB).

BLUE RIBBON PRESEASON HONORS: The Blue Ribbon Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference Team included Arkansas State players *Josh Jarboe* (Sr., WR), *Ryan Aplin* (Sr., QB) and *Nathan Herrold* (Sr., LB).



Gus Malzahn was named the Red Wolves' 28th head football coach Dec. 14, 2011, bringing him back to his home state after most recently enjoying highly successful stints as a top assistant coach at three NCAA FBS universities that garnered national acclaim.

A name highly recognized throughout Arkansas and the nation, Malzahn comes to Arkansas State after serving as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Auburn for the past three seasons. A native of Fort Smith, Malzahn was named the winner of the 2010 Frank Broyles Award, given annually to the nation's top collegiate assistant coach.

His innovative offense made an immediate and profound impact during his tenure at Auburn, highlighted by a record-setting offense in 2010 when the Tigers finished 14-0 and claimed the school's first national championship since 1957. The Auburn offense set nine school records, including points in a season (577), points per game (41.2), total yards (6,989), total offense (499.2), rushing yards (3,987), rushing touchdowns (41) and passing touchdowns (31). Malzahn's record-setting offense in 2010 led the Southeastern Conference and finished in the top 10 nationally in six statistical categories.

He coached Heisman Trophy winner Cam Newton during the Tigers run to the 2011 BCS National Championship. Under Malzahn's direction, Newton later became the overall No. 1 pick in the 2011 NFL Draft after producing one of the best single-season quarterback performances in collegiate history. Newton threw for 2,908 yards and 30 touchdowns, while rushing for 1,586 yards and an additional 20 touchdowns as Auburn finished 14-0 and defeated Oregon 22-19 in the BCS title game.

Newton also won the school's first-ever Davey O'Brien Award and Manning Award, given to the nation's top quarterback. He also claimed the Maxwell Award presented annually to college football's top player, while also earning Associated Press National Player of the Year and SEC Offensive Player of the Year awards.

He helped lead the Tigers to a 7-5 record this season, which will include an appearance in the Chik-fil-A Bowl on Dec. 31. The Malzahn-led Auburn offense had four players named to the All-SEC Team, including sophomore running back Michael Dyer, junior tight end Philip Lutzenkirchen, senior offensive lineman Brandon Mosley and junior running back Onterio McCalebb.

Malzahn's arrival in 2009 and style of offense marked a drastic turnaround from the 2008 season when Auburn struggled offensively. In a two-year period, the Tigers improved from a tie for 110th to 7th in the nation in scoring offense (from 17.3 to 41.2) and from 104th to 7th in total offense. It also took Auburn just six games in 2009 to score more points than it did in all 12 games in 2008.

Before coaching at Auburn, Malzahn spent two seasons at Tulsa, coordinating a Golden Hurricane offense that finished first nationally in total offense in 2007 and 2008. Tulsa's offense in 2007 established nine team school records and 12 individual records. The Hurricane also set nine Conference USA team records, while Tulsa quarterback Paul Smith broke an

NCAA record by throwing for at least 300 yards in 14 consecutive games.

Prior to his time at Tulsa, he coached one season at Arkansas, where he served as offensive coordinator, coached Heisman Trophy runner-up Darren McFadden and helped the Razorbacks finish fourth nationally in rushing offense at 228.5 yards per game. In fact, two of Malzahn's first three collegiate offenses ranked in the top 10 nationally in rushing, including the 2008 Tulsa team and 2006 Arkansas squad.

In 14 seasons as a high school head coach, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. Malzahn coached two quarterbacks, Josh Floyd and Rhett Lashlee, who set national passing records. Malzahn also tutored 2005 Gatorade, Parade Magazine and Rivals.com National Player of the Year Mitch Mustain at Springdale High School

Malzahn is married to the former Kristi Otwell and they are the parents of two daughters, Kylie (23) and Kenzie (20).



Aplin passed Corey Leonard to become ASU's all-time leader in total offense with 9,075 yards. Aplin also passed Cleo Lemon to become A-State's all-time leader in passing yards with 7,720 yards. He finished the night 29-of-44 for 304 yards and three touchdown passes, while Jarboe had 66 yards receiving and a touchdown.

PRACTICE COVERAGE: Arkansas State football practice is open to the media the first 20 minutes Tuesday and Wednesday. TV crews wishing to shoot practice must notify the sports information office in advance. Players and coaches are available for interviews following each practice, Tuesday-Wednesday.

Take ramp onto I-240 West toward I-240 Little Rock/Downtown for 2.6 miles. Continue on I-55 North for 6.1 miles. Take the St. Louis/Little Rock exit on I-55 North and go 24.4 miles. Take exit 23B/Marked Tree/Jonesboro onto US-61for 0.5 miles. Continue on US-63 North for 41 miles. Take ramp toward Caraway Road/Stadium Boulevard for 0.2 miles. Bear right on Stadium Boulevard and go 2.2 miles until seeing ASU Stadium on the left. Parking is available for the working media on the northwest grass lot of the stadium complex.

From Little Rock National Airport: Leaving the airport on East Roosevelt Road go 0.3 miles and continue on Annie M. Bankhead Drive for another 0.4 miles. Turn left to take the ramp onto I-440 East toward TO I-40 for 11.3 miles. Take the Jacksonville exit onto US-67 North and go 96.5 miles. Turn right on AR-226E and go 11.7 miles. Turn right on Co. Road 203. Turn left on US-49 and 6.5 miles. Take ramp onto US 49 North and go 2.7 miles until taking the Stadium Boulevard exit for 0.2 miles. Turn left on Stadium Boulevard and go 2.4 miles until seeing ASU Stadium on the left. Parking is available for working media on the northwest grass lot of the stadium complex.
