THE PRINCIPALS: Following a 56-0 victory over Alcorn State, the Red Wolves are off to a 2-2 start for the second consecutive year. A-State will carry an eight-game conference winning streak, tied for the longest in the nation with Northern Illinois, into Saturday's game. Western Kentucky brings a 3-1 record and two-game winning streak into the game, picking up victories over Kentucky and Southern Miss its last two times out. ASU defeated WKU 26-22 in both team's 2011 league opener, but the Hilltoppers won their final seven Sun Belt games to give them the nation's third longest conference winning

HEAD COACH GUS MALZAHN: Gus Malzahn was named the Red Wolves' 28th head football coach at Dec. 14 press conference, bringing him back to his home state after most recently enjoying highly successful stints as a top assistant coach at three NCAA FBS universities that garnered him national acclaim. A name highly recognized throughout Arkansas and the nation, Malzahn comes to Arkansas State after serving as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Auburn for the past three seasons. A native of Fort Smith, Malzahn was named the winner of the 2010 Frank Broyles Award, given annually to the nation's top collegiate assistant coach.

COACHING RECOGNITION: First-year Arkansas State Head Football Coach *Gus Malzahn* was recognized as one of the top hires in the nation this offseason, named as the No. 4 best hire and No. 2 most intriguing hire in the nation by CBSSports.com. He was also one of two head coaches in the nation to receive a grade of A+ among new hires for the 2012 season by the *Sporting News*. Bleacher Report's "Over/Under Victories" for every new head coach places A-State at nine victories, one of the tops listed in the report.

HALL OF HONOR: A-State head coach *Gus Malzahn* will be one of seven inductees into Henderson State University's Reddie Hall of Honor on Oct. 6. The event will take place at the Garrison Center Day Gym on the Henderson campus with festivities beginning at 11 a.m. Saturday. A two-year letterman, Malzahn averaged 35.3 yards per punt his first year at Henderson and 37.7 yards his senior year, including a long of 64 yards. He also caught 24 passes for 288 yards for an average of 12.0 yards per catch. He earned All-AIC Honorable Mention honors in 1989.

#### ASU ANNOUNCES FOOTBALL FACILITY PROJECT:

Arkansas State University announced a \$22 million football facility project, including a two-level football operations building and 76,000 square-foot indoor practice facility in ASU Stadium's north end zone, at an 11 a.m. press conference held Sept. 6 at the current ASU Football Facility . . . The new football operations building's first floor will house A-State's locker room, state-of-the-art strength

and conditioning and sports medicine centers, a players lounge and equipment room. The second floor will feature coaching and administrative offices, team meeting rooms, a history and heritage showroom and a team film room with theatre seating. The indoor practice facility will run east and west and be connected to the north side of the operations building . . . The facility will have a brick exterior and feature an outdoor plaza facing the field on the building's second level. The interior will have a strong Red Wolves' theme with black and red dominating the esthetic appearance.

IT'S ALL IN THE NAME: In recognition of a \$5 million contribution by Liberty Bank, the ASU Board of Trustees announced last Sept. 8 that Liberty Bank Stadium is the new name of the football stadium at Arkansas State University. The naming rights to the stadium are for the next 15 years, as announced at the newly-named facility just prior to kickoff of the Red Wolves' home football game against the Memphis Tigers.

A-STATE NAMES NEW AD: Arkansas State University Chancellor Dr. Tim Hudson announced Sept. 19 that Terry Mohajir, a 20-year veteran leader in collegiate athletics with a diverse background as an administrator, coach, student-athlete and city government participant, has been named A-State's 11th Director of Athletics. An Arkansas State University alumnus, Mohajir's (pronounced MO-HA-JUR) career path went through three other NCAA Division I institutions, including the University of

Missouri-Kansas City, Florida Atlantic and Kansas, before leading him back to his alma mater. The Overland Park, Kansas native has been involved with major fundraising campaigns at multiple universities, while also overseeing corporate sales, marketing promotions and ticket sales. He most recently served the last 13 months as Kansas' Senior Associate Director of Athletics and Chief Marketing Officer. Prior to his time with the Jayhawks, he spent a seven-year stint as Florida Atlantic's Senior Associate Director of Athletics for External Relations from 2004-11 after working at UMKC from 1997-2004 as its Assistant Director of Athletics for External Relations.

98th SEASON UNDER WAY: Arkansas State kicked off its 98th season of football Sept. 1 at Oregon. ASU now holds a 418-456-37 record since the inaugural 1911 season and has played in eight bowl games. A-State did not field a football team from 1942-44 due to World War II. ASU also didn't have a team in 1918 as World War I was ending.

COACH TO CURE MD: The Arkansas State and Western Kentucky coaching staffs will be wearing Coach to Cure MD patches this week to raise awareness and funding for Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy research. Fans are encouraged to donate online at www.CoachtoCureMD.org or donate \$5 by texting CURE to 90999.

THE ASU-WKU SERIES: Arkansas State is 3-2-1 all-time versus Western Kentucky and 1-1 when facing the Hilltoppers in Jonesboro. Five of the six previous contests between the two teams have been decided by four points or less, including all three meetings as Sun Belt foes. The Red Wolves pulled out a 26-22 comeback victory over WKU in Bowling Green last season, one year after falling to the Hilltoppers 36-35 in overtime in Jonesboro. ASU also claimed a 24-20 comeback victory over WKU in 2010, the first meeting between the two teams in 57 years. ASU and WKU first met during the 1947 season when they played to a 14-14 tie. The very next year, A-State picked up a 13-12 victory. WKU evened the series with a 34-19 victory in the 1952 Refrigerator Bowl played in Evansville, Ind. During the Refrigerator Bowl, the Hilltoppers overcame and opening 73-yard drive on ASU's first possession to improve their record to 9-1. They scored 34 unanswered points before a pair of fourth quarter ASU touchdowns set the final score. ASU had to play without All-America running back Richie Woit, sidelined with a broken ankle, during the game.

A-STATE vs. THE SUN BELT: A-State is 71-63-1 all-time against current members of the Sun Belt Conference. Since the league's inaugural football season in 2001, the Red Wolves hold a 42-36 on-field record against all opponents that have been a member of the league. Against current members of the conference, ASU is 37-32 since 2001. The Red Wolves hold their most all-time victories against Louisiana-Monroe with 19. With the exception of first-year member South Alabama, the Red Wolves have defeated every team in the SBC since the football league was formed.

AN A-STATE VICTORY WOULD . . . : Give the Red Wolves a 3-2 record through five games played for the second consecutive season . . . Extend its home winning streak to nine games . . . Improve its record against current SBC opponents to 72-63-1 . . . Move its record at Liberty Bank Stadium to 34-7 since the 2005 season . . . Extend its conference winning streak to nine games . . . Mark the second consecutive year it has won its league opener and run its all-time record in SBC openers to 8-4.

UNBUCKLE THE BELT: ASU is 7-4 all-time in Sun Belt Conference openers. The Red Wolves snapped a two-

game skid in league openers with a 26-22 win over Western Kentucky to start their league slate in 2011.

**DEFEND THIS HOUSE:** Arkansas State has won its last eight home games, which gives the Red Wolves their longest winning streak at Liberty Bank Stadium since 2004-2006 when they won 11 in a row. ASU's home wing streak is currently tied for the sixth longest in the nation.

HOME SWEET HOME: With a 6-0 home record last season, Arkansas State secured its seventh consecutive winning record at Liberty Bank Stadium dating back to 2005. ASU is now 33-7 at ASU Stadium since the 2005 season. The Red Wolves actual on-field record all-time at Liberty Bank Stadium is 125-70-1 since it opened in 1974. ASU's six home wins last season were its most since 1985.

SUN BELT CHAMPIONS: Arkansas State claimed its first ever outright Sun Belt Conference championship in 2011. Including last season, ASU has won eight conference championships all-time. ASU won the Southland Conference seven times (1986, 1985, 1978, 1975, 1970, 1969, 1968). ASU also won the 2005 Sun Belt Conference title, but it was later vacated due to NCAA sanctions.

WHAT GIVES?: Saturday's game matches up the top two statistical teams in the Sun Belt Conference in total offense and total defense. The Red Wolves are averaging a league-high 517.2 yards of total offense, which is also the 15th highest average in the nation. At the same time, Wester Kentucky's defense is giving up a league-best 279.8 yards per game, which ranks 13th in the nation. Additionally, ASU's rushing attack is averaging 267 yards per game while the WKU run defense is allowing just 112.5 yards per contest.

SENIOR CLASS AWARD: Ryan Aplin was named last week as one of just 30 candidates from across the nation for the 2012 Senior CLASS Award, annually recognizing an NCAA FBS senior with notable achievements in areas of community, classroom, character and competition. An acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School, the prestigious Senior CLASS Award focuses on the total student-athlete and encourages students to use their platform in athletics to make a positive impact as leaders in their communities.

CFPA RECOGNIZES APLIN: The College Football Performance Awards recognized senior Ryan Aplin as an Honorable Mention National Quarterback of the Week following A-State's victory over Alcorn State. Aplin broke a pair of school records and took over second place for career total offense yards in the game. Aplin only played in the first half, leading ASU to 42-0 lead at the break with 198 yards passing, another 24 rushing and three touchdown passes. Aplin completed 12-of-13 pass attempts for a school-record .923 completion percentage. His three touchdown tosses gave him 50 for his career, making him ASU's all-time leader in the stat and one of just four players in Sun Belt history to record at least 50 touchdown passes. Aplin ended the game with 222 yards of total offense, pushing his career total to 9,847 and leaving him just 387 yards shy of the league's all-time

**300-PLUS:** Dating back to the 2010 season, Arkansas State has posted at least 300 yards of total offense 27 of its last 29 games. ASU's 12-game streak with over 300 yards total offense came to an end just two games shy of the school record against Nebraska earlier this season.

THAT'S OFFENSIVE: A-State's 634 yards of total offense against Alcorn State was the seven most in school history and marked the second time this year the Red Wolves have recorded over 600 yards. They also piled up 619 yards against Memphis, which were the most against an FBS opponent since recording a school-record 681 against Louisiana-Lafayette in 2007. ASU has now posted at least 500 yards total offense in three of its first four games and at least 30 first downs in two.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD: With 34 (vs.

Oregon), 33 (vs. Memphis) and 56 (vs. Alcorn State) | Mississippi Valley State 61-0 in its 2009 season opener. points scored in three of its first four games this season, A-State has now posted at least 30 points in 11 of its last 15 regular-season games dating back to last season. The Red Wolves scored 30 or more points in eight games during the 2011 season, the most since 1951 when it hit the total 10 times

GETTING DEFENSIVE: With its 56-0 win over Alcorn State, ASU recorded its first shutout since defeating

ASU limited Alcorn State to just 2.2 yards per play, which tied the fifth lowest average for a game in Sun Belt Conference history. ASU's defense allowed just 130 yards, which is the fewest since giving up 69 to Mississippi Valley State in 2009 as well. The Red Wolves also held Memphis under 300 yards total offense, limiting the Tigers to 293 yards for the fewest by an ASU opponent since FAU recorded 281 last season.

HERALDED PEFORMANCE: Senior linebacker Nathan Herrold recorded 11 tackles against both Oregon and Nebraska, giving him two games this year and five for his career with double-figure stops. He now has a team-high 37 tackles, placing him tied for third in the Sun Belt Conference and tied for 41st in the nation in tackles.

AT LEAST SIX: Redshirt freshman receiver J.D. McKissic recorded at least six receptions in ASU's last three games, including a career-high eight against both Memphis and Nebraska. He now has a team-high 26 catches to place him tied for 28th in the nation in receptions. McKissic also has a team-best 249 receiving vards.

MORE OFTEN THAN NOT: Senior quarterback Ryan Aplin's 12-game streak with at least one touchdown pass came to an end against Nebraska, but he bounced back to throw a career-tying three against Alcorn State. He has now tossed at least one touchdown in 29 of his last 32 games dating back to his freshman season. Aplin has also thrown for at least 200 yards 24 times in his career and all 24 have come over ASU's last 31 games. Additionally, he has 15 career games with over 300 yards total offense, including five of the last seven.

ACTIVE APLIN: Senior quarterback Ryan Aplin is ranked among the top active players in the NCAA in several career statistics, including:

4th, career total offense yards (9,847) 6th, career passing yards (8,377) 6th, career completions (714) 6th, career TD responsible for (77) 9th, career touchdown passes (50) 15th, career rushing touchdowns (26)

percentage, touchdown passes and most passing yards per game.

REACHING THE CENTURY MARK: Sophomore running back Rod Smith broke 100 yards rushing for the first time of his career last game, finishing the Alcorn State contest with a career-high 104 yards. He is the second ASU player to rush for 100 yards in a game this season, joining David Oku (111 yards vs. Memphis). A-State had a running back record over 100 yards in a rushing in a game only once all of last season.

PLAYING IN THE BACKFIELD: Senior defensive end Tim Starson recorded a career-high three tackles for loss last game against Alcorn State, and now has a Sun Belt Conference best six tackles for loss. He has recorded at least a partial tackle for loss in ASU's last three games. He had three career tackles for loss entering his senior season this year.

CAREER HIGH TACKLES: Chris Humes (7 tackles), Kyle Coleman (7 tackles) and Dexter Blackmon (4 tackles) all set new career highs for tackles. Tim Starson (6 tackles) and LaAngelo Albright (4 tackles) matched their career highs.

FCS WINNING STREAK EXTENDED: Arkansas State is coming off a 56-0 win over Alcorn State, which extended its winning streak against FCS oppoents to eight games. The Red Wolves have won those eight games by a combined 426-60 score. ASU improved to 19-4 against FCS opponents since moving to the FBS in 1992.

SULLIVENT HONORED: Senior punter *Neely Sullivent* was announced as a College Football Performance Awards national honorable mention punter of the week following the Nebraska game. Sullivent averaged 48 yards per punt against the Huskers, almost a full 10 yards more than his season average of 38.4 entering the game. He recorded his second punt of the season to travel over 50 yards and also posted his first punt inside the 20. Sullivent raised has season average to 41.8 yards per punt to rank him third in the Sun Belt Conference.

PRESEASON ALL-CONFERENCE: Senior quarterback Ryan Aplin was named Sun Belt Conference Preseason Offensive Player of the Year and one of four A-State players named to the all-conference team at the league's Media Day in New Orleans. Aplin, senior wideout Josh Jarboe, senior offensive lineman Zack McKnight and senior defensive back Don Jones were all named to the Preseason All-SBC Team.

RED WOLVES TABBED SECOND IN PRESEASON SBC POLL: The Red Wolves were picked second in the preseason coaches poll announced as part of the league's annual Media Day. Arkansas State received 85 points and two first place votes, just behind Florida International, which received five first place votes and 92 points to earn the nod as the preseason favorite in the league race. The Red Wolves won the Sun Belt Conference Championship a year ago after posting a perfect 8-0 record in league play during the 2011 season. Louisiana-Lafayette, Western Kentucky and Troy rounded out the top five in the poll, and FIU defensive lineman Tourek Williams was named the Preseason Defensive Player of the Year.

HIGHLY TOUTED RECRUITING CLASS: With a Parade All-Amercian, Under Armour All-American, NJCAA All-American, 23 players that earned either junior college all-conference or high school all-state recognition and 18 players rated at least three stars by one or more of the major recruiting sources, the 2012 ASU signing class could be considered one of the best in the history of the ASU football program. Arkansas State had the top-rated class in the Sun Belt Conference by Rivals.com, Scout.com, ESPN.com and 247Sports.com.

**RETURNING ALL-CONFERENCE PLAYERS:** A-State returns five 2011 All-Sun Belt Conference players this season, including the league's Player of the Year in senior quarterback *Ryan Aplin*. Aplin was a first-team selection

and was joined by second-team choices *Josh Jarboe* (Sr., WR) and *Nathan Herrold* (Sr., LB). Returning as honorable mention choices are senior wideout *Taylor Stockemer* and senior punter *Neely Sullivent*.

GODADDY.COM BOWL: Arkansas State accepted an official invitation to the GoDaddy.com Bowl last season following its victory over Middle Tennessee on Nov. 19, placing the Red Wolves in a bowl game for the first time since 2005 when they played Southern Miss in the New Orleans Bowl in Lafayette, La. ASU was bowl eligible for the first time since 2008, but for the fourth time over the last seven seasons. ASU reached bowl eligibility after just eight games, making last year the earliest ASU had ever been bowl eligible as an FBS member (since 1992).

SUN BELT CHAMPIONS: Arkansas State claimed its first ever outright Sun Belt Conference championship last season. Including 2011, Arkansas State has won eight conference championships all-time. ASU won the Southland Conference seven times (1986, 1985, 1978, 1975, 1970, 1969, 1968). ASU also won the 2005 Sun Belt Conference championship, but it was later vacated due to NCAA sanctions.

IN THE POLLS: Arkansas State received as many as 18 votes in the AP Top 25 Poll and 13 votes in the USA Today Top 25 Coaches Poll, while also ranking as high as No. 35 in the BCS and reaching No. 30 in the CBSSports.com 120 rankings during the season.

**SENIOR BOWL WATCHLIST:** ASU has two players on the inaugural Senior Bowl Watch list. Senior quarterback *Ryan Aplin* and senior wide out *Josh Jarboe* were added to the watch list on August 24.

APLIN ON NUMEROUS WATCH LISTS: An All-America and Heisman candidate, senior quarterback *Ryan Aplin* has garnered a significant amount of national attention this preseason as he is listed on the Walter Camp Player of the Year Watch List, Davey O'Brien Award Watch List, Johnny Unitas Award Watch List and the Manning Award Watch List. Video, action photos and biographical information for Aplin are all available on a Facebook Page, maintained by the ASU Sports Information Department, called "Ryan Aplin All-America and Heisman Campaign." Fans and media will be able to follow Aplin's 2012 season on the page, where updates will be posted throughout fall camp and the upcoming season.

ATHLON'S PRESEASON HONORS: The Red Wolves had six players named to *Athlon's* preseason All-Sun Belt Conference Team, including senior quarterback *Ryan Aplin* (first team), senior wide receiver *Josh Jarboe* (first team), senior offensive lineman *Zack McKnight* (first team), senior linebacker *Nathan Herrold* (first team), junior defensive lineman *Ryan Carrethers* (second team) and senior safety **Don Jones** (second team).

PHIL STEELE'S PRESEASON HONORS: Phil Steele's preseason All-Sun Belt team featured 12 A-State players, including first team selections Ryan Aplin (Sr., QB) and Josh Jarboe (Sr., WR). ASU's 12 selections tied the fourth most in the league with Troy. Earning a spot on the second team were Taylor Stockemer (Sr., WR), Zack McKnight (Sr., OL), Nathan Herrold (Sr., LB), Chaz Scales (Sr., DB) and Andrew Tryon (So., DB), who made the team as a kick returner. The Red Wolves' third-team choices were Frankie Jackson (So., RB), Ryan Carrethers (Jr., DL) and Brian Davis (Jr., K), while Ishamail Hayes (Jr., DE) and Qushaun Lee (So., LB) were fourth-team selections.

COLLEGE SPORTS MADNESS PRESEASON HONORS: CollegeSportsMadness.com has announced its preseason All-Sun Belt Conference Team, which includes Offensive Player of the Year Ryan Aplin (Sr., QB). Along with Aplin, Zack McKnight (Sr., OL) was named a first team choice. Second team selections included Josh Jarboe (Sr., WR), Brian Davis (Jr., K) and Nathan Herrold (Sr., LB). A-State's third team picks included Taylor Stockemer (Sr., WR), Andrew Tryon (So., DB) as a kick returner and Chaz Scales (Sr., DB).

**BLUE RIBBON PRESEASON HONORS:** The Blue Ribbon Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference Team included Arkansas State players *Josh Jarboe* (Sr., WR), *Ryan Aplin* (Sr., QB) and *Nathan Herrold* (Sr., LB).



Gus Malzahn was named the Red Wolves' 28th head football coach Dec. 14, 2011, bringing him back to his home state after most recently enjoying highly successful stints as a top assistant coach at three NCAA FBS universities that garnered national acclaim.

A name highly recognized throughout Arkansas and the nation, Malzahn comes to Arkansas State after serving as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at Auburn for the past three seasons. A native of Fort Smith, Malzahn was named the winner of the 2010 Frank Broyles Award, given annually to the nation's top collegiate assistant coach.

His innovative offense made an immediate and profound impact during his tenure at Auburn, highlighted by a record-setting offense in 2010 when the Tigers finished 14-0 and claimed the school's first national championship since 1957. The Auburn offense set nine school records, including points in a season (577), points per game (41.2), total yards (6,989), total offense (499.2), rushing yards (3,987), rushing touchdowns (41) and passing touchdowns (31). Malzahn's record-setting offense in 2010 led the Southeastern Conference and finished in the top 10 nationally in six statistical categories.

He coached Heisman Trophy winner Cam Newton during the Tigers run to the 2011 BCS National Championship. Under Malzahn's direction, Newton later became the overall No. 1 pick in the 2011 NFL Draft after producing one of the best single-season quarterback performances in collegiate history. Newton threw for 2,908 yards and 30 touchdowns, while rushing for 1,586 yards and an additional 20 touchdowns as Auburn finished 14-0 and defeated Oregon 22-19 in the BCS title game.

Newton also won the school's first-ever Davey O'Brien Award and Manning Award, given to the nation's top quarterback. He also claimed the Maxwell Award presented annually to college football's top player, while also earning Associated Press National Player of the Year and SEC Offensive Player of the Year awards.

He helped lead the Tigers to a 7-5 record this season, which will include an appearance in the Chik-fil-A Bowl on Dec. 31. The Malzahn-led Auburn offense had four players named to the All-SEC Team, including sophomore running back Michael Dyer, junior tight end Philip Lutzenkirchen, senior offensive lineman Brandon Mosley and junior running back Onterio McCalebb.

Malzahn's arrival in 2009 and style of offense marked a drastic turnaround from the 2008 season when Auburn struggled offensively. In a two-year period, the Tigers improved from a tie for 110th to 7th in the nation in scoring offense (from 17.3 to 41.2) and from 104th to 7th in total offense. It also took Auburn just six games in 2009 to score more points than it did in all 12 games in 2008.

Before coaching at Auburn, Malzahn spent two seasons at Tulsa, coordinating a Golden Hurricane offense that finished first nationally in total offense in 2007 and 2008. Tulsa's offense in 2007 established nine team school records and 12 individual records. The Hurricane also set nine Conference USA team records, while Tulsa quarterback Paul Smith broke an

NCAA record by throwing for at least 300 yards in 14 consecutive games.

Prior to his time at Tulsa, he coached one season at Arkansas, where he served as offensive coordinator, coached Heisman Trophy runner-up Darren McFadden and helped the Razorbacks finish fourth nationally in rushing offense at 228.5 yards per game. In fact, two of Malzahn's first three collegiate offenses ranked in the top 10 nationally in rushing, including the 2008 Tulsa team and 2006 Arkansas squad.

In 14 seasons as a high school head coach, Malzahn led seven teams to the state championship game and won three titles. Malzahn coached two quarterbacks, Josh Floyd and Rhett Lashlee, who set national passing records. Malzahn also tutored 2005 Gatorade, Parade Magazine and Rivals.com National Player of the Year Mitch Mustain at Springdale High School

Malzahn is married to the former Kristi Otwell and they are the parents of two daughters, Kylie (23) and Kenzie (20).



LINCOLN, Neb. – Arkansas State suffered a 42-13 loss to 24th-ranked Nebraska before a Memorial Stadium crowd of 85,290 in Lincoln. The A-State defense and special teams combined to recover four Nebraska fumbles, but the Huskers offense racked up 527 yards of total offense, including 347 yards on the ground, to pull away for the victory. ASU trailed 28-3 at halftime, but pulled within 28-13 with 4:19 left in third quarter after taking advantage of a pair of Nebraska turnovers. Qushaun Lee recovered a fumble in the end zone for ASU's only touchdown and Brian Davis kicked a field goal almost six minutes later to trim ASU's deficit to 15 points. However, Nebraska tacked on a pair of fourth quarter touchdowns to set the final score.

JONESBORO – An impressive display on both sides of the ball by Arkansas State propelled the Red Wolves to a resounding 56-0 shutout win over Alcorn State before 21,559 Liberty Bank Stadium fans in a game televised on ESPN3.com. ASU came out dominating the action on the turf in the opening half, amassing 345 yards in total offense to claim a 42-0 halftime lead. ASU chalked up a program all-time single-game seventh-most 634 yards of total offense with 396 yards in passing and 238 yards on the ground to go with 30 first downs. The Red Wolves' defense held the Alcorn State offense to only 130 yards. Ryan Aplin, along with his three touchdowns, completed 12 of 13 passes for a ASU record 92.3 completion percentage.
