ON TAP: Arkansas State is set to hold its annual Senior Day on Saturday when it hosts Sun Belt Conference newcomer Georgia State in its 2013 home finale at Liberty Bank Stadium. The game, which is the fifth of six consecutive league contests to close out the regular season for the Red Wolves, is scheduled for a 2 p.m. kickoff and will be broadcast by ESPN3.com. Every A-State game can be heard live on 107.9 FM in the Jonesboro area as part of the EAB Red Wolves Sports Radio Network, and the live radio broadcast can be accessed through the A-State athletics Web site (AStateRedWolves.com).

THE PRINCIPALS: Winners of its last three games, Arkansas State became bowl eligible for the third straight season and the sixth time over the last nine years with its victory over Texas State last week. The Red Wolves are 4-1 in Sun Belt Conference play and remain in sole possession of second place in the league standings with two regular-season games remaining on their schedule. A-State is 15-2 over its last 17 games at Liberty Bank Stadium and will bring a 4-1 home record this season into Saturday's contest, while Georgia State is looking for its first win of the season.

HEAD COACH BRYAN HARSIN: Bryan Harsin was named the Red Wolves' 29th head football coach on Dec. 12, 2012. Harsin is a 13-year coaching veteran at the NCAA FBS level who has coached in 10 bowl games as either an assistant or offensive coordinator. Harsin, a finalist for the 2009 Broyles Award recognizing the top assistant coach in the country, has been associated with two nationally-prominent programs during his rise to A-State's head coach. Working closely with Chris Petersen at Boise State and Mack Brown at Texas, two of the most well-respected coaches in the country, Harsin spent the last seven seasons as an offensive coordinator with the Broncos and Longhorns.

HIGH MARKS: Arkansas State head football coach Bryan Harsin was ranked as the sixth best hire in the nation among 26 new coaches at the time, according to CBSSports.com. The article written by Dennis Dodd said the following when referring to A-State's 29th head coach: "We're talking a Sun Belt program that has changed its AD (once) and coaches (twice) over the last two years. Somehow the Red Wolves went from national championship game offensive coordinator (Malzahn) to Fiesta Bowl-winning offensive coordinator with a stop in Texas (Bryan Harsin). Not too shabby."

OUT OF THE GATE: With the Red Wolves victory over UAPB, *Bryan Harsin* became the Red Wolves first head coach to win his inaugural game at the school since Larry Lacewell in 1979. ASU's previous seven head coaches all suffered setbacks in their first game, including Al Kincaid, Ray Perkins, John Bobo, Joe Hollis, Steve Roberts, Hugh Freeze and Gus Malzahn.

YOUNGEST FBS HEAD COACHES: At 37 years of age, Arkansas State head coach Bryan Harsin is the fourth youngest head coach in the nation. Western Michigan's P.J. Fleck is the youngest at 32 years old with a Nov. 29, 1980 date of birth.

THE ARKANSAS STATE - GEORGIA STATE SERIES: Saturday's game will mark the first ever meeting between Arkansas State and Georgia State.

A-STATE vs. THE SUN BELT: Arkansas State has won 19 of its last 21 league games to run its all-time record in the conference to 53-38. The Red Wolves hold their most all-time victories against Louisiana-Monroe with 21. With the exception of Georgia State, which is in its first season as a member of the league, the Red Wolves have defeated every team in the SBC since the football league was formed in 2001. Along with Louisiana-Monroe and Louisiana-Lafayette, A-State is one of three teams that have been a part of the conference since 2001.

SENIOR DAY: The Red Wolves will hold their annual Senior Day this Saturday, recognizing their senior class for their contributions to Arkansas State University and the football program. This year's 21 seniors are LaAngelo Albright, Phillip Butterfield, Jake Campbell, Ryan Carrethers, Brian Davis, Amos Draper, Darius Dunaway, R.J. Fleming, John Gandy, Steven Haunga, Julian Jones, Adam Kennedy, Carlos McCants, Cliff Mitchell, Allen Muse, David Oku, Cade Oliver, Eddie Porter, Dexter Samuel, Sirgregory Thornton and Aaron Williams.

GEORGIA RED WOLVES: Arkansas State has five players on its roster from the state of Georgia, including deep snapper *Ryan Eustace*, center *Bryce Giddens*, wide receiver *Tres Houston*, defensive back Ryan Jacobs and linebacker *Troy Wyche*.

99th SEASON UNDER WAY: Arkansas State kicked off its 99th season of football Aug. 31, 2013, vs. UAPB. A-State now holds a 432-461-37 record since its inaugural 1911 season and has played in nine bowl games. ASU did not field a football team from 1942-44 due to World War II. Arkansas State also didn't have a team in 1918 as World War I was ending.

AN A-STATE VICTORY WOULD . . .: Give the Red Wolves a 5-1 home record for the second straight season . . . Ensure the Red Wolves a winning record for the third straight season . . . Extend its winning streak in the month of November to 10 games . . . Keep the Red Wolves in sole possession of second place in the Sun Belt Conference standings . . . Make it 5-1 in Sun Belt play through six games for the second straight season.

TELEVISION TIME: Every Arkansas State football game this season has been or will be televised for the first time in school history. The Red Wolves previous school record for televised games in a season was in 10 in 2010, 2011 and 2012.

RED WOLVES NOVEMBER: Arkansas State is undefeated in November since the 2011 season with a 9-0 record over that span. All nine victories have come against Sun Belt Conference opponents, including six by a double-figure margin.

STRONG IN THE SECOND: Four of Arkansas State's six victories this season have come when it was either tied or trailing at halftime, including the last three in a row. The Red Wolves four victories under those circumstances are one more than it had for the previous four seasons (2009-12) combined. The last time A-State had at least four victories in games it entered the second half tied or trailing was 2005 when it also had four (two trailing and two tied).

DAVIS NAMED LOU GROZA AWARD SEMIFINALIST: Senior kicker Brian Davis has been named one of 20 semifinalists for the Lou Groza Award. Davis, also a semifinalist for the award in 2012, is 11-of-11 on field goal attempts this year with a career-long of 50 yards.

SUN BELT PLAYERS OF THE WEEK: Senior kicker **Brian Davis** was named the Sun Belt Conference Special Teams Player of the Week on Monday,

marking the fourth straight week an A-State player has earned one of the conference's weekly honors. The Red Wolves have seen five different players earn one of the weekly honors from the league a combined six times this year. In addition to Davis, the other A-State players recognized this season are senior quarterback *Adam Kennedy* (Nov. 11, Oct. 14), senior safety *Sterling Young* (Nov. 4), senior DL *Ryan Carrethers* (Oct. 28) and sophomore WR *J.D. McKissic* (Oct. 14, Special Teams).

CFPA HONORS GORDON: Sophomore running back Michael Gordon was recognized by the College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) for the second straight week and third time this season following the Texas State game, earning national Honorable Mention Running Back of the Week honors. Gordon was also a CFPA honorable mention pick for running back and all-purpose player of the week earlier this season. Other players recognized by the CFPA with a weekly award include sr. kicker Brian Davis (three times), sr. DL Amos Draper, soph. TE Darion Griswold and sr. WR Allen Muse.

300-PLUS: Dating back to the 2010 season, Arkansas State has posted at least 300 yards of total offense in 43 of its last 48 games. The Red Wolves have posted at least 300 yards total offense in all but two games this season and is ranked 52nd in the nation (432.3 ypg).

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD: Including five games this season, A-State has posted at least 30 points in 23 of its last 33 regular-season games dating back to the 2011 season. The Red Wolves have won 14 consecutive games when scoring at least 30 points.

ROAD WARRIORS: Arkansas State has won 10 consecutive road conference games, its longest streak ever as a member of any league. The Red Wolves went 4-0 in conference road games in both 2011 and 2012 and is 2-0 in 2013. Its previous longest road conference winning streak was seven against Southland foes from 1973-75.

HOME SWEET HOME: With a 4-1 home mark this season, Arkansas State has secured its ninth consecutive winning record at Liberty Bank Stadium dating back to 2005. ASU is now 40-9 at Liberty Bank Stadium since the 2005 season and has won 15 of its last 17 home games. The Red Wolves actual on-field record all-time at Liberty Bank Stadium is 132-72-1 since it opened in 1974. ASU's six home wins in 2011 were its most since 1985.

SHUT 'EM DOWN: The A-State defense hasn't allowed a score in the second half over the last two games. A-State's last four opponents have scored just 13 second-half points consisting of only one touchdown and two field goals. The Red Wolves have allowed an average of just 133.5 yards total offense in the second half for the last two games.

OFFENSIVE PACE: Arkansas State is producing offensive numbers that are on pace to rank among the best in school history in several categories. The Red Wolves are averaging 432.3 yards per game, 5.9 yards per play and 221.2 passing yards per game, which all rank among the top five in school history. The total offense average and yards per play are both the third highest and passing yards average is the fifth highest.

PICK IT OFF: The A-State defense has recorded at

least one interception in four of the last five games and has five total picks over that span, which is two more than its total for the first five games combined. The Red Wolves recorded a season-high three interceptions against Troy, their third opponent of the season, and had two against ULM for their second most.

SPECIAL TEAMS TURNAROUND: Not only has Arkansas State's special teams shown significant improvement in several statistical categories, they are ranked among the top teams in the nation in many of them. A-State is one 34 teams in the nation yet to give up a blocked kick, is ranked tied for first in field goal percentage, fifth in kickoff returns, 26th in kickoff return defense and tied for 31st in the nation in blocked kicks. IN THE CLUTCH: Junior safety Sterling Young came up with a pair of clutch interceptions against South Alabama and ULM to help lead the Red Wolves to recent back-to-back road victories. Much like his pick against South Alabama, his interception against ULM came at a critical junction of the game and sparked a solid second-half performance by the Red Wolves. His interception against ULM came with score tied 14-14 and at the ULM's 38-yard line, directly leading to a touchdown that started a 28-0 scoring outburst by A-State. His pick against South Alabama came with Red Wolves trailing 6-0 and in the back of A-State's end zone. It occurred on the Jaguars first drive of the second half, and the Red Wolves marched down the field for a touchdown and 7-6 lead on its ensuing drive.

HITTING 1,000: Senior WR Julian Jones went over 1,000 career yards receiving during the South Alabama game, making him the third player on the Red Wolves roster to accomplish the feat. Sophomore WR J.D. McKissic leads the way with 1,514 to his credit (8th most in school history), while senior

ALL-TIME LEADING SCORER: Senior kicker *Brian Davis* became the Sun Belt Conference's all-time leading scorer last week, finishing the Texas State game with eight points to push his career total to 303. He became the first player in league history to record 300 points in the process. Davis also owns the A-State career records for points by a kicker (303) and extra points made (147). He has made his last 13 consecutive field goals for the second longest streak in school history.

BIG BLOCKS: A-State blocked two kicks against ULM, making it one of just nine teams in the nation to block multiple kicks in a game this season. Senior DL **Ryan Carrethers** blocked a field goal attempt and redshirt freshman WR **Booker Mays** was responsible for a blocked punt against ULM. The other teams to block multiple kicks in a game this season are Syracuse (3), UAB (3), Minnesota, Colorado State, Virginia Tech, Boise State, Akron, Oklahoma, North Texas and Texas A&M.

COVERING AT CORNERBACK: Sophomore corner **Rocky Hayes** has made a big impact in his first season on the defensive side of the ball, leading the team in both pass break-ups (9) and interceptions (3). He is ranked first in the Sun Belt Conference in passes defended with 12, which is three more than the most by an A-State player for all of last season (Chaz Scales, 7 PBU, 2 INT). Hayes is ranked 31st in the nation in passes defended.

LEAVE NO STONE UNBLOCKED: Sophomore defensive end *Chris Stone* has made a habit of disrupting the opponent's backfield this season, recording a team-high 9.5 tackles for loss that ranks fifth in the Sun Belt Conference. Stone has recorded at least one tackle for loss in seven games this season and a career-high two in two different games. He had three tackles for loss last season as a redshirt freshman.

RECEIVING RECORDS: Just a sophomore, *J.D. McKissic* is already taking over the Arkansas State record books in almost every major receiving statistical category. He holds the school record for receptions in a game (15) and season (103), and he broke the record for career receptions (164) last game against Texas State. He is ranked eighth for career receiving yards with 1,514 to his credit.

MAKING A RETURN: Sophomore WR J.D. McKissic is ranked fifth in the nation in kickoff returns (29.6 ypr) and 30th in punt returns (9.1 ypg). He recorded a career-high 125 kickoff return yards against Idaho, including a 98-yard return for a touchdown in the contest. The return for a touchdown was the first by an A-State player since 2001. Additionally, McKissic has posted eight kickoff returns of at least 25 yards, including a 50-yarder against ULM. His longest punt return has covered 43 yards, posted last week against Texas State.

ON THE RISE: Senior WR *Julian Jones* has recorded at least four receptions in six of the last nine games, including a career-high 10 versus Missouri. Jones has either led or tied for the team high in receptions in four games this season and is ranked seventh in the Sun Belt Conference in receptions per game (4.8 pg). Jones' 48 total receptions are 31 more than he had for his entire career entering the 2013 season.

100-YARD RUSHERS: Senior QB Adam Kennedy rushed for a career-high 102 yards against ULM, making him the fifth A-State player to reach the 100-yard mark in a game this season. Senior RB David Oku, senior RB Sirgregory Thornton, sophomore RB Michael Gordon and sophomore QB Fredi Knighten have also rushed for 100 yards in at least one game this year.

TOTAL OFFENSE PRODUCER: Senior quarterback Adam Kennedy ranks third in the Sun Belt Conference in total offense with 254.0 yards per game, which also ranks 35th in the nation. Kennedy recorded 358 yards of total offense against Auburn, 334 versus Missouri, a career-high 397 against Idaho and 337 against ULM. He also just missed going over 300 versus Troy with 299 to his credit. His 397 yards versus Idaho were the fifth most in school history. He has recorded over 200 yards total offense in six of the last nine games.

MAKING A CONNECTION: Senior QB Adam Kennedy tied the school record for completions in a game with 37 against Missouri (tied Ryan Aplin, 2011 vs. Western Kentucky). Kennedy has already completed 194 passes, which ranks tied for the fourth most in school history for a single season. He is ranked 32nd in the nation in completions (19.4 pg) and seventh in completion percentage (.690). His completion percentage currently stands as the highest in school history for a single season.

INSIDE FORCE: A member of the Bednarik Award and Outland Trophy Watch Lists, senior defensive lineman *Ryan Carrethers* is ranked second on the team and 10th in the Sun Belt in tackles with 73 through 10 games. He is averaging 7.3 tackles per game, 2.0 more than he averaged last season when he finished with 68 total for the most by an A-State interior defensive lineman since former NFL standout Jon Bradly in 2002. His 73 tackles this season are the second most in the nation by a defensive lineman. He posted a career-high 16 tackles against UL Lafayette, which hare also the most in the nation this season by a defensive lineman for a single game.

ANOTHER 100: Senior linebacker *Qushaun Lee* has recorded a team-high 102 tackles, making him the first A-State player to record over 100 tackles in back-to-back seasons since linebacker Les Echols in 2002 (105) and 2003 (123). He is averaging 10.0 tackles per game, which is the 16th highest in the nation and second highest in the Sun Belt Conference. Lee recorded a career-high 16 tackles at South Alabama and has at least 10 tackles in four of the last five games, giving him eight career games with double-figure stops.

GRISWOLD VACATION TO THE END ZONE: Senior tight end *Darion Griswold* tied his career high with five receptions for a career-high 89 yards and his first two career touchdowns against Idaho, earning CFPA national Honorable Mention Tight End of the Week for his efforts. He has now caught 22 passes for 269 yards, both the most in a season by an A-State tight end since Trevor Gillott recorded 24 receptions for 283 yards in 2009.

ON A ROLL: A Freshman All-America selection last season, sophomore WR *J.D. McKissic* has caught at least one pass in all 23 games of his career at A-State. He had a school-record 15 against Missouri. McKissic also finished the Missouri game with a season-high

117 receiving yards, marking the fifth time of his career he has posted 100 in a game.

A FLARE FOR THE DRAMATIC: Sophomore RB Michael Gordon is responsible for three of the four longest runs by A-State this year, including a 92-yard outburst against UAPB that was the second longest in school history. Gordon posted a 64-yard touchdown run against Troy and had a 40-yard touchdown rush against Texas State as well. He is averaging 7.7 yards per attempt (70) that stands as the third highest in school history for a single season. Gordon has three 100-yard rushing games, including a 102-yard showing against UAPB, a 115-yard effort versus Troy and a career-high 184 yards against Texas State.

MIDSEASON ALL-CONFERENCE: Arkansas State placed 10 players, including five first-team selections, on the Phil Steele's Midseason All-Sun Belt Conference Team. The Red Wolves 10 selections tied Louisiana-Lafayette and Louisiana-Monroe for the most in the conference, and their five first-team picks matched the most along with the Ragin' Cajuns. The A-State offense and defense were both represented by four players, and two Red Wolves made the list as special teams choices. Arkansas State's first-team selections included sophomore center **Bryce Giddens** (Moultrie, Ga.), senior guard Steven Haunga (Richmond, Calif.), senior defensive lineman Ryan Carrethers (Nashville, Tenn.), sophomore cornerback Rocky Hayes (Heflin, Ala.) and senior kicker Brian Davis (Brentwood, Tenn.). The Red Wolves' secondteam selections included senior running back David Oku (Midwest City, Okla.), senior wide receiver Julian Jones (Germantown, Tenn.), junior linebacker Qushaun Lee (Prattville, Ala.) and senior safety Sterling Young (Hoover, Ala.). Sophomore wide receiver J.D. McKissic (Phenix City, Ala.) was also a secondteam choice as a kick returner.

UNBUCKLE THE BELT: The Red Wolves opened Sun Belt Conference play in their third game of the season, the earliest since 2010 when they played their second game against a league opponent. A-State improved to 8-5 all-time in Sun Belt Conference openers with its 41-34 victory over Troy. The Red Wolves' victory was their first in an SBC opener since 2011.

NFF RECOGNIZES DAVIS: Senior kicker *Brian Davis* was announced as a National Football Foundation (NFF) Scholar-Athlete Awards candidate and a semifinalist for the William V. Campbell Trophy, which recognizes the top scholar-athlete in the nation. Davis is among 170 national candidates, including 54 from the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS), for the NFF's Scholar-Athlete Awards. Candidates for the awards must be a senior or graduate student in their final year of eligibility, have a GPA of at least a 3.2, possess outstanding football ability as a first-team player or significant contributor, and have demonstrated strong leadership and citizenship.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH: Arkansas State has 25 underclassmen (sophomores or freshmen) listed on its 2-deep. The list includes 13 sophomores, six redshirt freshmen and six true freshmen. Among the underclassmen, six are listed as starters on the offensive or defensive side of the ball. A-State's 25 underclassmen on its two-deep was tied for the 14th most in the nation with Colorado and Illinois according to the 2013 initial depth charts. Virginia

listed 34 players on its opening-day two-deep for the most among all teams.

IN THE POLLS: Arkansas State ended the 2012 season receiving votes in the final major polls, including 28 in the Associated Press Top 25 Poll and 13 in the USA Today Coaches Top 25 Poll. Both totals placed the Red Wolves 32nd in the nation. The Red Wolves were also among "others receiving votes" in the 2013 preseason and week two USA Today Coaches Top 25 Poll

NCAA RECORD: A-State became the seventh FBS team in NCAA history to have four players (*David Oku, Fredi Knighten, Michael Gordon, Sirgregory Thornton* vs. UAPB) rush for over 100 yards in the same game. The other teams include Arizona (1951), Texas (1969), Alabama (1973), Army (1984), Nebraska (2001) and Nevada (2009).

FOR STARTERS: A-State improved to 45-47-6 all-time in season openers with its victory over UAPB on Aug. 31. The Red Wolves claimed a win in their season-opening game for the first time since 2009.

RUSHING RED WOLVES: The Red Wolves piled up 509 rushing yards versus UAPB, which were the most in the nation during the season's first week and still stands as the fifth most. A-State's total was also the fifth most in school history and the second most in Sun Belt history.

HOMECOMING HISTORY: With its victory over Idaho, Arkansas State improved to 58-27-1 all-time in Homecoming contests. The Red Wolves have now won 10 of their last 11 Homecoming games dating back to the 2003 season.

HOME OPENERS: With its victory over UAPB on Aug. 31, Arkansas State won its ninth consecutive home opener dating back to the 2005 campaign. The Red Wolves now stand 29-11 all-time in home openers at Liberty Bank Stadium and are also 15-6 in such games since moving to the FBS in 1992.

RETURNING ALL-SUN BELT PEFORMERS: Arkansas State returned five All-Sun Belt Conference players from the 2012 season, including first team selections David Oku (Sr., RB) and Ryan Carrethers (Sr., DL). J.D. McKissic (So., WR) and Brian Davis (Sr., K) were both second-team choices, while Qushaun Lee (Jr., LB) was named honorable mention.

PRESEASON ALL-SUN BELT CONFERENCE: Arkansas State placed a league-high seven players on the 2013 Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference Team. Senior running back *David Oku*, sophomore wide receiver *J.D. McKissic* and sophomore center *Bryce Giddens* all represented the A-State offense on the preseason squad. ASU's defensive players earning a spot on the team were senior defensive lineman *Ryan Carrethers*, junior linebacker *Qushaun Lee* and junior safety *Sterling Young*. Senior kicker *Brian Davis*, also made the list.

RED WOLVES TABBED THIRD IN PRESEASON SBC POLL: The Red Wolves were picked third in the preseason coaches poll announced as part of the league's annual Media Day. A-State received 45 points and two first-place votes behind UL Lafayette and UL Monroe, which both received 57 points.

ASU ANNOUNCES FOOTBALL FACILITY PROJECT: Arkansas State University has announced a \$26.7 mil-

lion football facility project, including a two-level football operations building and 76,000 square-foot indoor practice facility in ASU Stadium's north end

SUN BELT CHAMPIONS: Arkansas State claimed its second consecutive outright Sun Belt Conference championship in 2012. ASU has won nine conference championships all-time. ASU won the Southland Conference seven times (1986, 1985, 1978, 1975, 1970, 1969, 1968). ASU also won the 2005 Sun Belt Conference title, but it was later vacated due to NCAA sanctions. Prior to the 2011 and 2012 seasons, the last time ASU won back-to-back conference championships was 1986 and 1985 when it was a member of the Southland Conference.

BACK-TO-BACK WINNING SEASONS: Arkansas State secured back-to-back winning seasons in 2011 and 2012 for the first time since 1986-87. ASU won 10 games in both 2011 and 2012, and its 19 combined regular-season victories were its most ever over a two-year span – topping its 18 in 1974 and 1975.

BOWL ELIGIBLE: Arkansas State has been bowl eligible five times over the last eight seasons, including the last two in a row.

ATTENDANCE FIGURES: Arkansas State's average home attendance last season was a school record 26,398, topping its previous best of 21,256 in 2011. The 31,243 in attendance for A-State's 2012 regularseason finale against Middle Tennessee was the largest in Liberty Bank Stadium history. The Red Wolves are averaging home crowds of 26,956 this season.

Bryan Harsin, a 13-year coaching veteran at the NCAA FBS level who has coached in 10 bowl games as either an assistant or offensive coordinator, was named the Red Wolves' 29th all-time head football coach on Dec. 12, 2012.

Harsin, a finalist for the 2009 Broyles Award recognizing the top assistant coach in the country, has been associated with two nationally-prominent programs during his rise to A-State's head coach. Working closely with Chris Petersen at Boise State and Mack Brown at Texas, two of the most well-respected coaches in the country, Harsin spent the last seven seasons as an offensive coordinator with the Broncos and Longhorns.

Harsin served the last two seasons as Texas' co-offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach after spending the previous 10 on the Boise State staff, including the last five as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach as well. During his tenure at both schools, he guided offenses that consistently ranked among the nation's best in almost every statistical category.

In his first season at Texas, he had the task of putting a new offense in place with a young group that featured 10 different freshmen and sophomores starting for the Longhorns. Despite its youth, the offense was able to put up over 500 yards of total offense four times and rank 21st nationally in rushing offense with 202.6 yards per game. Harsin helped guide three different starting quarterbacks to 2,360 yards and 12 touchdowns in addition to the offense creating four other passing touchdowns.

His influence on the offense continued to pay dividends for nationally-ranked Texas last season as the Longhorns climbed 31 places to No. 24 in the nation in scoring with 36.1 points per game. Under Harsin's direction, Texas also generated 441 yards total offense per game last year and ranked ninth in the nation in passing efficiency. The Longhorns posted over 400 yards total offense in nine games and scored at least 30 in eight, including a season-high 66 against Ole Miss. Texas' Harsin-coached quarterbacks last season have combined to throw 23 touchdowns and both held a pass efficiency rating that ranked among the top 20 players in the nation.

He was at the helm of the Boise State offense during a five-year period where the Broncos posted a 61-5 record that included two undefeated seasons, which were capped by Fiesta Bowl wins over TCU in 2009 (14-0) and Oklahoma in 2006 (13-0). They reached at least 12 wins in four of his five seasons as coordinator and had three Top 10 finishes, including ranking No. 5/6 in 2006, No. 4/4 in 2009, and No. 10/10 entering the 2010 bowl season. In 2008, they finished just outside the Top 10 at No. 11/13.

In his five seasons as offensive coordinator at Boise State, Harsin's offenses were in the top five nationally in scoring four times, capped by ranking first in 2009 (42.2 ppg) and second in 2010 (45.1 ppg). They also ranked second in 2006 (39.7 ppg), fourth in 2007 (42.4 ppg) and 12th in 2008 (37.6 ppg). In all, Boise State averaged 41.4 ppg during his time as coordinator.

The Broncos ranked in the Top 10 in total offense in three of Harsin's seasons as coordinator and were no lower than 18th in all five of his years, culmi-

nating in 2010 with an average of 521.3 ypg, which set the BSU school record and ranked second nationally. In those five seasons, the Broncos offense averaged 459.9 ypg.

As quarterbacks coach, Harsin guided Kellen Moore into becoming one of the nation's most productive quarterbacks. In 2010, Moore was named first-team All-America by the Football Writers Association of America and became Boise State's first Heisman Trophy finalist. He was also a finalist for the Maxwell Award, Davey O'Brien Award and Manning Award and was named the nation's top quarterback by The Touchdown Club of Columbus.

ESPN.com, SI.com and CBSSports.com named Moore first-team All-America, the Associated Press named him third-team All-America, while he also finished seventh in the 2009 Heisman voting and earned Western Athletic Conference Offensive Player of the Year honors.

In his third season as offensive coordinator, Harsin's 2008 unit was taken over by Moore, who was a redshirt freshman. Moore would compile one of the most outstanding seasons by any Broncos quarterback, finishing the year with a NCAA freshman record 69.4 completion percentage (281-of-405), 25 touchdown passes and just 10 interceptions. He was also named WAC Freshman of the Year.

In Harsin's first season as offensive coordinator, the 2006 Broncos went undefeated and running back Ian Johnson led the country in rushing touchdowns and scoring. He also set a school single-season record with 1,713 yards. He was named to four separate All-America teams and finished eighth in the Heisman Trophy voting.

From 2002-05 Harsin served as tight ends coach at BSU. That unit played a vital role in a Broncos offense that led the nation in scoring twice and finished in the top 10 in scoring in each of those four years. In 2005, four Broncos tight ends combined to catch 27 passes for 298 yards and three touchdowns. In 2004, Harsin helped the tight ends contribute to the top-scoring offense in school history (48.9 ppg).

In his four seasons as tight ends coach and one as a graduate assistant, Boise State had a record of 53-11, making the Broncos record in his 10 seasons there 114-16.

Prior to coaching the tight ends, Harsin was a graduate assistant with the Broncos in 2001. He was a member of the Bronco football team from 1995-1999, earning three varsity letters. He served as Boise State's backup quarterback in 1999 when the team went 10-3 and won the Crucial.com Humanitarian Bowl.

After graduating from Boise State in 2000 with a degree in business management, Harsin entered the coaching profession at Eastern Oregon, coaching running backs and receivers during the 2000 season.

Harsin and his wife, Kes, have two daughters, Devyn Lynn and Dayn Mykena, and a son, Davis. Harsin is a graduate of Capital High School in Boise.

JONESBORO, Ark. (8/31/13) – Four Arkansas State players rushed for over 100 yards as the Red Wolves cruised to a 62-11 season-opening victory over Arkansas-Pine Bluff (UAPB) in front of 30,451 spectators at Liberty Bank Stadium in Jonesboro, Ark.

Senior David Oku paced A-State with a game-leading 124 yards rushing while senior Sirgregory Thornton ran for 112 yards, sophomore Michael Gordon with 102, and sophomore Fredi Knighten had 101 yards as the Red Wolves tied a NCAA Division I FBS record for most players on one team gaining at least 100 yards.

Arkansas State, which is 1-0 on the season with the victory, snapped three-game losing string in season openers as the Red Wolves put on an impressive offensive performance against UAPB (0-1) with a team 509-rushing yards output in their first home season-opening contest since 2009. A-State's 509 rushing yards in the game represented the fifth time in which the Red Wolves have reached the 500-yard plateau in a contest.

UAPB came into the first-evermeeting with A-State as the defending Southwestern Athletic Conference Champions and the preseason favorite to win the SWAC Western Division title.

Arkansas State dominated the first half as the Red Wolves scored 48 unanswered points while rolling up 480 yards in total offense, including 344 on the ground, to hold a commanding 48-0 at halftime.

The Red Wolves led 14-0 after the first quarter on touchdowns runs by quarter-back Fredi Knighten and redshirt sophomore wide receiver J.D. McKissic. Knighten's 21-yard scoring run at 10:33 on Arkansas State's opening possession capped a seven-play, 60-yard scoring drive giving the home team a 7-0 lead. A-State added its second score of the game as McKissic went into the end zone from 14 yards out with 2:13 remaining in the opening frame.

Arkansas State continued its dominance in the second quarter by erupting for 34 consecutive points with all but one TD coming on the ground. David Oku scored his first of two TD's in the stanza on a two-yard scamper at 13:47 to give A-State a 21-0 lead after senior quarterback Adam Kennedy hooked up with running Michael Gordon on a 48-yard pass. Fredi Knighten broke through the UAPB defense on the ensuing play for a 79-yard gain to the UAPB one-yard line before netting the score on a one-yard keeper with 9:33 remaining. Oku would hit paydirt again for the sec-



ond time on a 17-yard rush as the Red Wolves extended their lead to 34-0.

UAPB's threatened to score midway thru the quarter as the Golden Lions moved the ball down to the A-State five-yard line, but turned the ball over on downs as quarterback Benjamin Anderson's pass on fourth down was incomplete. On the next A-State possession, Michael Gordon broke a tackle on the second play and outraced all defenders down the sideline for a 91-yard TD run to make it 41-0. The Red Wolves' final score before the half occurred with 2:09 left as Adam Kennedy connected with senior wideout Julian Jones on 22-yard TD pass play. Michael Gordon (102 yards) and Fredi Knighten (101 yards) combined for 203 rushing yards through the first half.

Arkansas State picked up right where it left off to start the second half as the RedWolves scored two third-quarter TD runs by running back Sirgregory Thornton, covering six and 31 yards, respectively. UAPB, trailing 62-0, would get its first points of the game with 6:23 to go in the stanza as the Golden Lions' Jer-ryan Harris scored on a 37-yard fumble recovery. UAPB came back to score again in the frame on a 39-yard Tyler Strickland field goal with just over two minutes in the third to account for the final margin.

The Red Wolves generated a program fifth-best 509 rushing yards and averaged 8.9 yards per carry to account for the bulk of their 672 total offensive yardage. A-State also totaled 163 yards in passing. ASU's defense held UAPB in check by limiting the Golden Lions to 173 yards of total offense, which consisted of 12 rushing yards and 161 through the air.

Adam Kennedy was nine-of-12 in the air for 149 yards in his A-State debut as seven different receivers caught at least a pass. UAPB's Benjamin Anderson threw for 161 yards on 13-of-26 passing with Dezmond Beverly on the receiving end of six aerials for 113 yards.

Defensively for A-State, senior tackle Ryan Carrethers posted a team-high eight tackles while junior middle linebacker Qushaun Lee contributed seventackles. Jerryan Harris was tops for UAPB with a game-leading 14 tackles to go with his TD fumble recovery.


AUBURN, Ala. (9/7/13) – Arkansas State saw its nation's second-longest nine-game winning streak come to an end as the Red Wolves suffered a 38-9 loss to the Auburn Tigers in front of a crowd of 83,246 at AU's Jordan-Hare Stadium in Auburn, Ala.

Arkansas State, which is now 1-1 on the season, battled Auburn (2-0) the entire game but the Tigers controlled the play on both sides of the ball for the majority of the non-league contest. The A-State setback was the Red Wolves' first since a 26-13 home conference loss to Western Kentucky a season ago (9/29) and also snapped a four-game road winning streak.

Auburn started the game by scoring on its opening two possessions to claim a 14-3 lead with just under four minutes left in the first quarter. The Tigers stuck first at the 11:37 mark as quarterback Nick Marshall connected with wide receiver Marcus Davis on a third-down 18-yard scoring strike. A-State bounced back by tallying on its first possession as the Red Wolves marched 58 yards on 14 plays culminating in senior kicker Brian Davis' 34-yard field goal at 6:54 to make the score 7-3. A 16-yard pass from senior quarterback Adam Kennedy to sophomore tight end Darion Griswold highlighted the A-State's initial scoring drive.

On its next possession, Auburn found paydirt again when running back Corey Grant scampered 17 yards into the end zone putting the Tigers up 14-3 with 3:56 on the clock. A-State took the ensuing kickoff and would get into Auburn territory, which was aided by a 40-yard Kennedy pass completion to sophomore wide receiver J.D. McKissic. The Red Wolves' drive would stall at the AU 20-yard line on an unsuccessful fourth-and-one rush.

A-State was able to keep Auburn off the scoreboard until 2:20 remaining in the second quarter as the Tigers went up 21-3 following Nick Marshall's 68-yard TD pass to sophomore wide receiver Sammie Coates. At the half, the Red Wolves compiled 161 passing yards while the Tigers had



139 to go with 143 yards on the ground.

Trailing 21-3 at halftime, Arkansas State came out in the third quarter by scoring six unanswered points on a pair of Brian Davis field goals to close within 21-9. Davis booted a 21-yarder at 9:58 to finish an 11-play, 71-yard drive, which was set up on quarterback keepers of 28 yards by Kennedy and 17 yards from sophomore Fredi Knighten. Auburn would turn the ball over on its possession as A-State junior cornerback Artez Brown recovered a Nick Marshall fumble on a third-and-11 situation with-under nine minutes to go at the AU 17-yard line and the Red Wolves would capitalize as Brian Davis made a 42-yard field goal with 7:53 left in the quarter. Auburn accounted for the final points of the stanza on an 11-yard TD run by running back Tre Mason with over a minute left to claim a 28-9 lead after three quarters.

In the fourth quarter, Auburn tacked on 10 more points with a field goal and a TD. Cody Parkey split the uprights from 35 yards out with 8:46 remaining and running back Cameron Artis-Payne, who ran for agame-high 102 yards, would score on a 12-yard run at 1:43 to wrap up the scoring.

A-State rolled up 24 first downs and 422 total offensive yards while Auburn had 23 first downs to go with 468 yards in total offense. Adam Kennedy led the Red Wolves with 74 rushing yards on 12 attempts to go with 29-of-41 in passing for 272 yards. Senior running back David Oku ran for 48 yards on 16 carries and had six receptions for 70 yards. Kennedy's favorite target was senior wideout Julian Jones, who caught a game-high seven passes for 29 yards. Darion Griswold totaled five grabs for 46 yards.

For Auburn, Nick Marshall threw for 147 yards and two TD's on 10-of-17 passing and also ran for 53 yards. Tre Mason chalked up 99 yards on the ground as the Tigers finished with 301 as a team.

Sophomore rover Chris Humes and junior free safety Sterling Young topped A-State defensively with 12 (nine solos) and 10 tackles (seven solos), respectively. Junior middle linebacker Qushaun Lee and senior nose tackle Ryan Carrethers contributed seven stops apiece. Cornerback Chris Davis' 10 tackles (seven solos) led Auburn defense, which limited Arkansas State to 150 rushing yards.

JONESBORO, Ark. (9/12/13) – A 13-yard touchdown run by Arkansas State's Fredi Knighten with just under fourminutes remaining coupled with four Troy turnovers led the Red Wolves to a 41-34 Sun Belt Conference (SBC) opening win over Troy this Thursday night (Sept. 12) in front of 26,012 fans at A-State's Liberty Bank Stadium in Jonesboro, Ark.

Arkansas State (2-1; 1-0 SBC) bolted out to a 20-7 first-quarter lead in the ESPNU televised contest before Troy (2-1, 0-1 SBC) answered by scoring 14 straight second-quarter points to lead 21-20 at the half. The second half featured three lead changes with the Red Wolves snapping a 34-all deadlock late in the game to win their eighth consecutive conference outing dating back to last season.

Troy would have the game's first scoring chance, but was able to cash in as kicker Will Scott's field goal attempt from 49 yards out fell short. The Red Wolves took possession on their 32-yard line and moved the ball down the field to the A-State 45-yard line before senior quarterback Adam Kennedy lofted a pass toward the right sideline into the hands of senior wide receiver Allen Muse for a 55-yard touchdown at 7:50 to cap a four-play, 68-yard scoring drive. A-State would increase its lead to 13-0 as senior running back David Oku found the end zone on a two-yard slant with 6:31 left in the opening quarter, finishing a 45-yard drive covering three plays. A 29-yard halfback pass from sophomore wideout Tres Houston to sophomore tight end Darion Griswold followed by a 14-yard Oku rush set up the A-State's second score after senior defensive tackle Amos Draper intercepted Troy quarterback Corey Robinson's pass, which was initially tipped at the line of scrimmage by senior defensive tackle Dexter Blackmon.

The Trojans rallied on their next possession, cutting A-State's lead to 13-7 as running back Jordan Chunn tallied on a one-yard TD plunge with 4:38 remaining in the first quarter. However, the Red Wolves would get erase those Troy points as David Oku lined up as quarterback in the Wildcat formation and outraced the Troy defenders to the goal line for a three-yard score to cap a 75-yard drive putting the hosts up 20-7 at the quarter's 2:08 mark. A 43-yard Adam Kennedy aerial to Allen Muse on the previous play set up the A-State touchdown as the hosts lead by 13 (20-7) after 15 minutes of action.

A two-yard TD keeper by backup signal-caller Deon Anthony 13 seconds into the second quarter narrowed Troy's deficit to 20-14, which was aided by an A-State pass interference call giving the Trojans a first-and-goal situation at the two-yard line. A-State maintained the lead until six seconds left in the stanza when Robinson connected with wide receiver Eric Thomas on a three-yard TD pass to claim a 21-20 halftime advantage. The Trojans received the ball with 1:33 left in the quarter and proceeded to march 43 yards in seven plays culminating in the score.

Arkansas State regained the lead in the third quarter at 27-21 as sophomore running back Michael Gordon took a David Oku handoff in the Wildcat formation and dashed 11 yards to paydirt at the 8:35 mark to conclude a 14-play, 80-yard drive. But Troy would strike back less than



two minutes later as Corey Robinson hooked up with wide receiver Bryan Holmes on a 58-yard strike as the Trojans took a 28-27 lead with 7:02 on the clock. The Red Wolves would erase the deficit on one play, a 64-yard TD run by Michael Gordon as the hosts would go back out in front 34-28. Gordon netted his second TD of the night as A-State's blockers created an opening in Troy's interior line as Gordon ran untouched into the end zone with 3:50 left on the board.

Troy managed to tie the contest at 34-apiece with 12:18 to be played as Deon Anthony hit wideout Chandler Worthy on a 53-yard scoring pass, but the Red Wolves caught a break as Will Scott missed the extra-point attempt. On the ensuing possession, A-State went three and out as Troy gained the ball at its own 18-yard line and drove into Red Wolves' territory to the ASU 43 before sophomore cornerback Rocky Hayes picked off a Corey Robinson pass at the A-State 40-yard line. The Red Wolves proceeded to capitalize on another of Troy's four turnovers in the contest as Fredi Knighten, a sophomore, recorded the game-winning score on a 13-yard quarterback keeper with 3:56 left to be played. Troy would use up most of the time remaining, starting from its 25-yard line and moving the ball all the way down to the A-State 26 to potentially create a scoring opportunity. But, the A-State defense rose to the occasion once again as junior Frankie Jackson intercepted Robinson at the six-yard line and returned the ball to the Red Wolves' 25-yard line as the home team ran off the final 55 seconds.

The conference opener featured a combined 1,153 yards in total offense as Troy racked up 614 of those yards to A-State's 539-yards output. The Red Wolves produced 228 yards on the ground and 311 in the air while the Trojans garnered 504 passing yards to go with 110 rushing yards. Individually, Adam Kennedy completed 20-of-34 for 282 yards and a TD with senior wide receiver Julian Jones catching a game-high eight for 65 yards. Allen Muse turned in his best performance at A-State by amassing 158 receiving yards on six grabs. Michael Gordon paced the Red Wolves' ground assault with a game-leading 115 rushing yards and two TD's on eight carries while David Oku ran for 74 along with twoTD's on 21 attempts. For Troy, Corey Robinson passed for 371 yards and a pair of TD's on 30-of-51 passing but threw two interceptions. The Trojans' other quarterback, Deon Anthony was five-of-six for 110 yards and a TD. Eric Thomas and Bryan Holmes were both on the receiving end of six passes for 125 and 117 yards, respectively.

Defensively, junior linebacker Qushaun Lee's 12 tackles (six solos) led all players. Senior defensive end Eddie Porter notched eight stops and a fumble recovery while senior defensive tackle Ryan Carrethers, junior linebacker Kyle Coleman, and sophomore rover Chris Humes had seven tackles apiece. Amos Draper, Rocky Hayes, and Frankie Jackson all collected a passtheft.


Memphis, Tenn. (9/21/13) – A quick start by Memphis with a 24-point output in the first half fueled the Tigers to a 31-7 win over Arkansas State at the Liberty Bowl Memorial Stadium.

Memphis scored on both its first two possessions of the contest to build up a 24-7 halftime advantage In a rivalry matchup before a crowd of 36,279 fans.

With the loss, A-State fell to 2-2 overall while Memphis picked up its first win of the season in improving its overall record to 1-2. The Red Wolves came into the game having won four of the last five series meetings and hadn't lost to the Tigers since 2008 with a 29-17 setback at Memphis.

The opening quarter saw Memphis score on its first two possessions with a pair of touchdowns to take a 14-0 lead eight minutes into the game. A six-yard TD run by senior running back Brandon Hayes put Memphis up 7-0 at the 12:01 mark and the Tigers would hitpaydirt again on their next possession as a result of freshman quarterback Paxton Lynch hooking up with sophomore tight end Alan Cross for a six-yard TD scoring strike. Arkansas State sliced Memphis' lead in half at 14-7 on its next possession as sophomore wide receiver J.D. McKissic caught a 15-yard pass from sophomore quarterback Fredi Knighten and vaulted from four yards out into the Tigers' end zone followed by senior kicker Brian Davis' successful point after kick with 5:03 to go in the quarter. The A-State scoring drive took six plays and covered 59 yards . Three straight pass completions from senior quarterback Adam Kennedy to senior wideout JulianJones, including the first of 22 yards, along with a 38-yard kickoff J.D. McKissic return help set up the Red Wolves' lone first-half score.

Memphis maintained the upper hand against A-State in the second quarter as the Tigers accounted for all of the stanza's scoring with 10 unanswered points to lead 24-7 at halftime. The Tigers' points came on freshman kicker Jake Elliot's 23-yard field goal with 9:52 left in the half and a five-yard TD run from freshman back Sam Craft at the 5:25 mark.



In the second half, Memphis tallied the game's final points as the Tigers increased their margin to 24 points (31-7) with 2:15 remaining in the third quarter following freshman running back Marquis Warford's 16-yard touchdown run.

Overall, Memphis rolled up 505 yards of total offense with 329 coming on the ground while Arkansas State produced 255 yards, 181 yards in passing and 74 in rushing. Adam Kennedy completed 20-of-37 balls and one TD for 166 yards despite facing constant pressure by the Tigers throughout the contest. A-State's Julian Jones caught six passes for 59 yards in the game to lead all receivers. For Memphis, Paxton Lynch hit on 17-for-26 of his passes for 176 yards while the Tigers also featured a pair of 100-yard rushers in the game, Marquis Warford with 173 yards on 11 carries and Brandon Hayes with 18 rush attempts for 114 yards. Both also recorded a touchdown in the non-league decision as the hosts converted five-of-seven chances in the redzone.

Freshman linebacker Xavier Woodson paced Arkansas State with nine tackles (five solos). Junior free safety Sterling Young finished with seven stops (seven solos) and had a fumble recover while sophomore cornerback Rocky Hayes(five solos) and sophomore rover Chris Humes (four solos) also supplied seven tackles apiece. Junior defensive end Martin Ifedi spearheaded the Memphis defense with a game-high 10 tackles (seven solos), including 2.5 sacks for 11 yards and 4.5 tackles for loss. Memphis finished with seven sacks for 31 yards in addition to three quarterback hurries and two pass breakups.

A bright spot for A-State was sophomore Luke Ferguson, who punted five times for 231 yards to post a 46.2 yards average which also included a long of 58 yards.


Columbia, Mo. (9/28/13) – A 21-point fourth quarter by Missouri proved to be difference as the Tigers handed Arkansas State a 41-19 loss at Faurot Field at Memorial Stadium in Columbia, Mo.

Arkansas State, which fell to 2-3 overall on the season, battled 4-0 Missouri throughout the first three quarters of the non-conference contest in front of 62,468 fans. The Red Wolves were behind only one point at halftime (14-13) and trailed by four points (20-16) after three quarters before Mizzou reeled off three fourth-quarter touchdowns.

The game featured productive offensive numbers as both teams eclipsed 400-yards in total offense as Arkansas State generated 425 yards while Missouri chalked up a 495-yards total. Individually, sophomore wide receiver J.D. McKissic set a school-record with 15 receptions for 117 yards while senior quarterback Adam Kennedy's 37 completions equaled an A-State single-game mark. Kennedy would finish the night throwing for 308 yards on 46 pass attempts.

A pair of field goals by senior kicker Brian Davis gave Arkansas State an early 6-0 lead, but Missourierased the deficit on a touchdown two minutes left in the opening frame to go up 7-6. A-State turned its opening possession until a successful one as Davis' first field goal from 41 yards at 10:41 capped a nine-play, 46-yard scoring drive, which was highlighted by J.D. McKissic's 32-yard run on a misdirection play. A 21-yard Davis field goal with 3:35 remaining in the first quarter added to A-State's margin as the Red Wolves marched 76 yards in 10 plays. The A-State drive was aided by a 15-yard Mizzou personal foul infraction following a four-yard completion from senior quarterback Adam Kennedy to J.D. McKissic. Mizzou's lone first-quarter score came 1:35 later via tailback Marcus Murphy's eight-yard run.

Missouri upped its lead to 14-6 at the second quarter's 11:57 mark when quarterback James Franklin threw a 68-yard scoring strike to wide receiver Donal Green-Beckham. However, the Red Wolves managed to pull back to within a single point at 14-13 as senior wide out Julian Jones outmuscled a Mizzoude-fender for the ball in the end zone for a 17-yard TD reception on a Kennedy pass to complete an 11-play, 56-yard drive. The score was set up as senior defensive tackle Darius Dunaway forced a fumble which junior linebacker Kyle Coleman re-



covered at the A-State 44-yard marker. A-State forced the Tigers into a three and out on their next possession and started out at its own three-yard line. The Red Wolves were able to move the ball all the way down to the Mizzou one-yard line, but the Tigers' defense made back-to-back goal-line-stands. Following its final timeout, A-State's David Oku was stuffed at the line of scrimmage on a second-and-goal attempt. Mizzou would thwart the Red Wolves' final attempt to get into the end zone on the opening half's final play as Oku was tackled for a 22-yardloss on a pass reception as time expired.

Arkansas State regained the lead early the third quarter as Brian Davis booted his third field goal of the game at 11:31 on a 44-yarder to wrap up a 48-yard, nine-play Red Wolves' scoring drive. The score remained that way until 3:39 left in the quarter when Mizzou went back on top 20-16 as James Franklin hit wide receiver L'Damian Washington on a five-yard TD pass. The Tigers' two-point conversion attempt failed as Franklin's pass was intercepted by junior cornerback Artez Brown in the end zone.

Mizzou put the game out of reach in the fourth quarter as the Tigers outscored the Red Wolves 21-3 in the final 15 minutes. A one-yard TD run by running back Henry Josey with 13:25 left gave Mizzou a 27-16 lead. A-State would close to 27-19 as Brian Davis split the uprights for the fourth time on the nightwith a 33-yard field goal at 7:31 to cap a 14-play, 59-yard drive. However, the Tigers would net a pair of TD's to close out the scoring as James Franklin scored on a nine-yard keeper just over five minutes to go and then tossed a five-yard TD aerial to Donal Green-Beckham with 2:56 left on the scoreboard.

The Red Wolves, who generated 25 first downs to Mizzou's 23 in the game, compiled 308 yards passing and 117 yards on the ground. The Tigers ran for 239 yards to go with 256 yards in the air. Individually for A-State, Julian Jones contributed 136 receiving yards on 10 grabs. Mizzou was led by James Franklin, who completed 20-0f-29 passes for 255 yards, which included six to L'Damian Washington for 67 yards and four to Dorial Green-Beckham for 95 yards. Tailback Russell Hansbrough rushed for 96 yards on eight carries to lead all rushers

Leading the way for the A-State defense was junior linebacker Qushaun Lee, who totaled seven tackles (four solos) and Kyle Coleman contributed six tackles to go with a fumble recovery. Mizzou middle linebacker Andrew Wilson made a game-high 17 tackles (eight solos)

JONESBORO, Ark. (10/12/13) – Arkansas State provided its fans and alumni with plenty to cheer about as the Red Wolves claimed a 48-24 homecoming win over Idaho at Liberty Bank Stadium in Jonesboro, Ark.


The victory, which marked A-State's ninth in its last 10 homecoming outings since 2003 and its third consecutive homecoming triumph, came in front of 26,781fans as the Red Wolves evened their overall record to 3-3. Idaho fell to 1-6 on the season with the non-conference loss.

Arkansas State struck first on its initial play from scrimmage as senior quarter-back Adam Kennedy hooked up with senior wide receiver Julian Jones on an 80-yard out-and-up touchdown pass play to give the Red Wolves a 7-0 lead. Jones, who would end up with 111 first-half receiving yards, managed to get open behind the Idaho secondary and outran two Vandals' defenders for the end zone after hauling in a Kennedy pass near midfield.

The Red Wolves increased their first-quarter advantage to 14-0 a little over four minutes later when Kennedy completed a 13-yard scoring toss to sophomore wide out J.D. McKissic, who pulled in the deflected ball while on flat on his back in the end zone as A-State moved the ball 65 yards in seven plays to paydirt. Idaho chipped into the Red Wolves' lead and cut the deficit into half at 14-7 with 1:29 left to go in the frame as running back James Baker scored untouched off right tackle from four yards out.

A 38-yard field goal by A-State senior kicker Brian Davis gave the Red Wolves a 10-point cushion at 17-7 in the second quarter with 6:43 left on the clock. Davis' field goal ended a 16-play, 66-yard scoring drive, which was helped by a 19-yard Darion Griswold pass catch from Kennedy. The Kennedy-Griswold combination struck again on A-State's next possession as Kennedy hit the Red Wolves' sophomore tight end on a 13-yard TD strike with 2:13 remaining to finish an 85-yard march as the hosts went up 24-7 before the end of the half.

A-State managed to increase its lead to 31-7 early in the third quarter as Adam Kennedy hit Darion Griswold in the back of the end zone from one yard away with 10:48 showing on the clock as the pair accounted for their second scoring play in a row. Idaho countered on its next possession with a field goal by kicker Austin



Rehkow, who booted a 28-yarder around the seven-minute mark as the Vandals to make it 31-10. A R.J.Fleming 56-yard return on the ensuing kickoff put the ball into Idaho territory at the UI 43-yard line, but Adam Kennedy's pass was intercepted three plays later and returned 37 yards by safety Trey Williams to the A-State 39-yard line. The turnover helped set up an Idaho touchdown, a 15-yard TD pass from quarterback Taylor Davis to wide receiver Dezmon Epps, exactly three minutes later as the Vandals cut the margin to 31-17.

Idaho came right back with another touchdown on its second play in the fourth quarter as the Vandals scored 17 unanswered points as a result of running back James Baker's one-yard TD run to draw within 31-24 at the 14:22 mark. However, A-State would get those points back in one play 12 seconds later as J.D.McKissic took an Idaho kickoff from his two-yard line and ran a school third-longest 98 yards for the touchdown to give the Red Wolves a 38-24 advantage. The Red Wolves added a Brian Davis' 21-yard field goal with 6:19 remaining and tacked on seven more points at 2:39 on senior running back David Oku's three-yard TD scamper.

The Red Wolves piled up 26 first downs and 565 yards in total offense, which featured 375 yards in passing and 190 yards rushing. Adam Kennedy threw for a career game-high 375 yards, which included 260 in the first half, and four scores on 22-of-32 passing. J.D. McKissic hauled in nine of those aerials for 80 yards, Darion Griswold five for 89, and Julian Jones had four grabs for 135 yards as the trio accounted for a combined 304 receiving yards and all three of A-State's TD receptions. Senior running back Sirgregory Thornton's 85 rushing yards led the Red Wolves.

Idaho, which netted 386 total offensive yards with 212 in the air and 174 on the ground, was led by James Baker's game-leading 150 rushing yards on 23 carries and Taylor Davis' 199 yards in passing with a 14-of-39 performance.

Junior linebacker Qushaun Lee turned in a game-high 15 tackles for A-State and was aided by junior linebacker Kyle Coleman's career game-best nine stops. Junior free safety Sterling Young and senior defensive tackle Ryan Carrethers supplied seven tackles apiece. For Idaho, linebacker Marc Millan led the way with 11 tackles.


JONESBORO, Ark. (9/12/13) – A strong first-half showing propelled Louisiana-Lafayette to a decisive 23-7 win over Arkansas State in an ESPN2-televised Sun Belt Conference matchup for sole possession of first place at Liberty Bank Stadium.

Louisiana-Lafayette (5-2, 3-0 Sun Belt) surged to a 13-point lead over Arkansas State (3-4, 1-1 Sun Belt) at halftime and managed to keep the Red Wolves off the scoreboard the entire second half en route to winning its fifth straight contest. The loss snapped A-State's eight-game conference winning streak and ends a team nine-game victory string for October outings.

Louisiana-Lafayette scored first and often in the first half, taking a 20-7 lead at the half. ULL put together two touchdowns and a field goal to claim a 17-0 early second-quarter advantage over the Red Wolves. A 36-yard field goal by Stephen Brauchle put ULL up 3-0 at 9:30 of the first quarter as the Ragin' Cajuns intercepted senior quarterback Adam Kennedy pass on the contest's opening possession setting up the score. The Ragin' Cajuns would find the end zone oftheir next two possessions as Alonzo Harris recorded a pair of three-yard touchdown runs as A-State trailed 17-0 with 10:44 left to be played in the first half.

Arkansas State managed to slice into ULL's double-digit lead as sophomore cornerback Rocky Hayes picked off a pass by Terrance Broadway at the Ragin' Cajuns' 39-yard line. The Red Wolves then drove 39 yards on six plays culminating in a three-yard quarterback keeper by Kennedy with 3:39 remaining in the quarter. Senior Brian Davis followed with a successful extra-point attempt as A-State trailed 17-7. With just over a minute left before halftime, ULL would get the ball and eventually scored as Stephen Brauchle booted the ball between uprights on a 38-yarder as the clock expired.

The momentum remained with Louisiana-Lafayette in the second half as



the Ragin' Cajuns generated the only scoring opportunities, missing on the first one and converting the next. Stephen Brauchle missed wide right on a 28-yard field goal attempt at the 6:57 mark, but redeemed himself on his next chance by making a 30-yarder with three seconds left in the third quarter as Louisiana-Lafayette held a 23-7 lead after three quarters.

ULL held A-State in check defensively as the Red Wolves managed to cross midfield on one occasion while the Ragin' Cajuns was equally effective from an offensive standpoint with their time consuming ball-control offense. ULL put the clamps on A-State's potent offense, holding the Red Wolves to 168 yards in total offense with quarterback Adam Kennedy limited to 89 yards on 11-of-20 passing with one interception. Sophomore wide receiver J.D. McKissic had a team-high six receptions for 51 yards and senior wideout Allen Muse finished with two grabs for 26 yards. Sophomore running back Michael Gordon rushed for a squad-most 31 yards as the Red Wolves mustered a 79-yard output on the ground.

The Ragin' Cajuns, who racked up 26 first downs for the game, ran up 265 rushing yards and had 205 in passing for a 470 total offensive yardage total. Running backs Elijah McGuire and Alonzo Harris chalked up 110 and 105 rushing yards, respectively while Terrance Broadway was 18-of-28 for 205 yards in the passing department. Jamal Robinson was Broadway's favoritetarget, catching a game-high seven aerials for 104 yards.

Conversely, A-State's defense would spend a significant amount of time on the field which led to both a game-high and career single-game best 16 tackles from senior defensive tackle Ryan Carrethers. Junior middle line-backer Qushaun Lee contributed 13 tackles (seven solos). Sophomore defensive end Chris Stone, who had a quarterback sack for minus seven yards, and junior cornerback Artez Brown chipped in with seven stops apiece. Strong safety T.J. Worth racked up 11 tackles (six solos) to lead the Ragin' Cajuns.

MOBILE, Ala. (11/2/13) — Sirgregory Thornton's three-yard touchdown with 6:29 remaining in the fourth quarter propelled Arkansas State to a 17-16 victory over South Alabama in a Sun Belt Conference match up at Ladd Peebles Stadium.

The touchdown run capped a nine-play, 75 yard drive for the Red Wolves (4-4, 2-1 SBC), and the defense forced South Alabama (3-5, 1-3 SBC) to punt on the following possession after Darrius Rosser sacked Ross Metheny on third down.

A-State failed to score on the next possession and punted the ball to the Jaguars with 3:17 left to play. USA completed a 20-yard pass play to move the ball to its own 34 yard line, but the A-State defense held as Ross Metheny's pass attempt to Jereme Jones fell incomplete on fourth-and-5 and the Red Wolves ran out the final 1:53 for the victory.

The Red Wolves trailed 13-10 with 14:12 left to go in the game after Brian Davis hit a career-long 50 yard field goal to cap an 11-play, 38 yard drive. The Red Wolves kept the drive alive after Adam Kennedy hit Allen Muse on fourth-and-6 at the Jaguars 27 yard line, but South Alabama pushed the lead back to six when Aleem Sunanon converted a 30-yard field goal to push the lead to 16-10 lead with 9:58 to play.

South Alabama started the second half with much of the same success it experienced in the first half, but the Red Wolves defense came up big. After a 42-yard completion to place the ball at the A-State 18-yard line, Sterling Young intercepted Metheny's pass in the end zone and the Red Wolves' offense did not waste the opportunity.



Kennedy led A-State on a 12-play, 80-yard drive that culminated with a 12-yard touchdown by Kennedy. The Brian Davis extra point gave the Red Wolves a 7-6 lead with 8:12 to go in the third quarter.

The Red Wolves found success via the run game on the drive, collecting 57 of the 80 yards via the ground on the scoring drive. Kennedy picked up 36 of the rushing yards, with all of his gains coming on quarterback draws, including the 12-yard touchdown scamper.

The lead would be short-lived as South Alabama responded with a scoring drive of its own. The Jaguars needed just eight plays to go 65 yards and regained the lead on a 2-yard touchdown run from Kndall Houston to go up 13-7 with 4:40 to go in the third quarter.

South Alabama got on the board when it capped an 11-play, 70-yard drive with a 27 yard field goal from Sunanon with 10:55 to go in the second quarter to go up 3-0.

The Jaguars added to their lead later in the quarter when Sunanon converted on a 19 yard field goal with 1:34 to go in the half to push the advantage to 6-o. The kick was setup by a 47 yard pitch and catch from Ross Metheny to Danny Woodson that placed the ball on the A-State two yard line, but the Red Wolves denied the Jaguars from putting it in the end zone. South Alabama attempted to score on back-to-back run plays and then attempted a pass over the top of the Red Wolves' defense, but it fell incomplete, and USA settled for the field goal.

Kennedy finished the night with 65 yards rushing and one touchdown on 16 attempts while also adding 136 yards on 15-of-17 passing. Muse hauled in seven receptions on 58 yards passing, and Thornton had 15 yards rushing and one touchdown.

Qushaun Lee recorded a career-high 16 tackles to lead the A-State defense, while Rosser finished with a sack in his first career start. Young's interception was his first of the season and the fourth of his career.

MONROE, La. (11/9/13) – The Arkansas State special teams units blocked two kicks, while senior quarterback Adam Kennedy posted 337 yards total offense and running back Michael Gordon recorded a career-best four touchdowns to help lead the Red Wolves past Louisiana-Monroe 42-14 in a Sun Belt Conference matchup at Malone Stadium.

With the victory, A-State (5-4, 3-1) moved into sole possession of second place in the SBC league standings.

Kennedy finished the night with a season-high in rushing yards (102) and touchdown rushes (2). He also added 235 yards passing with a touchdown. Both of Kennedy's rushing touchdowns came after the result of a block by the A-State special teams unit.

The first block came with 3:58 to go in the third quarter when Ryan Carrethers got his hands on a 39-yard field goal attempt by Justin Manton. Artez Brown returned it to the ASU 44 and the offense did not waste the opportunity.


Kennedy led the Red Wolves on a five-play, 56-yard drive the culminated with an eight-yard touchdown run from Kennedy to push the lead to 28-14 with 1:40 to go in the third quarter.

Arkansas State added a punt block in the fourth quarter when LaAngelo Albright blocked and recovered Manton's punt from inside the ULM 10-yard line. Kennedy again made the Warhawks pay by punching it in two plays later from four yards out to extend the lead to 35-14 with 9:26 to play in the game.

The final dagger came with 4:40 to play in the fourth quarter when Michael Gordon scored his third rushing touchdown of the night to put A-State up 42-14. The score was set up by an Artez Brown interception with 9:13 to go and the Red Wolves went on a 10-play, 4:33 drive that was capped with Gordon's touchdown.

Senior kicker Brian Davis added the extra-point and in the process tied the Sun Belt Conference record for most points by kicking with 295.

For the second straight week the Red Wolves took advantage of a Sterling Young third quarter interception. The junior safety intercepted Browning and



returned it to the ULM 36 yard line to setup the go-ahead score by Michael Gordon.

J.D. McKissic set up the score for Gordon by taking a reverse rush 15 yards down to the ULM 1 yard line and Gordon scored on the next play to give A-State a 21-14 edge with 8:00 to go in the third quarter.

Gordon finished the night with 72 yards rushing and three rushing touchdowns while also hauling in two passes for 59 yards and a score.

A-State started its scoring on the night by constructing a 91-yard scoring drive near the end of the first quarter that was highlighted by a 51-yard touchdown pass to Gordon and put the Red Wolves up 7-0 with 49 seconds to go in the quarter. It was Gordon's first touchdown reception of his career and Kennedy's first touchdown pass since Oct. 12 against Idaho.

The lead would not last as the Warhawks needed just two plays to answer the score when Kolten Browning connected with Rashon Ceaser on the final play of the first quarter to tie the score at 7-7.

The scoring continued on the following possession when McKissic returned the kickoff 50 yards to give the Red Wolves' offense a short field. A-State reached deep into its playbook of the first play, executing a reverse double-pass from Kennedy to Jones for a 49-yard gain to put the ball on the ULM 1 yard line. Gordon punched it on the next play and the Red Wolves took a 14-7 lead with over 14 minutes remaining in the first half.

The pass to Jones began with Fredi Knighten lining up in the quarterback position and handing the ball off to McKissic who then lateraled the ball to Kennedy who then passed it to Jones for the big gain.

ULM tied the game before halftime thanks to a 10-play, 90-yard drive that was capped by a 10-yard touchdown pass by Browning to Ceaser with eight seconds remaining in the first half.

A-State finished the night with 494 yards of total offense, 259 of which came via the ground game. McKissic led the Red Wolves with seven catches for 75 yards while Qushaun Lee led the squad with seven tackles


JONESBORO, Ark. (11/16/13) — Arkansas State piled up 328 rushing yards and sophomore running back Michael Gordon scored three touchdowns in a 38-21 victory over Texas State at Liberty Bank Stadium, giving A-State its sixth victory of the year to make them bowl eligible for sixth time over the last nine seasons.

A-State claimed its third straight win of the year, improving to 6-4 overall and 4-1 in Sun Belt Conference play as they maintained its hold on sole possession of second place in the Sun Belt Conference standings. Texas State dropped to 6-4 overall and 2-3 in conference play.

Gordon rushed for a career-high 184 yards and had three rushing touchdowns for the Red Wolves, which has now won 19 of its last 21 conference games. Junior linebacker Qushaun Lee had a team-high 12 tackles, while senior defensive end Darius Dunaway and junior defensive back Artez Brown combined for a sack to lead the way for the A-State defense.

"I'm really proud of the way our team played again tonight," A-State head coach Bryan Harsin said. "Second half, defensively, they came out there and didn't score any points, so great adjustments by the defense and the same goes for the offensive side. We always want to start off fast in both areas, but we have made good adjustments each game so we can go out there and finish these games off. We wanted to run the football tonight, that was a goal for us and we were able to do that."

The Red Wolves fell behind 14-7 after the first quarter, but Gordon scored his second touchdown of the night to tie the score at 14-14 with 12:44 to go in the first half. The Bobcats took the lead back on a 7-yard touchdown pass from Tyler Jones to Ryan Carden with 5:35 to go in



the quarter to take a 21-14 lead.

The advantage would not last long as A-State responded with a 10-play, 71-yard drive before the half that was culminated with an 8-yard touchdown pass from Adam Kennedy to J.D. McKissic to tie the score with just over a minute left to go in the first half.

Gordon finished the first half with 122 yards rushing and two touchdowns on 11 carries, while the Red Wolves racked up 273 of total offense during the first 30 minutes of play.

A-State took the lead for good in the with 7:57 to go in the third quarter when Gordon crossed the goal line for his third score of the night to put the Red Wolves up 28-21. The lead expanded to 35-21 when David Oku punched it in from 1-yard out with 27 seconds to go in the third quarter.

The Red Wolves took advantage of a Texas State miscue in the fourth quarter when Texas State punter Zach Robinson was ruled to have had taken a knee while fielding the punt and A-State took over at the Bobcats' 10 yard line. Brian Davis connected on a 23-yard field goal with 12:14 to go in the game to set the final at 38-21.

Davis also became the Sun Belt Conference all-time leader in career points when he added the extra-point on Gordon's first touchdown of the night in the first quarter. He now has 303 career points.

Gordon scored on his first touchdown of the night when he broke a 40-yard run to tie the score at 7-7. He finished the night with 184 yards rushing and three touchdowns, while Kennedy rushed for 78 yards and Oku added 55 yards.

McKissic hauled in seven receptions for 41 yards and a touchdown and also had a long punt return of 43 yards on the night.
