THE PRINCIPALS: After claiming a season-opening win over Montana State, the Red Wolves dropped back-to-back road games at Tennessee and Miami to run their record to 1-2 on the year. The young season has unfolded exactly the opposite for Utah State, which fell at Tennessee before winning back-to-back home games against Idaho State and Wake Forest. The last six seasons have striking similarities for the two programs, including identical 4-8 records in 2009 and 2010 before both strung together three consecutive winning seasons. In fact, both teams have won 29 games over the last four seasons (including 2014) to stand tied for the 21st most in the nation over that span. Additionally, both teams lost their bowl games in 2011 before winning back-to-back postseason games that last two years.

HEAD COACH BLAKE ANDERSON: Blake Anderson, a

13-year coaching veteran at the NCAA FBS level who also coached in an NJCAA National Championship game, was named the Red Wolves' 30th all-time head football coach on Dec. 19, 2013. Working on head coach Larry Fedora's staff as offensive coordinator and guarterbacks coach at both North Carolina and Southern Miss over the last four seasons, Anderson's dynamic offense helped lead the two programs to 34 victories, three bowl game appearances and two conference or divisional titles. Along the way, his potent offense was responsible for breaking both schools' total offense records while also ranking among the most productive teams in the nation. The Hubbard, Texas native comes to A-State after spending the last two seasons as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at North Carolina.

STARTING STRONG: Blake Anderson is A-State's 30th all-time head coach, but became just the 11th to claim a victory in his first ever game at the school. Last season Bryan Harsin became the first A-State head coach to win his initial game since Larry Lacewell in 1979, snapping a streak of seven head coaches to drop their debuts. A-State's head coaches to win their first game at the school include Anderson, Harsin, Lacewell, Bill Davidson (1971), Gene Harlow (1955), Glen Harmeson (1954), Bill Adams (1939), Jack Dale (1931), Bill Stanley (1924), Foy Hammons (1919)

THE ARKANSAS STATE - UTAH STATE SERIES: Saturday's game will mark the sixth all-time meeting

Saturday's game will mark the sixth all-time meeting between Arkansas State and Utah State, and the Aggies hold 3-2 advantage in the series that dates back to 1995. The Red Wolves' two victories both came at home, including a 21-17 win in the initial 1995 meeting and a 16-7 victory the last time they played in 2004. At the same time, all three setbacks suffered by A-State came at Utah State between 1999-2003. Four of the five meetings have been decided by 13 points or less.

HOME-AND-HOME: This year's contest will mark the first game of a home-and-home series between Arkansas State and Utah State. The Red Wolves are scheduled to face the Aggies on the road in 2016, when they will make their first trip to Logan since 2003.

OLD TIES: While Arkansas State and Utah State have played each other five times previously, this will be the first ever non-conference contest between the two programs. A-State and Utah State have shared two different conferences, including the Sun Belt from 2003-04 and the Big West from 1993-95 and 1999-2000.

never played a game against an opponent while it was a member of the league. The Red Wolves have played Boise State (0-2), Colorado State (0-2), Hawaii (1-0), Nevada (2-3), San Diego State (0-1), San Jose State (1-1), UNLV (0-1), Utah State (2-3) and Wyoming (0-2), but all those games were played before those teams joined the Mountain West Conference. A-State holds a combined 6-15 record in those contests.

STARTING FRESH: The Red Wolves had 11 players make their first career start in one of the first three games of the season. Six of them earned their first start against Montana State, including offensive linemen Jemar Clark, Devin Mondie and Tyler Greve, wide receiver Dijon Paschal, quarterback Fredi Knighten and defensive end Ja'Von Rolland-Jones. Defensive lineman Chuks Ota got his first career start against Tennessee, while last week defensive end Caleb Caston, wide receiver Booker Mays, defensive end Chris Odom and running back Johnston White made their way into the starting lineup against Miami.

NEW FACES: Arkansas State has seen 28 total players, including 13 true freshmen, achieve their first game experience this season at A-State. Six of those true freshmen are listed on the two-deep, including defensive lineman **Chuks Ota** and defensive end **Caleb Caston** – the only two to start a game this year (at Tennessee and at Miami, respectively).

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH: Entering the opening week of the season, Arkansas State had 27 (26 this week) combined freshmen and sophomores on its depth chart to tie for the 10th most in the nation. The Red Wolves' 10 seniors (10 again this week) on the depth chart were tied for the 10th fewest in the country.

AN A-STATE VICTORY WOULD ...: make it 2-2 after four games for the fourth consecutive year ... give the Red Wolves their first victory over a Mountain West Conference opponent ... improve its record over the last four seasons to 30-13 ... give it two consecutive wins over Utah State and run its all-time record against the Aggies to 3-3 ... give it four straight home wins dating back to last season ... make it 18-2 over its last 20 home games ... give it a regular-season .500 record against non-conference opponents for the third time over the last four years ... give it two non-conference wins for the fourth consecutive year.

STOP THE BLEEDING: Coming off losses at Tennessee and Miami its last two times out, the Red Wolves have dropped back-to-back games for just the second time over the last four seasons. The Red Wolves have not suffered a setback in three consecutive games since the last three contests of the 2010 campaign.

HOME SWEET HOME: With a 5-1 home mark last season, Arkansas State secured its ninth consecutive winning record at Centennial Bank Stadium dating back to 2005. A-State is now 42-9 at Centennial Bank Stadium since the 2005 season and has won 17 of its last 19 home games. The Red Wolves actual on-field record all-time at Centennial Bank Stadium is 134-72-1 since it opened in 1974. A-State's six home wins in 2011 were its most since 1985.

FOUR-YEAR WINS TOTAL: Including back-to-back 10-win seasons in 2011 and 2012, eight more in 2013 and a season-opening win this year, the Red Wolves have recorded 29 victories that are tied for the 21st most in the nation over the last four years.

SPREADING THE WEALTH: Just three games into the season, Arkansas State has already completed at least one pass to 15 players -- three more than all of last season. Ten of those players have multiple receptions, including *J.D. McKissic* with a team-high 16. The last time A-State had more than 15 players with a catch was 2012 when it had 16.

HOME OPENERS: With its 37-10 victory over Montana State, Arkansas State won its 10th consecutive home opener at Centennial Bank Stadium dating back to the 2005 campaign. The Red Wolves now stand 30-11 all-time in home openers at the stadium and are also 16-6 in such games since moving to the FBS in 1992.

SEASON OPENERS: A-State won its season opener for the second consecutive year for the first time since 2008 and 2009. The last time Arkansas State won its first two games of a season was 2008 when it defeated Texas A&M and Texas Southern to begin the year.

RED WOLVES TABBED SECOND IN PRESEASON SBC POLL: The Red Wolves were picked second in the preseason coaches poll announced in conjunction with the league's annual Media Day. A-State received 102 points behind Louisiana-Lafayette, which received 121 points and all 11 first-place votes.

PRESEASON ALL-SUN BELT CONFERENCE: Arkansas State placed 10 players on the 2014 Preseason All-Sun Belt Conference Team, which tied Louisiana-Lafayette for the most in the league. Senior linebacker Qushaun Lee was named the conference's Preseason Defensive Player of the Year, and he was joined on the first team by four other teammates. The Red Wolves placed four offensive and six defensive players on the all-conference squad, while junior receiver J.D. McKissic also made the team as a return specialist.

CENTENNIAL SEASON: Arkansas State kicked off its 100th season of football on Aug. 30 versus Montana State. A-State now holds a 435-464-37 record since the inaugural season and has played in 10 bowl games. A-State did not field a team from 1942-44 due to World War II. Arkansas State also didn't have a team in 1918 as World War I was ending. In honor of its 100th football season, the athletics department has created a microsite that can be viewed at

AStateFootball100.com.

SUN BELT CHAMPIONS: Arkansas State claimed its third consecutive Sun Belt Conference championship in 2013. A-State has won 10 conference championships all-time. It won the Southland Conference seven times (1986, 1985, 1978, 1975, 1970, 1969, 1968). A-State also won the 2005 Sun Belt Conference title, but it was later vacated due to NCAA sanctions. Prior to the 2011-13 seasons, the last time A-State won three straight conference championships was 1968-70 when it was a member of the Southland Conference.

A WINNING RECORD: Arkansas State secured its third straight winning season in 2013 for the first time since 1985-87. A-State won 10 games in both 2011 and 2012, while collecting eight victories last season. The Red Wolves' 28 total victories from 2011-13 were the most over a three-year span since winning 29 games from 1985-87.

OVER .500 IN THE SUN BELT: With a 5-2 conference record last season, A-State posted a winning Sun Belt record for the sixth time since the league's inaugural season in 2001. A-State has put together three straight winning records against conference opponents for the first time since 1984-86 when it was a member of the Southland Conference.

THREE-PEAT: Last year, Arkansas State became the third program in Sun Belt history to claim at least a share of the conference championship in three consecutive seasons, joining Troy (2006-10) and North Texas (2001-04). The Red Wolves also won three league championships in a row for the just the second time in school history, also claiming the Southland Conference titles from 1968-70.

TEN FORMER WALK-ONS EARN SCHOLARSHIP: Head coach Blake Anderson announced during A-State's fall camp that 10 former walk-ons to the Red Wolves football team have been awarded full athletics scholarships. While some of the 10 have been placed on scholarship in the past, they have all been a walk-on member of the team at some point during their careers. The list includes Brock Barnhill, Travis Bodenstein, William Boyd, Darius Buckley, Ryan Eustace, Charleston Girley, Ryan Jacobs, Booker Mays, TeDarius Turner and Raziel Velgis.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

OPENING DRIVE: A-State scored a touchdown on one of its first two offensive possessions in each of its first three games this season. The Red Wolves' opening drive versus Tennessee covered 40 yards, while their first drive versus Montana State covered 75. A-State's second drive at Miami that netted a touchdown covered 65 yards.

HOUSTON, WE DON'T HAVE A PROBLEM: Junior wide receiver *Tres Houston* is off to a fast start this season, ranking second on the team in both receptions (14) and receiving yards (157). Houston caught eight passes for 135 yards, both career highs, against Montana State and hauled in his first career receiving touchdown against Tennessee. While his receptions total dropped to two at Miami, he completed his first career touchdown pass in the game. Houston, who had eight receptions for 44 yards all of last season, is ranked 10th in the Sun Belt Conference in receptions.

300-PLUS: Dating back to the 2010 season, Arkansas State has posted at least 300 yards of total offense in 48 of its last 54 games. A-State went over 300 in each of its first three games this season, including 547 yards versus Montana State, 331 against Tennessee and 329 at Miami.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD: A-State has posted at least 30 points in 26 of its last 38 regular-season games dating back to the 2011 season. The Red Wolves have won 16 of their last 17 games when scoring at least 30 points.

TAKING OVER AT QB: In his first three career starts, junior quarterback *Fredi Knighten* has posted over 200 yards total offense in each game. Knighten piled up a career-high 312 yards against Montana State before coming back to record 231 versus Tennessee and 222 at Miami. The 2014 GoDaddy Bowl MVP recorded a career-high 22 completions last week against the Hurricanes.

LEARNING EXPERIENCE: Arkansas State's collective offensive line entered the 2014 season with the nation's third fewest combined starts in the nation. The Red Wolves returned just two offensive lineman with starting experience, including sophomore **Colton Jackson** and senior **Alan Wright**. The 22 combined starts entering the year were the fewest behind just Tennessee (six) and Ohio State (20). Following A-State was San Jose State with 23 and Army with 24.

RECEIVING RECORDS: Just a junior, **J.D. McKissic** is already taking over the Arkansas State record books in almost every major receiving statistical category.

He holds the school record for receptions in a game (15), season (103) and career (201). He is ranked fifth for career receiving yards with 1,852 to his credit and has nine receiving touchdowns rank tied for ninth. He is the only player in school history to have 70 or more receptions in two different seasons. He is also currently ranked fifth in the nation in career receptions among active players, and he is the only junior among the top-10 leaders.

ON A ROLL: A Freshman All-America selection in 2011 and Sports Illustrated Honorable Mention All-America in 2012, sophomore WR **J.D. McKissic** has caught at least one pass in all 29 games of his career at A-State. His 29 consecutive games with a reception is tied for the 12th longest streak in the nation. He had a school-record 15 against Missouri last season. McKissic also has five career 100-yard receiving games.

100-YARD RUSHER: Junior RB *Michael Gordon*. Gordon accumulated over 100 yards rushing a teamhigh four times last season, including two of the last three regular-season games. Gordon posted 606 of his 754 rushing yards in conference games, averaging 86.6 yards per contest that ranked second in the league.

GRISWOLD BREAKS OUT: Senior tight end *Darion Griswold* enjoyed a break-out season last year, catching 24 passes for 312 yards. His receptions total was the most in a season by an A-State tight end since Trevor Gillott recorded 24 in 2009 as well, while his 312 receiving yard were the most by a player at the position since David Johnson had 356 in 2008.

A-State Athletics Announces Largest Personal Gift Commitment in its History

The Arkansas State Athletics Department announced Aug. 26 the single largest personal gift commitment in its history, a \$5 million contribution by the Johnny Allison family that will be used in conjunction with A-State's "Centennial Expansion" project.

The announcement was made at an afternoon press conference fittingly held on the west side of Centennial Bank Stadium, where the project's construction and renovations will take place to the press box and concourse-level amenities. The entire project, including the press box and concourse, will cover 39,673 square feet.

The Centennial Expansion project will include a complete overhaul to the stadium press box, expanding it to 35,741 square feet. The face of the stadium will be redesigned to include 42 loge boxes, 20 suites and 300 club seats in its revenue-generating areas. The suites will average 433 square feet each.

Not only will depth be added to the press box, it will span from approximately the 15-to-15 yard lines, allowing for enhanced media, coaching, broadcasting, control booth, visiting athletics director suite, and camera areas.

A FLARE FOR THE DRAMATIC: Sophomore RB Michael Gordon was responsible for three of the four longest runs by A-State last year, including a 92-yard outburst against UAPB that was the second longest in school history. Gordon posted a 64-yard touchdown run against Troy and had a 40-yard touchdown rush against Texas State as well. He had a 42-yard run against Montana State during the season-opening week, giving him four career carries that went for at least 40 yards – and he also scored a touchdown on all four.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

GETTING TO THE QUARTERBACK: Arkansas State recorded a combined 11 sacks against its first two opponents, giving it a 3.67 average per game that ranks 13th in the nation. The Red Wolves had six sacks against Montana State, which were its most since posting the same number against Arkansas-Pine Bluff in its 2013 season opener.

PLAYING BEHIND THE LINE OF SCRIMMAGE: Fifteen players have combined to record 20 tackles for loss

over the first three weeks of the season, giving the Red Wolves a 6.7 average per game that ranks 36th in the nation. Sophomore linebacker *Xavier Woodson* is responsible for a team-leading 2.5 tackles behind the line of scrimmage. Woodson didn't record a tackle for loss last year in his 32 stops.

LOADED SECONDARY: Arkansas State's secondary has combined to start 112 career games, which is among at least the six highest in the nation. A-State's players in the defensive backfield with starting experience include Sterling Young, Chris Humes, Money Hunter, Artez Brown, Andrew Tryon, Rocky Hayes, Frankie Jackson and Charleston Girley.

COVERING AT CORNERBACK: Junior corner Rocky Hayes made a big impact in his first season on the defensive side of the ball in 2013, leading the team in both pass break-ups (10, tied for most) and interceptions (3). He ranked second in the Sun Belt Conference in passes defended with 13. Hayes ranked 43rd in the nation in passes defended. Hayes picked off his fourth career pass in the season opener against Montana State . . . Additionally, senior Artez Brown had a career-best 10 pass break-ups last season and had 11 passes defended. Brown ranked fourth in the Sun Belt Conference in passes defended, and he has two pass break-ups this season – tied for the second most on the team.

LEAVE NO STONE UNBLOCKED: Sophomore defensive end *Chris Stone* made a habit of disrupting the opponent's backfield last season, recording a team-high 9.5 tackles for loss that ranked 11th in the Sun Belt Conference. Stone recorded at least one tackle for loss in seven games last season and posted a career-high two in two different games. He had three tackles for loss as a redshirt freshman in 2012. Stone has two tackles for loss and two sacks this season.

ANOTHER 100: Senior linebacker Qushaun Lee recorded a team-high 134 tackles last season, making him the first A-State player to record over 100 tackles in back-to-back seasons since linebacker Les Echols in 2002 (105) and 2003 (123). He ranked 12th in the nation in tackles and led the Sun Belt Conference. Lee recorded a career-high 16 tackles at South Alabama and had at least 10 tackles in six of the last eight games, giving him 10 career games with double-figure stops. His 134 tackles were the

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

FERGUSON HONORED: Junior punter and kicker *Luke Ferguson* was named both the Sun Belt Conference Special Teams Player of the Week and a College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) national Honorable Mention Specialist of the Week for his performance against Montana State. Ferguson, handling placekicking duties for the first time, was a perfect 3-of-3 on his field goal attempts and all four of his punts pinned the Bobcats inside their own 20-yard line. He finished the game with 13 points by kicking, which tied the seventh most in school history.

BIG BOOT: Junior punter *Luke Ferguson* punted seven times against Tennessee for 303 yards - both career highs - for a 43.3 average, while also pinning the Volunteers inside their own 20-yard line three times. His punts and yardage were both the most by an A-State player since Ryan Wilbourn punted seven times for 314 yards versus Middle Tennessee in 2007. He has nine punts inside the 20 this season and his 42.8 punting average is the 42nd best in the nation.

ON THE RETURN: Arkansas State ranked sixth in the nation in kickoff returns last year with a 25.18 average per return, and is picking up this year where it left off last season. The Red Wolves have seen three players return at least one kickoff this season for a combined 26.1 average, which ranks 15th in the nation. Junior **J.D. McKissic** has returned four kicks for 102 yards and a 25.5 average that ranks 26th in the nation, but true freshmen **Blaise Taylor** and **Daryl Rollins-Davis** have also combined for eight returns covering 211 yards (26.4 average). Rollins-Davis has a team-high seven returns for 173 yards (24.7 avg.) and Taylor one for 38 yards.



Blake Anderson, a 13-year coaching veteran at the NCAA FBS level who also coached in an NJCAA National Championship game, was named the Red Wolves' 30th all-time head football coach on Dec. 19, 2013.

Working on head coach Larry Fedora's staff as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at both North Carolina and Southern Miss over the last four seasons, Anderson's dynamic offense helped lead the two programs to 34 victories, three bowl game appearances and two conference or divisional titles. Along the way, his potent offense was responsible for breaking both school's total offense records while also ranking among the most productive teams in the nation.

The Hubbard, Texas native came to A-State after spending the previous two seasons as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at North Carolina, where he helped lead the Tar Heels to an Atlantic Coast Conference Coastal Division title in 2012 and the Belk Bowl in 2013. Under Anderson's direction, North Carolina averaged 432.4 total yards per game last season after setting the school record the previous year with 485.6 yards per contest. Prior to his arrival in Chapel Hill, the Tar Heels had not averaged 400 yards in a season since 1993.

North Carolina's offense posted more than 500 yards of total offense seven times during Anderson's two seasons at the school, including a school-record 721 versus Old Dominion last season, and scored 40 or more points in nine games. The Tar Heels averaged 44.2 points per game at Kenan Stadium (14 games) and 25.4 on the road (10 games) with Anderson as their offensive coordinator.

Anderson led a passing offense a year ago that ranked 23rd in the nation, averaging 286.3 yards per game. North Carolina posted 27 passing touchdowns, which were the second most in school history and just two behind the 29 recorded in 2012. The Tar Heels ranked among the top 44 teams in the nation last year in total offense, completion percentage, passing offense, red zone offense, scoring offense, passing efficiency, fourth down conversions and turnovers lost.

North Carolina's offensive success last season was just a con-

tinuation from Anderson's initial season, which saw the Tar Heels establish more than 35 school records. The Tar Heels finished eighth in the country in scoring, averaging 40.6 points per game and were 14th nationally with 485.6 yards per game. Their passing attack was 26th nationally with 291.8 yards per contest, and the Tar Heels also rushed for 193.8 yards per game, their highest average since 1994.

Individuals excelled in Anderson's system at every position. During his time at the school, six offensive players received All-ACC recognition, including First Team All-America selection Eric Ebron at tight end. As quarterbacks coach, Anderson tutored standouts Bryn Renner and Marquise Williams. Renner set the single-season school record for touchdowns passes with 28 in 2012, while Williams provided a spark to the UNC offense last season with his mobility outside the pocket. Williams finished the regular season with 1,058 yards of total offense in the last three games alone, which was the most in any three-game stretch in Tar Heels history. He was also the first quarterback to lead North Carolina in rushing since 1968.

Anderson went to Chapel Hill after a record-setting run as Southern Miss' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. The Golden Eagles set school records for total offense in each of Anderson's last two years. He was part of a Southern Miss staff under Fedora that won a school-record 12 games in 2012, including the Conference USA championship over previously unbeaten Houston and the Hawaii Bowl over Nevada.

Anderson spent his first two seasons as USM's quarterbacks coach and run game coordinator and developed Austin Davis into one of the nation's top signal callers. Davis broke nearly every school record in an outstanding four-year career.

Under the eye of Anderson, the Golden Eagles were one of 14 teams in the country that averaged more than 200 yards per game in both rushing and passing in 2011. The Golden Eagles had nearly 6,500 yards of total offense and set a school record with 461.4 yards per game. In addition, USM was 15th nationally in scoring offense, 16th in total offense and 21st in rushing offense. Anderson's offense posted 30-or-more points in 10 of 14 games in 2011, including a season-high 63 in a win over Navy.

In 2010, Southern Miss was 18th in total offense, 20th in rushing offense and 35th in passing offense. The Golden Eagles also averaged 36.9 points per game to rank 15th in the nation. That season, Anderson's quarterbacks were among the most efficient in the nation with only eight interceptions thrown – including one by a wide receiver – to 24 touchdowns. Davis accounted for 10 of the team's 28 rushing touchdowns, more than any other back.

In his first year in Hattiesburg in 2008, Anderson mentored then redshirt freshman and first-year starter Davis, who responded by having the best season ever for a freshman QB at the school, while also putting together one of the better years that any signal caller has had at the university.

Davis, who was the first freshman to start in his opening game since 1991, notched 15 school records, including six season marks – passing yards (3,128), completions (261), attempts (454), total offense (3,636) and touchdowns responsible for (30).

Anderson came to Southern Miss after spending the 2007 campaign at Louisiana-Lafayette as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. The Ragin' Cajuns posted the No. 6-rated



rushing offense nationally (251.6) in 2007 and became the Sun Belt's first ever 3,000-yard rushing team (3,019).

Anderson, who was in private business from 2004-06, previously worked at Middle Tennessee, where he helped direct an offensive unit as co-offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach from 2002-04.

He spent three seasons at New Mexico before landing at MTSU. He served as the wide receivers coach in 2001 and running backs coach from 1999-2000. The UNM rushing attack was responsible for a major share of the Lobo offense in 2000. The Lobos averaged 148 yards per game on the ground, which accounted for 56 percent of the team's total offense.

Anderson worked at Trinity Valley Community College (1995-98) before joining the Division I FBS ranks at New Mexico. In 1998, he was the offensive coordinator and the Cardinals went 7-3. He helped lead the Cardinals to the 1997 NJCAA National Championship.

He began his coaching career at Eastern New Mexico in 1992 (graduate assistant) and 1993 (full-time), where he tutored the wide receivers. He then moved on to Howard Payne University in Brownwood, Texas, to coach wide receivers in 1994. HPU won the Texas IAA conference title.

A two-year letterwinner at wide receiver for Sam Houston State from 1989-91, Anderson was named Southland Conference All-Academic as a senior. He also played for two years as a quarterback and receiver at Baylor (1987-89) before transferring. Anderson graduated with his bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Sam Houston State in 1992. He also attained his master's degree in sports administration from Eastern New Mexico in 1994. Anderson and his wife Wendy have one daughter, Callie, and two sons, Coleton and Cason.

JONESBORO, Ark. (8/30/13) – Arkansas State scored 24 unanswered points in the second half as the Red Wolves went on to a 37-10 victory over Montana State in their 2014 season opener before 26,143 fans at Centennial Bank Stadium.

A-State, which is celebrating its 100th season of football, extended its homeopening winning streak to 10 straight dating back to the 2005 campaign. The victory also gave A-State back-to-back season-opening wins for the first time since the 2008 and 2009 seasons. The Red Wolves handed in-state Arkansas-Pine Bluff (UAPB) a 62-11 loss in last season's opener.


The Red Wolves, the three-time (2011-13) defending Sun Belt Conference (SBC) champions, netted 558 yards in total offense as A-State featured a balanced attack with 294 yards on the ground and 264 in passing. Junior quarterback Fredi Knighten would tally a combined 323 yards on his own, which included 219 passing yards. Defensively, A-State held Montana State to 228 offensive yards.

A-State scored on the game's opening possession to take a 7-0 first-quarter lead as junior running back Michael Gordon busted down the right sideline on a 42-yard touchdown run with 14:19 to go and capped a three-play, 75-yard drive. A 29-yard pass from Fredi Knighten to redshirt junior wide receiver Tres Houston helped set up the Red Wolves' scoring play.

Montana State would tie the contest up at seven apiece with 5:45 left in the opening quarter by capitalizing on an A-State turnover. Redshirt junior J.D. McKissic fumbled a 52-yard punt by Trevor Bolton, which was recovered by the Bobcats' middle linebacker Rhett Young at the A-State seven-yard line. Running back Anthony Knight would hit pay dirt on his fourth straight rushing attempt from one yard out.

The Red Wolves regained the lead at 1:21 left in the first quarter on a 29-yard field goal by junior kicker Luke Ferguson, which concluded a 12-play, 59-yard scoring drive. Ferguson would go onto add a second one, this time from 23 yards out with just five seconds remaining before the half to finish a 93-yard, 13-play sequence as the Red Wolves led 13-7 at the half. A-State produced 302 total offensive yards in the first half, which included an average of 5.4 yards per carry (141 rushing yards) while limiting Montana State to 18 yards on the ground.

The teams exchanged field goals to open the third-quarter scoring as the Bobcats sliced A-State's lead to 13-10 at 10:21 on kicker Luke Daly's 34 yarder. Luke Ferguson



would counter for the Red Wolves with his third field goal of the game, a 41-yard boot with 5:26 left to be played in the quarter as the hosts led 16-10. A-State extended its lead to 23-10 when junior tight end Darion Griswold snared a Fredi Knighten pass for a 23-yard score with 1:53 remaining in the stanza. A 45-yard half-back pass from Tres Houston back to Knighten helped set up the scoring play.

A-State increased its margin to 30-10 early in the fourth quarter as junior cornerback Rocky Hayes picked off MSU quarterback Dakota Prukop's pass at the A-State 46-yard line, which eventually lead to a one-yard TD run by freshman running back Terrance Hollingsworth with 14:25 left. The Red Wolves tacked on their fourth TD of the game with 9:47 to be played on redshirt frosh running back Johnston White's one-yard run giving A-State a 37-10 lead. Redshirt senior middle linebacker Qushaun Lee put the Red Wolves in prime field scoring position with a 40-yard interception return to the MSU 15-yard line.

Knighten ran for 104 yards to lead all rushers in the game while Michael Gordon had 68 yards on seven carries. In receiving, Tres Houston's eight receptions for 87 yards was a game high and J.D. McKissic contributed four catches for 83 yards. Knighten was 19-of-29 for 219 yards in the passing department for A-State, which converted five-of-six red zone opportunities.

Dakota Prukop threw for 142 yards on 14-of-26 passing for Montana State, but was intercepted twice and sacked four times.

Sophomore linebacker Xavier Woodson paced the Red Wolves with seven tackles (six solo). Senior redshirt free safety Sterling Young along with redshirt senior cornerback Andrew Tryon and redshirt junior linebacker Chris Stone contributed six stops apiece. Woodson, junior linebacker Austin Copeland, and freshman defensive end Caleb Caston each had a sack.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (9/6/14) - The Tennessee Volunteers scored on three consecutive possessions in the first half and led the rest of the way en route to a 34-19 non-conference victory over the Arkansas State in front of 99,538 fans at UT's Neyland Stadium in Knoxville, Tenn.

A-State struck first on its opening drive of the game as the Red Wolves marched 40 yards on six plays and found the end zone on a four-yard quarterback keeper from junior Fredi Knighten to claim a 6-o lead. Back-to-back pass completions from Knighten to redshirt freshman wide receiver Tres Houston, covering 14 and 16 yards, along with a 12-yard Knighten run moved A-State to the UT six-yard line. Junior running back Michael Gordon's rush moved the ball two yards closer and on the ensuing play, Knighten scampered into the end zone untouched.

Tennessee answered back with a 73-yard drive resulting in a 20-yard field goal by Aaron Medley to cut A-State's lead at 6-3 with 7:16 to go in the first quarter. The Volunteers would claim a 10-6 advantage on their next possession as tailback Jalen Hurd finished off a 70-yard drive with a four-yard TD run at the opening quarter's

A 10-yard TD pass from quarterback Justin Worley to wide receiver Marquez North early in the second quarter resulted in the third straight scoring series for Tennessee, which bumped its lead up to 17-6 with 13:01 remaining on the clock. The Red Wolves bounced back to draw within 17-12 at the 4:10 mark as a result of a Fredi Knighten slant pass to Tres Houston from nine yards out. A-State went for two points, but was unsuccessful as redshirt junior quarterback Stephen Hogan's pass was incomplete and the Red Wolves were also whistled for offensive pass interference. A-State managed to keep the drive alive on a fourth-and 11 situation when junior punter Luke Ferguson faked a punt and then completed a 24-yard pass to redshirt junior Chris Stone for a first down to the UT 49-yard line. However, the Vols stretched their lead back to double digits at 24-12 with 1:20 to be played in the first half as Justin Worley tallied on a five-yard keeper to cap a 10-play, 71-yard drive.

Tennessee stretched its margin to 31-12 in the third quarter by capitializing on a Red Wolves' turnover as Worley connected with Marquez North on another scoring pass play, this one of 14 yards at the 7:52 mark. A 33-yard Matt Darr punt was fumbled by redshirt junior J.D. McKissic, which was recovered by the Vols at their own



36-yard line to set up the drive.

The last touchdown of the game came from A-State and occurred with 10:06 left to be played as redshirt frosh DeKeathan Williams' 24-yard TD run capped an 11-play, 83-yard scoring drive as the Red Wolves closed their deficit to 31-19. Tennessee would account for the final points in extending its lead to 34-19 with 1:41 remaining in the outing as Aaron Medley split the uprights on a 38-yard field goal.

Fredi Knighten completed 21-of-34 passes for 166 yards and a touchdown in directing the Red Wolves offense, which produced 190 yards passing and 141 rushing yards for a 331-yards total to Tennessee's 415 offensive yards. He also ran for a teamhigh 65 yards on 14 carries and one score.

Redshirt freshman Tres Houston's 48 yards in receiving on four catches lead A-State, which also received a five catch, 38-yard performance from J.D. McKissic.

Defensively, redshirt senior free safety Sterling Young and redshirt senior middle linebacker Qushaun Lee each compiled a squad-high nine tackles apiece, which included seven solo stops each. Redshirt senior cornerback Andrew Tryon and sophomore linebacker Xavier Woodson each chipped in with seven tackles (six solos). Sophomore defensive back Money Hunter contributed with a pass interception and five tackles (four solos).

For the Vols, Justin Worley threw for 247 yards and two TD's on 22-of-38 passing while Jalen Hurd's 83 yards on 23 carries led all rushers in the contest. Tight end Ethan Wolf had five grabs for 20 yards while Von Pearson and Marquez North caught four Worley aerials for 71 and 68 yards, respectively. North had a pair of TD receptions in the game as well.

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. (9/16/14) – Several big scoring plays by Miami proved too much for the Arkansas State football team to overcome as the Red Wolves suffered a 41-20 loss in a non-league tilt before 41,519 spectators at Sun Life Stadium.

Miami scored its touchdowns on passes covering 63 yards twice, along with a pair of runs which covered 27 and 33 yards, respectively. The Hurricanes, who improved their record to 2-1 this season, finished the day with 488 yards in total offense while A-State recorded 329 yards, which included 236 passing yards.

A-State trailed Miami 21-7 after the opening quarter as the Hurricanes scored a touchdown on their first two possessions. A 63-yard scoring strike from true freshman quarterback Brad Kaaya to wide receiver Phillip Dorsett on Miami's second offensive play of the game put the hosts up 7-0 less than four minutes into the contest, but the Red Wolves managed to erase the deficit on their next offensive series.

A-State took the kickoff and marched 65 yards down the field in 11 plays culminating in junior Fredi Knighten's one-yard quarterback keeper with 9:03 remaining in the quarter to tie the score at 7-7. Knighten completed five passes during A-State's scoring drive, which included back-to-back 11-yard tosses to junior tight end Darion Griswold and junior wide receiver J.D. McKissic to set up the Red Wolves' score. The game didn't stay tied for long as Miami came right back on the ensuing kickoff and scored by utlizing the long pass. The Canes' Brad Kaaya hooked up with Phillip Dorsett on a 51-yard aerial to give Miami the ball at the A-State 19-yard line and then on the next play, Kaaya then connected with Clive Walford on a 19-yard scoring pass as the Hurricane went back on top at 14-7 with 8:21 left in the stanza.

The Red Wolves then would face a 20-7 deficit late in the first quarter as Miami hit paydirt for the third straight time as running back Duke Johnson dashed 33 yards into the end zone with 3:12 to be played in the opening frame. A-State had its share of scoring opportunities but was unsuccessful in converting as junior kicker Luke Ferguson missed wide on a pair of field goal attempts from 36 yards in the first quarter and from 42 yards early in the second.

Miami extended its lead to 27-7 with 1:16 remaining before the end of the first half as running back Gus Edwards broke several tackles and scampered 27 yards for the Canes' fourth TD. A 32-yard return by frosh Daryl Rollins-Davis on the Miami kickoff



gave A-State the ball at its own 40-yard line and the Red Wolves would move into Hurricane territory on the next play as Knighten completed an 18-yard pass to J.D. McKissic. Two plays later, Miami was flagged for pass interference moving A-State to UM's 19-yard line. The Red Wolves signaled for a trick play and the call paid dividends as J.D. McKissic took a Knighten handoff on a reverse and flipped the ball to junior wideout Tres Houston, who threw a backfield pass to a wide open Knighten at the nine-yard line. Knighten hauled in Houston's pass and sprinted to goal-line marker with 16 seconds left as A-State sliced the deficit to 27-14 at intermission.

Miami upped its lead to 34-14 in the third quarter as defensive lineman Olsen Pierre recovered a Fredi Knighten fumble at the UM 40-yard line, which eventually led to a 63-yard TD scoring pass play from Brad Kaaya to Phillip Dorsett with 8:32 left on the clock. Kaaya would throw his fourth TD pass of the game less than five minutes later with a six-yard toss to wide receiver Braxton Berrios to make it 41-14.

A-State started the fourth quarter on a positive note as the Red Wolves drove 89 yards in 16 plays resulting in a seven-yard TD run by redshirt freshman running back Johnston White as the visitors narrowed the gap to 41-20 with a second under 10 minutes left in the game.

For the Red Wolves, Knighten ended the day throwing for 217 yards on 22-of-40 pass completions while his counterpart, Brady Kaaya chalked up 342 passing yards after completing 16-of-24 passes with four TD's.

Johnston White led the A-State rushing attack with 83 yards on 14 carries for a 5.9 yards per attempt average while J.D. McKissic was the Red Wolves' favorite target with seven receptions for 59 yards. Redshirt freshman wideout Brandon Cox contributed five grabs for 29 yards. Duke Johnson was the game's top rusher with 90 yards on 14 attempts and Phillip Dorsett caught four passes for 201 yards and two TD's to help key the Miami offense.

On the defensive side of the ball, redshirt junior defensive back Charleston Girley's 10 tackles (six solos) led the way. Redshirt senior free safety Sterling Young compiled eight stops (five solos) as did redshirt senior defensive back Frankie Jackson (four solos), sophomore defensive back Money Hunter (four solos), and redshirt senior linebacker Qushaun Lee (four solos), who also notched a pass interception.
