ON TAP: Arkansas State, the three-time defending Sun Belt Conference champions, will host South Alabama on Saturday in the first of three home games over its final four regular-season contests. The game, scheduled for a 2 p.m. (CT) kickoff, is set to be televised by ESPN3. Every A-State game can be heard live on 107.9 FM in the Northeast Arkansas area, and the live radio broadcast can be accessed through the official A-State Athletics web site (AStateRedWolves.com).

Blake Anderson was named A-State's 30th head football coach on Dec. 19, 2013, and was immediately recognized as one of the top hires in college football.

THE PRINCIPALS: Arkansas State will enter Saturday's game needing one more victory to become bowl eligible for the seventh time over the last 10 seasons. A-State also needs one more victory at Centennial Bank Stadium to secure its 10th consecutive season with a winning home record. Like the Red Wolves, South Alabama enters the game with a 5-3 overall record and needs one win to become bowl eligible for the second straight year. The Jaguars have performed well away from Ladd-Peebles Stadium with a 3-1 road record, but A-State has also won 19 of its last 21 home games.

HEAD COACH BLAKE ANDERSON: Blake Anderson, a 13-year coaching veteran at the NCAA FBS level who also coached in an NJCAA National Championship game, was named the Red Wolves' 30th all-time head football coach on Dec. 19, 2013. Working on head coach Larry Fedora's staff as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at both North Carolina and Southern Miss over the last four seasons, Anderson's dynamic offense helped lead the two programs to 34 victories, three bowl game appearances and two conference or divisional titles. Along the way, his potent offense was responsible for breaking both schools' total offense records while also ranking among the most productive teams in the nation. The Hubbard, Texas native comes to A-State after spending the last two seasons as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at North Carolina.

STARTING STRONG: Blake Anderson is A-State's 30th all-time head coach, but became just the 11th to claim a victory in his first ever game at the school. Last season Bryan Harsin became the first A-State head coach to win his initial game since Larry Lacewell in 1979, snapping a streak of seven head coaches to drop their debuts. A-State's head coaches to win their first game at the school include Anderson, Harsin, Lacewell, Bill Davidson (1971), Gene Harlow (1955), Glen Harmeson (1954), Bill Adams (1939), Jack Dale (1931), Bill Stanley (1924), Foy Hammons (1919) and Clint Young (1913).

THE ARKANSAS STATE - SOUTH ALABAMA SERIES: Arkansas State holds a 2-0 all-time record against South Alabama in the Sun Belt Conference series that dates back to just 2012. The Red Wolves picked up a 36-29 home win over the Jaguars in 2012 and escaped last year's meeting with a narrow 17-16 win in Mobile.

A-STATE vs. THE SUN BELT: Arkansas State has won 23 of its last 27 Sun Belt Conference games (.852 winning percentage) to run its all-time record in the conference to 56-40. The Red Wolves hold their most all-time victories against ULM with 23 and, with the exception of newcomers Appalachian State and Georgia Southern, have defeated every team in the SBC since the football league was formed in 2001. Along with ULM and Louisiana-Lafayette, A-State is

RED WOLVES NOVEMBER: Dating back to the 2011 season, Arkansas State holds an 11-1 record over its last 12 games played in the month of November. The Red Wolves won 10 consecutive games in the month of November before falling to Western Kentucky in their 2013 regular-season finale.

HOME SWEET HOME: With a 3-0 home record this year, Arkansas State needs one more home victory to secure its 10th consecutive year with a winning record at Centennial Bank Stadium dating back to 2005. A-State is now 44-9 (.830 winning pct.) at Centennial Bank Stadium since the 2005 season and has won 19 of its last 21 home games. The Red Wolves actual on-field record all-time at Centennial Bank Stadium is 136-72-1 since it opened in 1974. A-State's six home wins in 2011 were its most since 1985.

BOWL ELIGIBLE: With a 5-3 overall record, A-State needs one more victory to become bowl eligible for the fourth consecutive season and seventh time over the last 10 years.

Since joining the FBS in 1992, Arkansas State has been bowl eligible after nine games just twice (2011 and 2012). The earliest Arkansas State has ever become bowl eligible was in 2011 when it was 6-2 after eight games.

THROUGH EIGHT: Arkansas State has a winning record (5-3) after eight games for the first time since the 2012 season and just the fourth time since joining the FBS in 1992 (2014,

2012, 2011, 2006). The Red Wolves' 5-3 record matches the 2012 and 2006 teams as their second best record through eight games since joining the FBS. The 2011 team was 6-2 through eight contests.

AN A-STATE VICTORY WOULD . . . give it six victories, matching (2012) its second most ever through nine games since joining the FBS in 1992 . . . make it bowl eligible for the fourth consecutive year and seventh time over the last 10 seasons . . . give it six straight home wins . . . make it bowl eligible after nine games for just the third time since joining the FBS in 1992 . . . secure its 10th consecutive season with a home winning record . . . improve its Sun Belt Conference record since 2011 to 24-4 . . . make it 3-0 all-time versus South Alabama . . . make it 12-1 over its last 13 games played in the month of November . . . give it 20 wins over its last 22 home games . . . run its record to 34-14 over the last four seasons.

FOUR-YEAR WINS TOTAL: Including back-to-back 10-win seasons in 2011 and 2012, eight more in 2013 and four this year, the Red Wolves have recorded 33 victories that are tied for the 22nd most in the nation over the last four years.

STRONG IN THE SECOND: Dating back to last season, nine of Arkansas State's last 13 victories have come when it was either tied or trailing at some point during the third quarter. Three of A-State's five victories this season have come under the circumstances, while its six last year were its most ever since returning to NCAA Division I-A (now FBS) status in 1992.

FINISHING IN THE FOURTH: Arkansas State has outscored its opponents 86-38 in the fourth quarter this season for a +48-point scoring margin that ranks tied for ninth in the nation. The Red Wolves have at least matched their opponents fourth-quarter scoring output in every game and have outscored six teams in the quarter. The A-State defense has also kept the opposing offense off the scoreboard in the fourth quarter in four games.

STARTING FRESH: The Red Wolves have had a new starting lineup on offense or defense in every game this season. They have had 15 players make their first career start this season, which is tied for 13th most in the nation. A-State's first-time starters this season include:

NEW FACES: Arkansas State has seen 30 total players, including 14 true freshmen and nine redshirt freshmen, achieve their first game experience this season at A-State. Eight of those true freshmen are listed on the two-deep, including defensive lineman **Chuks Ota** and defensive end **Caleb Caston** – the only two to start a game this year.

FOUNTAIN OF YOUTH: Arkansas State has 29 combined freshmen and sophomores on its depth chart to tie for the fourth most in the nation, along with Wake Forest, Alabama and Tennessee. Oklahoma State has the most with 35. The Red Wolves' 11 seniors on the depth chart are tied for the 21st fewest in the country. Temple has the fewest with five.

.500 NON-CONFERENCE: Arkansas State completed the non-conference portion of its regular-season schedule with a 21-14 overtime victory over Utah State on Nov. 20. The Red Wolves have now completed their regular season non-conference schedule with a .500 record for the third time over the last four years. They have also won two non-conference games during the regular season the last four years.

WORKING OVERTIME: Arkansas State's 21-14 triumph over Utah State marked its first overtime victory since defeating Florida Atlantic 3-0 in 2005. With the win, the Red Wolves improved to 3-4 all-time in overtime games dating back to 1998.

ROAD WARRIORS: Arkansas State has won 12 of its last 14 conference road games dating back to the 2011 season. A-State had won 10 consecutive conference road games, its longest streak ever as a member of any league, before falling at Western Kentucky in its 2013 regular-season finale. The Red Wolves went 4-0 in conference road games in both 2011 and 2012, 2-1 in 2013 and are 2-1 this season.

CENTENNIAL SEASON: Arkansas State kicked off its 100th season of football on Aug. 30 versus Montana State. A-State now holds a 439-465-37 record since the inaugural season and has played in 10 bowl games. A-State did not field a team from 1942-44 due to World War II. Arkansas State also didn't have a team in 1918 as World War I was ending. In honor of its 100th football season, the athletics department has created a microsite that can be viewed at AStateFootball100.com.

SUN BELT CHAMPIONS: Arkansas State claimed its third consecutive Sun Belt Conference championship in 2013. A-State has won 10 conference championships all-time. It won the Southland Conference seven times (1986, 1985, 1978, 1975, 1970, 1969, 1968). A-State also won the 2005 Sun Belt Conference title, but it was later vacated due to NCAA sanctions. Prior to the 2011-13 seasons, the last time A-State won three straight conference championships was 1968-70 when it was a member of the Southland Conference.

A WINNING RECORD: Arkansas State secured its third straight winning season in 2013 for the first time since 1985-87. A-State won 10 games in both 2011 and 2012, while collecting eight victories last season. The Red Wolves' 28 total victories from 2011-13 were the most over a three-year span since winning 29 games from 1985-87.

OVER .500 IN THE SUN BELT: With a 5-2 conference record last season, A-State posted a winning Sun Belt record for the sixth time since the league's inaugural season in 2001. A-State put together three straight winning records against conference opponents for the first time since 1984-86 when it was a member of the Southland Conference.

THREE-PEAT: Last year, Arkansas State became the third program in Sun Belt history to claim at least a share of the conference championship in three consecutive seasons, joining Troy (2006-10) and North Texas (2001-04). The Red Wolves also won three league championships in a row for the just the second time in school history, also claiming the Southland Conference titles from 1968-70.

**A-State Athletics Announces Largest Personal Gift Commitment in its History**

The Arkansas State Athletics Department announced Aug. 26 the single largest personal gift commitment in its history, a \$5 million contribution by the Johnny Allison family that will be used in conjunction with A-State's "Centennial Expansion" project.

The announcement was made at an afternoon press conference fittingly held on the west side of Centennial Bank Stadium, where the project's construction and renovations will take place to the press box and concourse-level amenities. The entire project, including the press box and concourse, will cover 39,673 square feet.

The Centennial Expansion project will include a complete overhaul to the stadium press box, expanding it to 35,741 square feet. The face of the stadium will be redesigned to include 42 loge boxes, 20 suites and 300 club seats in its revenue-generating areas. The suites will average 433 square feet each.

Not only will depth be added to the press box, it will span from approximately the 15-to-15 yard lines, allowing for enhanced media, coaching, broadcasting, control booth, visiting athletics director suite, and camera areas.

The project also calls for major improvements and additions to the concourse bathrooms, concessions, gating and ticketing areas.

TEN FORMER WALK-ONS EARN SCHOLARSHIP: Head coach **Blake Anderson** announced during A-State's fall camp that 10 former walk-ons to the Red Wolves football team have been awarded full athletics scholarships. While some of the 10 have been placed on scholarship in the past, they have all been a walk-on member of the team at some point during their careers. The list includes **Brock Barnhill, Travis Bodenstein, William Boyd, Darius Buckley, Ryan Eustace, Charleston Girley, Ryan Jacobs, Booker Mays, TeDarius Turner** and **Raziel Velgis**.

OFFENSIVE NOTES

SECOND HALF SURGE: All five Arkansas State victories this season have seen it score at least 21 points in the second half, and the Red Wolves have put up more points in the second half than the first in four of them. The Red Wolves have posted at least 17 second half points in six games this year, including the last five in a row. Including overtime, A-State has put up 151 second-half points in comparison to 110 in the first. The Red Wolves have outscored their opponents 58-52 in the third quarter and 86-38 in the fourth.

QUICK STARTS: While the Red Wolves were held scoreless in the first half against both Utah State and ULM, that comes in stark contrast to their quick starts in their other six games when they scored a touchdown on one of their first two possessions.

EXPLOSIVE PLAYS: Arkansas State recorded 25 of its 42 (59 percent) plays of over 20 yards this season in its last four games. The Red Wolves had seven plays versus both ULM and Louisiana-Lafayette, six versus Idaho and five more against Georgia State that covered at least 20 yards, giving them a 6.3 average per game over that span.

300-PLUS: Dating back to the 2010 season, Arkansas State has posted at least 300 yards of total offense in 53 of its last 59 games. A-State went over 300 in each of its first eight games this season, including a season-high 618 at Georgia State.

500-PLUS: Arkansas State has recorded at least 572 yards total offense in three of its last four games, increasing its average to 468.8 yards per game that ranks 29th in the

nation. A-State has posted at least 500 yards total offense in four games for the year.

TAKING OVER AT QB: In seven of his first eight career starts, junior quarterback **Fredi Knighten** has posted over 200 yards total offense. Knighten has recorded at least 300 yards total offense in the last four straight games, including a career-high 405 versus Louisiana-Lafayette. He is averaging 346.2 yards total offense over the last four games. He is now ranked first in the Sun Belt Conference and 24th in the nation with 293.3 yards total offense per game.

QUARTERBACK KEEPER: While junior quarterback **Fredi Knighten's** 467 rushing yards this season are 57 shy of former A-State quarterback Adam Kennedy's 524 posted last year, his 58.4 average per game is the highest by an A-State quarterback since Roy Johnson averaged 71.1 in 1991. Johnson recorded 782 yards rushing in 1991, but the highest total since then by an A-State quarterback was 588 by Ryan Aplin in 2011.

A FLARE FOR THE DRAMATIC: Sophomore RB **Michael Gordon** is responsible for five of the 10 longest plays this

season by an A-State player, and all five were posted in one of the last four games. Gordon is averaging 8.6 yards per rushing attempt, which is ranked third in the nation. Gordon had one run over 40 yards versus Idaho to give him 10 such carries for his career:

92 yd TD vs UAPB (2013); 70 yd TD vs ULL (2014); 68 yd vs ULM (2014); 64 yd TD vs Troy (2013); 53 vs GSU (2014); 50 vs GSU (2014); 49 yd vs ULM (2014); 44 yd TD vs Idaho (2014); 42 yd TD vs Montana State (2014); 40 yd TD vs Texas State (2013)

ANOTHER 100: Arkansas State junior running back **Michael Gordon** added another 100-yard rushing game to his career totals with 105 yards versus Idaho. It was his fourth consecutive 100-yard performance after also recording 168 against ULM, a career-high 188 versus Georgia State and 134 at Louisiana-Lafayette. Gordon has surpassed 100 yards rushing eight times during his career, and he is averaging 148.8 yards per game over the Red Wolves last four outings. His 113.3 yards per game for the entire season is ranked 17th in the nation.

GOING THE DISTANCE: Junior RB **Michael Gordon** and junior QB **Fredi Knighten** have both recorded two touchdown runs covering at least 50 yards, which is tied for the sixth most in the nation. Five players in the nation have three rushing touchdowns of at least 50 yards, while Georgia Southern's Matt Brieda has the most with six.

WALK-ON 100: Redshirt freshman and walk-on running back **Johnston White** not only recorded the first 100-yard rushing game of his career versus Utah State, it was the first 100-yard game of the season at the time by an A-State player. Johnston has posted 303 rushing yards this season and his four rushing touchdowns are the second most among all A-State running backs.

SPREADING THE WEALTH: Just eight games into the season, Arkansas State has already completed at least one

pass to 20 players -- eight more than all of last season. Fifteen of those players have multiple receptions, including **J.D. McKissic** with a team-high 43. The 20 players with a reception are the most ever by A-State since joining the FBS in 1992. The next closest was 19 in 2006.

HOUSTON, WE DON'T HAVE A PROBLEM: Eight games through the regular season, junior wide receiver **Tres Houston** ranks second on the team in receptions (30) and third in receiving yards (358). Houston caught eight passes for 135 yards, both career highs, against Montana State and has hauled in two touchdown passes (vs Tennessee and ULL). Houston had eight receptions for 44 yards all of last season.

LIGHTING UP THE SCOREBOARD: A-State has posted at least 30 points in 29 of its last 43 regular-season games (67 percent) dating back to the 2011 season, including the last three in a row. The Red Wolves have won 18 of their last 20 games when scoring at least 30 points.

LEARNING EXPERIENCE: Arkansas State's collective offensive line entered the 2014 season with the nation's third fewest combined starts in the nation. The Red Wolves returned just two offensive linemen with starting experience, including sophomore **Colton Jackson** and senior **Alan Wright**. The 22 combined starts entering the year were the fewest behind just Tennessee (six) and Ohio State (20). Following A-State was San Jose State with 23 and Army with 24.

ACTIVE DUTY: Junior wide receiver **J.D. McKissic** is among the active career leaders in several statistical categories, including receptions (6th: 228), kickoff return average (10th: 27.7 average per attempt), receiving yards (22nd: 2,196), all-purpose yards (29th: 3,416).

RECEIVING RECORDS: Just a junior, **J.D. McKissic** is already taking over the Arkansas State record books in almost every major receiving statistical category. He holds the school record for receptions in a game (15), season (103) and career (228). He is ranked third for career receiving yards with 2,184 to his credit and has nine receiving touchdowns that rank tied for ninth. He is the only player in school history to have 70 or more receptions in two different seasons.

ON A ROLL: A Freshman All-America selection in 2011 and Sports Illustrated Honorable Mention All-America in 2012, junior WR **J.D. McKissic** has caught at least one pass in all 34 games of his career at A-State. His 34 consecutive games with a reception is the 12th longest streak in the nation. He had a school-record 15 catches against Missouri last season.

DEFENSIVE NOTES

TRIO OF HONORS: Redshirt freshman defensive end **Ja'Von Rolland-Jones** picked up a trio of honors this week, including Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Week, College Football Performance Awards national Honorable Mention Defensive Lineman of the Week, and College Sports Madness Sun Belt Conference Defensive Player of the Week.

MORE ON ROLLAND-JONES: **Ja'Von Rolland-Jones** recorded a career-high eight tackles, five tackles for loss that tied the most by a Sun Belt Conference player this season, a school-record tying four sacks and one pass break-up against Idaho. His five tackles for loss were the third most in the nation this season, while his four sacks tied the third most in the country this year and also tied the third most in Sun Belt Conference history. His eight tackles were the third most on the team and the most among the Red Wolves' defensive linemen. The Mesquite, Texas, native has now posted 9.5 tackles for loss and six sacks, both team highs, this season. Rolland-Jones ranks fourth in the Sun Belt Conference and 22nd in the nation in sacks, while his tackles for loss total ties the fourth most in the league and are tied for 41st in the country.

FORCING TURNOVERS: Arkansas State recorded a season-high eight turnovers gained last week versus Idaho, giving it 18 total for the season that ranks tied for 19th in the nation. The Red Wolves recorded four interceptions and four fumbles recovered in the contest. One of the fumbles recovered was returned a school-record 93 yards by junior corner **Rocky Hayes** for a touchdown. Cornerback **Artez Brown** was also responsible for a career-high two interceptions.

SCORING DEFENSE: Arkansas State has held four opponents

to 14 points or less – the most since holding four to no more than 14 in 2008. The last time A-State held more than four opponents to 14 points or less in a season was 1986 when it did so 10 times. The Red Wolves have won 16 consecutive games when holding an opponent to 17 point or less.

GETTING TO THE QUARTERBACK: Arkansas State recorded a combined 27 sacks against its first eight opponents, giving it a 3.4 average per game that ranks 12th in the nation. The Red Wolves had six sacks against Montana State, which were its most since posting the same number against Arkansas-Pine Bluff in its 2013 season opener. Through just eight games, A-State has already passed its total (26) for all of last season. The last time the Red Wolves had more than 27 sacks in a season was 2011 when it had 35.

PLAYING BEHIND THE LINE OF SCRIMMAGE: Twenty-one players have combined to record 55 tackles for loss over the first eight games of the season, giving the Red Wolves a 6.9 average per game that ranks 34th in the nation. A-State needs 16 more tackles for loss over its final four regular-season games (4.0 average per game) to match its total (71) last season.

AMONG THE LEAGUE LEADERS: Sophomore linebacker **Xavier Woodson** leads the team and is ranked sixth in the Sun Belt Conference in tackles, averaging 8.6 per game. He has 69 total tackles, 13 more than the Red Wolves' second leading tackler Qushaun Lee. Woodson is averaging 6.4 solo tackles per game, which ranks 14th in the nation. He has posted a double-figure tackles total three times this season and four times during his career, including a career-high 14 versus Louisiana-Lafayette.

LEAVE NO STONE UNBLOCKED: Junior defensive end **Chris Stone** has recorded at least a half-sack in five of eight outings this season, giving him 4.5 on the year that ranks seventh in the Sun Belt Conference. Additionally, he has at least one tackle for loss in six of eight games this year for a 6.0 total that ranks tied for 17th in the Sun Belt. Last season, he posted a team-high 9.5 tackles for loss that ranked 11th in the league. He entered the season with four career sacks, already topping that total over A-State's first eight games this season.

PICK IT OFF: Seven A-State players have combined for 10 interceptions this season, and the Red Wolves have picked off at least one pass in seven of their last nine games dating back to the 2014 GoDaddy Bowl. The Red Wolves' 10 interceptions are the third most in the Sun Belt Conference and rank tied for the 26th most in the nation. A-State had a season-high four interceptions last game versus Idaho.

UNDER 100: A-State has held three teams, including Georgia State, ULM and Montana State, to under 100 yards rushing this season. The Red Wolves have allowed a player from just two teams this year to rush for over 100 yards individually.

ANOTHER 100: Senior linebacker **Qushaun Lee** recorded a team-high 134 tackles last season, making him the first A-State player to record over 100 tackles in back-to-back seasons since linebacker Les Echols in 2002 (105) and 2003 (123). He ranked 12th in the nation in tackles and led the Sun Belt Conference in 2013. Lee has recorded a double-figure stops total 11 games during his career.

LOADED SECONDARY: Arkansas State's secondary has combined to start 137 career games, which is among at least the six highest in the nation. A-State's players in the defensive backfield with starting experience include **Sterling Young**, **Chris Humes**, **Money Hunter**, **Artez Brown**, **Andrew Tryon**, **Rocky Hayes**, **Frankie Jackson**, **Sterling Wright** and **harleston Girley**.

SPECIAL TEAMS NOTES

TWICE AS NICE: Through its first seven games this season, A-State has seen two different players named the Sun Belt Conference Special Teams Player of the Week. Junior punter and kicker **Luke Ferguson** was named both the Sun Belt Conference Special Teams Player of the Week and a College Football Performance Awards (CFPA) national Honorable Mention Specialist of the Week for his performance against Montana State. Senior cornerback **Artez Brown** earned the

recognition for his performance against Utah State, most notably for blocking a Utah State field goal attempt to force overtime.

INSIDE THE 20: Junior punter **Luke Ferguson** has recorded a career-best 20 punts inside the 20-yard line this season for a 2.5 average per game. He has pinned the opponent inside its own 20-yard line at least one time in every game this season. His 20 total are the most in the Sun Belt Conference. He has placed 47.6 percent (20 of 42) of his punts inside the 20, which is the seventh highest percentage in the nation. Ferguson, who entered the season with eight career kicks inside the 20, is ranked fourth in the league and 50th in the nation in punting average with a 42.1 average per attempt.



Blake Anderson, a 13-year coaching veteran at the NCAA FBS level who also coached in an NJCAA National Championship game, was named the Red Wolves' 30th all-time head football coach on Dec. 19, 2013.

Working on head coach Larry Fedora's staff as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at both North Carolina and Southern Miss over the last four seasons, Anderson's dynamic offense helped lead the two programs to 34 victories, three bowl game appearances and two conference or divisional titles. Along the way, his potent offense was responsible for breaking both school's total offense records while also ranking among the most productive teams in the nation.

The Hubbard, Texas native came to A-State after spending the previous two seasons as the offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach at North Carolina, where he helped lead the Tar Heels to an Atlantic Coast Conference Coastal Division title in 2012 and the Belk Bowl in 2013. Under Anderson's direction, North Carolina averaged 432.4 total yards per game last season after setting the school record the previous year with 485.6 yards per contest. Prior to his arrival in Chapel Hill, the Tar Heels had not averaged 400 yards in a season since 1993.

North Carolina's offense posted more than 500 yards of total offense seven times during Anderson's two seasons at the school, including a school-record 721 versus Old Dominion last season, and scored 40 or more points in nine games. The Tar Heels averaged 44.2 points per game at Kenan Stadium (14 games) and 25.4 on the road (10 games) with Anderson as their offensive coordinator.

Anderson led a passing offense a year ago that ranked 23rd in the nation, averaging 286.3 yards per game. North Carolina posted 27 passing touchdowns, which were the second most in school history and just two behind the 29 recorded in 2012. The Tar Heels ranked among the top 44 teams in the nation last year in total offense, completion percentage, passing offense, red zone offense, scoring offense, passing efficiency, fourth down conversions and turnovers lost.

North Carolina's offensive success last season was just a con-

tinuation from Anderson's initial season, which saw the Tar Heels establish more than 35 school records. The Tar Heels finished eighth in the country in scoring, averaging 40.6 points per game and were 14th nationally with 485.6 yards per game. Their passing attack was 26th nationally with 291.8 yards per contest, and the Tar Heels also rushed for 193.8 yards per game, their highest average since 1994.

Individuals excelled in Anderson's system at every position. During his time at the school, six offensive players received All-ACC recognition, including First Team All-America selection Eric Ebron at tight end. As quarterbacks coach, Anderson tutored standouts Bryn Renner and Marquise Williams. Renner set the single-season school record for touchdowns passes with 28 in 2012, while Williams provided a spark to the UNC offense last season with his mobility outside the pocket. Williams finished the regular season with 1,058 yards of total offense in the last three games alone, which was the most in any three-game stretch in Tar Heels history. He was also the first quarterback to lead North Carolina in rushing since 1968.

Anderson went to Chapel Hill after a record-setting run as Southern Miss' offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. The Golden Eagles set school records for total offense in each of Anderson's last two years. He was part of a Southern Miss staff under Fedora that won a school-record 12 games in 2012, including the Conference USA championship over previously unbeaten Houston and the Hawaii Bowl over Nevada.

Anderson spent his first two seasons as USM's quarterbacks coach and run game coordinator and developed Austin Davis into one of the nation's top signal callers. Davis broke nearly every school record in an outstanding four-year career.

Under the eye of Anderson, the Golden Eagles were one of 14 teams in the country that averaged more than 200 yards per game in both rushing and passing in 2011. The Golden Eagles had nearly 6,500 yards of total offense and set a school record with 461.4 yards per game. In addition, USM was 15th nationally in scoring offense, 16th in total offense and 21st in rushing offense. Anderson's offense posted 30-or-more points in 10 of 14 games in 2011, including a season-high 63 in a win over Navy.

In 2010, Southern Miss was 18th in total offense, 20th in rushing offense and 35th in passing offense. The Golden Eagles also averaged 36.9 points per game to rank 15th in the nation. That season, Anderson's quarterbacks were among the most efficient in the nation with only eight interceptions thrown – including one by a wide receiver – to 24 touchdowns. Davis accounted for 10 of the team's 28 rushing touchdowns, more than any other back.

In his first year in Hattiesburg in 2008, Anderson mentored then redshirt freshman and first-year starter Davis, who responded by having the best season ever for a freshman QB at the school, while also putting together one of the better years that any signal caller has had at the university.

Davis, who was the first freshman to start in his opening game since 1991, notched 15 school records, including six season marks – passing yards (3,128), completions (261), attempts (454), total offense (3,636) and touchdowns responsible for (30).

Anderson came to Southern Miss after spending the 2007 campaign at Louisiana-Lafayette as offensive coordinator and quarterbacks coach. The Ragin' Cajuns posted the No. 6-rated



rushing offense nationally (251.6) in 2007 and became the Sun Belt's first ever 3,000-yard rushing team (3,019).

Anderson, who was in private business from 2004-06, previously worked at Middle Tennessee, where he helped direct an offensive unit as co-offensive coordinator and wide receivers coach from 2002-04.

He spent three seasons at New Mexico before landing at MTSU. He served as the wide receivers coach in 2001 and running backs coach from 1999-2000. The UNM rushing attack was responsible for a major share of the Lobo offense in 2000. The Lobos averaged 148 yards per game on the ground, which accounted for 56 percent of the team's total offense.

Anderson worked at Trinity Valley Community College (1995-98) before joining the Division I FBS ranks at New Mexico. In 1998, he was the offensive coordinator and the Cardinals went 7-3. He helped lead the Cardinals to the 1997 NJCAA National Championship.

He began his coaching career at Eastern New Mexico in 1992 (graduate assistant) and 1993 (full-time), where he tutored the wide receivers. He then moved on to Howard Payne University in Brownwood, Texas, to coach wide receivers in 1994. HPU won the Texas IAA conference title.

A two-year letterwinner at wide receiver for Sam Houston State from 1989-91, Anderson was named Southland Conference All-Academic as a senior. He also played for two years as a quarterback and receiver at Baylor (1987-89) before transferring. Anderson graduated with his bachelor's degree in kinesiology from Sam Houston State in 1992. He also attained his master's degree in sports administration from Eastern New Mexico in 1994. Anderson and his wife Wendy have one daughter, Callie, and two sons, Coleton and Cason.

JONESBORO, Ark. (8/30/14) – Arkansas State scored 24 unanswered points in the second half as the Red Wolves went on to a 37-10 victory over Montana State in their 2014 season opener before 26,143 fans at Centennial Bank Stadium.

A-State, which is celebrating its 100th season of football, extended its home-opening winning streak to 10 straight dating back to the 2005 campaign. The victory also gave A-State back-to-back season-opening wins for the first time since the 2008 and 2009 seasons. The Red Wolves handed in-state Arkansas-Pine Bluff (UAPB) a 62-11 loss in last season's opener.

The Red Wolves, the three-time (2011-13) defending Sun Belt Conference (SBC) champions, netted 558 yards in total offense as A-State featured a balanced attack with 294 yards on the ground and 264 in passing. Junior quarterback Fredi Knighten would tally a combined 323 yards on his own, which included 219 passing yards. Defensively, A-State held Montana State to 228 offensive yards.

A-State scored on the game's opening possession to take a 7-0 first-quarter lead as junior running back Michael Gordon busted down the right sideline on a 42-yard touchdown run with 14:19 to go and capped a three-play, 75-yard drive. A 29-yard pass from Fredi Knighten to redshirt junior wide receiver Tres Houston helped set up the Red Wolves' scoring play.

Montana State would tie the contest up at seven apiece with 5:45 left in the opening quarter by capitalizing on an A-State turnover. Redshirt junior J.D. McKissic fumbled a 52-yard punt by Trevor Bolton, which was recovered by the Bobcats' middle linebacker Rhett Young at the A-State seven-yard line. Running back Anthony Knight would hit pay dirt on his fourth straight rushing attempt from one yard out.

The Red Wolves regained the lead at 1:21 left in the first quarter on a 29-yard field goal by junior kicker Luke Ferguson, which concluded a 12-play, 59-yard scoring drive. Ferguson would go onto add a second one, this time from 23 yards out with just five seconds remaining before the half to finish a 93-yard, 13-play sequence as the Red Wolves led 13-7 at the half. A-State produced 302 total offensive yards in the first half, which included an average of 5.4 yards per carry (141 rushing yards) while limiting Montana State to 18 yards on the ground.

The teams exchanged field goals to open the third-quarter scoring as the Bobcats sliced A-State's lead to 13-10 at 10:21 on kicker Luke Daly's 34 yarder. Luke Ferguson

would counter for the Red Wolves with his third field goal of the game, a 41-yard boot with 5:26 left to be played in the quarter as the hosts led 16-10. A-State extended its lead to 23-10 when junior tight end Darion Griswold snared a Fredi Knighten pass for a 23-yard score with 1:53 remaining in the stanza. A 45-yard half-back pass from Tres Houston back to Knighten helped set up the scoring play.

A-State increased its margin to 30-10 early in the fourth quarter as junior cornerback Rocky Hayes picked off MSU quarterback Dakota Prukop's pass at the A-State 46-yard line, which eventually lead to a one-yard TD run by freshman running back Terrance Hollingsworth with 14:25 left. The Red Wolves tacked on their fourth TD of the game with 9:47 to be played on redshirt frosh running back Johnston White's one-yard run giving A-State a 37-10 lead. Redshirt senior middle linebacker Qushaun Lee put the Red Wolves in prime field scoring position with a 40-yard interception return to the MSU 15-yard line.

Knighten ran for 104 yards to lead all rushers in the game while Michael Gordon had 68 yards on seven carries. In receiving, Tres Houston's eight receptions for 87 yards was a game high and J.D. McKissic contributed four catches for 83 yards. Knighten was 19-of-29 for 219 yards in the passing department for A-State, which converted five-of-six red zone opportunities.

Dakota Prukop threw for 142 yards on 14-of-26 passing for Montana State, but was intercepted twice and sacked four times.

Sophomore linebacker Xavier Woodson paced the Red Wolves with seven tackles (six solo). Senior redshirt free safety Sterling Young along with redshirt senior cornerback Andrew Tryon and redshirt junior linebacker Chris Stone contributed six stops apiece. Woodson, junior linebacker Austin Copeland, and freshman defensive end Caleb Caston each had a sack.

KNOXVILLE, Tenn. (9/6/14) - The Tennessee Volunteers scored on three consecutive possessions in the first half and led the rest of the way en route to a 34-19 non-conference victory over the Arkansas State in front of 99,538 fans at UT's Neyland Stadium in Knoxville, Tenn.

A-State struck first on its opening drive of the game as the Red Wolves marched 40 yards on six plays and found the end zone on a four-yard quarterback keeper from junior Fredi Knighten to claim a 6-0 lead. Back-to-back pass completions from Knighten to redshirt freshman wide receiver Tres Houston, covering 14 and 16 yards, along with a 12-yard Knighten run moved A-State to the UT six-yard line. Junior running back Michael Gordon's rush moved the ball two yards closer and on the ensuing play, Knighten scampered into the end zone untouched.

Tennessee answered back with a 73-yard drive resulting in a 20-yard field goal by Aaron Medley to cut A-State's lead at 6-3 with 7:16 to go in the first quarter. The Volunteers would claim a 10-6 advantage on their next possession as tailback Jalen Hurd finished off a 70-yard drive with a four-yard TD run at the opening quarter's 3:02 mark.

A 10-yard TD pass from quarterback Justin Worley to wide receiver Marquez North early in the second quarter resulted in the third straight scoring series for Tennessee, which bumped its lead up to 17-6 with 13:01 remaining on the clock. The Red Wolves bounced back to draw within 17-12 at the 4:10 mark as a result of a Fredi Knighten slant pass to Tres Houston from nine yards out. A-State went for two points, but was unsuccessful as redshirt junior quarterback Stephen Hogan's pass was incomplete and the Red Wolves were also whistled for offensive pass interference. A-State managed to keep the drive alive on a fourth-and-11 situation when junior punter Luke Ferguson faked a punt and then completed a 24-yard pass to redshirt junior Chris Stone for a first down to the UT 49-yard line. However, the Vols stretched their lead back to double digits at 24-12 with 1:20 to be played in the first half as Justin Worley tallied on a five-yard keeper to cap a 10-play, 71-yard drive.

Tennessee stretched its margin to 31-12 in the third quarter by capitalizing on a Red Wolves' turnover as Worley connected with Marquez North on another scoring pass play, this one of 14 yards at the 7:52 mark. A 33-yard Matt Darr punt was fumbled by redshirt junior J.D. McKissic, which was recovered by the Vols at their own



36-yard line to set up the drive.

The last touchdown of the game came from A-State and occurred with 10:06 left to be played as redshirt frosh DeKeathan Williams' 24-yard TD run capped an 11-play, 83-yard scoring drive as the Red Wolves closed their deficit to 31-19. Tennessee would account for the final points in extending its lead to 34-19 with 1:41 remaining in the outing as Aaron Medley split the uprights on a 38-yard field goal.

Fredi Knighten completed 21-of-34 passes for 166 yards and a touchdown in directing the Red Wolves offense, which produced 190 yards passing and 141 rushing yards for a 331-yards total to Tennessee's 415 offensive yards. He also ran for a team-high 65 yards on 14 carries and one score.

Redshirt freshman Tres Houston's 48 yards in receiving on four catches lead A-State, which also received a five catch, 38-yard performance from J.D. McKissic.

Defensively, redshirt senior free safety Sterling Young and redshirt senior middle linebacker Qushaun Lee each compiled a squad-high nine tackles apiece, which included seven solo stops each. Redshirt senior cornerback Andrew Tryon and sophomore linebacker Xavier Woodson each chipped in with seven tackles (six solos). Sophomore defensive back Money Hunter contributed with a pass interception and five tackles (four solos).

For the Vols, Justin Worley threw for 247 yards and two TD's on 22-of-38 passing while Jalen Hurd's 83 yards on 23 carries led all rushers in the contest. Tight end Ethan Wolf had five grabs for 20 yards while Von Pearson and Marquez North caught four Worley aerials for 71 and 68 yards, respectively. North had a pair of TD receptions in the game as well.

MIAMI GARDENS, Fla. (9/16/14) – Several big scoring plays by Miami proved too much for the Arkansas State football team to overcome as the Red Wolves suffered a 41-20 loss in a non-league tilt before 41,519 spectators at Sun Life Stadium.

Miami scored its touchdowns on passes covering 63 yards twice, along with a pair of runs which covered 27 and 33 yards, respectively. The Hurricanes, who improved their record to 2-1 this season, finished the day with 488 yards in total offense while A-State recorded 329 yards, which included 236 passing yards.

A-State trailed Miami 21-7 after the opening quarter as the Hurricanes scored a touchdown on their first two possessions. A 63-yard scoring strike from true freshman quarterback Brad Kaaya to wide receiver Phillip Dorsett on Miami's second offensive play of the game put the hosts up 7-0 less than four minutes into the contest, but the Red Wolves managed to erase the deficit on their next offensive series.

A-State took the kickoff and marched 65 yards down the field in 11 plays culminating in junior Fredi Knighten's one-yard quarterback keeper with 9:03 remaining in the quarter to tie the score at 7-7. Knighten completed five passes during A-State's scoring drive, which included back-to-back 11-yard tosses to junior tight end Darion Griswold and junior wide receiver J.D. McKissic to set up the Red Wolves' score. The game didn't stay tied for long as Miami came right back on the ensuing kickoff and scored by utilizing the long pass. The Canes' Brad Kaaya hooked up with Phillip Dorsett on a 51-yard aerial to give Miami the ball at the A-State 19-yard line and then on the next play, Kaaya then connected with Clive Walford on a 19-yard scoring pass as the Hurricane went back on top at 14-7 with 8:21 left in the stanza.

The Red Wolves then would face a 20-7 deficit late in the first quarter as Miami hit paydirt for the third straight time as running back Duke Johnson dashed 33 yards into the end zone with 3:12 to be played in the opening frame. A-State had its share of scoring opportunities but was unsuccessful in converting as junior kicker Luke Ferguson missed wide on a pair of field goal attempts from 36 yards in the first quarter and from 42 yards early in the second.

Miami extended its lead to 27-7 with 1:16 remaining before the end of the first half as running back Gus Edwards broke several tackles and scampered 27 yards for the Canes' fourth TD. A 32-yard return by frosh Daryl Rollins-Davis on the Miami kickoff

gave A-State the ball at its own 40-yard line and the Red Wolves would move into Hurricane territory on the next play as Knighten completed an 18-yard pass to J.D. McKissic. Two plays later, Miami was flagged for pass interference moving A-State to UM's 19-yard line. The Red Wolves signaled for a trick play and the call paid dividends as J.D. McKissic took a Knighten handoff on a reverse and flipped the ball to junior wideout Tres Houston, who threw a backfield pass to a wide open Knighten at the nine-yard line. Knighten hauled in Houston's pass and sprinted to goal-line marker with 16 seconds left as A-State sliced the deficit to 27-14 at intermission.

Miami upped its lead to 34-14 in the third quarter as defensive lineman Olsen Pierre recovered a Fredi Knighten fumble at the UM 40-yard line, which eventually led to a 63-yard TD scoring pass play from Brad Kaaya to Phillip Dorsett with 8:32 left on the clock. Kaaya would throw his fourth TD pass of the game less than five minutes later with a six-yard toss to wide receiver Braxton Berrios to make it 41-14.

A-State started the fourth quarter on a positive note as the Red Wolves 89 yards in 16 plays resulting in a seven-yard TD run by redshirt freshman running back Johnston White as the visitors narrowed the gap to 41-20 with a second under 10 minutes left in the game.

For the Red Wolves, Knighten ended the day throwing for 217 yards on 22-of-40 pass completions while his counterpart, Brady Kaaya chalked up 342 passing yards after completing 16-of-24 passes with four TD's.

Johnston White led the A-State rushing attack with 83 yards on 14 carries for a 5.9 yards per attempt average while J.D. McKissic was the Red Wolves' favorite target with seven receptions for 59 yards. Redshirt freshman wideout Brandon Cox contributed five grabs for 29 yards. Duke Johnson was the game's top rusher with 90 yards on 14 attempts and Phillip Dorsett caught four passes for 201 yards and two TD's to help key the Miami offense.

On the defensive side of the ball, redshirt junior defensive back Charleston Girty's 10 tackles (six solos) led the way. Redshirt senior free safety Sterling Young compiled eight stops (five solos) as did redshirt senior defensive back Frankie Jackson (four solos), sophomore defensive back Money Hunter (four solos), and redshirt senior linebacker Qushaun Lee (four solos), who also notched a pass interception.

JONESBORO, Ark. (9/20/14) – A 24-yard touchdown pass from Fredi Knighten to Dijon Paschal in overtime and a last second blocked field goal by Artez Brown in regulation proved to be the difference makers as Arkansas State rallied for a thrilling 21-14 overtime win over Utah State at Centennial Bank Stadium in Jonesboro, Ark.

A-State, which was playing in its first overtime outing since 2010, evened its overall record this season to 2-2 with the extra-session non-league victory over the Aggies in front of an energized crowd of 29,029 fans and an ESPN3 television audience.

The Red Wolves, who donned red helmets for the first time since the late 1970's, rose to the occasion when it mattered the most by blocking a last-second Utah State field goal in regulation to force overtime. A-State then received first possession in overtime after the Aggies won the toss and elected to start on defense. The Red Wolves, who started the extra session on the 25-yard line, scored the go-ahead TD on a second-and-nine situation in their offensive series with Knighten completing a 24-yard pass to redshirt freshman wide receiver Dijon Paschal and junior kicker Luke Ferguson's PAT followed to five A-State a 21-14 lead. On its ensuing possession, Utah State could only produce three net yards in as many plays as the Aggies were hampered by a five-yard false start penalty to push the ball back from the A-State 17 to the 22-yard line. A-State's redshirt junior nickelback Charleston Girley dashed any Utah State hopes to tie the contest by breaking up quarterback Darell Garretson's fourth-and-seven pass attempt to end the game and hand the Red Wolves' a dramatic comeback decision.

The first half was a quiet one in terms of scoring as Utah State accounted for the only points, which came in the opening quarter. On the first play of its second possession, USU quarterback Darell Garretson hooked up with wide receiver Hunter Sharp for an 81-yard score as the Aggies lead 7-0 with 7:47 remaining in the quarter. A-State did little to help its cause in the first half as the Red Wolves were hampered by three turnovers and penalties, five for 40 yards. The best scoring opportunity for the Red Wolves came on the game's opening possession as A-State drove to the USU 19-yard line, but any scoring opportunity was dashed as the Aggies recovered A-State Tres Houston's fumble.

Utah State was well on the way to potentially increasing its lead early in the second quarter as the Aggies had the ball at the A-State six-yard line on a third-and-goal situation. However, senior free safety Sterling Young picked off a Garretson pass at the two-yard line to end the threat. A-State then moved the ball from its two-yard line all the way into Utah State territory to the 44-yard line before a Fredi Knighten fumble was recovered by the Aggies. Utah State had a chance to put more points on the scoreboard with 24 seconds to go before the half, but kicker Jake Thompson's 45-yard field goal attempt fell short.

The ball turned to A-State's favor early in the second half as the Red Wolves pulled into a 7-7 tie with 7:40 to be played in the third quarter, taking advantage of a Utah State fumble. The Aggies botched a punt attempt at its own 22-yard line as punter Jason Bentrude recovered his own fumble at the visitor's 13-yard line with 8:40 on the clock. Three plays later, redshirt junior wideout J.D. McKissic tallied his first touchdown of this season and second career rushing TD on a 12-yard reverse play to cap a 13-yard, three-play A-State scoring drive. McKissic tallied after taking a pitch from redshirt freshman running back Johnston White around left

end and breaking a tackle near the goal line to find the end zone. However, Utah State answered with a TD of its own as wide receiver Ronald Butler caught a Darell Garretson in the middle of the Red Wolves' defense and outran all defenders to the end zone for a 41-yard scoring play as the Aggies regained the lead at 14-7 with 3:43 left in the third quarter.

A-State had scoring chances on its first two fourth-quarter possessions and would cash in on its second series as Johnston White followed his blockers into the end zone for a four-yard TD run with just under five minutes left in the game for the equalizer as the Red Wolves tied it at 14 apiece following Luke Ferguson's successful extra-point kick. A 15-yard pass interference penalty by Utah State on a fourth-and-nine yard situation gave A-State second life and the ball at the USU three-yard line.

The Red Wolves committed what potentially could have been a costly turnover with 47 seconds left as Fredi Knighten fumbled on a pass attempt and the Aggies recovered at their opponent's 38-yard line. Utah State had an opportunity to win the game in regulation following a timeout with three seconds remaining, but senior cornerback Artez Brown arguably turned in the play of the game by blocking Nick Diaz's 38-yard attempt which sophomore defensive end Chris Odom recovered at the Red Wolves' one-yard line as time expired to force overtime.

Offensively for A-State, Fredi Knighten threw for 190 yards and a TD on 19-of-33 in the passing department as the Red Wolves chalked up 316 total yards. J.D. McKissic was on the receiving end of six Knighten aeriels for 43 yards and redshirt junior tight end Darion Griswold grabbed four passes for 68 yards. Johnston White's 100 rushing yards led all rushers as A-State registered 126 yards on the ground for the game. Utah State, which drops to 2-2 overall, accumulated 413 yards in total offense with 268 coming through the air. Darell Garretson passed for 268 yards and a pair of TD's after completing 27-of-46 for Utah State and Hunter Sharp was his favorite target, catching nine passes for a game-high 130 yards.

A pair of linebackers, redshirt senior Qushaun Lee and sophomore Xavier Woodson, paced the A-State defense with 13 tackles apiece. Lee totaled 10 solo stops while Woodson compiled nine solo tackles. Redshirt senior cornerback Andrew Tryon contributed eight tackles (six solos) for the Red Wolves. Utah State, which forced four Red Wolves' turnovers in the game, featured three individuals with double-digit tackles led by inside linebacker Zach Vigil's game-leading 14 stops (12 solos).

The overtime victory improved A-State's record to 3-4 all-time dating back to 1998 and was the Red Wolves' first overtime encounter since 2010, which resulted in a 36-35 setback to Western Kentucky. Prior to the win over Utah State, A-State's last overtime victory occurred in 2005 with a 3-0 home decision over Florida Atlantic.

JONESBORO, Ark. (10/4/14) – The recent Homecoming success for the Arkansas State University football team continued as the Red Wolves, behind the passing of junior Fredi Knighten and junior Michael Gordon's running, claimed a 28-14 victory over the ULM Warhawks in A-State's Sun Belt Conference opener in front of 29,317 fans at Centennial Bank Stadium.

A-State, which improved its record to 3-2 overall and 1-0 in league play, won for the 11th time in its last 12 Homecoming contests. The three-time defending SBC Champions also prevailed for the 21st time in their last 24 conference matchups and defeated ULM for the fifth time in a row to date.

Knighten registered career highs in both total offense (355 yards) and passing (284 yards) for the Red Wolves, who scored all of their 28 points in the second half. Michael Gordon also turned in a productive night by running for a game-high 168 yards and averaging 11.2 yards per carry.

The first half was scoreless as both teams were plagued by turnovers and penalties. The Red Wolves, who generated 224 total offensive yards and limited ULM to 66 in the game's initial 30 minutes, had a pass intercepted and lost a fumble. A-State's lone scoring opportunity came up short as junior kicker Luke Ferguson missed wide right on a 23-yard field goal with 19 seconds left in the opening quarter as redshirt junior Stephen Hogan's hold was hampered by a poor center snap. ULM's best scoring chance came early in the second quarter as A-State quarterback Fredi Knighten's fumble was recovered by Cordero Smith on the Red Wolves' 32-yard line, but four plays later redshirt senior defensive back Frankie Jackson forced a fumble. Jackson dislodged the ball loose from running back Tyler Cain at the A-State 13-yard line with redshirt senior linebacker Qushaun Lee recovering the ball at the Red Wolves' 11-line mark.

The contest remained scoreless the first six minutes of the second half until with 8:51 remaining in the third quarter as A-State went up 7-0 after completing a 71-yard, three-play drive on its second possession of the half. A 68-yard run through the Warhawks' defense by junior running back Michael Gordon set up the Red Wolves' scoring play, which culminated on a three-yard Fredi Knighten TD rush off right tackle. Gordon took Knighten's handoff and made it all the way to the ULM three-yard line before tackled from behind. On its next possession, A-State found the

end zone once again at the 1:38 mark to claim a 14-0 lead. Knighten connected on a 15-yard pass play with redshirt junior wideout J.D. McKissic and then one of 25 yards to redshirt junior wide receiver Tres Houston to highlight the scoring drive. A fade pass covering 12 yards from Knighten to junior receiver Tyler Trosin in the corner of the end zone gave A-State its second TD on the night.

Trailing by two touchdowns, ULM cut A-State's lead in half early in the fourth quarter as quarterback Pete Thomas threw a 59-yard strike to wideout Ajalen Holley on a deep post route to make it a 14-7 game with 12:21 on the clock. The Red Wolves came right back with scores on their next two possessions as Fredi Knighten ran for touchdowns covering 29 and 12 yards. Knighten's 29-yard keeper gave A-State a 21-7 lead at 10:08 and then his 12-yard dash with 9:13 left gave the hosts a 28-7 advantage. ULM tallied the contest's final points with 1:30 to be played on a 41-yard TD pass from backup quarterback Brayle Brown to wide receiver Kenzee Jackson.

A-State compiled 572 yards of total offense while ULM recorded a 348-yards output in a game featuring a combined 19 penalties for 179 yards and five turnovers. Knighten's 284 yards in passing came on 21-of-36 completions and was intercepted twice. The starting signal-caller also ran for another 71 yards and scored three times on 20 carries. J.D. McKissic caught eight passes for 120 yards and redshirt frosh wide receiver Dijon Paschal had five grabs for 82 yards.

On the ULM side, Pete Thomas completed 21-of-39 passes for 181 yards and a TD. Wide receiver Rashon Ceaser made a game-leading 10 catches for 82 yards and Kenzee Jackson also accumulated 82 receiving yards on six receptions.

Defensively, sophomore linebacker Xavier Woodson's 10 total tackles (seven solos) and three tackles for minus 12 yards was tops for A-State. Frankie Jackson chipped in with five stops. Woodson along with freshman defensive end Caleb Caston, freshman defensive back Charles Grant, and redshirt junior end Chris Stone each notched a quarterback sack. ULM was led by nose tackle Gerrard Johnson with 11 tackles (nine solos) and defensive end Joey Gautney contributed 10 stops (six solos).

ATLANTA, Ga. (10/11/14) – Total domination was put forth by Arkansas State as the Red Wolves were unstoppable offensively and stellar defensively in handing Georgia State a one-sided 52-10 setback in Sun Belt Conference (SBC) play at the Georgia Dome.

The victory extended A-State's present winning streak to three straight as the Red Wolves not only improved their season record to 4-2 overall and 2-0 in the conference, but won a league outing for the 22nd time in their last 25 such encounters. The win also gives A-State its 11 conference road triumph in the last 12 contests. Georgia State falls to 1-4 overall and 0-3 in league action with the loss.

"We have not played a complete game until now and had too many mistakes to be consistent," A-State head football coach Blake Anderson said. "The guys were extremely nervous about Georgia State's offense and the defense stepped up early and played well, and the offense got the ball when they needed to. They set the tone for the game. I can say this was definitely the most complete game that we played and we eliminated a lot of mistakes. There is still some things that we need to work on, but all in all, I am really proud of the way the guys played, and really hammered down to have a great second half as well."

A-State executed well on both sides as the offense totaled 618 yards while the Red Wolves' defense limited Georgia State to a 269-yard output. Individually, junior running back Michael Gordon rushed for a career-high 188 yards with two TD's and averaged an impressive 10.4 yards per attempt. Junior quarterback Fredi Knighten also was productive, throwing for 215 yards and running for another 93 yards. On the other side of the line, A-State held Georgia State to 71 yards on the ground, forced two turnovers, and constantly pressured the Panthers' two signal-callers.

A-State bolted out to a decisive 24-0 first-quarter advantage in the ESPN2 televised contest as the Red Wolves' offense amassed 244 total yards while holding the Panthers' to only 19 yards. A seven-yard touchdown pass by junior quarterback Fredi Knighten to redshirt junior tight end Darion Griswold gave the Red Wolves a 7-0 lead at 8:32 of the opening quarter. A nifty 41-yard catch by freshman wide receiver Dijon Paschal of a Knighten aerial was the key play in the 85-yard A-State scoring drive, moving the ball from the A-State 46-yard line down to the GSU 13-yard mark. The Red Wolves would then go up 13-0 just under six minutes on junior kicker Luke Ferguson's 26-yard field goal after A-State gained ball possession at the GSU 22-yard line on a

fumble recovery by freshman defensive end Caleb Caston following a force by red-shirt senior middle linebacker Qushaun Lee.

The Red Wolves increased their margin to 17-0 on the next offensive possession as junior running back Michael Gordon took a Fredi Knighten handoff and broke up the middle through the Georgia State defense untouched for a 50-yard score with 3:20 left on the clock. A-State kept its scoring streak alive with its third touchdown of the game as redshirt senior tight end Kenny Rains caught his first collegiate TD pass on a two-yard Fredi Knighten toss on the final play of the quarter as the Red Wolves upped their lead to 24-0. A 16-yard run by Fredi Knighten on the series' first play followed by a 48-yard strike from Knighten to Dijon Paschal put A-State in prime scoring position at the Panthers' five-yard line.

Georgia State averted going scoreless in the opening half by putting a three on the scoreboard as Wil Lutz booted a 26-yard field goal at 2:22 of the second quarter. The Panthers capitalized on a Fredi Knighten fumble and appeared on the verge of scoring a TD by moving the ball down to the visitor's six-yard line, but the Red Wolves' defense came up big by sacking GSU quarterback Nick Arbuckle for a four-yard loss and forcing the Panthers into a field goal. A-State, which netted 335 total offensive yards in the first half of which 214 occurred on the ground, bumped its lead to 28 points (31-3) with 35 seconds to go before halftime as freshman running back Johnston White tallied on a 13-yard TD dash after a exploded for a 53-yard run.

A-State picked right up where it left off early in the second half as Fredi Knighten scored from 51 yards out on the keeper, breaking a tackle near the GSU five to get into the end zone at 12:40 of the third quarter as the Red Wolves extended their advantage to 38-3. Eight minutes later, Michael Gordon scored his second TD of the game with an 11-yard run to cap a 93-yard scoring drive as A-State's lead bulged to 45-3. In the fourth quarter, the Red Wolves hit paydirt again to take a 52-3 advantage with under 10 minutes remaining as Fredi Knighten completed a two-yard TD pass to redshirt sophomore tight end Warren Leapheart. Georgia State scored its lone touchdown with 3:49 left in the game on running back Gerald Howse's two-yard scamper.

Leading the defensive charge for A-State were four players with seven tackles apiece – Qushaun Lee (six solos), junior outside linebacker Austin Copeland (six solos), sophomore outside linebacker Xavier Woodson (four solos), and redshirt senior cornerback Andrew Tryon (four solos).

LAFAYETTE, La. (10/21/14) – Eight rushing touchdowns by Louisiana, which included four apiece by Alonzo Harris and Elijah McGuire, proved too much for Arkansas State to overcome as the Red Wolves' three-game winning streak came to an abrupt end in a high-scoring 55-40 setback.

A-State fought an uphill battle in the ESPN2 televised conference contest as the Red Wolves faced a 34-9 deficit midway through the second quarter. A-State managed to pull within eight points with 1:12 to go in the contest but could never overcome the deficit as Louisiana won its third straight. The hosts, who were selected the preseason favorite to win the conference title, had history on their side as the home team has now prevailed in 11 of the last 14 series meetings to date.

The first-half score resembled a final one as both teams combined for 57 points and 735 yards in total offense with Louisiana leading 34-23 at halftime. The second half didn't quite keep the scoring pace of the first, but nevertheless was an active one as the Red Wolves and Ragin' Cajuns produced a combined 31 points.

The Red Wolves finished the evening with 595 yards in total offense as junior quarterback Fredi Knighten passed for 344 yards and three touchdowns on 26-of-37 completions and junior running back Michael Gordon ran for 134 yards to go with a score. In receiving, redshirt freshman wide receiver Dijon Paschal was A-State's top target with 141 yards and two TD's on eight receptions and senior wide-out J.D. McKissic caught seven passes for 99 yards.

A-State was the first on the scoreboard as the Red Wolves took a 6-0 first-quarter lead at 11:22 as a result of Fredi Knighten's 60-yard touchdown run and a missed extra-point kick attempt. Louisiana erased the deficit on its next possession as running back Alonzo Harris scored the first of his four TD's on the night on a four-yard run at the 7:45 mark to tie the game up at 6-6 as the Red Wolves blocked the extra point. With under five minutes to go in the quarter, A-State regained the lead 9-6 as junior kicker Luke Ferguson connected on a career-best 44-yard field goal try. The A-State lead would only last for a little over three minutes as Alonzo Harris dashed 22 yards up the middle into the end zone giving the Ragin' Cajuns a



13-9 advantage.

The second quarter, which featured a combined 35 points by both teams, saw Louisiana erupt for 21 unanswered points early in the stanza as the hosts led 34-9 with 8:49 to go before intermission. Alonzo Harris netted his third rushing TD on a one-yard plunge before the 14-minute mark and his backup, Elijah McGuire followed with scoring runs covering 74 and 13 yards to give UL a 34-9 lead. Down but certainly not out, A-State rallied with back-to-back touchdowns as the Red Wolves trimmed a 25-point deficit down to 11 points at 34-23 with 4:29 left in the half. A 70-yard TD run by Michael Gordon made it 34-16 and capped a 79-yard, three-play Red Wolves' scoring drive which took less than a minute. Gordon carried the ball off left tackle and was tackled as he fell upon a couple of his blockers, but never was whistled down. With the presence of mind, Gordon got up and proceeded to sprint to the end zone for the score as the call was upheld following an official's replay review. A-State tallied again on its next possession, the first play in fact as Dijon Paschal hauled in a pass from Fredi Knighten and outraced his defenders for an 87-yard touchdown with 4:29 left on the clock.

In the third quarter, the Ragin' Cajuns recorded the lone score by capitalizing on an A-State trick punt play in the Red Wolves' end zone as junior linebacker Chris Stone completed a minus two-yard pass to punter Luke Ferguson, who was tackled at the A-State six-yard line as Louisiana took ball control on downs. Two plays later, Alonzo Harris rushed up the middle for a four-yard score with 6:14 remaining as the Ragin' Cajuns would have a 41-23 lead after three quarters.

A-State had a productive fourth quarter as the Red Wolves tallied 17 points, starting with a 29-yard field goal by Luke Ferguson at 10:10. A six-yard scoring pass from Fredi Knighten to Dijon Paschal with 5:37 to go made it 41-32 before UL countered on an Elijah McGuire 43-yard TD run. Knighten would throw his third TD 2:18 later when junior wideout Tres Houston came down with a 12-yard catch in the end zone to draw within 48-40 following a two-point conversion pass from Knighten to sophomore tight end Warren Leapheart. However, the tables quickly turned on A-State as Elijah McGuire struck again on a 54-yard TD run with 54 seconds left to account for the final margin.

The Red Wolves' defense was led by sophomore linebacker Xavier Woodson with 14 tackles (12 solos) and sophomore cornerback Money Hunter contributed seven stops, all solos.

For Louisiana, Elijah McGuire ran for 265 yards on 19 rushes while Alonzo Harris gained 107 yards on the ground in 27 attempts as the Ragin' Cajuns compiled 521 yards in total offense.

MOSCOW, Idaho (11/1/14) – Junior running back Michael Gordon scored a school single-game third-most five touchdowns and the Arkansas State University football team forced eight turnovers to post a 44-28 win over the Idaho Vandals in a Sun Belt Conference (SBC) outing at UI's Kibbie Dome in Moscow, Idaho.

Gordon, who finished the day with 105 yards on 17 carries and had six receptions for 45 yards, not only posted an A-State all-time third-best five TD's but also tied a Sun Belt Conference record for most touchdowns in a game. Gordon's noteworthy effort marked his fourth consecutive 100-yard plus rushing performance of this season to date. Defensively, A-State made Idaho commit eight turnovers with four pass interceptions and fumble recoveries apiece.

A-State took advantage of an Idaho turnover to gain a 7-0 lead following a 44-yard touchdown run by Michael Gordon at the 10:15 mark. The game's opening score was set up after UI quarterback Matt Linehan's pass was tipped near the line of scrimmage into the hands of red-shirt senior free safety Sterling Young to give the Red Wolves' ball possession at the Idaho 39-yard line. Two plays later, Gordon took a handoff from junior quarterback Fredi Knighten on a sweep left and followed his blockers down the field before locating the end zone.

In the second quarter, A-State increased its lead as junior cornerback Rocky Hayes recovered a fumble by Matt Linehan at the A-State seven yard line and proceeded to run a school-record 93 yards for the TD giving the Red Wolves a 14-0 cushion with 10:23 remaining in the stanza. Sophomore outside linebacker Xavier Woodson's tackle forced the ball out of Linehan's hands and Hayes alertly scooped up the ball and covered the distance untouched. Idaho managed to cut A-State's lead in half with 7:49 left as running back Elijahhaa Penny scored from a yard out

on his third straight rush attempt to make the score 14-7. The momentum remained with Idaho as the Vandals tied the game at 14-all as running back Jerrel Brown hit paydirt on an eight-yard run with 3:17 to be played in the first half. A-State snapped the deadlock with 11 seconds to go before the break as junior kicker Luke Ferguson's 28-yard field goal was successful giving the visitors a 17-14 half time advantage.

The A-State lead didn't last long as Idaho went ahead 21-17 with just over nine minutes left in the third quarter on a two-yard Elijahhaa Penny run. The lead exchanged hands going back to A-State's favor as Michael Gordon tallied on a seven-yard TD run with 6:34 left in the third. A completed 23-yard pass from Knighten to redshirt junior wide receiver Tres Houston put the ball at the Vandals' seven after a pass interference call was declined and Gordon converted on the ensuing play. The scoring drive started when A-State capitalized on another Idaho turnover when redshirt senior cornerback Andrew Tryon recovered a David Ungerer fumble on the kickoff. However, Idaho managed to erase its deficit and went ahead 28-24 at the 2:58 mark as Jerrel Brown scampered 16 yards for the touchdown. The Red Wolves stormed back to reclaim the lead at 30-28 as Michael Gordon netted another TD on a one-yard plunge with seven seconds left before the end of the quarter. A-State pushed its margin 37-28 as Michael Gordon ran 23 yards for the score with 7:41 remaining and the elusive backfield performer tallied again on a four yarder at 6:35 as the Red Wolves extended their lead to 44-28.

While Gordon had a productive game so did Fredi Knighten, who threw for 244 yards on 21-of-28 passing and ran for 73 more on 22 carries. Tres Houston chalked up 83 yards in receiving on five grabs. Sterling Young paced the A-State defense with 12 total tackles (nine solos) while senior middle linebacker Qushaun Lee had nine tackles (eight solos) and freshman defensive end Ja'Von Rolland-Jones contributed eight stops (seven solos).
